





## The sun's rays are still harmful during the fall

Don't Forget the Sunscreen!

During the fall season filled with outdoor activities, it is easy to forget about the harmful properties of the sun's rays. About 1 million Americans will develop skin cancer

each year, according to the National Cancer Institute. That makes skin cancer-not breast cancer, prostate cancer or even lung cancer—the number-one cancer threat.

The American Cancer Society lists skin cancer as the most common type of cancer. With this looming statistic, it is important to be educated on what causes skin cancer and how to lower your risk factor. Ultraviolet (UV) radiation is the leading contributor to contracting melanoma skin cancer. Prolonged or unprotected exposure to these UV Rays damages the DNA of skin cells. When the genes that con-

trol skin cell growth are damaged, skin cancer is formed.

Tanning beds use an artificial light source made entirely of UV rays. Risk of contracting melanoma skin cancer increases 4 percentage from the first time a person uses a tanning bed. By cutting out this form of tanning, people significantly decrease their risk factor. There are several alternative ways to get a natural looking tan without subjecting your skin to this harsh method. South Central Dermatology now offers Tan Towels, a product that creates a sunless, healthy looking tan.

The UV rays found in natural sunlight are significantly lesser than those in artificial light, yet can still be hazardous if ignored. Amy Adams, DO, Dermatologist at South Central Dermatology Clinic in Laurel explains.

"It is important when you are outside, to wear sunscreen

with at least a SPF of 30 and containing the ingredients titanium and zinc," says Dr. Adams. "The peak hours of UV exposure are from 11 am to 4 pm, so be sure to monitor your time in the direct sunlight during these hours. These simple steps will significantly aid in prevention."

Skin cancer can also be genetic. If your family has a history of skin cancer it is imperative to be extra cautious when enjoying the sun. "We recommend that everyone has a regular screening for pre-existing moles," states Ashlynn Martin, FNP. "Also, it is important to be aware of any new moles you may develop and be sure to notify your dermatologist of these."

When checking moles, remember your "ABCs":

- **Asymmetry:** One side of the mole does not match the
  - Border: A mole's outline is jagged or blurry.
  - Color: The color is uneven. You may notice different

shades of tan, black and brown. Areas of white, gray, red, pink or blue also may be present.


- Diameter: The mole is larger than ¼ inch in diameter—about the size of a pencil eraser.
- Evolving: Be cautious of moles that are changing in

To detect skin cancer at an early stage, get familiar with your moles and birthmarks. Then, every month, check your entire body in the mirror for skin changes, including your back, scalp and feet. A handheld mirror can help ensure a thorough self-exam. Each year it is important to schedule an annual screening with your Dermatologist. Ask your doctor to check out anything that concerns you. These preventative steps are easy, yet skin cancer is still the most common form of cancer. It is important to know the facts about what increases and decreases personal risk for melanoma skin cancer to better combat it. "You can enjoy the sun and get the tan you want while being safe," states Martin. "This season, be aware of your exposure to UV rays and wear sunscreen."





## Bulldogs unveil 2018-19 men's basketball schedule

The Mississippi State men's basketball program and fourth-year head coach Ben Howland revealed its 2018-19 schedule on Friday which features a potential of 18 games versus opponents who reached the 20-win mark last season. Howland wanted to challenge his talented roster that is coming off a 2018 NIT Semifinals berth, and the rigorous non-conference schedule is highlighted by nine teams who captured postseason berths coupled with top three conference finishes a season ago.

"Our non-conference schedule is going to be very challenging and a difficult one this year," Howland said. "It will be great preparation for the SEC which also is going to be incredibly challenging and competitive. I'm excited to get really good games against outstanding competition. It will be a great opportunity night in and night out for our team to improve and get better."

The Mississippi State Athletics Ticket Office is selling season tickets for as low as \$199, Fans can purchase tickets online at www.HailState.com, in person at the MSU Athletics Ticket Office located at the Bryan Athletic Building or via the phone at (662) 325-2600. Information on single game tickets and mini plans will be announced at a later date by the ticket office.

A MSU squad fueled by all five starters returning from last season's 25-12 team welcomes Austin Peay (Nov. 9) for its season opener to Humphrey Coliseum. The threegame opening homestand concludes with Hartford (Nov. 11) and Long Beach State (Nov 16), respectively. Howland's squad hits the road for the first time and travels to the MGM Resorts Main Event hosted at the T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas, Nevada. The Dawgs meet NCAA Tournament participant Arizona State (Nov. 19) followed by either Utah State or Saint Mary's (Nov. 21) two

days later. The Gaels ripped off a 30-win campaign and a NIT appearance last season.

A trip to Dayton (Nov 30) comes between home contests against Alcorn State (Nov. 26) and McNeese State (Dec. 4). Then, MSU faces a challenge close to the nonconference docket sparked by five consecutive teams coming off postseason berths who racked up a combined 126 victories in 2017-18. The five-game stretch opens with back-to-back matchups versus Top 15 foes from last season's final USA Today Coaches Poll. The Bulldogs take on NCAA Sweet 16 participant Clemson (Dec. 8) as part of the Never Forget Tribute Classic in Newark, New Jersey followed by a rematch a week later when defending American Athletic Conference champions Cincinnati (Dec. 15) ventures to the Hump.

Prior to the holiday break, MSU squares off with Wofford (Dec. 19) before a matchup with Wright State (Dec. 22) in Jackson at the Mississippi Coliseum. The Bulldogs face off with BYU (Dec. 29) to conclude the nonconference ledger at the Hump. MSU begins its 18-game SEC schedule with a trip to South Carolina (Jan. 8). The Bulldogs play host to Ole Miss (Jan. 12) in its SEC home opener followed by home tilts against Florida (Jan. 15) and defending SEC regular season co-champion Auburn (Jan. 26). MSU also travels to Vanderbilt (Jan. 19), fourtime defending SEC Tournament champion Kentucky (Jan. 22) and Alabama (Jan. 29) in January.

February's schedule features a three-game homestand versus LSU (Feb. 6), Kentucky (Feb. 9) and Alabama (Feb. 12), in addition to home dates with South Carolina (Feb. 23) and Missouri (Feb. 26). The Bulldogs have a return trip to Ole Miss (Feb. 2) along with road meetings against Arkansas (Feb. 16) and Georgia (Feb. 20) in Feb-

ruary. MSU wraps up the regular season versus Texas A&M (March 9) after consecutive road matchups with last season's SEC regular co-champions Auburn (March 2) and Tennessee (March 5). The SEC Tournament is set for March 13-17 at the Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tennessee. All game times and TV network designations will be announced by the SEC and its television partners at a later date.

Mississippi State University President Mark E. Keenum has been selected as chair of the College Football Playoff (CFP) Board of Managers. Keenum has served as the Southeastern Conference representative on the board since 2015. Keenum served a term as president of the Southeastern Conference from 2016-2018.

"The College Football Playoff has made a name for itself over the past

four years as a great way to decide the national champion in college football. That's an important task, and I plan to lead this board in maintaining the integrity of the event," Keenum said. "Working with the representatives of the nation's major athletic conferences, we will work to ensure the continued growth and success of the CFP."

Entering its fifth season, the CFP determines the national champion of the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision. Four teams play in two semifinal games, and the semifinal winners advance to the CFP National Championship.

The CFP Board of Managers is the governing board of CFP Administration, LLC, the organization that manages the administrative operations of the College Football Playoff. Members are the 10 FBS conferences (American Athletic, Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Pac-12, Southeastern and Sun Belt) and the University of Notre Dame.

The CFP's business, property and affairs are governed by the board, comprised of the university presidents or chancellors from the 10 FBS conferences and Notre Dame. The board develops, reviews and approves annual budgets, policies and operating guidelines. It also appoints officers of the company. It has authority of overall primary aspects of the CFP's operations.

#### Mississippi's Alligator Hunting Season Opens August 31st

JACKSON - The 2018 Public Waters Alligator Hunting Season opens in Mississippi on Friday, August 31, at 12 p.m. The season will be open for ten days and will close at 12 p.m. on Monday, September 10, 2018. A total of 930 permits in seven hunting zones across the state were offered in two random drawings of over 4,000 applicants during the application process in mid-June. This is the 14th year of public waterway hunting opportunity in Mississippi. Ricky Flynt, the Alligator Program Coordinator for the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks, (MDWFP) is expecting high participation among the hunters. Flynt says, "Alligator hunters should experience good hunting conditions with favorable weather and most river levels being slightly above normal depths for this time of year, which will improve navigation on waterways across most of the state."

All persons, 16 years of age or older, who are in a vessel with or assisting a permit holder, must possess an Alligator Hunting License (\$25) and a valid prerequisite hunting license, which includes the following: a Mississippi Sportsman License, All-Game Hunting/Fishing License, Small Game Hunting/Fishing License, Apprentice Sportsman License, Apprentice All Game License, Apprentice Small Game License, Senior Exempt License, or Disabled Exempt License. Lifetime License holders are exempt. Licenses are available on-line at www.mdwfp.com, via the official MDWFP App, at any point of sale location where Mississippi hunting and fishing licenses are sold, or by calling 1-800-5GO-HUNT.

## The Greatest Games in the Series - UTSA

Who says a game has to be played a long time ago to be considered the greatest in a series?

One only has to look back a year ago to feature the best game of the UTSA series. In that game, the Golden Eagles held on for a 31-29 victory over the Roadrunners at the Alamodome in San Antonio. This summer, Southern Miss athletics has been looking back at the greatest games in each of the playing series of all 12 opponents from its 2018 football schedule, giving Golden Eagle fans a weekly look of what we consider to be the greatest game in history between the two respective programs. We will post these games on social media as well, and ask fans to agree or disagree with our selections as well as share their favorite memory from these games.

This week, the focus is on UTSA, who the Golden Eagles are set to play at The Rock, Saturday, Oct. 20, at 6 p.m., in the school's annual homecoming contest.

In last year's game, the Golden Eagles pull off an old-fashioned fleaflicker for one of three touchdowns they scored in a span of 3 minutes, 27 seconds in the late third quarter/early

fourth quarter as they rolled up 458 yards total offense.

Running back Ito Smith capped off the game-changing, three-touchdown scoring binge with the longest touchdown run in the football program's history. Smith burst up the middle and outraced the Roadrunners for an 89yard score to cap a 21-point rally that erased a 13-7 UTSA halftime lead and left the Golden Eagles up 28-13.

UTSA rallied on Jared Sackett's third field goal of the game and a pair of touchdown passes from Dalton Sturm to Marquez McNair, the second on coming with just 48 seconds to play. But Sturm's potential, gametying two-point conversion pass was incomplete as Cornell Armstrong made a nice defensive play.

UTSA's on-side kick attempt went out of bounds and USM just needed a couple snaps to run out the clock.

After an end zone interception and 61-yard return by Curtis Mikell, Keon Howard capped a 39-yard drive with a 20-yard touchdown pass to Korey Robertson that lifted Southern Miss into a 14-13 lead. Southern Miss forced a three-and-out, and got the ball back at the UTSA 48. On the first play, the Golden Eagles pulled off a flea flicker, with Howard finding

Quez Watkins for a 48-yard touchdown and a 21-13 lead.

Southern Miss forced another UTSA punt, and got the ball back at its own 11-yard line. On first down, Smith found a big hole up the middle and simply outran defenders for an 89-yard touchdown run and a 28-13 lead. After being limited to 38 yards in the first half, Smith finished with 178 yards on 17 carries, averaging 10.8 yards a carry. Sturm got the Roadrunners back within 28-20 on a 28-yard pass to McNair. Howard was then stripped from behind and UTSA recovered at Southern Miss' 32-yard line. But the Golden Eagles forced the Roadrunners to settle for a 44yard field goal by Sackett that cut the lead to 28-23 with 7:33 left to play.

But Southern Miss went 69 yards on 12 plays, taking 5:37 off the clock, as Parker Shaunfield pushed the lead back to eight points with a 24-yard field goal with just 1:56 to play. After a 46-yard kickoff return, Sturm sped UTSA 53 yards, capping the drive with a 24-yard pass to McNair with 48 seconds to play and getting the Roadrunners within a two-point conversion to tie the game. But Sturm's pass on the conversion was low, falling incomplete.
