What's in a Work Space? A Lot Actually!

By Kevin O'Connor It used to be very simple to decide where and how employees worked for a business. You would look for a location that had ample parking, access to public transportation, and perhaps some natural light or nice amenities. "Telecommuting" was the first disrupter of the traditional office space. Technological advances allowed employees to work from home. Then came "Open Spaces", where walls were removed and offices were replaced with couch-style seating and standup desks. Now, the latest work environment trends revolve around coworking and shared workspaces.

Typically, shared workspaces tend to be geared more towards established businesses, offering private offices and amenities such as printers and office suite services. In this environment, the "shared" space is the lounge area, conference rooms and reception. Coworking spaces are more in line with the open space concept, where startup businesses or freelance business professionals can work with other professionals in a creative and productive environment.

Both coworking and shared workspaces offer the ability for small businesses and

individual freelancers to work in an office space at a lower price point than renting their own office space while allowing for the collaboration of a business community. These workspaces avoid the long-term commitment of a lease and provide a more professional atmosphere to meet clients or have meetings than in a coffeeshop or at home (I think we've all heard the dog barking on a conference call). Additionally, most of these workspaces offer a community for their members with the ability to collaborate with other businesses as well as offer developmental opportunities from subject matter experts on many business topics. Both coworking and shared workspaces offer affordability, flexibility, community and amenities to businesses and individual business owners.

Thanksgiving Recipe: Bourbon Maple Brine for Turkey

Brining is the process of submerging a cut of meat in a brine solution prior to cooking, which enhances juiciness. The meat absorbs extra liquid, resulting in a more flavorful final dish. This technique is particularly great for lean cuts of meat that tend to dry out during cooking such as turkey! Ingredients:

10 to 15 lb. fresh thawed Turkey
1 gallon water
1/4 cup kosher salt
1/4 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup maple syrup
1/2 cup bourbon
1 bulb of garlic (cut in half)
1 Tbsp. whole pepper corn
1 bunch cleaned fresh parsley
1/2 bunch fresh thyme
1/2 bunch fresh sage

Method:

Combine water, sugar and maple syrup in large pot. Bring to boil, stir until salt and sugar dissolve. Remove from heat, add bourbon, garlic, pepper corns and fresh herbs. Steep (Let sit) until room temperature then add two trays of ice cubes to chill mixture around 40°degrees. Taste for salt content. If too salty dilute with water.

Brine your turkey:

You'll need a large food safe bucket or large pot - a container that will allow the turkey to be fully submerged. Place turkey in container, fill with brine until turkey is submerged. If it floats, weigh it down with a couple large ceramic plates. Cover with lid or plastic wrap. Place container with turkey and brine in refrigerator. It should brine for at least one hour per pound or overnight.

After brining is complete, remove turkey from container and discard brine. Prior to roasting or frying, rinse in cold water and pat dry with paper towels. If frying turkey make sure it's thoroughly dry to avoid dangerous scalding oil splatter. Bake or fry until the thickest parts internal temperature is 170°. Let rest for 15 minutes.


Marching Bands Will Compete
