BADGES FOR LAWMEN Tumbleweed Smith



Kevin Johnson of Clarendon carves designs on silver. He'll take a small chisel and tap on it with a special hammer he made. He says most silversmiths and engravers make their own tools. After he is satisfied fied with the design, he'll polish it with another special instrument. He puts his work on bits, spurs, belt buckles and pistols. He is perhaps best known for making badges from five peso coins for law enforcement

officers.

"All kinds," he says. "Anybody from our local or area sheriff's departments. I've probably made badges from every sheriff or deputy in the panhandle plus the rest of the state. I've done them for the secret service, FBI, United States Marshall Service, just all over. There is a limited number of people authorized to do badges for them. I'm lucky enough to be one of them."

He's a former high school and college basketball referee and did engraving in his spare time. His business increased when the local sheriff brought in a Texas Ranger.

"He wanted me to do some custom work for him and he took what I had made to a company meeting and he showed some of his Ranger buddies what I had done and it just took off from there. I stopped being a referee to devote fulltime to my silversmithing. That really pleased my wife because that meant I wouldn't be traveling at night so much."

His badges are in great demand by law enforcement people all over the United States and beyond. He has sent his creations to England and Australia.

"I've done close to six hundred agencies, federal, state and local. I've also made dog tags for cowboy's dogs, just about anything you can think of. Some guys want me to put designs on handcuffs. I built a set of spurs for President George W. Bush. I keep a picture of those on the wall."

He works long hours in a barn studio behind his house.

"I usually get out here about one o'clock after lunch and work until three or four o'clock in the morning seven days a week. I have to in order to keep up with the demand. That box over there has about fifteen hundred to two thousand orders. On some of the firearms that I've engraved, some people had to wait two to four years for me to get them done."

For relaxation he plays blues harmonica. He's guite good and gave me a short sample of his playing. Then he got out his guitar and played a tune on that. He keeps he instruments around to get him away from the tedious work. He got his musical talent from his mom, Abigail Johnson, who is a professional singer. Kevin is self-taught and does everything by hand. His studio is like a museum with pictures, old equipment and shelves full of interesting items. The walls are completely covered with his memorabilia.

cisions are made without weakened condition, and fanfare, and come to light years later. We're running short on noble decisions of late, but two made by decades ago by two prominent Arizonans are worth calling to mind.

Senator John McCain's death last month caused much reflection on his life of service to country, including his imprisonment in Viet Nam for more than five years. When captors realized his prominence, they saw great public relations value in releasing him soon after imprisonment, with much fanfare. He immediately refused, indicating that he would wait his turn. Late columnist Erma Bombeck, a "favorite daughter" of Arizona during the final 25 years of her life, made a similar decision a quartercentury later....

Gravely ill with a kidney disease, she had the oppor-

tunity to move "up the list" on the transplant list, thanks to her celebrity status. She'd have no part of it,

vowing to wait her turn. When that time came,



Sometimes, selfless de- months later, she was in a her body rejected the transplant. One of the world's wittiest persons whose columns brightened millions of lives, was dead at 69.

> McCain's decision in 1968 resulted in four more years of imprisonment and degradation. Erma's decision was made in 1996 robbed readers of smiles. She could coax more grins from a column of 400 words or so than anyone I've ever read....

I was an avid reader, and wrote her a grateful letter nearly 50 years ago.

A couple of weeks later, I was surprised to receive a note she no doubt wrote. It was typed on copy paper, and signed "Erma," with an editor's pencil.

Even in the short note, her humor was evident. "I apologize for being late writing to thank you for your letter," she said. "I'm nearly as far behind with my correspondence as I am with my laundry.".... ." Those few words were "Erma to the core."...

Upon considering a col-

umn topic, I often muse, "How would Erma handle it?" (I know; her garment hem would go untouched if it depended on me to emulate her work.) For example, with Senator John McCain's death following Aretha Franklin's passing just nine days earlier, I think Erma would have found ways to lighten national mourning with touches of humor that in no way denigrated their great lives.

Writers and broadcasters covered both funerals in great detail. Somehow, I think Erma would have had a tongue-in-cheek comment about Aretha's funeral procession that included 120 pink Cadillacs (inspired by her hit song, "Freeway of Love"). "Hmmm," the columnist might have noted. "Maybe that explains the 'CLOSED TODAY' signs on the doors of 120 Mary Kay distributors."

"What-Would-Erma-Have-Written?" topics are at center stage every two years at the Erma Bombeck Writers' Workshop. Featuring top writers, it is held at the University of Dayton, honoring the memory of one of the alltime great writers. r*****
