



Making children leadership ready

decade ago, Google
launched a study to
determine the key qualities of its top managers,
gathering and analyzing a
huge volume of survey feedback from their workforce.
Their goal was to use the
expansive data to identify
those characteristics that
consistently define star leaders so they could design a
new Google management
training program.

Termed "Project Oxygen," the study's conclusion was surprising to many of us. Among the eight most important qualities of Google's most prized managers, technical expertise came in dead last. What were the seven top

attributes of success at Google, according to Project Oxygen?

- Being a good coach
- Empowering teammates and not micromanaging
- Expressing concern for teammates' success and personal wellbeing
- Being productive and results-oriented
- Being a good communicator and listener; sharing information
- Helping with career development, and
- Having a clear vision and strategy for the team.

While the Oxygen leadership attributes themselves are unsurprising, it was revelatory to many in the tech community that so-called "soft skills" were more important management qualities at Google than STEM talent. STEM is part of the balance of skills that are necessary to

Of course, these findings should be qualified by acknowledging that the Google sample is biased, since its employees and managers are already high in STEM expertise; science, technology, engineering and math skills are essential for proficiency in the tech workplace. So, we shouldn't conclude from the Project Oxygen findings that technical skills are unimportant or somehow secondary to Google's success.

However, while not an indictment of the central importance STEM expertise plays in leading a major tech company, Project Oxygen highlights why at Google,

of skills that are necessary to be effective as a team leader. To the extent that Google represents the sort of dynamic workplace for which schools seek to prepare children, educators (and parents) can foster this sort of balance in today's students by ensuring that young people have exposure to a wide range of learning experiences - including robust science and STEM programming along with frequent opportunities to collaborate in teams, to listen and provide feedback, to lead and to follow, to disagree and find compromise, to empathize and support, to fall and get up.

"As families and friends gather to celebrate New Year's Eve, AAA wants to ensure everyone has a plan on getting themselves or guests home safely," said Michael Blasky, spokesperson for AAA Northern California.

AAA Tips for a Safe New Year's Eve:

Be a responsible partygoer:

- If you plan to drive, don't drink.
 - If you plan to drink,

select a designated driver and give them your car keys.

- If your ride falls through, use a rideshare service, call a cab, or use AAA's Tipsy Tow as a transportation alternative.
- Buckle up it's your best defense against impaired drivers.

Be a responsible host:

- Offer food and nonalcoholic beverages.
- Make sure all of your guests have a designated driver.
- Keep the numbers for safe transportation options, like Tipsy Tow, handy.
- Take the keys away from anyone who is thinking of driving while impaired.

Tipsy Tow provides a free ride home and vehi-

cle tow of up to 10 miles for any driver, not just AAA Members. For mileage beyond this, motorists are charged a standard towing rate. To use the service, anyone who wants to ensure a safe ride home for an impaired motorist should call 1-800-AAA-HELP (1-800-222-4357) and state that they need a Tipsy


Services will not be provided to motorists requesting a tow to another drinking establishment, or to repair.

varied learning experiences help students discover what it's like to achieve mastery through a communication-rich, collaborative process of trial and error, as happens at Google and other industry-leading Silicon Valley businesses. As such, preparing young people to thrive in a cooperative workplace like Google's requires that we enable them to replicate the sorts of balanced learning experiences that prepare them to collaborate and lead in teams: building communication and interpersonal skills, rewarding and encouraging curiosity, nurturing empathy, and developing creative problem solving.

Indeed, few of these attributes are supported by the broader prevailing paradigm of schooling in America, which instead emphasizes memorization and recall and revolves around standardized test scores. This is an obsolete model designed for bygone times; proficiency in an interdependent world – as with Google's teams – calls for instructional objectives that move students beyond content mastery, test scores, or college admission: the goal is helping young people become leadership ready.

Historically, schooling in America distills down to individual students, sitting in rows, competing against one another in individual contests for superiority – with prizes for the top students who strive to outperform their peers. However, 21st century readiness depends on more than academic prowess and competitive drive. Our future, like the present at companies like Google, depends on how well educators and parents can help children learn to become contributing members (and leaders) of effective teams.

What does this mean? Google's research can help us again. Project Aristotle, undertaken by Google five years after the Oxygen study, was an effort by the company to define the qualities that make up effective teams. Project Aristotle researchers analyzed data on Google's most inventive and productive teams, which ostensibly would likely be comprised of their top scientists and engineers.

Rather, the study determined that Google's most innovative, high-performing teams consisted of employees who were not highly-recruited scientists or engineering stars. Surprisingly, Google's "B-teams" were its exemplars, and rather than university pedigrees or engineering prowess, members of these teams were valued for their command of the same soft skills, beyond their technical expertise: fairness, generosity, curiosity toward the ideas of teammates, empathy, and emotional

intelligence.

Most of all, these high-performing teams at Google were characterized by emotional safety: the absence of intimidation, the willingness to hear and acknowledge the ideas of others. Safety in making mistakes. The recognition that the team's collective strength depends on cooperation, putting competitive instincts and egos aside.

School leaders who acknowledge the socioeconomic and industrial shifts underway in the world are very aware that - like teams at Google - students are best positioned for the 21st century if they develop soft skills during their K-12 journey: learning how to collaborate on a team, imagine solutions to problems, communicate clearly, listen well, and understand how others around them are feeling. Clearly, we can be proud of offering strong STEM offerings in our schools, but STEM is just one part of a balanced approach to preparing learners and

Pragmatically of course, a school's fundamental aims must include helping students become academically ready, middle school ready, high school ready, college ready. These are necessary priorities, but they're also short-sighted. Google's example is just one illustration, as we move into the 19th year of the 21st century, that to thrive in the 21st century economy, young people must gain a balanced education.

Parents and educators must be mindful of this to help our children become leadership ready.





Achieving 'Beautility' - A tale of three city parks

n a brisk, sunny Saturday morning, December 8th, we celebrated the completion of the Beautility Park Art project at TJ Martin and Jeffrey Fontana Parks. "Beautility", a phrase coined by our Public Art department, is an effort to beautify our city's utility enclosures by transforming them from eyesores into eye-catching works of

With the permission of SCVWD, who owns the twelve concrete blocks that run through the fourpark chain, the Public Art department issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to seek artists interested in painting murals on those blocks. Many artists responded, and a committee made up of local residents, art professionals, and District 10 and City of San José staff, selected six finalists to paint two blocks each: Morgan Bricca,

Jane Kim, Andrew Kong Knight, Oree Originol, Vanessa Stafford, and Megan Stevens.

Three of the six artists attended the celebration, along with Vice Chair Linda LeZotte from the Santa Clara Valley Water District (SCVWD), Michael Ogilvie, Director of Public Art for the City of San José, Ramona Snyder, Chair of the San José Public Art Commission, members of the Martin-Fontana Parks Association (MFPA), and

Several challenges caused the project to take a bit longer than expected, but the artists were flexible and persistent. One even wore a respirator to

finish painting during the heavy smoke of the Paradise Fire. All had wonderful attitudes and their passion and dedication resulted in beautiful works of art that exceeded everyone's expectations! I encourage you to spend some time walking in these parks and admiring these amazing treasures. Stop by the kiosk near the dog park and view the map that indicates which blocks were painted by each artist.

Special thanks go to the leaders of MFPA who championed this idea, and to Michele Dexter on my staff who found the funds in the D10 park budget to pay for the project.

And now for some more fantastic news: on Tuesday, December 18th, the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to award the City of San José \$671,250 in their All-Inclusive Playground Grant (AIPG) Program to build an all-inclusive playground at Almaden Lake Park. This regional park is used by many visitors daily, and recently some of the play equipment was so damaged it had to be removed. This grant will be used to bring in new equipment that can be used by people of all abilities.

Please join me in thanking Supervisor Joe Simitian, who originally proposed this grant program, Supervisor Mike Wasserman, whose District includes all of San José District 10, down to Gilroy, and the rest of the Board of Supervisors who all voted to award grants in each of their Districts. This program will help build many accessible playgrounds and bring joy to families throughout Santa Clara County.

As 2018 comes to a close, we not only celebrate the completion of our Beautility project at TJ Martin and Jeffrey Fontana Parks, but we also look forward with eager anticipation to a wonderful new playground at Almaden Lake Park.

2018: The Year in Review

lthough this year proved tempestuous and challenging for many, Athons and chancing and philanthropy, simple acts of human kindness and coming together as a community provided assistance, hope and fellowship to those in need.

Stories featured in the Almaden Times ranged from addressing homelessness and natural disasters to community fundraising and striving for unity and inclusivity.

As 20th century philosopher Karl Popper stated, "All life is problem solving." As housing the homeless-including families whose rising rents outpaced their paychecks-grew to become a grave issue, the city, county, churches and organizations came together to strategize solutions.

Once again, wildfires ravaged California. From the Banscombe fire in Sonoma and Napa, which demolished 18,733 structures, including beloved wineries and 13,972 homes, to the Hill and Woolsey fires which raged through Ventura County displacing 200,000 people, and the Camp Fire which burned 153,336 acres, destroyed the entire town of Paradise, and lead to 85 deaths, the result was enormous personal loss, catastrophic damage and statewide.

On a positive note, residents and officials heeded the call to offer their help with these issues and more.

The May 4 "Local men offer a human touch to the homeless," Nov. 16 "Living room conversations on homelessness help build bridges" and Aug. 24 "Housing the Homeless a main priority" cover stories focused on reaching out to those who often feel alone and uncared for.

Wanting to make a difference, residents David Watkins and Steve Lam regularly bring donations to homeless encampments in St. James Park and underpasses. "We see a lot of people here on the brink of giving up hope," says Steve Lam. "Our mission here, in addition to giving them things, is about rekindling their hope."

Members of local churches not only volunteer their time at warming centers, but also band together to brainstorm solutions they could bring to political representatives. "It's about present," says being McPherson, Program Coordinator for Village House, "looking them in the eyes and hearing their stories. It's transformative. They move onto transitional housing, get jobs and get on

their feet."

The city and county are comparing notes and pooling resources to provide additional housing solutions for the homeless, including warming centers, converted hotel rooms and tiny homes. "One of San Jose's main priorities is ending homelessness with safe, affordable housing," says Kelly Hemphill, Acting Housing Policy and Planning Administrator, City of San Jose. They are also working to create more affordable housing for teachers, restaurant workers and sales clerks near transportation hubs.

The Nov. 30 cover story, "Lemon-Aid for Paradise," shares how following the Camp Fire, Almaden residents took to the streets to raise funds for those who lost so much in the devastating blaze. Holding signs saying, "Lemon-Aid for fire victims. Please donate" and "Help families in need," children and adults

flagged down cars, exchanging lemonade and baked goods for funding. Together, they raised \$4,123 for their efforts. "You hear all the tragic stories of people who lost everything," says Michelle Takeuchi, who coordinated the fundraiser. "It's devastating. How could we not help?"

The Jan. 26 cover story, "Recent disasters lead city to step up emergency preparations," focuses on lessons learned from the Coyote Creek flood, which cost the city more than \$100 million in damages, and a focus on cooperation and communication in battling natural disasters in the future. "The flood taught the city about what it didn't know," says Ray Riordan, Director of the San Jose Office of Emergency Management, "and they have to make changes. Understanding is one thing. Taking action is another."

The Sept. 7 and 21 cover stories celebrate the 42nd Almaden Valley Art & Wine Festival, presented by the Almaden Valley Women's Club. The festival, which features local artisans, wineries, bands and performers, is not only enjoyable but also raises funds for local non-profits and college scholarships. "The reward is having 20,000 people come to this festival and raise money for important causes," says Women's Club member Andreana Popovich. This highlyanticipated annual event also provides a community building opportunity as residents are sure to run into friends and associates in the idyllic setting of Almaden Lake Park: truly a win-win for all.

The Feb. 23 cover story, "Working together for a better tomorrow," features the Mayor's State of the City Address. "We're focused on affordable

housing, equity in our city and creating a blueprint for the most sustainable city in the country," says Mayor Sam Liccardo. "Together, we can forge the most successful multi-cultural community on the planet." Rabbi Dana Magat shares his sentiments. "We can create an even more inclusive San Jose where everyone has a place to live and all basic needs are taken care of," says Magat. "We are here to be a voice for the voiceless. To stand up for what is right and good for all."

"If you want to go fast, go alone," says Liccardo, quoting an African proverb. "If you want to go far, go together...we will go much further together."

As 2018 comes to an end and we look to the future, here's hoping we continue to meet what comes working together as a community, helping to shape a better tomorrow.

San José is one of 20 cities to be awarded resources and technical support to help achieve their ambitious climate goals under the Bloomberg American Cities Challenge

Bloomberg Philanthropies recently announced San José, California, as a winning city in the Bloomberg American Cities Climate Challenge, a \$70 million program that will accelerate 20 ambitious cities' efforts to tackle climate change and promote a sustainable future for residents.
