Dear "Speak Out,"

Since two "Speak Out" columns were centered on the traffic problems through the Village, I can't resist tossing another potato into the soup. I have a unique view of the topic. On Sunday, September 2, I had just entered my truck, parked in front of the hardware store, when 3 Canadian tanker tractor trailers raced by doing 50-60 mph. One came within 2-3 inches of taking my driver's side rear view mirror off. Anyone doing a right on red turn off State Street or Chapel Street would not have had a chance.

Fatal traffic accidents have happened in our Village. In the late 1960's the high school principal was killed when his car was struck at the corner of Clark Street and Main by a speeding truck. In the late 1970's a nurse walking to work on Chapel Street was killed by a tractor trailer. In nearby York, a Mount Morris school guidance counselor was killed when his car was struck by a tractor trailer on Route 36 (Main Street). Recently there was a serious truck accident on Main Street.

Traffic through the Village has been a problem at least since the 1960's when increased through-traffic was noticed. One suggestion was to build a through-traffic bypass around the Village. That was met with almost universal disapproval.

In the mid 1970's I was the State archaeologist in charge of field crews between East Avon and Dansville for the Genesee Expressway Project (Route 390). There were 3 primary proposed routes for the road. The first route would have connected in Henrietta and gone along the ridge on the east side of Conesus Lake and on to Dansville. A straight line. That was too logical. The second route was along the west side ridge at Conesus Lake with a state rest stop at the Groveland Ambuscade State historical site. Locals did not want to be inundated by tourists or have to deal with increased traffic. The third, and least logical route, was to bring it an additional 5 miles around Geneseo and diagonally across the valley to the Southwest corner of Dansville . . . through the best agricultural land in the state . . . that brought it close to the Village but away from those with a "not in my back yard" attitude and political influence. That resulted in an embarassing situation and a one year hiatus in construction because the Pioneer Road bridge was sinking! They quietly brought in an European engineer who had solved similar problems in Africa. They had built a heavy cement bridge and road over a large underground fresh water lake! Another bad idea was to create a "wildfowl pond" on farm land next to the Village . . . a swamp! . . . I don't even think that the planners considered air pollution, dust, light or noise pollution issues.

The expressway cost a million dollars a mile (pre inflation dollars) when it was built. Millions of tons of dirt taken from road cuts was trucked across the state as fill for development projects in Long Island. The road was not even funded as an "expressway". It was funded as a "federal military highway".

Traffic enforcement . . . I do not believe that the traffic problem is an issue of non enforcement or over enforcement. Rather, it is an issue of changing traffic patterns. Even before the English settled here, Mount Morris was at the crossroads of the areas main French roads. Olean Road, River Road and Big Tree/Louisville (Tonawanda/Ft. Niagara) roads. Mount Morris sits squarely on a major traditional travel route. Unfortunetly that location has never been an economic advantage. Many local merchants must feel like the Maytag repairman.

Getting back to speed enforcement . . . I spent 13 years in law enforcement/government service. I was a Mount Morris police officer, a deputy sheriff, and a regional supervisor for a Federal agency. There is a balance point between maintaining personal freedoms and rightful and ethical enforcement of laws. Stopping everything that moves or has a license plate light out is probably not the answer. I once gave several tickets to a drunk guy going 95 in a 30 on Main Street. His actions and those of the Canadian

drivers are inexcusable and major safety issues. Mount Morris is not the only community with this problem. Garbage tractor trailers race down Skaneatlas's Main Street coming and going from the Geneva and Waterloo mega landfills trying to save a few minutes of travel time. Recently we saw an elderly man and woman parked in a white convertible Rolls Royce get drenced in garbage juice by a speeding truck. Here, sometimes it takes several minutes to safely pull out on to Main Street.

There is an urban legend of sorts that "way back" Canadian drivers who got tickets in the U.S. did not get those tickets used as points against their Canadian driver's licenses or insurance. If that is true, Provincial officials need to change that.

The traffic problem needs to be studied by TRAFFIC experts, not by politicians or those who have a chicken in the fight.

'No Designation' in 2017 Fiscal Stress Scores

Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle recently announced that the County received "no designation" in the 2017 Fiscal Stress Scores from the Office of the New York State Comptroller. The marking of "no designation" is the best a local government can receive in the scores.

The County's 2017 Fiscal Stress Score was 3.3%, with an Environmental Score of 23.3%. The Fiscal Stress Scores were a continued improvement from 2 years ago, with the County earning a score of 9.6% in 2015 and 6.3% in 2016.

"The 2017 Fiscal Stress Scores are validation of the County's budget measures and fiscally-sound financial controls," said Coyle, who is also the County's Chief Budget Officer. "These scores show that the Board of Supervisors, Elected Officials, Department Heads, County workforce and I take seriously the responsibility we hold to the taxpayers to make sure our County is on sound financial footing."

Livingston County's score of 3.3% is lower acrossthe-board to all comparative sub-groups. The average score for all counties in the state was 17.7%, while for Finger Lakes counties it was 11.0%, according to the report.
