#### **COYOTES ARE IN**

By Douglas H. Domedion

Now that the deer season is over some of our hunters will take up the sport of running coyotes with hounds. The coyote has expanded its range across N.Y.S. and hunting them has become quite a sport. Their numbers have increased even though there has been a lot of hunting pressure on them. They have taken the place the wolf originally held across the country. Our Eastern coyote is larger than his Western cousin and

has some of the habits of the wolf, which is why he is sometimes referred to as a "brush wolf."

It is believed that our coyote is the result of cross-breeding between coyotes and wolves and then crossing the frozen St. Lawrence River from Canada.

The red and gray wolves have been hated and feared by humans since this country was discovered. Every possible means of destroying them was used including the deadly poisoning. The wolf needed large expands of land, hunted in packs and preyed on large mammals such as moose, elk, beaver, and deer. Once this top predator was eliminated, a gap existed that was not completely filled by the coyote. What we may be seeing with our eastern coyote is a piece of evolution. The few wolves left were forced to cross breed with the smaller coyote. This could have resulted in our coyote being larger in size then the Western coyote and its tendency to hunt larger prey, like deer, in small packs. At the same time it can exist in close quarters with civilization, which the wolf could not do, and survive on small prey such as mice, rabbits, etc.

Although the coyote in this area do not often hunt in packs they definitely do in our Adirondacks. They are great opportunists and can survive on almost anything, again something the wolf couldn't. He has learned how to exist by staying out of sight and being very clever. What we really have now is a small wolf that has done an excellent job of filling that gap the gray and red wolf left.

Coyotes in this area do take some adult deer, although not as often as in the Adirondacks. I feel the real problem is their taking of fawns in the summer. Taking young turkeys before they can fly and destroying nests can be another problem.

After deer season more hunters are getting involved in hunting coyotes. The sport is expensive as good hounds with costly tracking collars are needed as are radios plus a lot of gas for vehicles to keep on the trail of this crafty predator. It also requires the hunters to be in great shape because of the large amount of

There are also some serious problems in this sport like trying to keep the hounds from getting hit by cars when they are led across roads by these long ranging coyotes. Controlling the dogs is the biggest problem though; you just can't control hounds on a hot coyote trail. They don't care about private land or posted signs, just that coyote. A chase can last all day and a lot of private land can be crossed.

The ethical houndsmen take time to get permission to travel across any private land they may encounter during the day. They let the folks in the area know who they are and what they are up to.

A real problem comes from the groups who do not take the time to do this and it puts some landowners against this sport.

Most of these hunters are decent guys and try not to disturb local residents but some times it is just unavoidable. Give them a break! In the month of December, the Orleans County Sheriff's Office 911 Dispatch Center processed 1982 police incidents, including 765 events for Sheriff's Road Patrol, 179 for the New York State Police and 1038 calls for the Village police agencies of Lyndonville, Medina, Albion, and Holley. There were 526 Fire/EMS related calls dispatched county-wide with 385 of those emergency medical in nature and a total of 2 drug overdoses.

Sheriff's Office Road Patrol Deputies handled 76 automobile accidents, including 13 with injury and 41 car-deer collisions. Road patrol also made 56 service attempts and successfully served 24 subpoenas, civil, or court papers. The Orleans County Jail processed in 98 inmates and handled 23 prisoner transports to court appearances.

The Sheriff's Animal Control Division handled 59 incidents including 9 stray dogs, 2 dog bite complaints, 9 neighbor dog problems, and several other miscellaneous animal calls. In addition, 10 animals were taken in to shelter on voluntary surrenders.

In December the Sheriff's Office assisted the Lord's House Church, Waterport in spreading holiday cheer to those less fortunate. Members of the Sheriff's Office helped collect and distribute goodies to over 100 area children in 40 families through the "Toys for Tots" program.

## **Stay Mentally Fresh During the Work Day**

Energy levels tend to ebb and flow throughout a typical workday. A cup of coffee may provide some caffeine-infused spark in the morning, but a big lunch can squash energy later in the afternoon.

Foods and beverages that are high in sugar may provide an immediate energy boost, but that spike is almost instantly followed by a crash that can adversely affect your mental sharpness. Stick to healthy snacks, such as fruits and vegetables, and avoid late afternoon cups of coffee, which studies have shown make it harder to fall asleep at night, thereby compromising your energy levels the next day.

#### LOST TREAM MAP

The STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW YORK resembles another map-known to Pennsylvania anglers as the "Lost Stream Map."

It was completed in 1965 after a 30 year effort by Howard Higbee, a former Penn State Professor.
