FLORENCE – Officials with the University of North Alabama broke ground on the site of the new Laura M. Harrison Hall. The hall will house the Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions upon completion.

The UNA Board of Trustees met for a special session last week to approve the bid for the new building of just under \$19 million by Consolidated Construction out of Huntsville. Local firm Create Architects will serve as the architects for the project.

UNA vice president for Student Affairs and provost, Dr. Ross Alexander, said, "This important project took a little longer than anticipated to launch," said Alexander. "But it's the exact building we need to facilitate growth, support students, and maintain the tradition of excellence in the Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions. It will also be a picturesque addition to our beautiful campus."

The proposed completion date for the 55, 729 square foot building is Dec. 26, 2019.



TUPELO – Drivers beware. Rangers will now be using unmarked vehicles to patrol the Natchez Trace Parkway. A six-month pilot program showed a dramatic increase in the number of traffic stops for distracted and aggressive driving. This prompted the decision to order additional unmarked units. The order includes both typical and non-typical law enforcement vehicles such as SUVs and pickup trucks. "They will not all be



Medicare Minute "Medicare Part A Part 1"

On a Medicare card Part A will have the word "Hospital" beside it. Because of that Medicare Part A is most commonly known as the inpatient or hospitalization part of Medicare. This means when a Medicare beneficiary is admitted into the hospital most of the services that are received are filed under Medicare Part A. This sounds simple but sometimes it's not.

Medicare Part A has a deductible of \$1,340 per benefit period. Notice two things here. First is the deductible of \$1,340. If you are admitted into the hospital and had Original Medicare only, you would owe the first \$1,340 of your stay. This deductible covers hospital services, including semi-private rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and

supplies.

The second thing to notice is the term "benefit period". This tells you the deductible is not an annual deductible but could hit you more than once in a calendar year. A "benefit period" begins when you are discharged from a hospital or skilled nursing facility and ends when you haven't received any inpatient care for 60 consecutive days. If you are admitted as an inpatient after the 60 days of no inpatient care a new benefit period begins, meaning another \$1,340 deductible. Also if you are confined to the hospital for 60 consecutive days your deductible will cover you but on the 61st day you will begin paying a coinsurance.

The good news is for most Medicare beneficiaries Part A is free. Free meaning you don't pay a premium for it. The reason for this is while you are working you pay 1.45% of your pay check into Medicare. If you did that for 40 quarters you're entitled to Part A for free. Next week will discuss the other benefits of Medicare Part A.





CAR WRECKS

As most of you know, Joel and I primarily handle car wreck cases. We only handle accidents with injury and we do see a lot of them. Most of them have common issues.

A type of wreck that we see with more frequency than we should are courtesy wrecks. A courtesy wreck occurs when one motorist allows another motorist through a line of traffic as a courtesy and a wreck occurs as a result. Sometimes these wrecks occur when another motorist signals by hand gesture that the roadway is clear. The courts of our State have held that a motorist's hand signal to another motorist to proceed does not absolve the signaled motorist of their duty

under Alabama law to ensure that it is safe to travel across an intersection and to yield to oncoming traffic.

Secondly, we see rear-end collisions. Everybody knows or thinks that they know that if a driver hits someone from the rear, it is automatically their fault. I don't think that is true. I think there are circumstances where someone who makes a very abrupt stop unexpectedly could cause an accident. The person who got hit would not have caused it but they may have contributed to it and in Alabama that is enough to lose. Nonetheless, the law is the driver of a vehicle shall leave a distance of at least 20 feet for each 10 miles per hour of speed between the vehicle that he is driving and the vehicle they are following. The interesting point about this particular rule is that if it is broken and a collision results, the law finds negligence as a matter of law. I want each of you to do me a favor and please leave enough distance between the front of your car and the rear of the car in front of you to see the rear tires of the car in front of you. We see people all the time who get hit from the rear and then are slammed into the car in front of them. This secondary blow often causes significant injury.

Third, we see yield sign wrecks where drivers are in a lane that is controlled by a yield sign. The driver's attention is divided between the car in front of them and the traffic they are merging in to. Very frequently the car in front starts to go and then stops. The driver behind them thinks they have gone and it looks clear to merge and they drive right into the back of the car in front of them. This happens all the time where Savannah Highway merges into Mitchell Blvd. to cross O'Neal Bridge. I have had at least half a dozen cases from that one intersection.







the emergency lighting is activated. "These vehicles will have multiple flashing red and blue lights, headlights and grill lights," said District Ranger and vehicle coordinator John Hearne. "It will look like a police Christmas tree when

they light up."
Since the Parkway
travels through three states, law enforcement ranger vehicles use both red and blue lights instead of just blue lights. Rangers use both colors because red lights are easier to see in the daylight and blue at night. Safety is the number one priority on the parkway and the multi colored lights make it safer for both the Ranger and drivers.

Check for WIC Eligibility

MONTGOMERY-Alabama families may qualify for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children, better known as WIC. If you are a woman who is pregnant, who had a baby within the past six months, who is breastfeeding, or who is the parent or guardian of a child up to age five, you are encouraged to apply for WIC at your local county health department or WIC agency.

Participants in the program receive free nutrition education and breastfeeding peer counseling support. In addition, participants have the option to receive up to three months of food benefits at a time for each qualified family member. Food benefits are redeemable at WIC-authorized stores throughout Alabama.

Under the 2018 federal poverty guidelines, more families may be eligible for the program. WIC is open to participants with incomes up to 185% of the federal poverty level. Check the table below to see whether your family qualifies:

WIC participants must have both a limited income and a nutritional need. Families who receive Medicaid, SNAP or Family Assistance already meet the income qualifications for WIC. Families who do not qualify for those programs may be eligible for WIC because of its higher income limits.

Decisions, Decisions: guidelines for what to do when someone has a serious or chronic illness.

The following is a <u>brief</u> summary of questions and principles which may be helpful for families facing a serious, life-limiting, or chronic illness. Discussing these within one's family <u>before</u> a crisis occurs can prevent suffering, allowing for more peace and comfort as we age.

Dr. Robert Webb

- * Do you want to actually 'live' -- or just 'be kept alive'? In other words, how do you want to die: 'with your boots on', doing something you enjoy; or, confined to a bed with others wiping your bottom? It's the 'quality' vs 'quantity' dilemma!
- * Are pills a burden? [most seniors say 'yes'; the evidence confirms, we live better on fewer pills]
- * First, do no harm. Always relieve suffering. [the primary goals of medicine].
- * Treatments can cause suffering! [doctors are under pressure to use the newest technology and drugs—resulting in unintended side effects!]
- * Acceptance [of a condition that can't be fixed] can lead to serenity. [as in the Serenity Prayer].
- * Should having Dementia influence decisions about other problems? Since dementia is terminal, we often prolong patient and family suffering by treating other terminal medical problems! Left untreated, that other problem could cause an earlier death, thereby allowing a patient to escape [what many families have described as] a 'fate worse than death'—the progression to end-stage dementia. [More families therefore are choosing to stop all non-comfort treatments before the end-stage develops.]
- * Do seniors with a LLD [Life Limiting Disease—one eventually causing death] take treatments just because their kids want it? [and thereby suffer longer?]

And, for family having difficulty 'letting go' when a patient has severe dementia:

If your loved one could tell you what to do, what would they say? If it was you in bed, what would YOU want?

Reset Button

Several years ago we decided to go the satellite route for our television signal feed. We have been reasonably happy with it, although there are many occasions when I think we would be better off without TV at all. But then I remember how much I like college football and... excuse me, I digress.

Not long after we had the system installed I discovered that satellite signals and thunderstorms do not get along very well. So, one of the first storms that came along created a peculiar situation that I was

unsure how to remedy. The picture was stuck on one frame as if you had put the program on pause. Yet, the sound track continued on in real time. So, we could hear a show, but could only stare at a still picture- - which was not good.

When I came to the conclusion that it would not correct itself, I was getting ready to call customer service. Then I remembered a piece of advice the installer had offered. He pointed to a "reset" button on the front of the receiver and noted that most problems that arise could be fixed by pushing that button. Hence, I gave it a try and within a couple of minutes we were back in business again.

Thinking back on that experience I am reminded of how it often parallels our lives. The storms of life can sometimes disrupt our service for the Lord. And somewhat like my TV experience, we can talk in "real time" without a glitch about what we need or ought to do, but our "action mode" is on pause. So many people I talk with say "We are ready to get back in church where we know we belong" or "We are ready to turn over a new leaf in our walk with the Lord." But somehow they cannot seem to get those words translated into achievement-which is not good.

Therefore, rather than waiting for the problem to correct itself, we need to be searching for our "reset button" that corrects our life so that it matches our words. But don't just locate it; follow through by using it immediately! The Bible never encourages procrastination, but it does encourage prompt action. Note Paul's emphasis on this matter, "Behold now is the accepted time; behold, today is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

Thankfully we serve the "God of a second chance." He graciously allows us to repent, reset and start again (cf. 2 Peter 3:9).

thens-Clarke County Georgia police arrested a man on July 20 who was being charged with aggravated assault by strangulation and false imprisonment.

surrounding the arrest were posted on social media for no other reason than to stoke racial tensions. The person recording the situation initially said it was his "seven year-old unarmed cousin." Some accounts later changed that to nine years old. The boy is actually ten, but that just helps prove the point.

Shared social media had an abbreviated version showing police forcefully restraining the kid. *The Atlanta Journa*l Constitution posted a similar 1:34 version on its website.

The Root describes itself as a digital magazine that provides thoughtprovoking commentary and news from a variety of black perspectives. Actually, it's from a variety of *liberal* black perspectives. It posted a spliced 1:33 video on it's website with the description, "Athens-Clarke County Police slammed an unarmed, shirtless 10-year-old boy to the ground after the distraught child witnessed his father being arrested."

Each variation was selectively posted/edited to imply that racial issues were at the heart of the treatment that the kid received by police officers. It is also interesting that we so often







make a big deal that a person is "unarmed" when he or she is accosting, assaulting, or interfering with police.

The complete situation is portrayed more accurately on the full 5:18 video www.youtube.com/ watch?v=fxDtm0RdTPU

The bodycam footage from one of the police officers clearly shows that the boy was a liability from the ten second mark of the video forward. It's amazing that no one on either side was hurt.

However, in the minds of social media advocates, facts are not nearly as

important as impact. And by the time facts of a full vídeo make it out, impact has already formed many opinions.

The most irresponsible people in this video are the mindless adult onlookers.

Despite the fact that several adults were at the scene, some of them apparently relatives of the boy, no one attempted to intervene. Even though the child was being traumatized by the arrest of his father, neither the father nor any of the other adult relatives at the scene could control the child's behavior. The father was actually yelling "leave him alone," which further confused the boy. No one had the foresight to see that the child needed to be COMPLETELY removed from the situation. No, they all wanted to watch the arrest and weigh in with their opinions.

After several minutes of agitation and nothing more than passing verbal directives to the child from relatives at the scene to stop and get back, the child is seen passing through the frame at eye level to the camera. It appears that the momentum of the child launching himself into the officer took both onto the hood of the police car.

Two officers restrained

the boy on the ground. They made sure the boy was calm before allowing him off the ground and letting him say goodbye to his father in the police vehicle.

Worse, several of adults also made what could be considered aggressive moves toward the police officers while the child was being restrained. The situation was tenuous until elevated police voices to GET BACK were taken seriously.

It is amazing how a simple arrest warrant turned chaotic at no fault of the police, yet they are the ones being judged on social media, and having their actions scrutinized by law enforcement review boards.

Sure, there have been a handful of inexcusable injustices that give all men and women in uniform a black eye. However, there are several additional points of importance.

Edited Facebook posts that inevitably go viral all for the sake of sensationalizing a situation are NEVER in favor of law enforcement.

The blatant lack of discipline and social skills exhibited by this child are microcosm of trending

societal failings that have led directly to many tragic outcomes.

This pack mentality by adult onlookers resembles the start of a wildlife feeding frenzy. That mindset benefits no one and is going to get more people needlessly killed.

We have to remember that officers in our communities represent all races and backgrounds, and they are there to help keep everyone safe.

We HAVE TO get past this mindset of divisiveness and condemn those who help proliferate it.





ON YOUR DEBT

What are Estimated Tax Payments, Who Needs to Make them and When are They Due

Taxes must be paid as you earn or receive income during the year. Chances are if you receive a regular paycheck (either weekly, bi-weekly, semi-monthly or monthly) from an employer your taxes are being withheld from that check. You need to make sure the amount being deducted is correct so you don't owe taxes at the end of the year. Check out my previous blog entitled Please Review Your Pay Check Withholdings Yearly to Avoid Tax Debt.

Estimated tax payments are direct payments to the IRS by the Taxpayer for those who do not have income tax withheld from their salary and/or paycheck. Some examples are rental income, 401-K withdrawals, interest, dividends, alimony, self-employment income, capital gains, prizes awards and retirees that receive a pension or retirement other than social security income where either no taxes or not enough are withheld. If you are in business for yourself, you generally need to make estimated tax payments. If you receive any of this type of income or fall into any of the above listed categories, you may have to make estimated tax payments. Estimated tax is used to pay not only income tax, but other taxes such as self-employment tax and alternative minimum tax.

Estimated tax payments are typically made quarterly as follows:

- January 1st March 31st is due April 15th
- April 1st May 31st is due June 15th
- June 1st August 31st is due September 15h
- September 1st December 31st is due January 15th of the following year.

If you don't pay enough tax through withholding and/or estimated tax payments, you may be charged a penalty. You also may be charged a penalty if your estimated tax payments are late, even if you are due a refund when you file your tax return. Generally, most taxpayers will avoid this penalty if they either owe less than \$1,000 in tax after subtracting their withholding and refundable credits, or if they paid withholding and estimated tax of at least 90% of the actual tax for the current year or 100% of the tax shown on their previous year return. Exceptions to the penalty and special rules apply to some groups of taxpayers, such as farmers, fishermen, casualty and disaster victims, those who recently became disabled, recent retirees, and those who receive income unevenly during the year. In addition, there is an exception to the penalty for those who base their payments of estimated tax on last year's tax. The IRS would be remiss if they did not have a form to help you and of course they do in Form 2210.

The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, enacted in December 2017, changed the way tax is calculated for most taxpayers so it is important to make sure your taxes are being withheld correctly and/or your estimated tax payments are sufficient. Among other reforms, the new law changed the tax rates and brackets, revised business expense deductions, increased the standard deduction, removed personal exemptions, increased the child tax credit and limited or discontinued certain deductions. As a result, many taxpayers may need to raise or lower the amount of tax they pay each quarter.

TRADING **SOMETHING**

When you think of "trading something in" on a new purchase, you usually think of buying a car, but did you realize you can also trade for

You can. How does the trade work? Let's say Mr. and Mrs. Jones have a home on Poplar Street listed for \$299,000 that they want to sell. Along comes Mr. Smith who wants to buy the home on Poplar Street, but to qualify for a mortgage he has to first sell his home on Oak Street, which is listed for \$150,000. Mr. and Mrs. Jones might be willing to buy Mr. Smith's home on Oak St, freeing him to buy the home on Poplar St? It may sound complex at first, but it really is quite simple. Simply put, they trade

Like everything else in the world, there are many variables to this equation. For example, if the house on Oak Street is exactly what Mr. and Mrs. Jones are looking for, they are more likely to pay market value for the home as they are obviously going to live there. But let's say they have no desire whatsoever to live in the Oak St home and are planning to immediately put it back on the market? In this case they will only be able to pay 80-85% of market value for the home, in order to avoid losing money when they sell it.

There are Pros and Cons for both parties involved with a trade. For example, the seller of the larger home might be trading higher debt for lower debt. Maybe homes in the \$150's sell faster than homes in the high \$200's. Mr. Smith may have enough equity in his home on Oak St that he can afford to sell it for 80-85% of appraised market value and move up to the home on Poplar St.

A trade is a creative tool to move real estate. Is it always a solution? That would depend on the situation. If you're looking for a larger home, but need to sell yours in order to buy, see if the seller of the home you want might be willing to trade. It could be a win - win situation for both of you. Especially if they are looking for a home like yours. -mr



Alabama Department of Agriculture & Industries Commissioner John McMillan has announced that three horses have tested positive for Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) by the department's diagnostic laboratory in Auburn

The positive results came from horses in Houston, Mobile and Geneva Counties. EEE is a mosquito-transmitted disease that is more severe than West Nile Virus

that is more severe than West Nile Virus (WNV). The mortality rate in horses from WNV is reported at around 30%, while the rate for EEE is almost 90%.

These viruses cause inflammation or

I hese viruses cause inflammation or swelling of the brain and spinal cord. General symptoms include central nervous system signs such as head pressing, convulsions, lack of response to facial stimulation, fever above 103 degrees, ataxia, paralysis, anorexia, depression and stupor. Other symptoms may include irregular gait, teeth grinding, circling, and staggering. An infected horse may not exhibit all symptoms.

McMillan and State Veterinarian Dr. Tony Frazier recommend vaccinating your horses every six months against both EEE and WNV. Horse owners are encouraged to contact their local veterinarian to schedule a vaccination for their horses. The public is also advised to make every effort to reduce human exposure to mosquitoes during this time of year.



Why do you think all debt is bad? Åren't some kinds of debt, good?

Dear Nathan,

It sounds like you're letting me know you think some kinds of debt are okay, instead of really asking for my opinion. When you ask a question that's really a statement, it's called a passive aggressive question. That's okay. You and I will now argue as best we can in a newspaper column.

It's not necessarily a really just the aggregator information we've gathered while walking with people through their financial issues. I've worked with tens of thousands of folks over nearly 30 years, everyone from billionaires and millionaires to broke and those in people, between. In the process, we've collected a lot of data through formal research projects — I'm talking about a huge stockpile of statistics, facts, and figures. And all that data shows debt is the biggest roadblock between people and wealth. I'm also a Christian. Having read the bible, and what it says about money, I can tell you there's not one place where it says

debt is a good idea. So, all that information leads me to one conclusion. Debt is not a positive thing. The only kind of debt I don't beat people up over is mortgage debt, as long as it's a 15-year, fixed rate loan. Houses are wildly expensive, and I understand that most people can't save up to buy a home with cash in a reasonable amount of time. Still, that doesn't make mortgage debt a good thing.

Any kind of debt is a burden, Nathan. It steals from your ability to save, build wealth, and be generous.




If it would take longer than 18 months to pay it off, I'd get rid of the car. To do this, you'd have to sell it for as much as you can get, then go to a local credit union for a small loan to cover the difference. If it's your only car, you'd need to ask for an extra \$2,000 to \$3,000 to buy a little beater to drive until you can save up and get into something better.

I hate all kinds of debt, Monty. But being \$5,000 to \$6,000 in the hole is a lot better than having \$18,000 in debt hanging over your head!
