Texas Legend Bob Wills!!



Good News, Texans, the Bob Wills Legend continues! The truth is, it will always continue! Through the music and entertainment tradition he created, Bob's realm of influence continues to journey far beyond the borders of Texas. For many of us, Bob Wills and Western Swing is music to our ears. Back in 2011, Western Swing was named the Official State Music of Texas by Texas Senate resolution, representing the proud spirit and heritage of our state.

Ray Benson, founder of the premiere Western Swing group "Asleep at the Wheel", met but never actually got to talk with Wills in person. In an interview with Evan Smith for Texas Monthly, Benson described the meeting. "I went up to Dallas to see him in 1973. He was making what would be his last record, which we had helped put together with United Artists, our label at the time. We drive up there, we go in, and he's in a wheelchair. He's kind of slumped over. They said, "Look, we go in, and he's in a wheelchair. He's kind of slumped over. They said, he'll talk to you tomorrow. He's very tired." And they took him back to his room.

That night he had a stroke and went into a coma, and he died eighteen months later. So I met Bob Wills, but I never got to talk to him". It was this near-miss event that served as the catalyst for the triumphant stage play "A Ride With Bob" which Benson wrote, produced and took on tour in the Spring of 2005 to mark Bob Wills' 100th birthday. "A Ride With Bob" uses the premise of a surreal meeting on a tour bus to frame what that conversation might have been like.

In this make-believe meeting which formed the basis of the play, Benson continues "We talk about how Asleep at the Wheel has carried his music on - and the disillusionment I've sometimes had in trying to keep it going," Benson says, noting the difficulties both his and Wills' acts faced in "reconciling" swing and jazz within a resistant country music format. "He had the same conflicts we had, but he always stood his ground and got his way because he was Bob. One thing we both had in common, we always



Yes, this vintage form of music will survive, as there is a movement to get more youth involved in Western Swing performance. Among several more now, the Bob Wills Swing School launched in July 2010 sponsored by the Bob Wills Foundation. Its aim is bringing more talented youth to the genre. Many bands such as Leon Rausch and The Texas Playboys, Billy Mata and the Texas Tradition's and Bobby Flores and the Yellow Rose Band invite young talented musicians to join them on stage during performances. Hopkins County's own Fiddlin Jack Phillips is one of these youth whose natural talent is being embraced by the established Western Swing bands today. Young Jack was invited to appear with one of them at the Grand Ole Opry on July 21, 2018. What a ride this young man's career is already taking him (and his parents Mark and Allison) on!





THE MILKY WAY OVER FORT DAVIS

If you've been to Fort Davis on a night when the moon is barely visible, you know that when you look skyward you see the Milky Way in all its radiance. Fort Davis is one of the darkest spots in the United States so you get a good glimpse of the stars at night. They really are big and bright.

The darkness is one reason the McDonald Observatory is located just outside of Fort Davis. Scientists from all over the world go there to do research. Residents of Fort Davis are mindful of the need to keep the area dark and seldom use their bright lights while driving at night. All lighted areas in the town have covers on them to make sure the light goes down,

The observatory is one of the main tourist attractions in Fort Davis. On Tuesday, Friday and Saturday nights, visitors go there for star parties where they peer through strong telescopes and listen to informal lectures about the stars. Marc Wetzel is an education specialist at McDonald. "We're a little bit higher than Denver, Colorado. Here our elevation is about 6,500 feet. We're at a high altitude in a remote area. If you looked at a map of nowhere, we're right in the middle of that map.

"At the McDonald Observatory we are studying amazing things. We can measure distances to galaxies and can even find planets around other stars. We can determine the expansion rate of the entire universe here. It's truly a gem. We have one of the largest telescopes in the entire world and one of the biggest efforts to study the universe and address some of the most fundamentally amazing questions that we've had for the length of time humans have been on earth. If you've never seen the Milky Way before, you can see it plainly here in all its glory without using any amplified device.

"I convey the night sky and all the amazing things about it to young children. Try to explain a black hole to a third grader. I train elementary, middle and high school teachers how to teach astronomy in the classroom. We have great evening programs that are really popular and we just try to have the best time looking at the night sky and interpreting what people are seeing.

"There are so many opportunities to make a connection with nature here and understand what we see when we look at the dark sky."

Nearly 100 people work at the observatory. There are residences in the complex and some employees live in Fort Davis. Night time is not the only time people can go to the observatory. It also studies the sun and offers information programs about the ball of fire.

The observatory, located on Mount Locke 16 miles from Fort Davis, is owned by the University of Texas. It was made possible by the bequest of William Johnson McDonald, a Paris, Texas banker in hopes that astronomers would find ways to forecast weather, thus helping farmers far ahead of planting time. Mount Locks is named for the rancher who donated land for the observatory.
