
large enthusiastic crowd attended Hot San Jose Nights 10th annual charity car and airplane show at Reid-Hillview Airport on Sat., September 8th.

#### Classroom air quality reviewed at Dove Hill Elementary School due to Cal OSHA complaint

Scrubbing completed in the classrooms during the summer

t the June 14, 2018 board meeting (item 9.2) it was stated in a letter from Superintendent Gomez to the school board that on February 16, 2018, "a complaint had been issued from Cal-OSHA."

The letter went on to state, "that a complaint had been filed alleging that the conditions of Dove Hill E.S. have violated safety orders found in Title 8 of the California Code of Regulations."

Four concerns were listed in the Cal-OSHA requested investigation.

At the same board meeting it was stated that "some class-rooms were kind of "musty and stale." Some teachers were said to use oil based perfume in the classrooms.

Over the summer scrubbing was done in the classrooms. Testing has been completed, a report has been presented, and a follow up of testing may occur. "The consultant for the Evergreen School District wanted the classrooms lived in before testing again, to make sure we can make an apples to apples comparison," said Charles Crosby, communications director for the Evergreen School District.

It was stated that use of the Measure M Bond monies was used in the cleaning of the classrooms.

- 6. "... Housekeeping of the classrooms, while visually acceptable, could benefit from additional cleaning..."
  - 7. "After all the classrooms have been

given a thorough deep cleaning during the summer break of 2018, Classrooms 16 and 33 should be re-sampled to help assess if the detected anomalous Significant Mold Genera was caused by passive transference of the room occupants and/or carried through open doors/windows or if there actual concealed interior source."

8. 

### **Evergreen School District exploring options to generate revenue including land swap**

The Evergreen School District has been working with Terry Reality Consultants, with approval from board members, to explore swapping land for revenue generating properties as well as future exploration of leasing opportunities.

A report was presented by the hired consultant company to the Joint Facilities Advisory Committee of the school district. In the report all 18 school sites are reviewed and some schools have comments listed as to how potential land use might be initiated in the future. (The information is available on the Evergreen District website and going to PARENTS, JOINT USE FACILITIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE and clicking on the April 12 meeting presentation.)

"The District is exploring options for joint use and other possibilities to maximize the potential of our spaces. If there are ways to bring more revenue to the District in the face of severely declining enrollments due to housing costs, we're prepared to carefully consider them, said Charles Crosby, Communications Director for the Evergreen School District.

Below are some comments stated in the report:

Cadwallder Elementary School: low enrollment of 388 children is highlighted.

Carolyn Clark Elementary School: "Slope impacts usable land. If buildings are re-purposed, potential housing on current fields. Not easily accessible from major streets."

Cedar Grove Elementary School: "Potential overhead power line impacts to site. Potential airport influence. Head Start located on campus. New City fields located close by."

Dove Hill Elementary: "School is primarily portables. Potentially good location to re-purpose for housing."

Evergreen Elementary School: "Potential overhead power line impacts site. Topo impacts portions of the site. Close to Silver Creek High School."

Martin Site: "Potential land to exchange or enter into a Joint

Occupancy ground lease to create revenue.

In the report more detailed information is listed for each school.

Peter Castonguay's 1921 Studebaker involved in old time bank robbery

There sitting in the shade with his lawn chair was local resident Mr. Castonguay. He sparked up conversations with anyone who wanted to know more about his classic car. "This is an EJ Lite 6 and I got it from a friend when I lived in Connecticut. The car was in pieces so I put it on a trailer, my company moved and I went with it to San Jose where I put it together in my home garage. I farmed the engine work out to a machine shop and the upholstery to a local shop too. That's it and I did all the other restoration myself. I also made my own spray booth in my garage with draped plastic and gave it three coats of the paint color I loved. It took me three years to restore.

Back in the day, most cars were shipped with black paint. However, the dealer also shipped the cars with primer and the dealerships would paint the car whatever color the buyer liked. I choose the brown color because I like it and it is contemporary with the 1920's.

On the bank robbery story, about four years ago in downtown History Park the word went out for classic cars to be part of a movie. I went and my car was in the movie. I had it set up for the camera where I knelt on the front sideboard and shot at the getaway car with others using a make believe tommy gun. I guess that was my big contribution to the film industry! Don't know the name of the movie or if it ever came out of production.

Why am I here? Well, I just love getting out of the house and I love to show kids how cars looked way back when and go over how the engine works. I also notice that lots of adults harken back and say things like their grandpa had one of these."

When looking at the well-designed engine he was asked if it could be driven to New York as is. Castongaway said, "Well, it will go faster than 40

miles per hour, but it has two wheel brakes, so you can go, but you got to stop too so best to keep it at 40."

#### Eagle Field Foundation displays military history items so all can learn

The kids were right at home hopping into 1940's tanks and specialized war Jeeps. They grabbed the guns and put on big smiles. Lots of docents were on hand to explain any questions to all and provide military history.
