



Dear "Speak Out,"

My name is Edward Kenney I have over 40 years combined service as a police officer for NYS, in Mount Morris and Village of Geneseo. I retired two years ago as the overnight/weekend shift supervisor (Lieutenant) at SUNY Alfred, a university with approximately 3000 resident students.

The only reasonable solution to the traffic problem on Main Street is to hire more officers and return our PD to its full-time status. There are options of course like speed cameras. However, be prepared to pay a vendor to administrate the program and the cost of signage. Red light cameras might give people pause, but be prepared for more fees and more signs. About 50% of the money will not go to the village and the systems often lose effectiveness within a couple of years, but we will still be paying fees to the vendor. The most serious drawback is that a sign cannot respond to your call for help.

We really need to get back the 7p-11p patrol car so that officers can once again check the doors of the businesses then go write tickets and assist where needed. I am old enough to remember the old triple A-trip ticks. Every one I ever saw had "SPEED STRICTLY ENFORCED" stamped in red all over Mount Morris. Unfortunately, the village board decided to vote themselves a raise and short the PD at every turn.

I find it amusing how the village fathers are so willing to poo-poo our plight. Unfortunately, chin pulling and head bobbing will not get it done. FIFTEEN THOUSAND cars a day go through our village. Our village fathers wanted to park on Main Street like they do in Geneseo. Any Police Officer will tell you that Route 36 is a New York State access highway and they can haul any length, width and height they can get down the road. That is precisely why you see all the big equipment come through the village and precisely why you have to parallel park on Main Street. This board is not attentive to the potential hazards involved.

A few years ago the Board authorized officers to go to special tractor trailer enforcement school, but it was only lip service. They never funded any money for it afterward. I can imagine the hue and cry of our residents when a tractor trailer of methyl-ethyldeath overturns and erupts into a mushroom cloud of noxious death at Main and Barone. Where was the PD? Reduced to less than viable and allowed to wither on the vine while the village fathers dance off to the bank. We are the Best Town by a Dam Site. Unfortunately, with terrorism threats and the largest concrete gravity dam east of the Mississippi, we need a local PD to observe suspicious comings and goings.

We need a board that is responsive to the residents. In my opinion, this Board is killing the PD with a thousand cuts. The bleeding has begun. A recent candidate for the part-time Chief job was hired by the mayor and ready to be sworn in. The Officers at the PD intervened at the last minute and thwarted the hiring of a candidate with no supervision experience and also of dubious character. Neither the mayor nor the board called his former employer for any background at all. Is this the action of a board that has our best interest at heart?

I know Rich White, the new part-time and I hope temporary Chief. I know and like Rich but we need to get back to a full-time Chief ASAP. Rich has a solid reputation and will provide a steady experienced hand in guiding the PD. As it stands now the PD is way ahead of last year's numbers in tickets. But that is what cops do, even when working short staffed, because they care about their community.

The investment in Main Street by Mr. O'Connell has improved all our lives. Maybe we have turned a corner. A local PD will go a long way to improving our quality of life as well as property values. Do you really think that any favors gained by getting rid of the PD by our village fathers will translate to better and faster police response for you?

Alas, the more things change the more they remain the same, The village board tried to get rid of the PD before. I see some of the same familiar faces on the board now. A prominent citizen once said that we needed a PD just not the PD we got. I agree. I also know that the fish rots from the head. The only thing that will save the village and the PD is to end this slipshod Persian bazaar, What's in it for me? way of doing business.

Recalling that time, the amount of the estimated repair was near \$70,000. The church members and pastor were aware that a member congregation of about 50 would not be able to afford this repair. "Many hands make light work" was true for this project. Hearts and brains from the entire community were responsible for the First Presbyterian Church doors to be open for all to enjoy. On the Federals observance of Veterans Day in November of 1993, everyone gathered to witness the ingenuity of creative workers lift a steel beam at the top of the structure to strengthen the entire church after slowly jacking the walls. It was a glorious day with workers from as far as Virginia coming to help with all the details that needed to be in order before the large machine from Rochester arrived to place the beam.



It worked! The church was able to continue to serve the community and the community continues to serve by attending our many fund raising events.

Each year a community picnic is held in August at the Tuscarora Park where this year over 70 attended and music provided.




