Avera is a sophomore at Meridian Community College in the Dental Hygiene program where she serves as fundraiser chairman. She is a member of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. Upon graduation, Avera plans to further her education at the University Medical Center in Jackson to obtain a bachelor's degree. Avera will represent Laurel

She will be attending Pearl River Community College in the fall. After graduating from PRCC, she will attend Mississippi State University to obtain a degree in fashion merchandising.

Serving Jones County, Welch attends Jones County Junior College and is studying elementary education. She

is a member of Phi Theta Kappa and plans to graduate with a master's degree from the University of Southern Mississippi. Welch graduated summa cum laude from West Jones High School and was elected Most Admired.

In its 21st year as host city, Hattiesburg will showcase this year's best and

brightest young women as they compete for the title of Mississippi's Miss Hospitality. Thirty-one women, who represent all regions of the state, will vie for the title of Mississippi's Miss Hospitality, with the winner serving for a full year as the state's official ambassador for economic development and tourism. For the first time, the Mississippi Miss Hospitality Competition has added a Little Miss Hospitality component. Each local representative has selected a young girl between the ages of 6 and 10 from her hometown to mentor throughout her reign. Little Misses will appear on stage during competition and be invited to official events. If crowned the next Mississippi Miss Hospitality, the contestant's Little Miss will be able to serve alongside her as she fulfills her duties and responsibilities as Mississippi's Goodwill Ambassador. Avery Ladner of Laurel, KeriAna Warden of Ellisville, and Brayleigh Thornton of Jones Country will represent their

Sharon - Shady Grove Fire Protection District gets better insurance rating

It is with great pride that we announce (effective May 2) the Sharon - Shady Grove Fire Protection District, informally referred to as District 2 in Jones County, has received a better insurance rating from the Mississippi State Rating Bureau. Out of the six districts across Jones County, District 2 comprises the only communities to have their classification reduced from 8 to 7, which implies lower insurance prices for homeowners in the Sharon and Shady Grove communities. Sharon and Shady Grove Volunteer Fire Departments have achieved this rating by providing above-standard fire protection services to the communities in which they serve, as well as meeting or exceeding the standard requirements for public fire hydrant locations, and the required five-mile radius placement of the responding department within a community.

What many people do not realize is that the fire protection and medical first responder services are facilitated and provided by men and women who willingly volunteer their time to ensure the safety and protection of the community, saving both lives and property. Without these dedicated individuals who fight on behalf of their community to ensure above-standard fire protection, insurance ratings could and would most likely be much higher, raising the general insurance premium prices for homeowners, as well as reducing the overall protection for life and property.

Volunteer Fire Departments across the country rely on specific avenues for financial coverage, and one of those avenues is directly related to the community which is serviced by volunteers. The Sharon Volunteer Fire Department has reported that it receives "water money" from less than or closely equal to 50 percent of all households covered in the Sharon area. The water money that is referred to is the optional \$1 donation included in each household's water bill.

Many areas do not offer this \$1 donation as optional, and therefore is already included in a standard water bill. However, the Sharon community is granted the option to donate \$1 per water bill to the Sharon Volunteer Fire Department, and at this time, only half of the homeowners in the Sha-

ron community do so. The Sharon Volunteer Fire Department, like many other volunteer fire departments across our county and nation, rely heavily upon donations to maintain operations and continue to provide above-standard services to the communities in which they serve. The difference that a \$1 donation per water bill could make is outstanding. The members of the Sharon Volunteer Fire Department request that people of the Sharon community recognize the premiere fire protection services provided by the Sharon Volunteer Fire Department and consider whole-heartedly in providing support for your local volunteer fire service by giving that small \$1 donation on each of your water bills.

There is an ever-growing need for better equipment, fire apparatus and training in the volunteer fire service, and even though the Sharon-Shady Grove area has been granted a better insurance rating, this does not negate the fact that these two volunteer fire departments are in continuous need of financial donations from their communifies. It is therefore requested that each household or business in the Sharon community that receives a monthly water bill consider donating \$1 per bill to the Sharon Volunteer Fire Department so that they can continue to maintain a Class 7 rating and help lower your insurance rates while providing superior fire protection and emergency medical services to each and every member of the Sharon community.

Moselle Elementary student wins first prize at **45th National Junior Beta Club Convention**

(Submitted) - Clark Piercy, a 5th grade student from Moselle Elementary won first prize in the woodworking division at the 45th National Junior Beta Club Convention held recently in Savannah, GA. Mississippi holds Beta Conventions across the state and out of state where kids from a variety of schools can attend and compete. This year's convention venue boasted nearly 25,000 attendees from all over the nation, marking the event to be the largest in Savannah's history.

Contest participants get to showcase not just their work but also their academic and leadership abilities with peers from across the states. Many children put their skills to the test making a diversity of entries but Piercy's meticulously made billiard pool cue with 92 intricately designed inlays of synthetic ivory, silver, ebony, cherry, and blue mahoe, with a bird's eye maple as forearm outclassed all other entries and bagged this year's coveted award. The eleven year old has been consistently top of all his competitions, receiving first place in Division 1 of 4th and 5th grade for woodworking at the State Beta Convention held in Biloxi, MS, last March, which advanced him to compete in Savannah, GA, in June.

The experience has inspired confidence and ambition in Piercy that he aims to join the contest again next year and stated, "I would like to push myself and do more to show the talents and skills that my family, especially my father, has shown me." Clark credits his family for their love and support, as well as, helping him in his faith journey. He stated that he "trusted God's guidance" in all his activities and is thankful for all the blessings he has received. The Piercy family are parishioners at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church in Hattiesburg. Piercy is also actively involved with their youth program which according to him has helped foster strong family bonds and values that he was able to put into practice.

JCJC's McGowen accepted into Rural Physician Scholarship Program

The long list of honors and awards just got longer for recent Jones County Junior College graduate, Katelynn McGowen. The Moselle native and daughter of Hugh and Robin McGowen officially learned she was selected to participate in the undergraduate portion of the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program (MRPSP). This program provides a way for rural Mississippi students to earn a seat in medical school, receive mentoring during the medical school application process and earn a \$120,000 medical school scholarship in return for four years of service while learning the art of healing from practicing rural physicians. The biological sciences/pre-medicine major has a long-term goal of working in the pediatric field. She said being a part of the MRPSP has been a dream that she has worked long and hard to accomplish.

"I am grateful to be accepted into the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program because I have always wanted to enter the medical field since I was about seven years old," said McGowen. "The program is a huge blessing in helping to pave my route to medical school while offering guidance, scholarships, and a medical family that will always be by my side. I am excited to see where the MRPSP journey takes me!"

In the fall, McGowen will be a junior at the University of Mississippi as one of 15 students named a prestigious Lyceum Scholar. At Jones, she was a member of the Charles Pickering Honors Institute, Phi Theta Kappa honor society where she served as the VP of Leadership and Service, and she was selected as a New Century Pathway Scholar. Other honors she has earned include JCJC's Who's Who, Hall of Fame and Letter "J" Awards, the Presidential Scholarship and she was

a member of the JCJC Student Government Association, Baptist Student Union, Sigma Kappa Delta English Honors Society, and the College Republicans Club. McGowen was the Maroon Typhoon Lead Drum Major both years, additionally, she served as Ellisville's 2016 Miss Hospitality, and she currently volunteers with the Hattiesburg Elks Lodge and in the Emergency room at Forrest General Hospital.

"I am so thankful for my professors, my academics, and the endless opportunities Jones County Junior College offered me. I have made many connections by being involved on and off campus, and I pray to always inspire greatness in other people's lives," McGowen said.

Created in 2007, MRPSP identifies college sophomores

and juniors who demonstrate the necessary commitment and academic achievement to become competent, well-trained rural primary care physicians in Mississippi. The program offers undergraduate academic enrichment and a clinical experience in a rural setting. Upon completion of all medical school admissions requirements, the student can be admitted to the University of Mississippi School of Medicine or William Carey University College of Osteopathic Medicine.

During medical school, each MRPSP scholar may receive \$30,000 per year based on available funding. Consistent legislative support of MRPSP translates to 60 medical students receiving a total of \$1,800,000 to support their education this fall. Additional benefits include personalized mentoring from practicing rural physicians and academic support.

Upon completion of medical training, MRPSP Scholars must enter a residency program in one of five primary care specialties: family medicine, general internal medicine, medicine-pediatrics, obstetrics/gynecology or pediatrics. The MRPSP Scholar must provide four years of service in a clinic-based practice in an approved Mississippi community of 15,000 or less, located more than 20 miles from a medically served area.

The Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Program and the Mississippi Rural Dentists Scholarship Program are state-funded efforts to increase the number of dentists and physicians serving the health-care needs of Mississippians in rural areas. Housed at the University of Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson, and collaborating with its schools of medicine and dentistry and the College of Osteopathic Medicine at William Carey University in Hattiesburg, the programs use various outreach, mentoring and training methods to identify, support, educate and deploy new generations of health-care workers for Mississippi's underserved populations.

Did You Know... Relocating for a Job & Degrees in Demand

In a survey of 3,500 working professionals, Allied Van Lines found that 17 percent had relocated for a job. Roughly 50 percent of those who relocated did so for career advancement and/or more money, while 8 percent moved to be closer to family or for other relationship reasons. Moving is often characterized as stressful, and 31 percent of survey respondents who moved indicated that finding a home was the most challenging part of relocating for a job.

Acclimating to a new community (29 percent), finding services such as utilities and medical care (13 percent) and making friends (12 percent) were also cited as some of the most challenging parts of relocating for a job. As difficult as relocating can be, 64 percent of those who had relocated expressed positive sentiments toward their job relocation, while just 7.5 percent harbored negative feelings about relocating
