





Current capacity will be expanded from 17 treatment rooms to 22, improving patient reception and triage flow, and integrating lobby space into a combined ER/ second hospital entrance. In 2017 the emergency room had 42,731 visits. The updated emergency room will have the capacity to see more than 50,000 patients per year.

Specialized Wound Care is the next point of focus. A planned joint venture with Healogics will open a new comprehensive wound care center with two hyperbaric oxygen chambers. It will be located in a free-standing building on the Keller The emergency campus. room and wound care projects are expected to be completed in late 2018.

Phase II – While Phase I is being completed, the design and planning work for Phase II will occur. This includes plans for a hospital entrance and first floor renovation — this would include not only the entrance, but admitting, registration, the cafeteria, kitchen, doctor's dining, and provide for additional retail space.

Keller desires to provide a 21st century experience visitors, patients, physicians, and staff as they enter and interact with the campus. This will include:

· A more user-friendly

Design work at the same time will occur for a major surgical services expansion. A plan to connect the main hospital with the outpatient surgery pavilion on the south side of the campus is currently in development.

Finally, a Muscle Shoals facility is planned to provide Imaging & Outpatient Services upon completion of a new medical office building on Avalon Avenue.

"We are nearing 100 years of service to the Shoals community," said Paul Storey, Helen Keller Hospital President. "These projects set us up to serve the Shoals very well for the beginning of the next 100."

from a few years ago. It deserves a repeat because I've had two people call me this past week claiming they've experienced this. I don't know what is causing the uptick but you should

review this and be aware.

I received a call from a friend recently. Let's call her "Mabel" just because I think that name is funny. She

Fisher excitedly explained that her email account had been hacked. Someone using her name sent email to all her friends in her Contacts list telling them that she, Mabel, was stranded in London and needed money. We have seen quite a bit of this lately.

THE TRAVELLER **SCAM**

by "The Computer Skeptic"

The message from "Mable" read, "I'm stuck in London, England right now, I came down here for a short vacation then i was robbed, worse of it is that bags, cash and cards and my cell phone were stolen at GUN POINT, it's such a crazy experience for me, I need help flying back home. Please i need you to loan me some money, will refund you as soon as i'm back home, i promise.All i need is (\$900 USD) but dont know how much you would be able to spare..we will be waiting to hear back from you on how you can get the fund to me please."

The "stranded" person asked Mabel's friends to wire the money to them via Western Union. Some recipients of this kind of message might be a bit skeptical of the claim and might ask a question or two to make sure it is really their friend who is stranded. Because the scammer has access to your web-based email account, they can often search for details and be quite

convincing.

Here is the anatomy of this scam: First, a scammer hacks into a random webmail account. There are various

ways of doing this such as a webmail phishing scam attack. In such attacks, the scammers will send out large numbers of bogus emails that try to fool users into providing their webmail account login details. Unfortunately, at least a few of the recipients fall for the ruse and submit their webmail details to the scammers. Once he has access to your account, the hacker will usually change your password and lock you out of your own account.

Next, the scammer sends a version of the "stranded" story to everyone in the "Contacts" list. Of course, many friends know you well enough to know when you are in town or not but some people just want to help and fall for the trap.

If you find yourself locked out of your own email account, you may be a victim of this scam. The only thing you can

do is call your email provider and get them to assist you. If you've not yet been scammed, just remember that your email or Internet provider will never, ever ask you for your email login credentials. So, be skeptical of anyone claiming to be a representative of AT&T or Comcast or whoever your provider is. Be even more skeptical of anyone asking for money. Besides me,



What is Natural Gas?

Natural gas is made up of hydrocarbon gases, primarily methane, naturally occurring in rock formations deep below the earth's surface. The natural gas is withdrawn and transported to homes and businesses through an underground system of pipes.

Why use Natural Gas?

Natural gas is a fuel of choice because it is:

- 1. Efficient
- 2. Clean-burning (emits few pollutants)
- 3. Plentiful
- 4. Safe

Who uses Natural Gas?

- Residential users use natural gas in their homes to fuel furnaces, pool/spa heaters, gas lights, stoves, generators and space heaters.
- Commercial users use natural gas in businesses such as restaurants, hotels, and hospitals.
- Industrial users use natural gas for heating processes and as a fuel for the generation of steam.
- Electric utilities use natural gas to generate electricity.
- Natural gas pipeline companies use natural gas as a fuel to run compressor units.

Natural Gas Safety Precautions

Natural gas is colorless, odorless, lighter than air, and non-toxic. Breathing natural gas is not harmful as long as there is an adequate supply of fresh air to breathe along with it. Natural gas by itself will not burn, but with the proper mixture of gas and air combined with an ignition source, combustion can occur.

An odorant that smells like rotten eggs is added to natural gas so that it can be detected. The odor is a warning that natural gas may be present and, if ignited, could result in personal injury or property damage. If the smell of gas is present inside your home or business (no matter how faint or strong),

Do Not:

- 1. Smoke or strike a match.
- 2. Operate an electric switch or appliance control.
- 3. Pull any plugs from outlets.
- 4. Use a flashlight or lighter.
- 5. Use a telephone or cell phone in the building.

If you SMELL A FAINT ODOR of natural gas INSIDE YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, check to see if any appliances have been left on accidentally or if a pilot light has been extinguished, which would cause the odor (rotten eggs). If the odor persists, TAKE NO CHANCES, get out of the house immediately, and then call us from a nearby phone or neighbor. If a STRONG OR PERSISTENT ODOR OF GAS is present IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, OR IF YOU HEAR A HISSING SOUND of escaping natural gas, follow this procedure:

- 1. Get everyone out of the building immediately.
- 2. Leave the door open.
- 3. Use a neighbor's phone or cellular phone outside the building to call us.

4. If you SMELL OR DETECT NATURAL GAS OUTSIDE, call us. Leaks from natural gas pipelines are extremely rare, however it is important that you know how to recognize the signs of a leak if one were to occur in your area. A strong odor, hissing sound, or dirt blowing up from a hole are signs of a leak. Move away from and upwind of the suspected leak before calling us. Do not light matches, smoke, use a cell phone or attempt to start any motor vehicles in the area of a possible gas leak.

Call Before You Dig

Whether you are building a home, installing a sprinkler system, or just planting a tree, we want you to be safe. No matter the size of the project, before you dig, grade, or excavate, the law requires you to call for all underground utilities to be located. Didn't Know? Inconceivable.

Dear Editor:

Recently one or your letter writers stated that the Messiah's name is "Yeshua." word frequently appears on the internet as a descriptive term. It's not terribly out of line; it means, "He Will Save" in Hebrew). However, it's not the correct pronunciation of the Messiah's name, nor does it convey the correct

meaning.

The Hebrew word we say as "Yeshua," was, in its original, UNPOINTED form, a late, abbreviated spelling of the name, "Yahsua." In our King James Bible, it appears in the later books of Ezra, Nehemiah and Chronicles, usually Anglicized "Jeshua." However, However, the Hebrew scholar Wilhelm Gesenius, in his Hebrew-Chaldee Lexicon, informs us

southern that "Yeshua" or "Jeshua" is "a contracted form" ne talking of "Joshua." Hasting's Hasting's Dictionary of the Bible, under the heading "Jeshua," also says the word is "Another form of Joshua." "Joshua" is nothing but the Anglicized form of the Hebrew name "Yahshua," which means "Yah (is) Salvation." Any educated pastor can tell you that.

and Nehemiah Ezra were using a shortened, unpointed spelling for the name "Yahshua."
They were both dedicated the Old Law worshippers of Yahweh. The Tetragrammaton appears at least thirty-seven times in the Hebrew text of Ezra, and at least sixteen times in Nehemiah. That's not counting the times in which the shortened form "Yah" is incorporated into other proper names within the text. In fact, Nehemiah's own name ends in the abbreviated form, "Yah." "Nehemiah"

COFFEE HIGH SCHOOL

Coffee High School opened at this site in the fall of 1917. Camilla Coffee donated the land in honor of her late husband, Capt. Alexander D. Coffee, son of Gen. John Coffee, a Founding Father of Florence. Because of her generosity, the school was named Coffee. Built at a cost of \$95,000, it had 18 rooms, an auditorium and a courtyard. The school served grades 8 through 11. Thirteen students graduated in 1918. It received accreditation as a secondary school in 1920. A red two-room frame structure was moved from Petton School to this site in 1921. loved from Patton School to this site in 1921 for added classrooms and, later, as the band room.

HISTORICAL MARKER LOCATION:

399 Hermitage Dr., Florence

For the Centennial of this "original" Coffee High School, the proud alumni of the class of 1950 erected this marker on June 10, 2017. In 1951, a larger Coffee High was created several blocks to the northeast and the original Coffee High was renamed Appleby School. Then Appleby burned in 1984 and was leveled the next year. With N. AL Medical Center replacing ECM Hospital in December, it seems the historical Coffee name is slowly disappearing in Florence.

Soon after, the Rieffs cared for a woman's cat while she was staying at Safeplace. Rieff said returning the cat to its owner felt like losing a family member, but they wanted to continue fostering other families' pets. Since then, they've cared for many cats and dogs in their home.

For those who are trapped in an abusive home, the option to have their pets fostered by Safeplace volunteers could mean the difference between leaving and

staying.





because their lives are threatened--the family needs to take their pets because they are part of the family," Rieff said.

"If the pets are left behind, the abuser could kill the pet and often does to punish the partner who left.

"In some cases, the abuser may have already killed a family pet; this has happened in community. Others may have threatened to harm or kill a pet if the partner leaves.

Many times, individuals and families who need to leave abusive situations won't leave unless there's a way to help their pets, too.

"Surrendering the pets to an animal shelter isn't an option," Rieff said. "And leaving the animal behind means the pet will most likely be killed, abused, or neglected."
"We don't have a pet-

friendly facility right now," said Leah Heathcoat, Transitional Housing Manager and Volunteer Coordinator for Safeplace.

"Pets are like your children," Heathcoat said.

The idea of separating from pets adds to the trauma of transitioning out of an abusive home, she said.

Making the transition from an abusive home into freedom and safety is a difficult one, and Rieff savs these families need their

According to Rieff, while some Safeplace foster pets are healthy, most have medical needs. These are perhaps due to the abusive dynamics in the homes they're escaping.

"The pets may need medical care like current vaccinations, complete physical exams, specific treatments for health issues, overdue medications, neutering, etc.," Rieff said.

The Rieffs care for their foster pets as if they were their own. Each pet requires medical attention before entering foster care. That care is extended as needed for the duration of their stay in each foster home.

Many local vets provide discounts for Safeplace foster pets' care, but expenses can still take a toll. "To love somebody's fur

baby for months is no small request," Heathcoat said.

The Rieffs take in pets for varied amounts of time, depending on how long it takes each pet's family to get settled after their transition. Sometimes families are resettled with friends or extended family within a matter of days or weeks. Other times, it could be months before the family has completed its transition.

"There are financial concerns, employment issues, and housing arrangements to resolve, he says. "The pets are reunited with the owners when the owners are settled and moving ahead with their lives.'

According to Rieff,

reuniting pets with their families is a critical goal for the families. "Imagine the emotions involved in being separated from your pets," he said.

"One part is the emotional comfort of knowing your pets are cared for and loved as you start over with your life. The other part is the motivation of wanting the pets to rejoin your family as soon as you can get settled."

Rieff has been keenly aware of the problem of domestic abuse since he was young.

"As a young child, I recall my parents helping a woman in our rural Texas community who was trapped in an abusive

relationship," he said.
"Later, my mother volunteered at a woman's shelter and served on the governing board; my father was very supportive of her work. So I grew up in a family that was involved in community service like this."

addition volunteering for Safeplace, the Rieff family is involved in other projects around the Shoals community. Rieff volunteers with the Shoals Community Soup Kitchen and works as a team leader for Edgemont Church, where he helps host community meals once a month.

Rieff said Safeplace has a critical need for more foster pet parents in the Shoals who can take a pet on short notice. While the organization is able to help many families, there are sometimes cases when a temporary home isn't available. According to Rieff, situations like this are 'deeply troubling.'

"I wish that volunteers would understand that serving as a foster for pets could make a difference in the number of individual and families that escape abusive and dangerous situations.

"This is about not about just helping pets; it is also about helping to rescue lives and protect children."

Medicare Minute

"Signing up for Medicare Part 1"

The most common way to qualify for Medicare is when you are turning 65. You will have a specific time period, set by Medicare, to enroll in Part A and Part B Medicare. This is known as the Initial Enrollment Period (IEP).

If you are qualifying for Medicare by turning 65 you will have a 7 month window to enroll in Medicare. This window is based off of the month you turn 65. It starts 3 months prior to the month you turn 65 and extends 3 months past the month you turn 65. For example, if you are turning 65 in September your IEP begins in June and extends all the way through the month of December. If you are eligible, you may not have to pay a premium for Part A, but Part B will have a premium.

For those electing to sign up for Part B after their IEP a late-enrollment penalty may be assessed. This penalty can last as long as you have Part B and there may be a gap in your health coverage. However, one exception to this rule is being employed and having coverage through your company's group health plan. If this applies to you check with your benefit coordinator, Medicare or contact our office.

In most cases, if you are already drawing your Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board benefits you should automatically be signed up for Part A and Part B. If you are not drawing your Social Security or RRB benefits and want to sign up for Medicare you can do so by signing up online at ssa.gov, visit your local Social Security office or give our office a call and we can help direct you.





What's the Difference Between Alzheimer's and Dementia?

Dear Savvy Senior.

What's the difference between Alzheimer's disease and dementia? My aunt has dementia, but they don't know if she has Alzheimer's disease, which is very confusing

Trying To Understand

Dear Trying,

Many people use the words "Alzheimer's disease" and "dementia" interchangeably, but they are not the same thing. In fact, you can have a form of dementia that is completely unrelated to Alzheimer's disease. Here's what you should know.

Dementia versus Alzheimer's

Dementia is a general term for a set of symptoms that includes memory loss, impaired communication skills, a decline in reasoning and changes in behavior. It most commonly strikes elderly people and used to be referred to as senility.

Alzheimer's disease is a specific illness that is the most common cause of dementia. Though many diseases can cause dementia, Alzheimer's - which affects 5.7 million Americans today – accounts for 60 percent to 80 percent of dementia cases, which is why you often hear the terms used interchangeably.

But there are many other conditions that can cause symptoms of dementia like vascular dementia, which is the second most common cause, accounting for about 10 percent of dementia cases. Vascular dementia is caused by a stroke or poor blood flow to the brain.

Other degenerative disorders that can cause dementia include Lewy body dementia, Parkinson's disease, Frontotemporal dementia, Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease, Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy (CTE), Huntington's disease and Korsakoff Syndrome. Some patients may also have more than one form of dementia known as mixed dementia.

Dementia is caused by damage to brain cells, but the symptoms can vary depending on the cause. In the case of Alzheimer's disease, protein fragments or plaques that accumulate in the space between nerve cells and twisted tangles of another protein that build up inside cells cause the damage.

In Alzheimer's disease, dementia gets progressively worse to the point where patients cannot carry out daily activities and cannot speak, respond to their environment, swallow or walk. Although some treatments may temporarily ease symptoms, the downward progression of disease continues and it is

But some forms of dementia are reversible, which is why it's important to be evaluated by a physician early on. Vitamin deficiencies, thyroid problems, brain tumors, depression, excessive alcohol use, medication side effects and certain infectious diseases can cause reversible forms of dementia.

Another treatable form of dementia is a condition known as normal pressure hydrocephalus, which is caused by a buildup of cerebrospinal fluid in the brain that can be relieved by surgically implanting a shunt to drain off excess fluid. This type of dementia is often preceded or accompanied by difficulty walking and incontinence.
