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








### SWEET POTATO BREAD

### **Ingredients:**

- 1 1/2 cups mashed sweet potatoes
- 3 tablespoons water
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 cup canola or vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup buttermilk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/4 cups granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup light brown sugar, packed
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- pinch salt, optional and to taste

### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 350F. Spray one 9-by-5-inch loaf pan (what I used), or two 8-by-4-inch loaf pans, or a 10-cup Bundt pan, or a muffin pan with floured cooking spray or grease and flour the pan(s); set aside.

Peel the sweet potatoes and chop them into 1-inch sized chunks. Place chunks in a large, shallow microwave-safe bowl. Add 3 tablespoons water, cover with plasticwrap, and cook on high power for 15 to 17 minutes, or until potatoes are very fork-tender. Pour off any water. Mash sweet potatoes with a fork. Allow them to cool momentarily so you don't scramble the eggs.

To the sweet potatoes, add the eggs, oil, buttermilk, vanilla and whisk until combined;

set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, combine the dry ingredients – flour, sugars, baking soda, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, allspice, cloves, optional salt, and whisk to combine. Pour the wet sweet potato mixture over the dry ingredients, and stir to incorporate. Stirring until no stray bits of dry ingredients are visible, folding and scraping the bottom of the bowl with a spatula as necessary. Stir and fold with a gentle hand as to not over-mix and over-develop the gluten, which results in tougher bread.

Turn batter out into prepared pan(s), smoothing the top lightly with a spatula. Bake for 60 to 70 minutes for a 9×5 pan, or until top is domed, golden, loaf is springy to the touch, and cake tester inserted in the center comes out clean. Tent pan with foil in the last 15 minutes of cooking if top is browning a bit fast before interior has cooked through. 8×4 loaves will take about 40 to 45 minutes, a Bundt about 1 hour, muffins about 18-20 minutes. Allow bread to cool in pan for 10 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack to cool completely. Bread will keep at room temperature for up to 1 week. Store bread by wrapping the completely cooled loaf in plasticwrap, and then placing loaf inside a gallonsized Ziplock.

### **SWEET POTATO CUPCAKES**

# Ingredients For the Cupcakes

- 1 box vellow cake mix
- 1 15-oz. can sweet potato puree



- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
- For the Graham Cracker Crust
- 1 c. crushed graham crackers
- 1/4 c. (1/2 stick) unsalted butter, melted
- 2 tsp. sugar
- pinch of kosher salt

### For the Marshmallow Frosting

- 1 c. (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 7 1/2 oz. (1 container) Marshmallow Fluff
- 1 1/2 c. powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- pinch of kosher salt
- Chopped toasted pecans, for garnish
- Cinnamon sugar, for garnish

### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 350° and line a muffin tin with 12 cupcake liners. Make batter: In a large bowl, mix cake mix with canned sweet potato, cinnamon, and nutmeg until well combined.

Make crust: In a large bowl, combine graham cracker crumbs, butter, sugar, and salt in a small bowl. Press about 1 tablespoon of the mixture into the bottom of each cupcake liner.

Top graham cracker crusts with a scoop of batter. Bake until cupcakes are golden and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 22 minutes. Let cool completely.

Meanwhile, make marshmallow frosting: In a large bowl, beat together butter and Fluff until combined. Add powdered sugar, vanilla, and salt and beat until light and fluffy. Transfer to a piping bag and pipe onto cooled cupcakes.

Garnish with pecans and cinnamon sugar.

# BACON-SWEET POTATO SOUP Ingredients

4 slices bacon, chopped

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- 1 medium red onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tsp. kosher salt
- 1/2 tsp. Freshly ground black pepper
- Pinch of cayenne (optional)
- 3 sweet potatoes, peeled and diced
- 4 c. low-sodium chicken broth
- Juice of 1 lime

### **Directions**

In a large pot over medium heat, cook bacon.

Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate and reserve 1 tablespoon fat. To pot, add onions and cook until slightly softened, 5 minutes. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 2 minutes. Season with salt, pepper, and cayenne, if using.

Add sweet potatoes and stock. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low and simmer until sweet potatoes are tender, 27 to 30 minutes.

Blend with immersion blender or transfer to a blender in batches and blend until smooth. Stir in lime juice.

Serve warm topped with chopped bacon.

She looked a little tearfully at him and said, "My parents don't like me dressing up like a girl." It's still unclear whether she jumped or was pushed.











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

ow is your attitude when giving? What's your motive for giving? Did you know that your attitude and motives are more important than the action itself? We can give without love, but we cannot love without giving? 2 Corinthians 9:7 says: "...for God loveth a cheerful giver." Someone who is noticeably happy and optimistic about giving.



Giving is an attribute/characteristic we find in Christendom that lies at the core of the believer's life. Gladness should reside in a person who has the ability and opportunity to be charitable and help someone else.

Often times we judge the act of giving and not the motive that caused the act. Good is looking at our heart when we give. Let's examine what Paul is saying in 2 Corinthians 9:7.

Giving should be freely done, whatever we give, be it more or less: Not grudgingly, nor of necessity, but cheerfully. A person sometimes will give for various reasons: being squeezed, forced like the twisting of the arm, influenced by the sob-story, unwillingness, gave only to silence the person, felt aggravated, being pressured by peers and leaders. So next time you give, be assured that our attitudes and motives far out-weight the act of giving.

Paul goes on to say in 2 Corinthians 9:8 "And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work."

While we are making grocery list, guest list, and decorating; let us not get so distracted with the festivities and exterior things that we forget to be thankful for all of our daily blessings. 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



Share with those around you the things you are thankful for.








**YEAR.:** Please pay close attention to the parade route, especially the parade route entry point on Peacock street. This is how we get everyone lined up going the right direction. Kiwanis members will be at Carroll High and Broad Street to help you find your lineup spot. The parade will proceed down Broad Street towards downtown, go around the Square and end at the SUPER SAV shopping center.

Parade flow: Once the parade starts, units cannot stop at the reviewing stand because the rest of the parade is still moving. This causes gaps and backups just like a traffic jam. If you have a unit that wants to perform before the Reviewing Stand let us know and we will do our best to make special arrangements. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. ### Parade Lineup Instructions:

- Enter parade route: On North Union, go past City Hall. Turn right onto Peacock at the Fire Station. Proceed to Carroll High and turn right on Broad Street.
- Parade workers will be at the Carroll High and Broad Street intersection to direct you to
  your lineup spot on the right or left side of Broad Street. In some cases, because of the
  length of the parade, entries will be lined up on a side street and fed into the parade.
- The parade starts at 6:00 PM with the lighting of the City Christmas tree.
- The parade will proceed down Broad Street and turn left at Milky Moo's.
- At Aabon, the parade will turn right onto Reynolds. This is a tight turn so swing wide.
- Follow Reynolds past the Reviewing Stand and turn right on Merrick.
- · Next, turn right on Broad Street.
- The final turn is left on North Union to the Super SAV parking lot where float riders can disembark. Please, carefully pay attention to Police and parade workers traffic instructions. Do not attempt to go South on North Union. Suggest you exit north to Roy Parker or take Peacock.
- This area becomes very congested and maximum caution and cooperation are necessary for traffic flow and the safety of everyone.


