Middlesex Elementary teacher asks for help, Lions roar their assistance

Eastern Baltimore Countians are known for responding when a plea for help goes out.

It doesn't matter if an individual needs help with rent, a food pantry needs some last minute donations or an organization needs volunteers eastsiders have a reputation for stepping up and accepting the challenge.

Such was the case when Middlesex Elementary School teacher Donna Krach put word out that she wanted to start an after-school service club that would teach students to sew while making products that would benefit local residents in need.

Needing pretty much everything she would need to start such a club — including sewing machines, thread and scissors, she put out word through Facebook that she would accept sewing machines that people had sitting around, going unused.

Enter the Eastern Regional Lions

"The post came across my news feed and I immediately thought that would be something the Lions Club might be interested in helping with," club Treasurer Paul Rufe told the East County Times. "And we had a meeting the next week so we invited Donna to come and make her presentation."

In the mean time, Rufe talked several times with Krach to see exactly what she needed and started doing some pricing in advance.

"If the club was interested in helping, I wanted to be able to tell members what it would cost instead of waiting another month to get it going," Rufe said. "School was starting and it just seemed timely to get the club going as soon as possible."

County Charter amendments on the ballot

Early voting starts today, which means that Baltimore County voters can start to cast their ballots for the next county executive, other candidates running for office and several significant changes to the county charter.

On the ballot are six questions that propose to amend the 51-page charter, a document last updated in 1990 that outlines the structure of county, including the powers and responsibilities of the executive (County Executive) and legislative (County Council) branches.

Councilman David Marks (R-5), who represents Perry Hall, Carney and Towson, won Council support in 2017 for the creation of an 11-member appointed Charter Review Commission to review the charter and recommend any changes to the County Council.

Voters can vote for or against the amendments, three of which focus mostly on clarifications, updated wording and other technical changes. However, three other questions address more substantive changes involving public comment about Council legislation, compensation for top administrators and expanded responsibilities of the Department of Public Works beyond roads and streets to include bikeways and transit options.

"The most important change is to extend the lifetime of a bill, as it will give the public — and Councilmembers — more opportunity to review legislation," Marks wrote in an email.

"Right now, if we can't get a bill just right, we have to introduce it again," he wrote. "The other critical change is to create a clear system for developing a salary scale for exempt employees.

Tradepoint Atlantic planning upgrades to local access roads

The redevelopment of the former Bethlehem Steel mill in Sparrows Point is expected to also include upgrades to two main roads running into the site from nearby Dundalk and Edgemere.

A new traffic signal is planned at Peninsula Expressway and Reservoir Road in an area of new development pending extension of sewer line, and improvements are also envisioned in an existing industrial and commercial area near the end of North Point Boulevard where it becomes Sparrows Point Boulevard.

"This is the stretch of road that runs past Micky's [bar and gas station], Pizza Roma, 7-11 [and], Subway ...," wrote Aaron Tomarchio, Tradepoint's senior vice president for administration and corporate affairs, in an email.

"We are looking at making safety and beautification enhancements," Tomarchio said about ideas to reconfigure turn lanes, install curbs and gutters and enhance the area visually.

"If funding is identified, we will be working with SHA [State Highway Administration], Baltimore County and local businesses to discuss potential plans," he wrote.

Tomarchio and other Tradepoint officials updated the public about the latest redevelopment efforts at its annual fall open house on Oct. 18.

Road improvements area also planned

for Wharf Road and Riverside Drive running north and south on the Tradepoint property, and a new road will be built across the center of the property to be called Tradepoint Avenue.

Also expected are changes at the Beltways northbound ramp at Bethlehem Boulevard and efforts to relieve truck traffic in the area.

The road upgrades are part of Tradepoint's request to Baltimore County for help to improve and build roads and water and sewer mains to help attract more tenants and related new jobs

Redevelopment of the demolished steel mill started in 2015, and Tradepoint is already home to FedEx, Amazon and Under Armour distribution centers, with space for storing and processing imported cars, said Eric Gilbert, Tradepoint's chief development officer, after the meeting.

Demand for industrial and distribution space is high right now, and Tradepoint is competing with other distribution centers such as the Lehigh Valley around Allentown, Bethlehem and Easton in Pennsylvania, he said.



infrastructure, Tradepoint has asked the county to support a tax increment financing [TIF] plan that would generate up to \$150 million for infrastructure projects.

Over the summer, Tradepoint organized a coalition of more than 40 community and business groups, called Revitalize Sparrows Point, that supports the TIF.

Pending approval by the County Council, the TIF would raise money for Tradepoint through the sale of bonds to institutional investors through the quasi-government agency MEDCO based in Baltimore.

The money would be paid back to the bondholders over time from the increase in property taxes owed to the county that are generated by the rise in value of the redeveloped land.

Should the increase in property taxes not be enough to repay bondholders, Tradepoint Atlantic would have to pay a special tax to cover the amount owed, according to officials. Baltimore County would not be financially responsible for repaying bondholders.

A consultant's study of the economic impact of doing a TIF is expected by the county in a week or two, Tomarchio said.

In the meantime, Tradepoint and the county are also looking at alternative methods of financing the infrastructure upgrades.

"They're looking at another funding option," said Robert Brennan, executive director for MEDCO, on Monday.

Brennan said MEDCO supports the TIF and referred questions about any

other options to Tradepoint and county representatives who declined to provide further details

"These items are still being discussed with The County, so I am unable to elaborate further. ... As soon as we have an update to share, we will," Tomarchio wrote

The county also declined to provide more information about alternatives to a TIF.

"The County and Tradepoint Atlantic continue their active discussions on infrastructure," wrote Fronda Cohen for the county's Department of Economic and Workforce Development.

Any public support for modernizing infrastructure at Sparrows Point must make economic sense for the County and County taxpayers," she wrote. "County

Executive [Don] Mohler is hopeful that this is something we can work through with the County Council, with community input, during this administration."

Should a TIF go forward, Tradepoint and Mohler have said they would like to see County Council approval before a new county executive and any new council members take office in early December following the Nov. 6 elections.

The County Council would hold a hearing to solicit public input about the TIF during one of the Council's work sessions, which are typically held on Tuesdays at 2 p.m., before taking a final vote the following week, according to officials.

While Krach was willing to accept a hodgepodge of used machines that locals might be willing to donate, Rufe thought it would make more sense to get new machines, all of the same make and model, which would make Krach's teaching a little easier.

He found basic, beginner Singer sewing machines at an online retailer for \$90 each, and figured the cost of five machines and all the necessary accessories would cost about \$700.

After Krach made her appeal, the club membership was on board and Krach's after-school service club was

"Oh, my, it was such a generous effort," Krach said of the Lions Club's support. "They literally provided everything I would need to get started the machines, 12 new scissors, seam rippers, pins, some fabric, just everything."

The sewing club, officially a "charitable services club" as far as the school system is concerned, had five members earlier this month, and Krach hopes to pick up more members as word gets out.

The charter members are busy working on lap robes that will be distributed to a local shelter or perhaps a nursing home, according to Krach.

"Right now, the students are practicing pinning and cutting, and figuring out how to place the pieces," Krach said. "Then we will practice on the machines before stitching the pieces together."

Krach has been in love with sewing since the days of her own middle school home economics classes. She also came by the hobby honestly, because her mother was also quite the seamstress, she said.

When she's not teaching 3-year-old pre-schoolers, she attends to a side business doing alterations, hemming and other sewing tasks many consider a lost art.

While her club students will spend the bulk of the school year creating projects to give to others, she also plans to reward them with a project for themselves.

"I'm going to teach them how they can alter a piece of older clothing to upscale it," she said of her

young charges. "They'll learn that they can buy something at a thrift store, perhaps of an older style, and make it new and fresh again."

For its part, the Eastern Regional Lions Club — which is a result of the former Essex and Dundalk clubs merging — is proud of its role in getting the club started.

"It's important for people to know that 100 percent of all money raised by the Lions goes right back into the community," Rufe said. "Every penny we raise, every project we perform, benefits the residents right here in our

The Lions meet the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Denny's restaurant in Essex and the fourth Wednesday of each month at Vinny's Cafe in Dundalk, according to Rufe. Anyone interested in joining is welcome to attend, as well as anyone who might need assistance from the club.

that the County Council can consider a bill before it automatically expires from the current 40 days to 65 days. Right now the council typically votes on bills four weeks after they are introduced.

Supporters argued that the change would extend the time for consideration for complicated or controversial issues, such as the council's decision in 2017 to pass a bill to allow commercial solar arrays on county farmland.

Opponents argued that a council member can reintroduce the bill to allow more debate if a final vote is not taken within 40 days.

Administrator compensation

Question E requires that compensation for some

high-level administrators would be set according to a system adopted or amended by the County Council on the recommendation of the County Executive.

The charter codifies the compensation system for classified hourly and union employees but no such system exists for exempt employees such as the county administrative officer and department heads.

A controversy about the administrative policy of awarding of individually negotiated severance packages to high-level employees erupted in 2017 and led to the proposed charter change initiated by the County Council.

DPW and transportation

Question F, which was initiated by Marks, would expand the transportation responsibilities of the Department of Public Works beyond roads, streets and highways to also include bicycle paths, pedestrian features and transit where appropriate.

Marks worked for the Maryland Department of Transportation from 2003 to 2007 and has also worked in the legislative affairs depart of the Federal Highway Administration.

"We simply do not do enough to encourage more biking, sidewalks, and other ways of moving around," he wrote

Not on ballot

The Charter Review Commission also discussed various other issues but disagreed about whether to support changes and therefore did not recommend them for further review by the County Council.

Bill amendments: Community groups argued that last-minute amendments to council bills just before a final vote that same night should instead be subject to the same notice requirements and chance for public review as the original bill.

Opponents argued that such a change in procedure should be done by the council and not be codified in the charter.

Council seats: Supporters argued that expanding members from seven to nine would result in more compact districts and fewer constituents for members who currently each represent about 115,000 people.

Opponents argued that two more seats would permanently raise staffing costs and that after the 2020 Census could instead be the time to change the number and boundaries of districts.

State jobs: Supporters argued that council members should be allowed to hold state jobs in the same way that state delegates and senators can hold county jobs.

Supporters said that not allowing a council person to work for the state could discourage some residents from running for a seat. Opponents argued that a council member with a state job could result in divided loyalty and conflicts of interest.



Alyssa, 12, lets nothing stop her adventurous nature, despite being born with multiple malformations in both legs, according to her mother, Colleen Rhine.

"When she was born, both of her feet were clubbed, but the right side was more severe, with her foot upside-down and backward," Colleen said. "Her left leg only had one-third of the femur and her knees didn't extend or flex."

This past January, Alyssa had her 18th and 19th leg surgeries, which involved the removal of a rod from her left leg and hardware from her right leg that were placed in previous surgeries.

In spite of severe mobility and flexibility difficulties, Alyssa holds an orange belt in karate, enjoys cheerleading, zip-lining, whitewater rafting and rope-swinging and took tap and ballet lessons for two years. She also is a Cadet in Girl Scout Troop 1004 at Back River United Methodist Church.

"She's very adventurous," Colleen said of the youngest of the family's two children. "We encourage her to get involved in anything she wants."

While Colleen considers her daughter an every day hero just because of the daily challenges she overcomes, Aylssa became a hero in the rescue sense on an unassuming, otherwise normal day in July 2017.

Alyssa was a camper at Adventure Amputee Camp in North Carolina for the first time that summer. The camp session had ended and because the family's hotel room wasn't yet ready, they decided to hang out at the



"I was in the pool and noticed a little toddler, about three or four, running all around the deck," Alyssa said. "I knew she was small enough that she would not be able to swim without a life preserver or floaty."

Sure enough, the little girl eventually fell into the pool, and no one in her family noticed. Alyssa saw the girl struggling and sprang into action — she pulled the sinking toddler up from under the water, took her over to the side of the pool and helped her out.

It was only when the toddler's aunt came over to Alyssa and thanked her for her efforts did Colleen learn of the rescue performed by her daughter.


"She didn't say anything to me about it at all," Colleen said of her daughter. "I had to ask her what the woman was thanking her for."

It is that quiet, unassuming nature that is one of Alyssa's more admirable traits, her mother believes.

"The true testament of a hero is that they don't brag about what they do," Colleen said. "And that is certainly true of Alyssa — she never brags, it's just not in her."

Alyssa has been selected to receive the Bronze Cross — on of the highest honors bestowed upon Girl Scouts — for her rescue of the drowning toddler.

New 'HALLOWEEN' serves up same old chills

I had high hopes for the new "Halloween." I liked that the film was going to be a direct sequel to the 1978 original, ignoring all of the convoluted sequels that had thoroughly messed up the timeline over the years. This decision also made it possible for Jamie Lee Curtis to return to the franchise as Laurie Strode, as she had twice been killed off in previous films. And the filmmakers didn't have to come up with some B.S. way to bring series villain Michael Myers back after having blown him up, decapitated him, and killed him umpteen times in other installments.

Alas, despite all the hype and box office, I was disappointed. I was pretty sure the film wasn't going to scare me, and I wasn't looking for director/co-screenwriter David Gordon Green to reinvent the genre here like Wes Craven and Kevin Williamson did with "Scream" 22 years ago. But I wasn't expecting such a slapdash and, in stretches, dull film. Once again, in the end, it's just about a boogeyman stalking a woman in a creaky house ... only this time, they're both pushing 60 and the only new wrinkles are on Curtis' face and Myers' mask.

The film's first half-hour is quite good, though. Green and screenwriting buddy Danny McBride take their time introducing us to a multi-generational cast of characters who are actually quite likable and played by good actors. Judy

Greer portrays Karen, Strode's daughter who grew up with a Sarah Connor-like mom who tried to prepare her for a dark future by teaching her survival skills and moving her onto a wooded compound with its own rifle range and safe room. Greer and Curtis immediately form a believable and highly contentious mother-daughter bond in the film.

Screen vet Will Patton, meanwhile, is solid as Officer Hawkins, an Illinois deputy who still recalls the Michael Myers murders among his first cases as a rookie deputy in the late '70s. And, of course, there are nubile teenagers for Myers to butcher as Oct. 31 approaches. Laurie's granddaughter, Allyson, is played by Andi Matichak and she reminded me of a young Diane Lane from "The Outsiders" era. I also liked her boyfriend, Cameron (Dylan Arnold); best friend, Vicky (Virginia Gardner); and horndogs Dave (Miles Robbin) and Oscar (Drew Scheid).

That first half-hour is almost too good. The characters actually come across, for the most part, as real people and not just imminent fodder. But once everyone is introduced, the rest of the film is just scene after scene of "cat-and-mouse hunt-andkill." The whole middle section then is just wheel spinning until the mechanics of the script inevitably place Myers on Laurie Strode's compound so they can settle their 40-year blood feud.

Finding a lot to love about 'THE HATE U GIVE'

"The Hate U Give" could have been an angry, simplistic, finger-pointing, scream-don't-listen kind of movie. And it would have only preached to one specific choir and gotten its point across to a moviegoer who was paying to see a film just to confirm his/her world view. Thankfully, it's not! It's actually a film that is as much interested as solving problems as pointing them out. It's central message isn't "Hate America." It's more like "America ... We're All Here So Let's Try and Make It Work."

What I really admired about the movie as a critic is that there is enough material here for three movies. But the recently deceased screenwriter Audrey Wells, adapting Angie Thomas' best-selling novel, uses the wealth of characters and material from the page to weave a layered cinematic tapestry in which a very wide range of audience members will have through lines into the story.

But in order for a flick like this to work, there has to be a compelling central character and actor. Amandla Stenberg, who filmed this when she was just 19, anchors the movie even as she is surrounded by such top-notch adult actors as Regina Hall, Anthony Mackie and Russell Hornsby. Stenberg plays Starr, a teenager who goes to a nearly all-white prep school by day far from the Garden Heights neighborhood where she lives, where the local public school is a place of drugs, promiscuity and under-achieving. Her mom (Hall) tries her best to keep Starr and her siblings safe from the negative influences.

As we come to see Starr and her daily and weekly routines, we see how comfortable she is in both worlds. She even refers to herself as "Starr Version 1" and "Starr Version 2" to let us know she's smart and adaptable and

Laurie having been planning for four decades (!) for Myers to escape from prison and come finish her off that her compound would be MUCH better set up for this scenario. Her arsenal is comprised entirely of handguns and rifles. I would have stocked it with rapid-fire machine guns, at least one rocket launcher, and grenades. I would've also booby-trapped the heck out of the property.

So, what's good? Again, the actors. I can only dream of this cast being in a legitimately great "Halloween" movie. It was great to see Curtis again in a starring role after a number of years. Greer and Patton, meanwhile, are pretty much always good in roles, big and small, and here is no exception. And I want to see each of the five main kids in future projects.

Also, the music! John Carpenter's classic theme is fantastic to hear in 2018 Dolby digital surround sound, and collaborators Cody Carpenter and Daniel A. Davies fire off some instrumentals throughout that sound right out of late '70s/early '80s slasher fare.

But, alas, nostalgia can only go so far. "Halloween" for all its hype is not any great improvement on every inferior sequel and reboot that has come down the pike in the last 40 years



self-knowing in both locales. At school, she gets along with her classmates and even has a white boyfriend (K.J. Apa). Back in the neighborhood, she has her family and friends who she can be more "real" with, most notably her ex-convict father, Maverick (Hornsby), who has taught her the proper way to act and react if ever pulled over or confronted by a police officer.


When she and an old friend Kahlil (Algee Smith) reunite after a long time apart, that teaching comes in handy when Kahlil is pulled over for a turn signal violation. Starr is calm and puts her hands on the dashboard. Kahlil, who has been ordered out of the car by the on-edge white cop, gets shot and killed when he reaches back into his vehicle for a brush.

And what's the one important ingredient to getting

a film of this kind to work, dear readers? Humor! No, seriously.

"The Hate U Give" is, in its own way, intense and serious. But it also has moments of lightness and witty commentary. Don't be surprised if you walk by this at the local cineplex on your way to see "Halloween" or "A Star Is Born" and hear fairly loud laughter coming from the screening room.

And that goes with the film's larger feeling that fills you as you leave the theater. That larger feeling is ... hope! This is a hopeful movie. This is a "We the People" movie. You know, "We the people ... of the United States ... in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility" — you know, THAT part of the Constitution!

Baltimore County Department of Aging requires all program participants to be registered members of the center where they engage in activity. 





The film, The Tormentors, is a project of Youth Writers Rock, a nonprofit that engages students in developing stories to improve their reading and writing skills.

MSP to participate in Drug Take Back Day

The Maryland State Police, in partnership with the Drug Enforcement Administration, are asking residents to dispose of any unwanted and expired prescription medications during the latest National Prescription Drug Take Back Day, which will take place from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 27, at all 23 state police barracks.

Each barrack will act as a collection station to give residents an opportunity to dispose of all unwanted and unused prescription drugs. The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications.

Second only to marijuana, non-medical prescription drugs are the most commonly used drug in the country. According to the Drug Enforcement Administration, a majority of teenagers abusing prescription drugs are finding an unlimited supply in their family's medicine cabinet.

Locally during the last initiative in April 2018, troopers collected nearly 2,155 pounds of prescription drugs. Since 2014, Maryland State Police have collected more than 17,823 pounds of prescription drugs through similar initiatives. For those that cannot make it on Saturday, you can drop them off to any state police barrack at any time of the day throughout the year.

Woman, 90, and three officers injured in fire

A 90-year-old woman and three officers were injured on Oct. 16 in a single-alarm Essex house fire.

Baltimore County Police Department fire investigators have ruled this an accidental fire; it began in a first-floor bedroom, where a heat lamp used to warm a pet lizard fell over and ignited.

Police officers arrived at 8:05 p.m. at the home in the unit block of Russell Frost Court in Essex. Fire units were dispatched immediately.

The officers found the elderly woman outside the home when they arrived. They went inside the house and attempted to put out the fire using an extinguisher, but evacuated after a short time and waited for fire personnel to arrive.

Engine 511 (Essex VFD) was the first-arriving unit; firefighters quickly extinguished the fire and placed it under control at 8:26 p.m.

The woman was transported to Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center. The three officers were transported to the R. Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center for treatment of minor injuries. All were released shortly after treatment. The lizard did not survive. Several dogs that were in the house did survive.

19-year-old man killed in Parkville shooting

The Baltimore County Police Department Homicide Unit is investigating a shooting that left one man dead near Taylor Avenue in Parkville on Oct. 20.

Police responded to a call for shots fired around 7:20 p.m. to find a man suffering from a life-threatening gunshot wound lying in the roadway in the 7800 block of Beverly Avenue near Taylor Avenue. He was transported to a local hospital where he later died. He is identified as Diamonic Reyshann Acca-Jones, 19, of the 7800 block of Beverly Avenue in Parkville.

The suspect fled the area prior to police arrival.

Detectives from the Homicide Unit are continuing their investigation this afternoon to determine the motive for this shooting. Anyone who may have information about the suspect in this crime is asked to call police at 410-307-2020. Callers may remain anonymous.

Child struck, killed near Sandalwood Elementary

The seven year old child killed when she darted out in front of a work van across from Sandalwood Elementary School on Oct. 18 as school was letting out is identified as Na Tasha Newman of the 1000 block of Punjab Drive in Essex.

The Baltimore County Crash Investigation Team is continuing to follow up on this incident.

Police were dispatched to the driveway of a town-home community across from the school around 3:26 p.m. where the girl was struck by a white work van. The preliminary investigation indicates that she was running down the sidewalk after a group of children when she darted out in front of the van as it began to exit the townhome community onto South Marlyn Avenue.

The first officer arrived on the scene at 3:28 p.m. and immediately began CPR on the 7-year-old child, who was rushed to Franklin Square Hospital by responding medics. She was later pronounced deceased. The driver remained at the scene. The Baltimore County Police Crash Investigation Team responded to the scene to conduct crash reconstruction and will continue the investigation into this fatal crash.

Mohler, Bevins announce county purchase of open space in Middle River

Baltimore County Executive Don Mohler and Sixth District Councilwoman Cathy Bevins announced the County's plans to preserve a significant parcel of environmentally sensitive land in Middle River to prevent development, thereby protecting water quality for local waterways and the Chesapeake Bay.

The County plans to acquire 23 acres, located on the southwest corner of Bengies Road and Bourque Road, which is less than a mile from Dead Head Creek and Middle River, and is immediately adjacent to another 28 acres of open space owned by the State of Maryland. Program Open Space acquisition funds will be applied to reimburse the full \$100,000 purchase price.

"Preserving rural lands is one of the most effective ways to protect the drinking water supplies for 2.6 million people in the Baltimore region, as well as the water quality of our streams and rivers that flow to the Bay and the oceans," Mohler said.

"I am always looking for sites around the district for Project Open Space," said Bevins. "I am thankful for the administration for purchasing this land. This is the latest in a long list of ways we have worked to improve the environment here in Middle River. From dredging the Bird River to preserving open space, I have worked hard to protect and improve the environment."

The property is zoned for medium-density residential development and has a recorded 20lot subdivision. By purchasing this property from Windlass Woods, LLC., the County is guaranteeing its ability to serve as a filter for stormwater, protecting the water quality of Middle River and the Chesapeake Bay. It will be preserved as a forested refuge for wildlife, while offering scenic views in a growing area of the County, near the Baltimore Crossroads mixed-use development.

Upton Road stream repairs to commence

- Councilman David Marks (R-5) -

Baltimore County Councilman David Marks announced today that repairs will begin this week to the Whitemarsh Run in the vicinity of Upton Road in Carney.

Baltimore County awarded the construction contract to Ecotone, Inc., an environmental company which specializes in ecological restoration. Construction will occur through the winter, and trees and shrubs will be installed in the spring. The project is estimated to cost \$1.3 million.

Approximately 2,200 linear feet of Whitemarsh Run will be affected.

"I have strongly supported efforts to improve deteriorating tributaries throughout northeastern Baltimore County, both here and at Jennifer Run," Councilman Marks added.






