Laurel's Russell Delk pens first children's book: "The Adventure of Smelly Sock"

If you don't have the book, your kids are missing out – and you could be too! I mean, do you know what to say to your lamp stand or your refrigerator? Do you talk to them now? So, how did Delk leap into the business of publishing conversations between socks and appliances and other objects? Well, he does like



The central character, Smelly Sock, was free to engage in conversations and activities with inanimate objects around Russell's house or ones from his childhood, like the family's old Snapper lawn mower; even animate creatures, like his childhood dog, have been weaved into certain scenes



As much as the younger Delk loves the creative process, he discovered that there were some obstacles that slowed the channeling of an idea from the mind to ink on paper.

Walk into local fabric store, Let's Make Something, on any given day, and you'll notice that you feel like family as soon as you step across the door's threshold. Owner Tammy Robinson has set up a shop that will take you back to a time when things seemed simpler, and you're sure to become fast friends as you spend time shopping

Let's Make Something opened its doors in March of 2015, after Tammy chose to leave a career in banking after 27 years. While that may seem like a daunting leap to some, Tammy says she knew right from the start that God was opening the door for her to begin her own business. "Everything began to

fall into place for the store to open," Tammy said. "From the location to finding sales reps to God sending me an encourager every day while we were in the planning stages."

Tammy moved to Sandersville, Mississippi from New Jersey when she was just

five, so she calls Jones County home. Ask her why she chose this business, and she'll tell you that she can't remember a time when she didn't sew. When Tammy was a young teenager, her father had surgery. He needed to have something to do inside the house while he was recovering, so he quilted. This was Tammy's first introduction to the world of quilting.

Tammy also had a friend who quilted and that friend taught her even more. Tammy said that her neighbor had a long arm quilting machine, and she had to have one, so now she does in her own home. While encouragement was poured into Tammy during the planning process and the business's beginning, you'll find her to be a true blessing herself and one of the most caring people you'll ever meet. She shows love to others through her teaching and her generosity. "I love helping and encouraging customers shop collects quilts for the Jones County Sheriff's Department to be placed in deputy vehicles and

Tammy has also been given the opportunity to work each month with ladies going through addiction recovery typically through small projects. She said, "It is always fun to see their faces when they make something for the first time. I never leave them without a full heart." 




The Mustangs have yet to allow a score in region play thus far and has four total shutout wins this season.
