Dedicated to Thomas Rollins

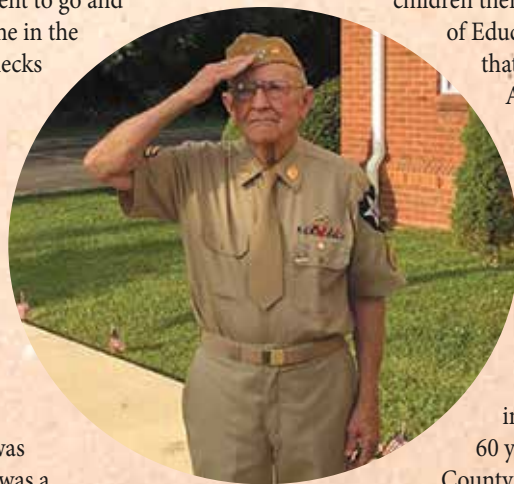
It is an honor and a privilege to dedicate the 2018 Grundy County Fair Book to this amazing man, Grundy County's own, Mr. Thomas Rollins.

Mr. Thomas Rollins service began over 75 years ago as he entered into the military as a very young man right in the middle of WWII. In 1944, he was only 18 years old when he joined the United States Army. His Mother and Father had nine children during the Great Depression. Thomas made it through the fifth grade, then he stayed home to help his family. He helped to provide food for his family by working in the garden by using a mule-pulled plow growing vegetables to feed his family.

At the young age of 18, he received his induction letter and he never hesitated one moment to go and serve his country. During his time in the Army, he sent his monthly paychecks to his mother and family to continue to help put food on the table.

On his very first trip abroad, he took the Queen Elizabeth to France to fight Hitler and his army. That ship was attacked by the Germans. Rollins and the other soldiers were in lock down during the attack. He lay there knowing that he would drown if his area was hit. He describes it this way. "It was a fearful night, knowing there was nowhere to go. It was the worst fear that I have ever experienced." The Queen Elizabeth made it through the attack and this young man served in the 2nd Infantry and the 28th Division. Rollins and his Division were at the Battle of the Bulge in Luxemburg, where they held off the Germans for two days, waiting for General George Patton's Army to arrive. Rollins said that they slept in foxholes, on the street, and just wherever they could find a place to lay down. He said that he didn't sleep in a real bed for a whole year.

Rollins stated that he was honored to serve his Country, and he is still serving his community. This Memorial Day found him placing American Flags on the graves of the 60 Veterans in his hometown cemetery as he has done faithfully for nearly 2 decades. This cemetery adjoins "The Old Place" where Thomas grew up. He has grown a huge garden there for years that family and friends have enjoyed. People know they are welcome to come pick greens there. Recently he picked and delivered them to more than one cancer victim that he knows. His cheerful



visits do good like a medicine! It's a regular routine for him to stop on his way to church and deliver potatoes, meat, and vegetables to someone in need. He and his wife, Ms. Mary, have been married for almost 70 years and have attended and supported the same church all of that time. Thomas has served there as Teacher, Elder, Deacon, and Encourager. Generations of children have sat on his lap and grown up claiming him as THEIR Pa. His profound love of children is an important part of Thomas' life prompting him to donate generously to St. Jude's Research Hospital for 30 years.

He wears his Army Uniform to participate in various Patriotic Events and to many schools. He speaks to the children there about History and the value of Education. He always reminds them that they are the future leaders of America.

When he served as Scout Master, he led many hikes through the forests of Grundy County and had numerous fishing trips. Along with Scout Master, Thomas served his community as Fireman, Alderman, and Director on the Farm Bureau. He held an office in the local American Legion for 60 yrs. and was on the first Grundy County Planning Committee. He is a member of The Grundy County Veteran's Association where he has the honor of nominating "Veteran of the Year". Many of these service men have told Thomas that he was their Mentor. He has also served on two local cemetery committees with his presence, donations, and physical labor.

Most recently, Mr. Rollins met nine-year old, Cruz Myers who loves World War II history. Mr. Rollins knew this young man's great grandfather. Mr. Rollins then made it a mission to obtain all of Young Myers' grandfather's medals. Rollins worked tirelessly getting these medals together and then he placed this medals on his very own Army uniform dress jacket from WWII and presented this amazing gift to Mr. Cruz Myers.

Mr. Thomas Rollins and the love of his life, Ms. Mary have been married for 70 years and they still live in the house they purchased back in the 50's. They have two children, Brenda who was a fourth-grade teacher for 30 years and Wayne who is a professor at Middle Tennessee State University and is still teaching after 42 years.

Did You Know? Grundy County Fair Moments in History

Lillian Wyckoff Johnson (1864-1956), a native of Memphis, Tennessee, who made her way to the mountain in early part of the 20th century, initiated the first Grundy County Fair. Lillian received degrees from Wellesley College and the University of Michigan.

After teaching both at home and overseas, she received her Ph.D. from Cornell University and became a professor at the University of Tennessee. She helped form the Southern Association of College Women in 1903 and from 1904-196 she served as the president of the Western College for Women. Forced to resign her position due to health problems, Lillian traveled the world, visiting Egypt, Greece, Palestine, and Turkey.

Returning to the United States in 1908, Lillian taught in Memphis schools before settling in Summerfield, Tennessee, where she built a home in 1915. This home became a center for social justice and was named Kindred Company (KinCo). Lillian served on the Summerfield Board of Education and helped establish a credit union for farmers. She was instrumental in establishing an agricultural economy in the community. It was during this time that she established Grundy County's first agricultural fair.

In 1932, Lillian donated her home and property to Highlander Folk School and relocated to Memphis to be near her family. She later retired to Bradenton, Florida, and was active in the Women's Christian Temperance Movement.

The first agricultural fair of note in Grundy County, originated in the Swiss Colony on October 11, 1873. It was known as the Grundy County Agricultural Society. Also on July 5, 1874 -- Plans were made for a Cattle and Produce Fair to be held on September 4 and 5. August 2, 1874 -- Further discussion of the fair took place. Eugene Plumacher was nominated for membership.

August 16, 1874 -- It was announced that the members of the Landwirtschaftsverein should distinguish themselves at the fair by wearing colored ribbons. September 6, 1874 -- Financial report of the fair was given. The amount taken in was \$132.10 and \$104.15 was paid out, making the net profits \$27.95. The Fair continued on for several years until its demise. Then in 1915 Lillian Wyckoff Johnson rekindled the interest of having a fair. It was called the Grundy County Fair and was first held in the Summerfield Community for an unknown number of years. Then later was moved to Tracy City where the Grundy County Fair seen its heyday in the 60's and 70's and some say it would have even rivaled the state fair. The fair continued for years but dwindling interest also led to its demise in 2005. 10 years passed with no fair being held in Grundy County. Interest was once again rekindled. Reorganizers Scotty Hoosier and Russell Meeks began hosting meeting at different locations across the county. Eventually in early 2016 it was decided that a fair would be held in August of 2016. The six day event continues. And is held in Gruetli-Laager.

Enclosed is a summary of Tennessee Fair Regulations - health requirements for livestock at fairs and exhibitions.

Special Comments:

1. It is expected that all exhibitors will bring only healthy animals to fairs and exhibitions. Although state and federal animal health officials will be performing some inspections, **fair officials are responsible** for ensuring that all animals entering fairs for exhibition are in overall good health and are accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Animals showing clinical signs of contagious disease should be sent home immediately. Violations should be reported to the state veterinarian or his agent.
2. Certificate(s) of Veterinary Inspection are to accompany all animal(s) to the respective shows with the exception of in-state Tennessee equine and poultry. In-state Tennessee equine six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months. Poultry assembled at shows or exhibitions should be accompanied by evidence of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days, or **be tested on-site prior to exhibition following strict biosecurity procedures**, or originate directly from a flock which has been certified as Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under the Tennessee Poultry Improvement Plan. As part of increased awareness and surveillance for Avian Influenza and other poultry diseases, all bird's physical appearance should be assessed at the time testing is conducted.
3. Health certificates issued in satisfaction of these Tennessee Fair Regulations shall be good for 90 days for Tennessee livestock only.
4. Please note that exhibition requirements for out-of-state livestock are the same as regular import requirements.
5. Warts and ringworm are considered contagious and infectious diseases and are permissible exclusions only if considered inactive by the issuing veterinarian and noted as such on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
6. Scabies, contagious ecthyma (soremouth), footrot, cutaneous fungal and bacterial infections (i.e. club lamb disease, caseous lymphadenitis) are considered contagious and infectious diseases, and are permissible exclusions only if considered inactive by the issuing veterinarian and noted as such on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
7. Avian Influenza – **All out-of-state poultry must originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and a H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock**, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative official Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

Also, please note that if highly pathogenic Avian Influenza is detected in Tennessee or a neighboring state, the commingling of poultry at fairs and exhibitions may be suspended.

Fair Biosecurity

Below is a summary of recommendations for fair management by the National Assembly of State Animal Health Officials and the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians to better protect fair attendees from disease:

- Provide easy access to hand washing stations.
- Post informational signage that includes the following messages:
- No eating or drinking in the animal areas.
- Wash hands frequently.
- No pacifiers, sipping cups or strollers in the animal exhibition areas.
- Discourage sleeping in the animal exhibition areas.
- If human or swine influenza-like-illness is associated with the exhibition, animal health and public health officials should be notified immediately.
- People who have influenza-like illness should leave the exhibition immediately and seek medical care. They should advise their health care provider about their fair attendance.
- People at high risk for developing severe complications from influenza should limit their exposure to swine.

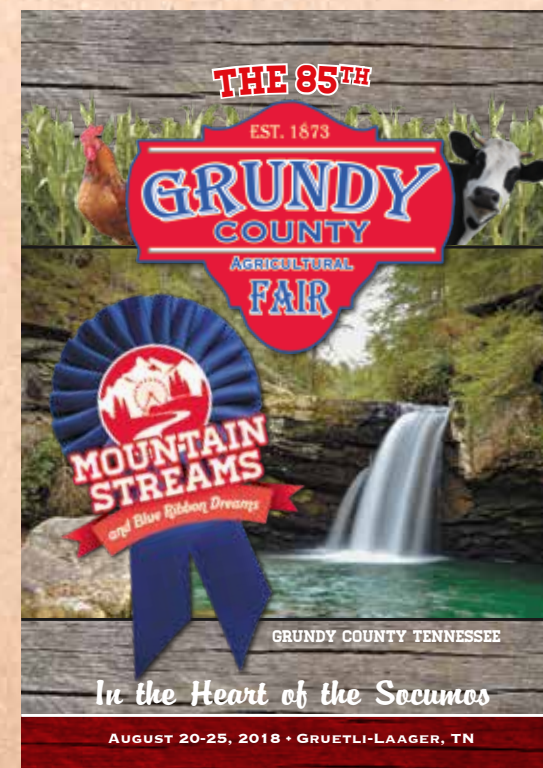
Also, be aware of the potential exposure of fair attendees to E. coli 0157 from animals exhibited on the fairgrounds.

TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE DIVISION OF ANIMAL INDUSTRIES

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

I. GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. POULTRY:

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
- (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

B. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

C. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

D. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.
- (2) Tuberculosis:
 - (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
 - (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

- IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter, and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

Concessionaire /Vendor rules to be followed as set forth in this contractual agreement with the Grundy County Fair Association. The rules include the following.

1. Concessionaire / Vendor agrees to abide by the rules and regulations adopted by the Grundy County Fair Association, which are incorporated herein by reference, and further agree to abide by any amended rules and regulations as adopted by the Grundy County Fair Association from time to time which amendments, if any will be furnished Concessionaire / Vendor prior to the Grundy County Fair.
2. Persons working in the booth rented by the Concessionaire / Vendor shall confine their activities to the interior of the booth or space rented. Concession signage must be placed on or in trailer, And on or in tent area.
3. No part of the concession Vendor shall be removed during the week of the fair without special permission from the management of the fair.
4. The Grundy County Fair Association reserves for itself and its duly appointed Representatives the right to void the Contract if at any time the Concessionaire / Vendor shall be engaged in illegal activities, fail to have proper State Health Permit, or exhibit conduct /materials which, in the opinion by the Grundy County Fair Association or it's duly appointed representatives, is offensive and/or is contrary to the community standards of decency and/or morality or would be unsuitable for viewing by minors. No weapons of any kind to be sold on fairgrounds. No explosive type novelties of any kind. Fair Board has the right to ban any novelties or concession/Vendor items for safety reasons. Spot checks of booths will take place. If, due to any of the above listed violations or for any other reason the Grundy County Fair Association or their representative feels the need to void a contract, the concessionaire / Vendor forfeits any and all deposits paid.
5. Concessionaire/Vendor shall not allow any exhibit other than his/her own to occupy any part of his space.
6. Concessionaire / Vendor is not permitted to use a public address system or loud speakers in his/her booth.
7. The Grundy County Fair Association reserves the right to reject application for space and the right to regain possession of any space in accordance with statements made in section 4. If an applicant is not accepted or is rejected prior to the fair for any reason, all deposits will be returned. Any concessionaire/vendor, who has an approved contract and after fair has begun, has their contract voided for reasons as stated in section 4 will not be eligible for a refund.
8.
