

# **Winners of Clean Green Litter Challenge** announced as new challenge kicks off

The winners of the Clean Green 15 Litter Challenge were announced on Tuesday morning, with multiple east side schools getting recognized — and rewarded — for their efforts to beautify their communities.

For the last five years, schools around the county have partaken in the challenge, with upwards of \$3,000 being awarded to grand prize winners. The money is to be used within the year for instructional projects emphasizing environmental literacy.

For the challenge, students work in 15-minute bursts to collect litter. Some schools, like grand prize winner General John Stricker Elementary, team up with area groups like Clean Bread and Cheese

# Eighth District Senate race gets testy

Delegate Christian Miele went on the offensive against Senator Kathy Klausmeier over what he referred to as "deceptive tactics" after a mailer sent to residents in the Eighth District showed Klausmeier "working with" Governor Larry Hogan "to build a better Baltimore County.'

Miele labeled the mailer a deceptive tactic aimed at convincing voters that Hogan supports Klausmeier when, in actuality, he is the one who has been endorsed by Hogan.

Klausmeier told the East County Times on Tuesday that she was not being deceptive, but that she has enjoyed a working relationship with Hogan since

"There was no endorsement mentioned there, just that I work with him. And I will never say I didn't work with him, ' said Klausmeier. "I work with everybody, including my opponent."

Klausmeier, an incumbent Democrat whose seat has been targeted by Maryland Republicans, noted that she

And with that proclamation, Irene Spatafore on Tuesday broke the news to the East County Times that she and the rest of her angels have found a new home from which to continue operating her benevolent project that supports American troops in war zones.

Spatafore, 84 and a lifelong Dundalk resident who created Angels Suporting Your Troops Inc. nearly nine years ago, has been operating the soldier care package project out of Sonshine Fellowship Church on Sollers Point Road since the program's inception in Janu-

# Deer hunt information session set for Friday

Residents of the Edgemere area have had complaints about the deer population for a long time.

Back in early April the problem jumped from a nuisance issue to a safety issue, after a car traveling on North Point Road was struck by a vehicle and ended up crashing through the window of a car in the opposite lane. The deer, stuck in the windshield, proceeded to bludgeon one of the passengers repeatedly, landing her in critical condition in R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma.

While the April incident added to the urgency of rectifying the problem, Delegate Bob Long (R-7) said that he had been working on addressing the issue for quite some time before the crash.

"I got a lot of complaints from constituents in Fort Howard about the deer population, the damages they were doing and the problems they were causing for the community," said Long. "So I reached out to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR)."

On Friday, Sept. 21, Long and Brian Noon from DNR will be holding an information session for the Edgemere area at the Muddy Beaver, located at 2606 S. Snyder Avenue in Sparrows Point, regarding an upcoming opportunity for hunters to bag some deer in North Point State Park.

Noon and Long will discuss the ap-

plication process to enter a lottery for licensed hunters who wish to partake in a managed deer hunt, aimed at decreasing the high deer population in the area.

Long told the East County Times that he would have liked to have restricted entry to only District Six residents, but because the hunt is taking place on state-owned land it has to be open to all state residents.

"In western Maryland they had a bear hunt that was able to be restricted, but that was on private land," Long said. "So we want to make sure as many local residents know about this as possible so they can enter the lottery.'

According to Long, 40 hunters will be allowed to hunt each day, with four deer allowed per hunter. The deadline to enter the lottery is Nov. 2. One out of ten hunters will also be chosen to harvest an antlered deer in lieu of one of the four anterless deer.

In addition to satisfying licensing, Maryland hunter safety and stamp requirements, a managed hunt permit and a shooter qualification card are reguired to participate in the hunt.

Shotguns with slugs are the only firearms allowed for these hunts, and the use of scopes is encouraged. Deer taken during these hunts will not count toward the hunter's regular deer Firearms Season bag limit.

was appointed to the Heroin and Opioid Taskforce by Hogan, as well as the Maryland Manufacturing Committee and other committees. According to Klausmeier, earlier this year billboards were put up on Harford Road and Belair Road urging her to work with Hogan.

"And that's what I did," said Klausmeier. "And I previously worked with Governor O'Malley, Governor Ehrlich and Glendening. That's what I'm supposed to do and that's what I do."

In a release sent out last Thursday, Miele also took aim at Klausmeier's voting record. Miele blasted the mailer's depiction of Klausmeier's record on supporting tax increases, including the "Rain Tax," which she initially supported. The mailer was sent out by the Senate Democratic Caucus Committee (SDCC).

This is nothing more than a bald-faced lie," Miele said. "In fact, in addition to the Rain Tax, Senator Klausmeier voted for dozens of O'Malley tax and fee increases between 2007-2014."

Klausmeier eventually voted to make the "Rain Tax" optional. Last week she told FOX that she initially did not consider the storm water management fee a tax, but ultimately ended up changing her tune.

While Klausmeier is a Democrat, she has voted with Hogan on multiple key issues, including paid sick leave and expanding voting rights for people convicted of felonies who are on parole.

While Klausmeier has voted with Hogan on such issues, Miele brought attention to her votes on 2016's "Road Kill Bill" and this year's bill that strips the Board of Public Works (BPW) of its oversight of school construction projects.

Since Hogan took office in 2014, he and BPW member Comptroller Peter Franchot (D) have warred with Baltimore County officials over capital projects surrounding air conditioning in Baltimore County Public Schools and other capital projects, like the construction of new high schools.

"The reality is that the Senator cast the deciding vote on at least two occasions to override Governor Hogan's vetoes," said Miele, highlighting that there are currently overcrowding issues in schools in the Eighth District.

"Am I going to agree 100 percent of the time? No," said Klausmeier. "But if it's good for the people of this district it's what I'll do."

Klausmeier said that the SDCC mailer was simply Democrats helping Democrats, much like how a Republican committee sent out a mailer earlier this year claiming she was "making it easier to get heroin than ice cream."

In 2014, Hogan won Baltimore County with 59 percent of the vote and the Eighth District with almost twothirds of the vote. Klausmeier won with 61 percent.

Creek to tackle the challenge. Other schools, like Parkville Middle School, predominantly handle the work in-house.

Kristina Eckhardt and Sara Mullin oversee the "green team" at Parkville Middle, which was started two years ago. They have since been certified as a green school by the state.

"We've done a lot," said Mullin. "We sold tomato plants last year at our STEAM night and grew them over the summer."

This year they plan to focus on composting and building a butterfly garden, which would be the perfect projects for their \$1,500 grant to be

"The budget for the butterfly garden is pretty extensive," said Eckhardt. "We've been waiting for something like this to come along.

Aside from General John Stricker and Parkville Middle, other area winners receiving \$1,500 grants include Chesapeake Terrace Elementary and Battle Monument School. Bear Creek Elementary, Edgemere Elementary and Perry Hall Middle School all received iPads for their efforts.

Councilwoman Cathy Bevins (D-6) stressed the importance of this initiative for the east side in particular.

'Our watershed comes all the way out to Harford Road, so every piece of paper, every water bottle, every cigarette butt, everything that hits the ground eventually goes to the rivers, and those rivers lead to the bay," said Bevins, thanking the students for participating.

The 2018 program resulted in 338 cleanups conducted by 5,057 volunteers who picked up 3,741 bags of litter.

# Social principles lead Piney Grove UMC to advocate for, lend voice to pets

Piney Grove Methodist Church members have been gathering in informal prayer circles each Sunday this summer, asking God for some guidance for the Bowleys Quarters church.

"We've been going outside after services, holding hands and praying," Pastor Christine Kumar told the East County Times. "We've been asking, 'God, what is your vision for our church? How can we be a better neighbor? What more can we do in our community?""

One vision that was borne of the prayer sessions will become a reality on Sept. 29, when, in cooperation with sister church Cowenton UMC, Piney Grove will host its first Pet Blessing Fair.

The two congregations have joined forces to create a comprehensive pet fair that will include pet blessings, a memorial service for pets that have died and information regarding adopting and fostering pets and low-cost or free spay/neuter and vaccination programs available.

"According to our United Methodist social princi-

ples, taking care of our earth and all living things on that earth is our responsibility," Kumar said. "And pets are such a big part of our lives; we believe it's important to advocate and provide a voice for our animals."

The church has an obligation to advocate for the oppressed who can't speak for themselves, Kumar believes, and she and church members consider animals a part of that group.

"This festival will have many purposes," Piney Grove member Colleen Shaneybrook said. "There are many people who are struggling to take care of their animals for a variety of reasons, and we want to connect those people with the resources that will allow them to take better care of their loved pets and keep them in their families."

Piney Grove already runs a community food pantry in cooperation with Chase United Methodist Church, and members hope to start collecting pet food to provide the service to four-legged family members, according to Shaneybrook.

The church also is collecting blankets and towels,

# **New luxury apartments on track for White Marsh**

The planned Avenue Grand high-end apartments in White Marsh are one step closer to becoming reality following a public hearing last week on the development plan.

If approved as expected, the 324 one- and twobedroom units will add to the supply of new luxury apartments in the area that includes the Arbors and Berkleigh complexes in the emerging Crossroads area off White Marsh Boulevard (MD 43) in Middle River.

A ruling by a county administrative law judge on the plan is expected in a few weeks.

Developed by Chesapeake Realty Partners of Owings Mills, the Avenue Grand project on 12.4 mostly cleared acres off Sandpiper Circle next to the White Marsh library includes four five-story buildings in an area of existing three-story office buildings.

The County Council passed legislation last year that allows residential buildings in what was originally planned as the White Marsh office park that also includes the nearby White Marsh mall and Avenue retail areas.

Rents are expected to start at about \$1,500 a month, which is similar to Chesapeake Realty Partners' Winthrop luxury apartments off Dulaney Valley Road in central Towson.

The Avenue Grand apartments are designed to appeal to people in their mid-20s to mid-30s and to older people without children. No units will be set aside for

subsidized housing vouchers or workforce housing.

The plan includes a 10,000-square-foot clubhouse, a pool and pavilions in an open area in the center of the complex.

Chesapeake Realty Partners agreed to pay the county \$45,000 in lieu of providing additional required open

The plan also includes 324 outdoor parking spaces, plus 66 indoor garage spaces in several enclosed onestory buildings equipped with doors.

Fullerton Elementary, the closest elementary school, is overcrowded, but the newly opened Victory Villa Elementary school across Interstate 95 in Middle River is expected to absorb any students generated by the complex.

A resident at the hearing commented that the height of the buildings would appear "overpowering" to someone coming out of the library.

However, an engineer for the project said the buildings would be set 20 feet down into a slope on the property and that they would not look out of place in relation to the surrounding business park.

A representative of the library noted heavy traffic congestion at the Sandpiper Circle and Honeygo Boulevard intersection, especially during rush hour.

The engineer replied the intersection has the county's top A rating for handling traffic flow and that the county has not asked for any road improvements as part of the project.

"It is my prayer that this will also result in our members going to volunteer at local animal shelters," Kumar said. "I pray that we reach out and get involved in that advocacy."


The fair will also include retail vendors offering a variety of pet supplies and gifts, so visitors might even get some holiday shopping done for their "fur babies."

"I am looking forward to the pet blessing, where I will lay my hand on the pet and say an individual prayer over each one," she said. "And we will hold a very short memorial service for any pet that has passed away — we will remember them like any loved one."

On Tuesday, Spatafore was effusive in her gratitude to Pastor Terry Turbin, who allowed the group to use Sonshine free of charge for nearly nine years, and to Pastor Jeffrey Tomlinson of Church of God of Dundalk, where the Angels organization hopes to hang its hat until its services are no longer needed.

"We are very happy with this outcome," Spatafore said of the move. "And we are very grateful to Pastor Terry for everything he did for us while we were at Sonshine."

On Monday, Spatafore and "some brawny men" from Wells-McComas VFW Post 2678 cleaned the classroom space at Church of God in anticipation of moving everything out of Sonshine.

"This is a classroom that hasn't been used in I don't know how many years, so we cleaned, and we were given a couple of racks that we cleaned and covered with shelf paper," she said.

Sonshine's Turbin is going to provide the group with six surplus pews to use as benches for their packing assembly line, according to Spatafore.

"At Sonshine, we used six, 24-foot pews for our boxes and our packing, but those won't fit in the new space," Spatafore said. "So Pastor Terry said he can give us some smaller ones."

Turbin told the *Times* earlier this month that while Sonshine had of-

ficially asked Angels to move and gave them a deadline, it was never the church's intention to throw the group to the street; church officials just wanted to make sure Spatafore was actively looking for another place to meet.

"It's been a blessing to have her here," Turbin said of Spatafore.

For her part, Spatafore said she is "forever grateful" for the generosity that Sonshine bestowed upon Angels — a generosity that has allowed a small band of volunteers to collect, store, pack and send more than 11,000 pounds per year of small but vital items to American troops serving in war zones.


"We couldn't have done this all these years without Sonshine," she said.

Spatafore, her Angel volunteers and her brawny VFW men have a lot of work ahead of them to get the new space prepared, materials and supplies moved from one place to the other and the old space cleaned and handed back to Sonshine.



# **Disturbance on The Avenue** leaves man injured

A man suffered a stab wound to his lower body during a disturbance at The Avenue at White Marsh following the closing of area restaurants in the early morning hours on Sept. 14.

Police were called to The Avenue at 8125 Honeygo Boulevard for a disturbance after fights began to break out outside the area restaurants as they were closing around 1:47 a.m. Emergency dispatchers received additional information that gunshots were heard in the area and that a 28-year-old man was injured and driven to an area hospital.

Officers responded and secured the area while the Baltimore County Police Violent Crimes Unit Responded. Hospital staff determined that the man actually suffered a non-life-threatening stab wound to the lower body, not a gunshot wound. No one at the location of The Avenue during the incident was found to be injured as a result of a gunshot wound.

The Violent Crimes Unit is continuing to investigate this incident and asks that anyone with information contact police by calling 410-307-2020.

# Home invasion leads to shooting in Parkville

A shooting in the unit block of Solar Circle left one man injured on the night of Sept. 11.

Police received the call for shots fired around 7:42 p.m. When they arrived in the area they found an adult male suffering a gunshot wound to the leg. He was treated at the scene and transported to an area hospital. He is expected to survive his injury.

Police are still investigating the circumstances surrounding the shooting but have preliminary information that the victim and suspect may have been engaged in a verbal argument precipitating the shooting. The suspect fled the area before police were called.

The Baltimore County Police Violent Crimes Unit will continue the investigation into this incident. Anyone with information on this shooting is asked to contact police by calling 410-307-2020.

# **County Fire Dept. members** deployed to Carolinas

Five Baltimore County Fire Department members remain in the Carolinas, assisting with rescue operations related to catastrophic flooding caused by Hurricane Florence.

Two of those members - Fire Lt. Michael Szczesniakowsi and Fire Lt. Brandon Watkins - are deployed with the Pennsylvania Task Force 1 (PATF-1), a FEMA Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) Team based in Philadelphia.

They were activated Sept. 10 and now are working with the National Guard in Dillon, SC, assisting with water rescues and evacuations.

A third member of PATF-1 who deployed last week, Fire Capt. Kelvin Seigle, returned early due to a personal emergency.

Three BCoFD personnel who are members of the Maryland Helicopter Aquatic Rescue Team (MD-HART) were deployed under mutual aid agreements and currently are positioned at a base of operations in Raleigh, NC.

As of Sept. 17, MDHART members have been engaged in missions.

Fire Lt. David Gouak, EMT/FF Shane Sierakowski and EMT/FF Andrew Hays are specially trained rescue personnel who work with the Maryland Army National Guard and engage in helicopter-based rescue missions under difficult conditions.



The 1980s were certainly fun for many folks. I had a good time, immersing myself in the music, movies, TV shows, and pop culture of the time. I was also the same age as the title character in "White Boy Rick." And when I say "character," I mean the very real person who was Ricky Wershe, who between 1984 and 1987 went from being a low-level street hustler to an FBI informant to a drug kingpin all before he could legally drink and vote. By contrast, during those years, I watched an excessive amount of Stephen J. Cannell shows. Why does he get a movie?!

When the '80s were good for Ricky, they were really good. He was certainly getting

paid in full. But he lived in crime-ridden, inner-city Detroit. His father, Rick (Matthew McConaughey), had dreams of being a video store owner and funding that dream with illegal gun sales. His mother abandoned them years earlier, and his teenage sister Dawn (Bel Powley) was a drug addict. But at least White Boy Rick had gold chains and Run-DMC playing on the boom box!

But he also had the feds breathing down his neck, using his father's inept gun running as leverage to get him to participate in controlled drug buys to get the goods on local crime lord Johnny (Jonathan Majors), who was engaged to the niece of Detroit's suspected crooked mayor. In the movie as in real life, this all leads to Ricky becoming a drug dealer for

his own profit after learning the ins and outs of the cocaine biz.

"White Boy Rick" is at its best when it's focused on Ricky and his family, which also includes bickering grandparents played by Bruce Dern and Piper Laurie. McConaughey's Rick has dreams of being a player and spouts enough motivational gibberish to convince Ricky for a while that his old man knows what he's talking about. But when it comes down to it, Rick's best moves are to sell handguns to suburban housewives out of the trunk of his car.

Ricky, on the other hand, is supposed to be this guy who goes from a green kid making his first street deal with Johnny to a valued member of the man's crew to one of the top dealers on the street. He's played by Dundalk's own Richie Merritt, who's making his screen debut here, and the young actor just isn't up to carrying a film. And once Ricky decides to be a criminal himself and not an FBI pawn, the film becomes sloppy, rushed, and jumps ahead in the true-life story to find Ricky fully established with street cred and a hard nose for the drug trade.

Part of the problem is director Yann Demange is making a film here in which Ricky is too sympathetic a character. He never gets called to task for his greed, his unforced criminal activity, and his complete lack of conscience in stringing out other people on cocaine after enduring years with his sister as an addict. It's more an anti-FBI film, calling out the Bureau (and


the Detroit PD) for transforming Ricky into the monster he became and then washing their hands of him when he played ball and got the goods on the bad guys they'd been hunting for years.

This is all really too complex for a twohour movie. "White Boy Rick" truly needed to be an eight- or 10-episode series on HBO or Netflix. Some potentially great characters get marginalized. And the whole thing feels a little too safe in spots for my tastes. Rarely are we made to feel any sense of real risk or danger for Ricky as he goes about setting up Johnny's crew. And we're never invited into his inner psyche to see if he had any misgivings or any sense of guilt over his actions.

And that's too bad. Because most of the cast came to play here, especially McConaughey stepping back into a supporting role and giving a fine, nuanced performance of a failed father and husband who's still clinging to good ol' American optimism. Powley, meanwhile, is quite impressive as his drug-addicted daughter. It really looks like the crew gave her actual

The real-life story is certainly one to read up on online. So, the film does its job in getting you to show interest in Ricky's tragic case. But I wanted to be more than interested. I wanted to be moved, compelled, even angered. I just wasn't.

"White Boy Rick" is rated R for language throughout, violence, drug content, some sexual references, and brief nudity.




