TCHS grads take next step toward a great future

What do West Point, Johnson & Wales University and Widener University all have in common? The answer is that these are just a few of the incredible institutions that Chester County Technical College High School (TCHS) Class of 2018 graduates will be attending this fall. The three graduates attending these institutions pursued interests at TCHS, which included Criminal Justice & Police Sciences, Culinary Arts and Marketing & Financial Services.

TCHS Pennock's Bridge Campus graduate Maggie Weir, from Avon Grove School District, will be attending West Point. TCHS Pickering Campus graduate Jessica Xu, from Tredyffrin/Easttown School District, will be attending Johnson & Wales University and majoring in baking and pastry arts. TCHS Brandywine

Campus graduate Kyle Pollick, from Bishop Shanahan High School, will be going to Widener University to study business analytics and to play lacrosse.

TCHS brings together students of diverse interests and offers them the opportunity to explore their passions and pursue their dreams. As a public high school of choice, TCHS is for students in grades nine to 12 who want to prepare for success in post-secondary education and the workforce. At TCHS, students get ahead with essential hands-on experience and opportunities to earn up to a year's worth of college credits in high school, making them stand out to prospective colleges and employers.

Whether they want to pursue a career in the arts, sciences, a modern skilled trade or a combination of those, stu-

Some students enter TCHS with an interest in a specific career field. Take Weir for instance. Weir is a recent graduate of the TCHS Pennock's Bridge Criminal Justice & Police Sciences program who fulfilled a lifelong dream by receiving an accommodation to West Point from Rep. Lloyd Smucker.

"I come from a military family, so from a young age I knew I wanted to join the military. Getting into West Point has been a dream come true. It was hard work, but I really believe being in the Criminal Justice & Police Sciences program at TCHS gave me a leg up," said Weir.

Tracey Weir, Maggie's

mother, believes that TCHS played an important role in fulfilling Maggie's dream of attending West Point.

"At TCHS, Maggie had opportunities to really step outside of her comfort zone and take leadership positions in the classroom," said Tracey.

When asked about her reaction to her daughter's success, Tracey Weir stated, "When I found out she got accepted into West Point, I didn't know whether to smile or cry. I did both! I am prouder of her than I am able to put into words."

Maggie Weir's teachers at Avon Grove are also confident about her success moving forward.

Her physics teacher, Dr. Jim Lertola, said of Weir, "Maggie is one of our brightest students who always seeks to challenge herself. She is serious, hard-working, soft-spoken and humble. We are confident she will find success in the future [at West Point]."

A recent graduate of TCHS Pickering Campus, Xu is also pursuing her dreams. Xu will attend the prestigious Johnson & Wales University to major in baking and pastry arts.

"I always really valued the ability of food to bring people together and connect them. Treats always make people happy, and I enjoy making people happy," said Xu.

Xu also used her time at TCHS Pickering to pursue excellence outside the classroom. Xu was the 2018 TCHS Pickering Campus valedictorian and Student of the Year. She was a SkillsUSA member, a National Honor Society and a National Technical Honor Society member, on the distinguished honor roll, a SkillsUSA and FCCLA medalist, a student ambassador and an academic competition team member.

When asked about her advice to others who are considering pursuing their dreams at TCHS, Xu noted, "Go for it. If you work hard, you will be rewarded with experience and

When asked about his plans for the future, Pollick credited TCHS with helping him get a better sense of what career he wants to pursue.




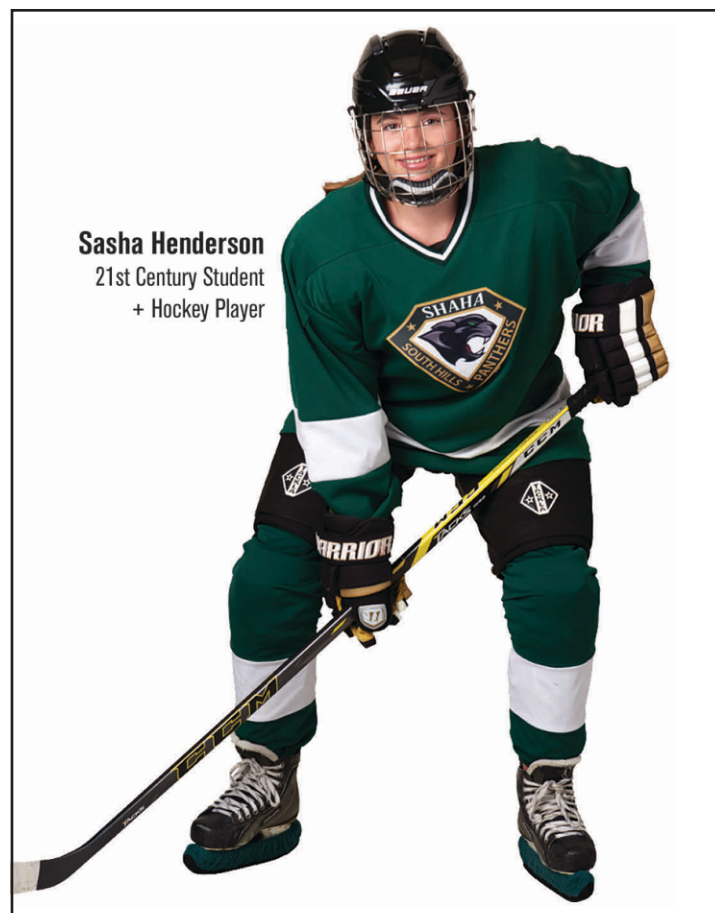

New Center for STEM Education takes shape at Notre Dame

Construction is underway on the Academy of Notre Dame de Namur's new Center for STEM Education, a 30,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art learning and innovation environment for faculty and students.

The new building reflects the Academy's historic Villanova campus while introducing a forward-looking facility that supports and embraces 21st science education.

The Center will include technology enabled active learning (TEAL) environments that include eight science laboratories; three lab prep rooms; eight mathematics classrooms; a design thinking and entrepreneurship classroom; and labs dedicated to design and innovation, robotics and coding.

"While the Center reflects the current curriculum offered by our excellent faculty, it provides a more extended, nimble space for research, teaching, collaboration and project-based learning," said Notre Dame's president, Dr. Judith A. Dwyer.

Large first- and second-floor gathering areas will provide space to celebrate student achievements while creating a flexible and multipurpose space. Spaces for small group collaboration are distributed throughout the corridors on both floors and state-of-the-art technology permeates the entire complex.

The Academy is a Catholic, independent school for young women in grades six through 12 in the tradition of the Sisters of Notre Dame



de Namur.

"One of the key educational philosophies of the Sisters is that we teach our young women 'what they need to know for life,'" said Dwyer. "STEM interdisciplinary education provides opportunities to develop core competencies such as critical thinking, analytical and deductive reasoning, computing and communication skills — competencies needed by all students in all careers.

Notre Dame offers a rigor-

ous STEM-based curriculum that demonstrates the connectedness of STEM with all fields of learning, especially the arts (STEAM) and emphasizes the ability of STEM designs and products to heal and enhance the quality of life throughout the world. More than one-third of recent Notre Dame graduates pursue STEM majors at leading universities.

While challenging courses in all subject areas mark the Academy's academic rigor,

Notre Dame is a caring, spiritual community, guided by the faith tradition of the Catholic Church, the legacy of service of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur and the school's Honor Code.

Bold, experiential education sets Perkiomen apart

Veterinary Clinic and Delaware Valley Veterinary Behavior.

The Mural Arts, Haverford School, Shoemaker Mastery Charter form partnership

In partnership with Mural Arts Philadelphia, students at The Haverford School and Shoemaker Mastery Charter School are working to conceptualize and create a 125-foot by 27-foot mural at 53rd and Lansdowne streets in West Philadelphia. The mural, funded through a grant from the 25th Century Foundation, is expected to be unveiled in summer 2018.

After interviewing residents regarding the past, present and future of the neighborhood, the students began to envision a mural

Fall semester brings changes to Immaculata University

President Barbara Lettiere's first year denotes a new era for Immaculata

University.

The shift in leadership has come with many pos-

itive changes, including a comprehensive rebranding of the school, marked

by the launch of a new website at <https://www.immaculata.edu>.

The new brand message is simple: Immaculata is committed to providing a quality education at an affordable price.

With this in mind, the most popular associate degree programs from the College of Adult Professional Studies (CAPS) — including business administration, communication, education and information systems — is being offered at a reduced tuition of \$250 per credit starting this fall. Select CAPS bachelor degree programs are also reduced. Additionally, Immaculata continues to offer competitively priced programs at the master's and doctoral levels.

Registration is still open for the 2018-2019 fall semester, which begins on Monday, Aug. 27.

Under Lettiere's stewardship, life on campus has been bustling.

The University co-founded the new Atlantic East Conference, an

NCAA Division III conference which will begin competition this September. Atlantic East is composed of seven private colleges: Immaculata University, Cabrini University, Gwynedd Mercy University, Marymount University, Marywood University, Neumann University and Wesley College. Additionally, Immaculata has expanded its varsity sports program to include women's golf, men's swimming, women's swimming and men's volleyball. With these, the University now offers 23 varsity sports. The teams have created the opportunity for 500 60 new student athletes to participate in athletics. The new teams will begin competition this fall semester.

Change has not been limited to the sports program. Since this spring, construction has been underway for a new IHM student center. A dedication ceremony is planned for the end of the fall semester, when construction is scheduled to be complete. The new stu-

dent center will provide space for students to relax and study. Included will be a dining area with a self-serve milkshake bar; a state-of-the-art exercise area; a game room with electronic stations and tables for billiards, ping-pong and shuffleboard; a large lounge area; and a media room big enough to accommodate club meetings. Immaculata's students are avidly awaiting the grand opening.

live the Quaker values," said Mimi Ackers, head of school. "At Goshen, we work hard to teach the children that serving others adds meaning to our lives and helps make the world a better place."

From September 2017 through May 2018, Goshen Friends preschoolers and pre-kindergartners planted seeds and harvested vegetables through the Chester County Food Bank's raised bed program, gathered smoke detectors on behalf of the Goshen Fire Company, decorated a Christmas tree for the students at Devereux's Kanner Learning Center and enjoyed an ice cream social with their neighbors at Bellingham Retirement Community.

They also collected toiletries for the residents of Safe Harbor of Chester County; household supplies for the women and children of Home of the Sparrow; bedding, pet food and other items for the Brandywine Valley SPCA; and breakfast foods for the Chester County Food Bank.

"Goshen Friends

School has been a longtime partner of the Food Bank. From their raised bed gardens to food drives to coloring kindness for our Senior Box Program, it is heartwarming to see the students grow into young ambassadors for the Food Bank and the community in which they are growing up," said Anne Shuniak, marketing and communications manager at the Chester County Food Bank. "Food

drives are always needed at the Food Bank, and last year Goshen Friends' breakfast items food drive during Thanksgiving was very much appreciated."

"It can be difficult for a child (and many adults even) to fathom the idea of being hungry/food insecure," added Shuniak, "but what has always been apparent is the care that Goshen Friends has given to giving back."

During the 2018-19 school year, Goshen Friends is looking forward to expanding its service program to include even larger events to benefit the community.

"Our school may be small, but we've got a great big heart," noted Michele Kornegay, Goshen Friends' director of admissions and advancement. "Through service to our community, we are taking the lessons we teach about kindness, respect and empathy beyond the classroom to help children understand what it feels like to do good for our neighbors."

and human destiny," said Mays. "It depicts a figure representing hope and curiosity holding the seed from which all is revealed. 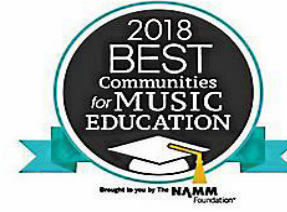
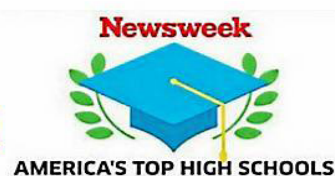
World-renowned DJ King Britt worked with students to add a musical component to the mural. Through an app, different points on the mural are mapped to unique music and content. Students tried their hand at designing soundtracks that will

be paired with resident interviews and other sounds that are native to the neighborhood.

"When people encounter the mural, we want it to be an immersive experience," said Haverford School Art Department Chair Chris Fox. "This app will allow visitors to hear the voices and sounds that helped inspire the mural — and the students."

"Students are energized by seeing their own ideas and drawings take on a larger-than-life form in our city," said Zoë Blatt, Upper School art teacher. "Witnessing their art's impact on a community can give young artists confidence as creative agents of change. The collaboration with Mural Arts has offered our students a new understanding of the role that artmaking can play in their lives."

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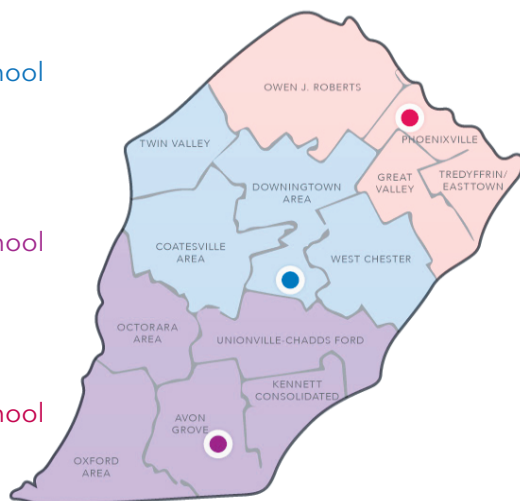
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
