

They jumped right in to this biggest event of the year, and were loving every minute of it. Another "newbie" to the Stew is the pastor of a local Baptist Church who recently moved to Sulphur Springs. He and his wife are embracing the culture of Hopkins County, and putting their Christian enthusiasm to work at their church. He's suggesting that we all pledge "30 Days of Giving" during November. From where I sit, I can see proof that there's a lot of good going on here!



### HALFTIME PLAY BY PLAY

### **Tumbleweed Smith**



"The Bulldog Band moves from right to left on your radio dial. As it approaches midfield it goes through a series of alternating right and left maneuvers to the rear and that sets up the band for a turn. They're still in full step, marching five yards apart. Now the band goes into a series of diagonal moves, changing direction from left to right. Then a series of slip-throughs that puts the band back into company front."

That's the way halftime sounds if you're listening to a broadcast of a high school football game on KGAS radio in Carthage. While Jerry Hanszen is describing the action, listeners hear the band's music in the background, sometimes in the foreground.

"You know you've got the first quarter, the second quarter, then there's halftime," says Jerry. "There are a lot of moms and dads there at the stadium to see the ballgame, but there's also a lot of moms and dads there to see the halftime. So for those who listen on the radio, I provide the play by play of halftime. We talk about the countermarches, the flanks and the turns and the music they're playing and all of that, and I try to give a very accurate play by play. We have wireless mikes that we put down on the field and we do our best to pick up the quality of sound that the crowd is listening

Jerry, who owns the station, is certainly qualified to call halftime.

"I started out as a high school band director, did that for a while, got out of high school band directing and decided I would sell band instruments. I went to Beaumont, Texas and worked for a music company traveling the southeast Texas area calling on schools. I had the chance to work with high school bands getting ready for marching or performance contests. These days a friend of mine and I now video and stream the entire marching contest for parents back home who can't get to the contests. It's a fun thing to do. I've enjoyed every bit of it."

Years ago Jerry used to go with the previous owner of the station to broadcast the games.

"The best seat in the house is in the press box. So I'd carry equipment to the press box, then help him set up for the broadcast. He did the game and I did the halftime. When he decided to sell the station I bought it because it seemed like it would be something I'd enjoy. I've enjoyed it about 30 years now."

"I've had the opportunity to broadcast all those championship ballgames and it has been a pleasure to do so. I'm a Bulldogs fan. At games, an announcer calls the plays. I do the engineering and halftime." Displayed prominently in Jerry's office is a case with six championship

"Players really get them, but every once in a while they'll let somebody not as special as the players have one for memory's sake.'
