Sharing our Journeys

Brevity a requisite

Having been a university professor for many years and giving three onehour lectures per week, brevity has become a requisite for any writing job or public speech. Even in one hour it's hard to break down the complexities of such topics as "Britain & the Concept of European Union" (my graduate thesis). Equally complicated are the history and current turmoil of the entire Middle-East geographic area.

I've noticed lately that both the Milwaukee Journal and the Wall Street Journal now seem to have lengthy, indepth feature articles that cover perhaps a lot more than the average reader can even absorb.

In contrast to this kind of detailed reality, however, there seems to be an opposing movement to reduce everything to broad, general, mini-paragraph reporting which explains little and provides only sketchy details if any at all. I've noticed this also on TV News casts, they rapid fire through a killing, a crash, or an international crisis so quickly that the announcer's over-the-speed-limit "report" leaves the listener with a "What did he just say?" query.

However, I will admit that brevity is not entirely a new phenomenon. Consider the greeting card—it's a real art for a writer to synthesize into a few words expressions of happiness for a birthday, comforting thoughts of sorrow for an

illness or death on a sympathy card, or happy jubilation or celebrations on a wedding card.

Come to think of it, I've never seen a divorce card. How about a "Whew, you finally got rid of the bum" or just a "Happy Divorce Day?" At least one of the married couples may feel that way. Without being too cynical, I think greeting card companies should explore this since a good majority of marriages end up in divorce. But that's a whole, new, different additional subject.

Another artful form of brevity are bumper stickers. A summarized political philosophy or the brief expression of one's political leanings can be reduced to a few words for the whole world to know. Of course, bumper stickers aren't limited to political messages, "Drive carefully, Kids On Board," etc., etc. are examples of some safety oriented messages that may just serve as useful political reminders.

In summary, and trying to be explanatory but still brief. Use short phrases to describe details. Give a few details if you need to, but keep them short. Be brief if the situation warrants it, but allow space to expand with a few details when necessary. Does it sound a little contradictory? Maybe this is a better way to express it. Explain just enough to make your major point; but not so much as to be boring.

Small towns have huge hearts

New Elkhart Lake apparel business takes off on Small Town Big Family

The love of community has inspired the creation of a new lifestyle clothing brand company, based in Elkhart Lake.

Beyond apparel, the vision of Small Town Big Family extends to promoting the kind of support, love and neighborliness that can be found in towns like Elkhart Lake, and other colloquial corners of the country. These are communities where the community's heart greatly exceeds the limitations of its demographics.

The Small Town Big Family vision resulted from the outpouring of community support for founder Jon Prigge's family during a pair of recent family tragedies.

Co-owner Jon Prigge said he experienced an incredible sense of what small towns like Elkhart Lake are like through the support for his sister's battle with ALS, and his family's loss of a nephew through a tragic accident.

"We saw the outpouring of support, the banding of community together to help keep a family in town, and keep kids in their school system. I was just overtaken by this sense of expanded family. Coming from Sheboygan, I had never experienced this in the past," Prigge said.

Prigge said it's the kind of feeling that is noticed by others who visit and vacation in Elkhart Lake. "Even though they don't live here, they keep coming back for this magical feeling that comes from people helping people."

The Small Town Big Family theme has caught on with customers as far away as Colorado and California.

A commitment to giving back

Returning the support and love of community, the Small Town Big Family label bears a strong commitment to giving back to others.

"We are a for-profit company, but if you look at our website we are strongly into supporting various fundraisers and charities," Prigge noted. Special Hope Hat orders placed on line generate a donation to ALS research.

Customers are also able to create Small Town Big Family designs for their own events and fundraisers.

In the community Small Town Big Family has worked with Keep Elkhart Blue, not only providing them with product, but helping support the fundraising effort. "We are a tourist town, and we all depend on the lake. We all benefit from the tour-

ism, but this is a chance to give back to our biggest resource, our beautiful lake."

A company without a brick and mortar footprint, Small Town Big Family has shown its physical presence at the Elkhart Lake Farmers and Artisans Market the past two summers.

"People were coming to the farmer's market and seeking us out because of our social media presence," he said. "We have also received a lot of support from Melissa at the Chamber and from the Depot Dispatch."

This year Small Town Big Family is looking forward to being a prominent vendor at the annual Elkhart Lake Downtown Night, set for August 13.

Growth curve

Originally, the company starated with four hat designs. They have expanded to more than 30 logos, all available at their online store—www.smalltownbigfamily. com.

"We always have giveways and special promotions going on at our online site," Prigge said. Deals might include a percent off on products, free shipping or other special offers.

A small inventory of the product can be found at specialized local outlines, including Gina's in Elkhart Lake, the Tiki Bar Resort in Dundee, Yoga on the Lake in Kohler, and EOS Surf Shop in Sheboygan.

Small Town Big Family works hard to shape its own designs. Co-owner Jenn Liermann handles most of the creative work. Prigge assists with photographic contributions. Together they pair the company's motto with designs from the locale they promote on their apparel—hats, shirts, sweatshirts, beach blankets, croakies, and the like.

Small Town Big Family will co-brand its slogan for any community or group that wants to promote the "community/family" cause.


Eventually, Prigge said, his company would love to be able to grown and create jobs for other people, and maybe even a brick and mortar location for the business.

Friends of Marsh share info on building

the Friends of the Marsh members who will be on hand at Downtown Night on Aug. 13 to greet everyone and tell you more about the exciting things planned for the Marsh Park. Do stop in and say

Members of the Friends of the Marsh board of directors regularly field questions regarding everything and anything having to do with the Sheboygan Marsh Park and what happens out there, so we decided to tell you a little more about the Friends of the Marsh as well as our purpose and goals.

The Friends of the Broughton Sheboygan Marsh, Inc. was formed as a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation many years ago when a group of conservation minded, nature-loving individuals came together with the initial goal of building an observation tower. Our "purpose" stated in our bylaws is "to promote the increased use and appreciation of the unique beauty of the Broughton Sheboygan Marsh through education and recreation."

We're celebrating 10 years of having successfully built the tallest wooden observation tower in the state of Wisconsin. Eight years ago, after turning the tower over to Sheboygan County to maintain into perpetuity for generations to enjoy, the group of 12 volunteers asked ourselves 'what next'?

A lot of brainstorming went into the planning of a multi-purpose building, focused primarily on educational purposes, which also could be used for meetings and gatherings.

Given the permanency of the structure we envisioned, it made sense to multipurpose it to include better shower and plumbing facilities at the park, and to provide some shelter for campers during inclement weather.

Although donors will contribute fixtures and needed materials to build the structure, Sheboygan County has budgeted to pay for needed site preparation and the additional infrastructure necessary for that portion of the structure to serve the needs of campers.

As with the tower, upon completion the Friends will turn ownership of the building over to Sheboygan County, with the understanding that it will be maintained

Ken Pipping and Keith Abler are two of into perpetuity. Unlike the tower, we will need to collect the majority of the funds needed to construct this building before we can break ground, given the greater expense as well as the cost efficiency of building and finishing the structure on a timely basis.

> The Friends have been reaching out to businesses and individuals who will benefit from this facility for some time now, and have accumulated about 60 percent of funds needed. Recognition and naming rights will be awarded to our donors.

Survivor feels fortunate to be alive

Stecker reflects on a long road back to health

When Laurie Stecker woke up the morning of January 2, she started her morning journal with a resolution for the New Year.

"It's 2018. I've got a lot on my plate, but I can handle anything," wrote the co-owner of Siebkens Resort.

Little did she realize how prophetic those words would prove to be.

Later that morning, as she took part in her barre yoga class, she was stricken by extreme pain emanating from the top of her head. "It started at the top of my head and it came down the sides, just like pulling a cap down," Stecker said.

Worse than any migraine, the pain sent an alert that something was seriously wrong. It was actually 911 serious.

Though she didn't realize it at the time, Stecker was experiencing the early stages of a brain aneurism—one that had ruptured and was growing more life-threatening by the minute.

Whisked away

As Stecker moved toward the front desk of her fitness center, she couldn't turn her neck. Her trainer, Kristy Haase suggested they call Laurie's husband, Brian, and she told him, "I feel like I am going to die."

These scary words, too, almost proved to be true.

With the help of emergency respondents, she was taken to Memorial Hospital, where good fortune aided her cause. The emergency room doctor recognized her symptoms and called for a brain scan, which accurately diagnosed the problem.

She remembers Brian telling her that she had a bleed on her brain, and that the bird was in the air.

That bird was the Flight for Life Helicopter which carried her to the neuro-ICU at St. Luke's in Milwaukee, where Stecker was destined for some extreme emergency medical procedures. The noise of the helicopter and the comforting words of a paramedic were the last things Laurie remembered hearing.

Once she arrived at St. Luke's, the neurosurgery staff was called to relieve pressure caused by the bleeding, and attempt to stop the bleeding aneursim. The aneurism was rather large and wrapped around other brian tissue.

Eventually, a full crainiotomy was needed to complete the life-saving operation.

Brian recalls that midway through the procedure, there were doubts that Laurie would survive the operation.

"There were four neurosurgeons working on me, and they were wrong. They did save me," she said.

Very lucky to be alive

Stecker counts herself among the luckiest of the lucky to be alive following her life-threatening aneurism.

She remembers waking up from her intensive surgery in a chatty state, asking her doctors if she was going to die.

Once again, truth rang out in Laurie's words. During her recovery period, she later learned that patients who suffer bleeding brain aneurisms have about a 50 percent chance of survival.

Among those who survive, about 2/3 experience significant physical, neurological or speech disabilities.

Laurie's case is among the 15% that experience a near complete recovery from the trauma.

Long stint in ICU

For Stecker, the brain surgery was just the beginning of the healing process.

The restful stages of recovery involved a 21-day mandatory stay in the ICU unit at St. Luke's.

"They kept a pretty good eye on me while I was recovering, and I was extremely lucky," she said. Other procedures were needed to assure that the aneurism was safely contained, including laser procedures.

Later, down the road to recovery, she would need a second surgery to correct a small bubble that was created when the aneurism was clipped. "They also put a stent in one of the vessels in my brain to help improve the blood flow," she added.

"I have to go back in October to have that checked, and hopefully that will be it," Laurie said.

The road to recovery

Surviving the bleeding aneurism was the first step for Laurie in her road to recovery.

After lying in bed for nearly a month, a lot of work lie ahead for regaining her strength and be able to walk and do other things with normalcy.

She was introduced to speech, occupational and physical therapy routines at Memorial Hospital in Sheboygan.

"At first I wasn't happy, because I didn't think I needed it," she said. But, the therapy work was an important part of her recovery, and though unwilling at first, she eventually graduated out of all her therapy sessions.

Speech therapy proved to be one of the most important phases, where she had to learn to practice on her inflections, since her speech patterns had drifted into monotones.

Community support amazing

Laurie, who operates Siebkens Resort along with her sister, Lisa Sadiq, was overwhelmed, yet not surprised by the amazing support offered to her from the Elkhart Lake community.

"The support is unbelievable, even to this day," she said. "Everyone in the community send notes, cards, thoughts and prayers. The outpouring of love is just ridiculous. I just really appreciate every single thoughtful gesture. It has been a big part of helping me through my recovery."

Laurie was also thankful for the work her sister and staff did to keep things flowing at the resort. "Lisa picked up a lot of the work and we have a lot of other key employees who have really pitched in," Laurie noted.

"And Brian has been the most phenomenal caretaker. He has been just amazing through all of this," she said.

Summer milestone

Recovering from a major medical trauma, and especially a bleeding brain aneurism is a major endeavor.

It's far from a straight line path.

"There are setbacks along the way," Laurie said.

"It's easy to suffer from a little depresssion, and you have a lot of antibiotics to

deal with, so you don't always feel normal or think normally."

Yet, for Laurie, one of the keys to recovery were her commitment to physical exercise and workouts. She relied on her athletic background to stay true to her goals and her workouts. She even talked Brian in to getting a new Peleton bike system to help with the recovery workout effort.

And, there was that one goal in the back of her mind.....the Elkhart Lake Triathlon.

An event she had participated in previously, was scheduled almost six months out from the date of her surgery.

"I wanted to be part of that. It was something I wanted to do for myself, to remind me that I was bruised but not broken," Laurie said.

She was joined by a friend, Rick Testwuide, who was recovering from hip surgery. Joined by Brian, a 19-time Iron Man participant, the trio basked in the joy of completing a milestone comeback effort in the triathlon.

"I did all three legs, and just finishing was my reward," she added.

Heightened perspective

Laurie acknowledges that she has emerged from her health ordeal with a new perspective on life.

"It has definitely changed the way I think about a lot of things," she said.

"I have been spending a lot of time on Elkhart Lake on my paddle board, and I am definitely more aware of the beauty of my surroundings, including the sunshine and the weather," Laurie added.

Survival has also softened her concern about the minor things in life.

"A lot less things upset me now," she acknowledged. "There can be a lot of drama when you employ 50 or more people in a business. You learn that you don't have to put so much weight on the minor things. If you don't take things too seriously, life will still work out fine."

For Laurie Stecker, who feels lucky to be a survivor, that means keeping a positive attitude, getting in a workout every day and above all keeping a sense of humor.

"Even at that, I realize how fortunate I am. I am extremely lucky, and I don't ever want to make light of that."

Village eyes sidewalk extension

Gottfried Street Sidewalk Extension

For the past several years the Village has been contemplating extending the sidewalk running North on Gottfried Street (County J) to County Highway JP. Preliminary drawings have been finished and final plans were requested. This sidewalk would be paid for by TIF dollars.

When a final plan is finished, the Village will submit an application to the Wisconsin Historical Society Preservation Office. Permission is needed because the sidewalk is adjacent to the Historic Race Circuit. The Village will be working to get support from the Historic Race Circuit Board of Directors. I will update this next month.

Planning Commission

Premiere Development presented a final plan for an apartment/condo project for the former Braun's Ranch Property. The Village and Premiere are negotiating the final version of the Development Agreement.

Yard Waste Dumpster

The dumpster is open for the season. Hours of operation are Wednesdays 2-6 p.m. and Saturdays 8:30 a.m.-3 p.m.



Yield to Pedestrians

We have had some issues with cars failing to yield the right of way to pedestrians in posted and unposted intersections. With the large numbers of families walking throughout the village, our police will be vigilant in monitoring the crosswalks.

State Statutes call for a stiff fine for not yielding. You will face fines of \$98. The police department will also be monitoring speed limit violations. The speed limit in the village is 25 MPH. Again, with the numbers of tourists and residents walking throughout the village we are taking this very seriously. The ELPD issued a total of 23 citations in 2017 for crosswalk violations.

The State Statute reads:

The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian or personal delivery device, or to a person riding a bicycle or electric personal assistive mobility device in a manner which is consistent with the safe use of the crosswalk by pedestrians, that is crossing the highway within a marked or unmarked crosswalk.

Driving Under the Influence

This summer we seem to have a particularly large volume of DUI citations. Please do not drink and drive. The penalties for a DUI violation become very expensive.



Our goal is for all of our residents and guests have a fun and safe environment in our village.

Open Intoxicants

The Village has regulations regarding the consumption and carrying of open containers. There are only three events that the Village allows drinking on the streets in designated areas. These events are: Fireman's Picnic Parade, Downtown Night, and Vintage weekend. Once the barricades come down for these events the ordinance is in force.

The open intoxicant ordinance states:

No person shall consume or carry in open containers any alcoholic liquor or fermented malt beverages on any street, sidewalk, parkway, municipally owned swimming beach, or railroad property within the corporate limits of the Village. The fine is: \$149.20.


County provides new election equipment for Elkhart Lake


