

Little did Maria Friedlund, a nurse at Riverwood in Aitkin, know that she would be out-danced by two Indian grandparents from overseas.

But out-danced and out-celebrated she was, as her daughter Misty DeForrest, 31, and her finance, Adrian Singh, 31, partook in both a traditional Hindu and an American wedding this summer on August 17 and 18. Adrian was born in London

and he has family in London and all over England. The Hindu "weddings" began on Wednesday, August 15, when Misty was painted with henna designs also known as mehndi. Henna is applied to both the hands and feet of the bride. It is a popular belief that the darker the color of the henna the more the bride's husband and mother-in-law will love her. It took 10 hours to complete this at

her in-laws' home in Blaine. Thursday, August 16, was the Matikore/Dig Dutty when the groom and bride are prepared physically and spiritually for the upcoming wedding ceremony. The Dig Dutty is just as it sounds — digging dirt. The offerings are placed in the ground and prayers are offered. It is followed by the Rub Dye, during which a paste that is made of turmeric dye is rubbed on the groom's and bride's body to purify them for the nuptials. "Thurs-

day, the bride and groom aratebodies, were separated and didn't see each other until the ceremony on Friday," noted Maria.

The Hindu wedding took place at a place of worship, the Mandir, in North Minneapolis. The male officiant was called a Pundit and there was a canopy (mundap) over the couple and lots of symbolic practices. The Hindu ceremony is comprised of a series of religious ceremonies and rituals. It is meant to unite two persons so firmly, that, although they retain two sep-

one in spirit. It is a sacred, spiritual partnership between two individuals in mind, body, spirit and soul in this and their future lives. Misty wore a red lengha. Red signifies prosper-

ity and fertility and she'll

and celebrations. Otherwise, she'll wear traditional American clothes.

Maria, who is Hispanic, looked fantastic in her sari, provided by the mother of the groom.

There was food after the Hindu ceremony and the next day the American ceremony was held at a wedding venue in Fridley called Banquets of Minnesota. Misty had a gorgeous traditional white wedding gown. The six bridesmaids traded in their saris for navy blue bridesmaid gowns



and the men wore tuxes.

"I've never had that much fun at a reception," noted Maria. "They played tons of Indian music and the Indian family never quit dancing. Grandma and Grandpa came from England and were in their 90's and they made it even longer than I did."







breezy and the lines were short. With the safe, family atmosphere, we could let the children walk around freely and easily keep an eye on them. And all of us enjoyed visiting the Pioneer Village.

For those of you who harken back to the old days, I think the miniature golf shack is repurposed as a concession stand, the old entrance and restaurant are now the oldtime photo shop and Paul's pocket watch from downtown Brainerd now hangs in the Pioneer Village.

Babe the Blue Ox is still in the parking lot, the creepy-looking cowboy statue and the jail are inside, albeit in different locations, and the atmosphere of endless summer exuberance still reigns.

As I rode the carousal and the Ferris wheel, round and round and unchanged from the old days, I was instantly transported back to the 60s and 70s. In fact, since my older sisters were teens when I was little, I visited Paul and company when I could barely walk and talk.

Paul Bunyan Center was opened in Baxter in 1950. The statue of Paul was built in 1948 by the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad and displayed at the Chicago Railroad Fair of 1948-1950. Sherm Levis established the park in the Brainerd area and built it around the statue of Paul that Levis and Roy Kuemicheal bought. At its heyday, the old park had over 40 rides.
