### Johnson and Johnson comes to Cadwallader Elem. School

By Frank Shortt *Times staff writer* Ctober 24 was the day set aside for Johnson and Johnson representatives Mr. Rafael Salcedo (parent of one of the 5th graders) and Shaaline Doan, along with a team of other engineers, to bring the WISTEM2D portion of the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathmatics) program to Cadwallader Elementary School.

WISTEM2D stands for "Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, Math, Manufacturing, and Design." As part of the STEM program, the objective is to inspire boys and girls in their pursuit of STEM2D studies and increase the representation of women in science and technical fields.

Students were asked, "Do you ever wonder how engineers and scientists develop products?" With that, students were taught about Motion and Design, through building K'Nex cars. Force, Friction, Gravity, and Velocity concepts were discussed as students tested their cars' performances. Students also learned about Force:

The push or pull of an object.

Friction is the resistance of motion when one object rubs against another.Gravity is a force that pulls everything

towards the earth.

■ Velocity is the speed of an object plus

its direction.

All the students in the fourth, fifth, and sixth grade participated.

Students were broken into five teams of 6 members for each classroom. They were instructed to observe individual designs and to observe the K'Nex pieces to be used for their particular design. They were told to sketch a vehicle design on the graph paper provided based on individual designs and K'Nex pieces. They were instructed to build the vehicle, test the vehicle and observe what happened. They were to measure and record the distance, discuss what did or did not work, then redesign the vehicle to improve its performance. A team spokesperson was selected to present the results to the class.

They also were taught about Potential Energy, the energy an object has because of its position. Also, Kinetic Energy, the energy of motion, was discussed. They were told that Mechanical Energy, the energy to do work consisted of Potential Energy plus Kinetic Energy. This was a mini-engineering class in a nutshell. Thanks to Mr. Salcedo and Shaaline Doan for bringing this wonderfully, informative program to Cadwallader. The students who witnessed this will have the inspiration they need to pursue careers in engineering and technical fields. Thanks Johnson and Johnson!

### **MITHIL PRASAD FOUNDATION Fundraiser scheduled to fight DIPG pediatric brain cancer**

The Mithil Prasad Foundation is holding its first annual Fundraising Gala on December 2 to raise funds to help fight DIPG, the number one form of pediatric brain cancer that affects 300 children in the United States every year.

The foundation was started last year by Prasad Rao and his wife Sarva, who lost their son Mithil to the dreaded disease in November 2016.

"We are acting on his wishes and his attitude of Live Life Blissfully," said Prasad. "So we have created this foundation last year. Mithil Prasad Foundation is a nonprofit created to raise awareness and funds to support DIPG research and patients. 'Live life blissfully' is profound advice, isn't it? It was written by 11 ½ year old Mithil on a post it, to hang at his mother's cubicle. We all soon realized however, that these were not just words on a paper, but that they were the true philosophy that Mithil lived by. Even through his sickness, Mithil's positivity never wavered and he spread that joy wherever he went."

Mithil's story

Mithil was a voracious reader, a big Star Wars fan, and loved playing with Legos, Minecraft and Clash of clans. Baseball was his favorite sport. He was the starting pitcher for his baseball team. "On a trip to his grandparents place, we noticed Mithil's gait was a bit off," Prasad said. "It seemed to get worse and prompted a doctors visit. That was when we were told that Mithil had DIPG - Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma. We had never heard of this disease and worse, the prognosis of 6-8 months left us shocked."

During his sickness, Mithil showed tremendous strength, was always positive, and cared for others. "Mithil also became very empathetic towards kids like him going through a tough time," Prasad said. "He would say 'I will never look at another kid in a wheelchair the same way again'. After Mithil passed away, we donated his brain and spine for medical research, with the hope that it will help researchers learn more about DIPG in any way possible."

The idea of starting a foundation stemmed from Mithil's love to help children like him. In honor of Mithil's spirit, the family started the Mithil Prasad Foundation.

up of cells that help support and protect the brain's neurons. These tumors are found in an area of the brainstem (the lowest, stem-like part of the brain) called the pons, which controls many of the body's most vital functions such as breathing, blood pressure, and heart rate.

The event opens at 4:00 p.m., with dinner and the program beginning at 6:00 p.m. Music will be provided by singer/songwriter LemoLive, and the guest speaker is Dr. Nalin Gupta, chief of pediatric neurological surgery at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital.

# **Expanding educational opportunity for San Jose residents**

s the global epicenter for innovation and technology, Silicon Valley has created enormous prosperity and opportunity. Countless residents have embraced the unique opportunity offered in our valley to create a better life for themselves and their families. Yet the region's prosperity remains out of reach for far too many of our residents – particularly those who lack a college education.

In an economy that relies on a welleducated and highly-trained workforce, a college education has become an increasingly important requisite. However, today, only three out of ten San José high school students go on to obtain a college degree. That leaves a staggering 70 percent of our kids illprepared to compete in our economy, often relegating them to a future of limited opportunity, financial hardship, and potential exile from their very expensive hometown.

While there are many reasons why a majority of our students don't go to or

finish college, we know that financial barriers are at the very top of the list. And if we're serious about providing students throughout our community with the opportunity to reap the benefits of Silicon Valley's economy, we must expand access to an affordable, high-quality college education.

That's why San José – Evergreen Community College District, the City of San José, and a variety of other educational and community partners came together last year to launch San José Promise: a program designed to ensure that a college education is affordable and accessible for San José students.

San José Promise removes barriers and creates pathways for student success by providing a cost-free education to students who have recently graduated from a high school in San José. By eliminating financial barriers that often discourage low-income kids from pursuing a college degree — like the cost of tuition, fees, textbooks, transportation and supplies — students can focus on their studies, rather than being forced to hold down one or more jobs that detract time and focus away from their education. And while other college promise programs typically only cover one year of classes, the San José Promise offers up to two years of free education, providing students the opportunity to graduate with a degree that will help them transfer to a fouryear university or enter the workforce.


The San José Promise also connects students with support and mentorship vital to their success. For example, at San José – Evergreen Community College District, San José Promise students receive access to both online and in-person mentoring that is specific to their chosen field. Integrating mentoring into students' academic portfolio not only enhances their academic support network, it also helps them develop key professional contacts as they prepare to enter Silicon Valley's workforce.

Now in its second year, the San José Promise is rapidly growing, with nearly 1,000 students attending Evergreen Valley College or San José City College alone. Nearly half of these students are entering their second year of the program and preliminary data indicate that they are successfully completing courses at a higher rate than the rest of their peers. In addition, the majority of these students in their second year of the Promise remain on track to earn an associate degree debt-free.

While we're off to a great start, we know there is still much work to do. In the months ahead, we'll keep pushing to expand San José Promise to make a college education financially-attainable for all San José students.

### **Protecting the historical building situated along San Felipe Road**

Special to the Times historical building has been saved at San Felipe Road (just a 1/4 mile south of White Road and Aborn Road).

Many may have noticed the construction going on and have wondered just what that old building once was. Here are some answers to your questions. It is the 1876 home of Francis Joseph Smith.

The entire home has been carefully moved up to the front of San Felipe Road at the intersection of Yerba Buena along with the original water tower structure which once had a windmill above it to ingeniously harness nature's power in moving water from the running creek to the storage tank.

### From the Ohlones to present day

A small boy stopped beside the creek to pick up some of the acorns scattered under the old oak tree. Soon it would be evening and time for his meal of berries and rabbit. His family gathered around the fire. They were weary from a long day of hunting, gathering roots, acorns, and berries. Across the valley a herd of antelope silently passed while high on a mountain came the evening howl of the coyote as he called his family together.

The Ohlone Indians lived a peaceful life in Evergreen. Creeks and springs covered the land yielding their acorns which were gathered and stored for winter ---a staple in the Indians daily diet. Small animals were plentiful. Since the mild temperature was pleasant most of the year in our Evergreen Valley, the Indians built only small temporary shelters.

All creatures and man lived in harmony Small bands of Indians occupied most of the valley, each speaking their own dialect. Apparently, these simple people lived without war or conflict. Their only threat may have been the large mountain lions that roamed Mt. Hamilton or a grizzly bear crossing Silver Creek. Yes, Grizzles lived here.

While most of our Ohlone families are

gone now, leaving very little of their history behind, grinding stones and table rocks mark their territory and a few burial grounds have been found in Evergreen.

These were the people of Evergreen whom the early Spaniards met when they arrived in Santa Clara Valley.

#### Spanish Era

Captain Juan Bautista de Anza brought the first 66 settlers here to the Pueblo De San Jose de Guadalupe in 1776. This place became California's first civil community. Here a farming community was established to provide food for the Presidio of Monterey and San Francisco.

### Rancho Yerba Buena

Antonio Chabolla (Chaboya) was the first Spanish citizen of Evergreen. His father came originally from the province of Catalonia, Spain. Chabolla eventually took possession of the whole area with a Mexican land grant which was known as "Rancho Yerba Buena," (translated as "Ranch of good Grass"). 22,642.64 acres were granted to Chabolla by Governor Figueroa in 1833 and confirmed by the United States Commission on October 17, 1854 and district court on January 21, 1858.

### Evergreen Pioneers

In the 1850's, the first American and immigrant families began to settle in Evergreen. It was a hard time however their dreams and courage helped them cross the plains by wagon and horseback and also "around the horn by ship." Hungry, tired, rich and poor, they were searching for the promised land of freedom, territory and riches! They came to find fertile land for their crops and raised families too in building their wonderful future.

Those who came to California for gold soon discovered that the real gold was here, where rich soil produced fields of gold every spring. One by one they came to find the small sheltered valley of Evergreen, given this name because of the forest of live oaks that covered the hills and valley. With them came corsets, stays, high-button shoes, herb gardens, Times **Community**

gaslights, outhouses, celluloid collars, aprons, sunbonnets, washboards, water pumps, windmills, buckets, Saturdaynight baths, horses, buggies, ploughs, hoes, shovels, and sarsaparilla.

For the first hundred years Evergreen remained a "Brigadoon" village where time had stopped, orchards blossomed, vineyards grew and neighbors gathered often at the general store and butcher shop located just up San Felipe Road.

### The Village of Evergreen

Before the days of mass production, mail-order parts, paved highways and automobiles, every small community had to be largely self-sufficient. The skills of the ironworker were much in demand. The Village "Smithy" was as essential to the community as the general store was. Along San Felipe road in a small barn, fires of the forge were kept hot and tools of the demanding graft were brought to Evergreen by Carl C. Smith in his blacksmith shop.

On May 15th, 1868, C.C. Smith and Francis "Joe" Smith opened the first general merchandise store which would remain in business for over 60 years. In 1870, the legislature resolved that Evergreen should have a post office and Francis "Joe" Smith was made Postmaster who for 14 years drove his wagon to downtown San Jose and back with mail to be picked up at his general store while being paid \$12 a year.

When you drive on San Felipe Road towards Evergreen Valley College you will see the newly placed historical home. It may interest you to know that F.J. Smith's daughter, Katherine Smith was a devoted and dedicated teacher for 80 years and lived in the home till she was 103 years old. In addition to teaching children, during her ladder years she taught English citizenship classes for new arrivals to the country. There is a reminiscing of a story passed down in the Cortese family where one day Katherine noticed Vincent Cortese Sr. standing with the group of people who admired her greatly. As he stood in the crowd, she said to him with a caring smile, "Hi Vincent, you were a very good boy." The Katherine R. Smith Elementary School in the Evergreen School District was named in her honor. This historical landmark home

is a representation of a residence from that time period and there are others too in Evergreen. The nearby home of his brother is gone so this building is an important representation of the architecture of that era.

So, now you know and you can tell your friends.

Pioneer families have remained in Evergreen, many now into their 8th generation. As Santa Clara Valley's private little "Village" Evergreen has protected its secrets, we celebrate the past and prepare for the future. We are preserving our precious history to share with the new Evergreeners who have arrived once again as in the 1850's to find peace and prosperity in a community where they can build a home, raise a family, and become part of the present history being made in Evergreen. Lets make sure to keep history alive!

Editor's Note: Great care to preserve the historical landmark Smith home is being provided by Oakmont Senior Living Company. They will be creating a special community behind the landmarks. They are a nationally recognized leader in the development and construction of high-end senior communities. The Oakmont team has designed and built 34 retirement communities on the West Coast, including continuing care retirement communities and independent living, assisted living, and memory care communities.

The Pioneer Cortese Family has graced our Evergreen Valley with always giving back to all. Currently there is a donated historical center housed at Evergreen Valley College by the Cortese Family and other families from the community. There is a new effort to enhance this collection for the college. Look for more information in future installments of Colleen Cortese's Evergreen Heritage series. She is truly a wonderful historian of our valley.



Dear EarthTalk: What are PFASs and why should we be concerned about them? -- Jim Stobbins, Cary, NC

**EARTHTALK®** 

PFASs-short for perfluoroalkyl substances-are synthetic chemicals of various formulations (including PFCs, PFOA, PFOS and GenX, among others) that are used widely in various products for moisture and stain resistance. Non-stick pans. rain jackets and carpeting are among thousands of different types of consumer goods that now contain one form or another of PFASs.

"Sealant tape, ski wax and floor wax are waterproof thanks to them," reports the non-profit Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), "and in machinery they reduce gear friction." NRDC adds they are found in our homes, our offices, our supermarkets-practically everywhere.

But while it's nice that we can't stain our carpeting no matter how messy we are, are we paying for this luxury with our health? The fact that these chemicals are so hard to break down in their intended applications also means they don't easily break down in nature when released into the environment.

A wide range of animal studies has linked the chemicals to kidney, prostate, rectal and testicular cancers, not to mention hormone malfunction, liver and thyroid problems, and abnormal fetal development. NRDC cites research showing that the offspring of human mothers exposed to certain PFASs had lower-than-average

"For years, bad-actor PFASs were used in food containers like pizza boxes, microwave popcorn bags, Chinese take-out containers and other food packaging to repel grease, and they could leach into the food," reports NRDC's Erik Olson, adding: "PFASs that enter the body through the foods we eat and products we use every day can linger there for years before they are eventually flushed out,"

In 2016 the U.S. Food and Drug Administration banned three of the worst PFASs from food uses in response to a petition from NRDC and other non-profit partners. "But we're worried that chemical cousins of those PFASs are being used," says Olson. "And the trouble is, manufacturers don't have to disclose to consumers that they're using them."

While the battle to eliminate PFASs entirely rages on, NRDC suggests consumers can take matters into their own hands to minimize their exposure. For starters, ask manufacturers whether their products contain PFASs since such chemicals likely won't be listed on labels. Steer clear of non-stick cookware, Gore-Tex clothing, personal care products with "PTFE" or "fluoro" ingredients, or textiles made with the original (pre-2000) formulation of Scotchgard, as these likely contain significant amounts of PFASs.

Residents can also use the County Roads app "Mobile Citizen" to report a County Road or Expressway-related issue such as a malfunctioning traffic signal, graffiti, or illegal dumping. Simply download the Mobile Citizen App to your smartphone, take a picture of the issue and submit it.



### Create a healthy, winter-ready home

(Family Features) When chilly weather arrives and the days get shorter, chances are good you'll spend the majority of your days indoors. Before you start your hibernation, it's a good idea to ensure your home is up to the task. Put your well-being at the top of the list with these ideas to help ensure a health-conscious home that's ready for the dark days of winter.

### Encourage better air quality

When the house is closed up tight to keep out the cold, you may be trapping in some undesirable air pollutants. A well-sealed house may not have the best circulation, and that's the ideal environment for dust mites and other allergens to accumulate.

A thorough cleaning is the first step toward better air quality. Do a deep vacuuming of all carpets, including under furniture and around baseboards. Be sure to launder linens that aren't typically part of your regular washing routine, like window treatments and comforters.

You may want to consult a heating and cooling specialist to determine whether your ductwork is due for a cleaning. Especially if your system didn't get much use through the summer months, there may be a fair bit of dust just waiting to infiltrate your home once the furnace begins to blow.

Be sure to change filters, clean vents and air returns and, if necessary, consider adding an air purifier that helps filter any remaining particles for the best quality air. When opening windows isn't comfortable during cold winter weather, letting the sunshine in can still help to improve indoor air quality. A study by the University of Oregon's Biology and the Built Environment Center showed rooms with increased sunlight have fewer viable bacteria.

"Until now, daylighting design has been primarily about visual comfort or circadian health, but now we can say daylighting influences air quality," said Kevin Van Den Wymelenberg, co-director of the BioBE Center and co-author of the study.

### Let in light

Natural light plays an important role in overall health, and reduced daylight in the winter months can have a big impact on productivity and sleep, according to a recent survey conducted by YouGov on behalf of Velux. For example, nearly two-thirds of respondents said they believe daylight affects their productivity and mood. Light is also an important cue to the body's circadian clock, and proper exposure to natural light during the day can help support better sleep when darkness falls.

What's more, sunlight is a natural antidepressant, and there is ample scientific evidence that associates daylight with better health and quality of life, such as improved mood, less fatigue and reduced eyestrain.

It may be tempting to keep the drapes closed when it's blustery outside to ward off a draft, but with well-sealed windows, there's no reason to block that allimportant natural light. In rooms with ample natural light available, take advantage, especially in the morning when exposure to daylight can benefit your circadian rhythm.

However, not every room is situated to maximize your access to natural light, and that's when you can get creative. One solution is skylights, which add natural light to virtually any space. An option like a Sun Tunnel Skylight offered by Velux Skylights lends brightness to even the smallest spaces, like a bathroom or hallway. For a larger room, a fresh-air skylight can help address air quality concerns, and some models offer smartphone connectivity to open and close the skylight and even raise or lower blinds with a few quick taps of the finger. Keep out the cold

As a child, you were probably warned to bundle up in cooler weather to avoid catching a cold. As an adult, you likely realize that germs, not temperatures, cause illness. However, there is some truth to the old wives' tales associating cold with getting sick. The viruses that cause colds and the flu thrive in cooler temperatures, for example. This means that, at least indirectly, a cold environment may indeed make you sick.

To ward off a chill in your home, safeguard against drafts around windows and doors. If seasonal weather-proofing is impractical, consider temporary solutions like draft stoppers or mats you can place at the base of doors. Add insulation, if needed, in areas that commonly release a significant amount of heat, such as the attic and garage.

### Daylight makes a difference

As the days become shorter and colder, the importance of getting enough daylight is even more acute to sleep patterns, mood and productivity. These tips can help you get a better night sleep:

Increase your exposure to natural light during the day. Take a lunchtime walk at work or, if you can't get outside, sit by a window while you eat.


<sup>r</sup> Install blackout curtains in your bedroom to block light from street lamps and the moon.

\* Turn your thermostat down in the evenings to create a cooler bedroom to sleep in.

Establish a good bedtime routine. For example, read a book instead of spending more time looking at a screen. Blue light from electronic devices mimics daylight and can trick your brain into staying alert.

Use red or orange bulbs in kids' night lights as these are some of the least disruptive to sleep.
