Cummings new director of Aitkin's rebranded HOPE

To celebrate life, Megan (pronounced Mee gan) Cummings turned 40 and celebrated her 19th wedding anniversary at the end of September with a gathering of family and friends at the Green Lantern, owned by her cousin Carl Larson.

"It's time to celebrate life," she noted.

Cummings is the new director for Aitkin's HOPE. Healing Opportunities Provided Equally is the former

Advocates Against Domestic Abuse in Aitkin.

Cummings has been on board throughout 2018. "We don't want to focus on what we're working against, domestic violence," she explained in an interview. "We want to bring positive healing and hope to everyone who comes through our door. If they can find a tiny bit of hope in their situation we can help them through it."

Also the director of the Cuyuna Range Youth Center,

Cummings and her husband Tony, who works for Anderson Brothers Construction, are raising four offspring aged 11, 13, 15 and 17.

She had an old-fashioned upbringing in the Pine Center area where she could ride her bike to her grandparents' dairy farm and her relatives, the Kraklaus and Larson families, surrounded them. Her children have the same experience, living close to extended family out in the country.

Cummings organizes the bloodmobile for the Pine Center area and is a coach and president of the Pierz Youth Fastpitch Softball League for girls aged third through 12th grades.

About HOPE's programs

Cummings has the challenging task of raising funds to pay salaries for herself and two full-time advocates as well as keeping up two buildings.

Darla Belgen is the legal advocate with eight years of experience in Aitkin. Amanda Johnson, advocate, has been on board since April.

"We are a very close-knit, like minded team – working very well together," Cummings said of the staff.

The advocates do direct client services, prevention and youth programs and Cummings oversees operations, staff training and support. "It's very important that I support my staff and they practice

self-care," she explained. "I cannot provide any services without them so my staff is my top priority. Their top priority is our clients."

HOPE provides advocacy, assisting with legal matters and navigating the judicial system; supervised family visitation, support groups at the local jail and at the HOPE headquarters and a crisis line that is answered 24/7. They also provide secure temporary and transitional housing for families in crisis and can furnish such items as toiletries, diapers, clothing, food and gasoline. "Some families come to us with nothing," she noted.

Cummings said she is very excited about two recent happenings. One is that the playground at HOPE was completely refurbished top to bottom thanks to an anonvmous donation from a family. Another is that there are starting up a supervised family visitation program again and have signed a Memorandum of Understanding agreement with Aitkin County for safe parent-child visitations.

HOPE has rebranded the program inside and out. They have a new name and logo and have fixed up and refurbished their physical space with help from Habitat for Humanity, Pearl Crisis Center team, HOPE board of directors and staff and Aitkin County Sentence to Serve.

"We worked really hard to change the environment to reflect calmness and a **Continued on Page 2**



but all items must be new, not used, and all are carefully organized.


Cummings is working hard to network and build community partnerships, hosting an open house this spring and reaching sustainable into the future. out to local law enforcement.



Local fish passage project funding

On September 10, local erberg; Crow Wing County partners went to the Capitol in pursuit of Clean Water, Land and Legacy Funds to restore fish passage in the Lower Pine River. In 1970, a rock dam was constructed downstream of Big Pine Lake to protect the aquatic plant community and fisheries but it blocked fish migration. Today, these partners are working to replace that dam with natural rock riffles. If funded, this project will reopen fish passage to vital upstream resources.

Partners included Crosslake Mayor, Patty Norgaard; Soil and Water Conservation District Project Manager, Beth Hippert; Big Lake Association President, Ken Ormsbee; Project Engineer William WestAssistant Hwy Engineer Rob Hall; and DNR Fisheries Specialist Owen Baird. The group attended a special hearing with the Lessard Sams Council Outdoor Heritage Council to request \$1.2 million for the project. Members of the Council, appointed by the Governor and Legislature are charged with allocating \$118 million dollars for projects that will restore, protect, and enhance wetlands, prairies, forest and habitat for fish, game, and wildlife. The \$1.2 million requested to fund this project will restore, protect, and enhance habitat for fish and other aquatic life.

It will also help rebuild ecologically healthy fish & mussel communities in the river system that includes the Mississippi, lakes, feeder

streams and wetlands the dam blocks. The riffles are engineered to open the system, restoring natural flows, spawning habitat, and in-stream cycling. This design will help walleye, smallmouth bass, other bait fish, mussels and more by expanding spawning habitat and access to the resources needed for each stage of their growth. All stream life will have cradle to grave access to resources; from fish larvae, to fry, to adults to species dependent on them for food and prey. Recreational use will also be improved with passage for kayaks and canoes!

The Council's recommendations will go to the 2019 legislature for review and final approval.

Crosby citizen Randolph rails against free speech at council meeting

At the Crosby council meeting on Monday September 24, the council was one short. Council-member Paul Heglund was not in attendance.

Kevin Randolph, dressed in street clothing, identified himself as a private citizen and was the only individual to present for the public comment portion of the meeting. Following is a complete transcript of what Randolf said.

"My comments tonight," said Randolph, "are about a subject that's not new, but this is the first time I've kind of chimed in on the subject. And that's the ongoing attacks against the City of Crosby and the Crosby Police Department and the Crosby City Council by Kelly Avelsgard, resident of Deerwood. Um, I've chosen to stay out of this debate for a long time even though, I am frequently one of the primary subjects of those attacks. Um, I'd like to start off just briefly thanking Linda Peeples, of the Courier, for her editorial that she put in the paper this week, um, explaining several of the problems and obvious falsehoods of these attacks and

no longer going to print any more letters from Kelly Avelsgard. In this several month long continuous attack, um, one of the primary reasons that I've decided to speak out tonight, is that, ah, over the last several months, we have had a number of complaints against individual officers that have come in to me that I have investigated. I've found the complaints, after thorough investigation, to be completely unfounded. And when I tell the complainants and present my facts to them, they always seem to make the same comment, well your just a bunch of corrupt cops anyway. Ah, that's a very dangerous belief. That's not only untrue, but it puts the officers at risk and it puts the citizens of Crosby at risk. This, ah, person, Kelly Avelsgard, claims that he is interested in the safety of Crosby, but he is in fact not. Um, it's very obvious that this is a political campaign that he is running for a particular candidates. And it is a very dangerous way to run a political campaign. It is become so egregious and

declaring that the Courier is has attracted several state agencies, um, the Bureau of Mediation Services, who is in charge of arbitrations has expressed their concerns and is looking into the situation. The State Auditor Rebecca Otto called Linda Peeples, after her article after her editorial appeared, and thanked her for putting in the facts and clarifying some of the things that have been printed in there. And the League of Minnesota Cities, which carries Crosby's insurance, as well as insurance for cities around the state, contacted the City of Crosby and urged the targets of this attack campaign to consult with private attorneys and investigate the possibility for liable, for a liable suit against the author.

"Last council meeting, we sat in here and council member Paul Heglund engaged in a spirited debate with Mr. Eric Heglund, um, the owner and publisher of the NewsHopper. And, um, basically, Eric Heglund's defense against these letters was that he was only the messenger. He doesn't participate; he prints all letters that get submitted to the Courier. We know in fact that he doesn't print all letters because. ah, Marylee Abrams."

Mayor Bob Novak corrected private citizen Randolph "get submitted to the NewsHop-

Private citizen Randolph continued, "Oh, I'm sorry, to the NewsHopper, thank you.

"He doesn't print them all, because the city's attorney printed a very succinct and very in depth counter to the attacks by Kelly Avelsgard and it went unprinted in the Hopper for over a month, despite several phone calls and emails, and it finally had to be resubmitted before it was printed. And that's just one example of letters we know that have been sent in, that don't get printed.

"Um, in this weeks NewsHopper, ah there is another letter from Kelly Avelsgard, um, but first off, I'd like to point out that right next to the letter from Kelly Avelsgard. There's a big bold block that says. 'NewsHopper deadlines are Monday at noon.'

"Not too long ago the City of Crosby tried to submit a news article on an award that I had won, a very prestigious award, and we submitted it to the NewsHopper on Monday afternoon and were told that it would not be in for another additional week. The reason being was that we had missed the noon deadline. It was pointed out that this wasn't the letter to the editor that this was a press release from the city, an official press release. We were told, well, news actually has to be submitted the Friday before. This Monday deadline only counts for ads and letters to the editor. And so it's right there next to Kelly Avelsgard's letter. And let me read you the first paragraph of Kelly Avelsgard's letter entitled, 'Shining Endorsement'.

"'The letter from an employee of the Courier and the City of Crosby stating they will no longer publish my letters, is a shining endorsement that I am telling the truth.'

"He is referring to the, obviously, the article that Linda wrote, saying that the Courier would no longer be publishing his articles. That newspaper hit the stands Wednesday morning about 36 hours before this would have to go to press. So not only was that deadline waived for Mr. Avelsgard. If you look above Councilman Heglund's letter has the little tail end of it 'sent via Linda Peeples email'. Paul Heglund asked, submitted his letter to the Courier. Asked Linda, if she would use her personal email to email it over to the NewsHopper. The NewsHopper didn't need to put on that it came from Linda Peeples private email. But it nicely ties in the fact that, ah, Paul has an association with Linda who is immediately attacked in the next paragraph of Mr. Avelsgard's, um, thing. So either Mr. Avelsgard is psychic, which I haven't met him, and most of the people that I know have not met this man, ah, or Mr. Heglund is actively participating with Mr. Avelsgard in this attack campaign. And again, I repeat dangerous attack campaign against the

City of Crosby. "I know that I have consulted a private attorney to investigate the possibility of liable. I would suspect that the other people that work for the City

of Crosby may investigate the same thing. Um, I would suggest in their conversations with their attorney, they, ah, look into the possibility of a publisher who is actively participating in an attack campaign and what the ramifications for that might be."
