year is especially exciting for me and my team as we hit the ground running with new opportunities to build a safe and thriving District 8.

I'm thrilled to share the launch of the much anticipated Eastridge Community Room located in the second floor of the mall between Cinnabon and Hallmark! Through an innovative partnership lead by my office with Eastridge Mall and the City's Park, Recreation and Neighborhood Services, our

community now has another fun, safe space to enjoy family-friendly activities.

Last summer, we piloted a youth summer camp that quickly filled up. We saw that so many of you, our residents, valued the programming and availability of recreational classes for your families that we knew we had to work to fully establish a community room at Eastridge Mall. During the February 19-22 school break, kids can come and join staff for a funfilled four-day camp where we will be enjoying crafts, games, and a one-time field trip. The camp is open for ages 6-12 from 8am to 3pm.

The community center has something for everyone and classes begin next week! Take a look at all that our city's Park, Recreation and Neighborhood Services department will offer. Scholarships are still available. Finally, I'd like to thank you for all that you did to help create a stronger, safer,



women in our community who
have overcome adversity and
not only persevered, but
thrived. Her family escaped
from Vietnam, and was stranded
on a boat for 12 days before
being rescued, when she was

only four years old. Although our backgrounds are quite different, I have grown through trauma and feel we have so much in common. I have been told I am the epitome of grace under fire. I couldn't have thought of a better person to help me inspire others."

As a pre-teen, Toni's family was terrorized by neighbors for several years. She and her sister, Diane, survived a military-scale tear gas bomb being thrown into their bedroom window, their home later flooded, and eventually their family home was burned to the ground.

More recently, Toni cared for her terminally ill father, full-time for five years while running her healthy food business. After his passing last year, she decided to write a second book. "People face challenges daily and I felt there was so much I could share to help people to overcome their struggles. My papa always taught me that in order to study and accomplish, I had to sit down on a hard stool and just get to it. That's exactly what I did. I was diagnosed with Melanoma on my arm, the worst type of skin cancer that has the ability to metastasize, in August. I felt that if it



was the last thing I could accomplish on this Earth, that I would finish the book."

Not knowing the outcome, Ms. Julian wrote uninterrupted for three weeks while undergoing three surgeries and endless testing. She was able to beat cancer, while pre-releasing her book on Amazon.

"Women are pulled in so many different directions. It's hard for most to balance their lives and make a healthy lifestyle a high priority. I wanted to cut to the chase, and help them find the fastest, most effective and impactful ways to achieve vitality and stay as healthy as they can be, so they can live their life to the fullest. My passion is helping them be healthy and happy."


During the event, Toni will do a reading from her book and will share some behind the scenes experiences and inspirations which led her to write Smart, Fit & Female.

The Scripps List runs all the way from the word 'red' to the word 'infinity'. The word list for the Oral part was such words as: tendrils, felicitously, homo sapiens, balaclavas, jacquerie, and auf Wiedersehen! These are words that most adults would have difficulty with.

#### **Evergreen Senior Citizen Property Owners Are Eligible for Measure EE Parcel Tax Exemption**

Evergreen property owners age 65 by June 30, 2020 or older are eligible to file for exemption from the annual \$125 Evergreen School District parcel tax for parcels they occupy as their principal residence.

For joint owners of a principal residence, only one owner needs to be age 65.


To complete the exemption, the form and supporting documents may be brought into the District Office located at 3188 Quimby Road, San Jose.

Residents must file for the exemption in person with documents to prove their home ownership, residency, and age eligibility.

Those who have previously been granted an exemption from the Measure H Parcel Tax, their exemption will continue to be automatically renewed each year as long as you remain eligible for the exemption.



# Creating a good relationship with your veterinarian

Recently I had a painful experience of false online/social media slandering by a disgruntled client so I decided to give some tips to pet parents on how to establish a good relationship with a veterinarian.

Developing a good relationship with your veterinarian is an important part of caring for your pet's health. The most challenging part of finding a

veterinarian is establishing trust, which can only come with time. These tips will make sure you and your vet are on the same page when it comes to your pet's well-being.

#### Developing a Relationship with Your Vet

There are several things you can to do make sure your vet is a good match for your pet(s), including:

-See your vet one to two times a year for a health check-up and yearly shots.

-Set an appointment with the veterinarian you have chosen when nothing is noticeably wrong with your pet.

-Engage the vet in conversation until you get to know his/her style with you and your pets.

-Bring in a single pet, not a carload; you don't want to overwhelm the vet all at once. It is also nice to bring a friend, be it a loved one or just a friend. It will help if you have a second person accompanying you, especially when you are in a stressful situation with a sick or injured pet.

-It's always best to set up an early morning appointment because the staff and the vet are fresh. If you need to leave your pet, it will be just for the day and not an overnight visit since you've come in early.

#### **Prepare for the Visit**

I find it always helpful to have a list of

questions written out on a piece of paper to bring to the vet. With so much going on in the room, you will be focused on your pet. It is easy to forget important questions. I suggest you take five minutes the night before your appointment and make a list.

#### Ask Ouestions

Remember to ask questions when you do not understand. Your vet should always be happy to answer any and all questions, and this should


include the staff out front. You'd be surprised how many times people call my office just to ask a question, so they know they are on the safe side. Vets are always happy and willing to help pet parents. You also want to establish this type of relationship with your vet.

#### Treat your veterinarian with respect

Every veterinarian will tell you most clients are great. Unfortunately, it takes only a small number of difficult individuals to make a veterinary practice a nightmare. A few clients leave things to the last minute before they book an appointment and then demand others be bumped off the schedule to accommodate them right away. Out of guilt, they often blame their own negligence on the vet and then go on social media and complain about it. This can be very distressing for a veterinarian. Be nice. I find in life in general, I get further with honey than vinegar. When you are nice, friendly and outgoing, people tend to respond back the same way.

#### Imagine yourself in your vet's shoes

I'm a dog lover and every time I help a dog and his people, I imagine how I'd feel if I was on the other side. If you want your dog's vet to be your greatest ally, do the same. Try to see his or her point of view and then clearly state your wishes, expec-



tations and decisions with kindness and clarity. The tone of the conversation and your body language is as important as what is being said.

#### What you can say to your veterinarian

Whatever you decide, explain your wishes to your vet. If he or she objects, politely decline, calmly stating you've made up your mind and you'd like him to respect your decision. This should put the issue to rest, but if it doesn't, state you'd like to stay with the practice, as long as you're free to make decisions for your dog. If the guilt-tripping continues, change vets or stick with your current one, but stand your ground.

Almost 15 years in practice, I've provided many second opinions and one of the most common concerns I hear from


dog lovers is they feel pressured by their vets to do things they don't want to do and buy products and services they don't want to buy.


As an 'insider' in the profession, I believe most of my colleagues have gone to school because they love animals, want to make a difference and honestly put their patients way ahead of financial gain. But it's true that's not always the case.

The goal of this article is to help you protect your dog and learn how to communicate with your veterinarian and build a good and honest relationship.

# One instructor who is not wasting time: The continuing saga of Lucy Hsu

ucy Hsu, who is an instructional

coach at Cadwallader School in the Evergreen School District, is a dynamo of energy and uses it to the fullest extent by volunteering in underprivileged

What drives this young wife, mother, and coach of other teachers to expend her energies in other countries? Her reply, "I grew up hearing stories of my parents' village lives in Vietnam and their eventual escape by boat, and difficulty surviving in a refugee camp before coming to the states. This inspired me to eventually travel to Asia and upon my first visit I was very touched to see firsthand the struggles of people residing in these underdeveloped countries "

Hsu said she feels great gratitude being born and raised in America with the opportunity of a good education and overlooked luxuries we have like running water and unlimited electricity. "I have been blessed with so much, and I have a desire to give and help, both here at home and abroad," said Hsu. "Simultaneously, I became fascinated with international travel, seeing the beautiful unique landscapes abroad, famous historical architecture and struc-

tures, and most of all immersing with the local people. I try not to be a tourist who just shows up, check into a fancy hotel, and go on some sightseeing tours! Traveling as a volunteer has been the best method for me to live with the locals, shop and eat amongst them, and truly get a glimpse of their everyday lives in such a way that I'm truly immersing myself and experiencing life in their shoes. Sleeping on a bamboo mat on the dirt floor, or sleeping in a hammock when there's limited floor space (or mice and critters!) riding in a tuk tuk or rickshaw, drawing my own water from the communal well, learning how to use an old fashioned kerosene lamp... those are the experiences that make traveling and experiencing the world truly memorable for me."

During the summer of 2018 from June 15 to July 20, Lucy visited Uzebekistan, Tajikstan, Lebanon, Cambodia, Singapore, Brunei, Indonesia, and Malaysia. Why did Lucy choose Uzbekistan and Tajikistan? "I've always had a fascination with Central Asia and the 'Stan countries.' Historically they were the epicenter of the Silk Road where everyone from Ancient Europeans. Arabs, Chinese, and Indians gathered to exchange goods and ideas, resulting in a beautiful intermingling of culture, art,

food, and people. Having gone to Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan previously and seeing this unique blend, I've been eager to experience the rest of this uniquely exotic region, particularly Uzbekistan. Tajikistan, on the other hand, is known for its breathtaking mountains and lakes, and marks the historic path of Alexander the Great. I love ancient history and a visit to this region is a must in my book!" She went to the two "Stan" countries by herself.

Mrs. Hsu chose to go to Lebanon for the following reasons: "The endless news stories of displaced Syrian families in the last few years, particularly images of mourning mothers and drowned children, had deeply impacted me. It brings back haunting stories of my own family... many who also escaped by boat from Vietnam, some having perished at sea. I had been searching for opportunities to work with survivors and got in touch with an NGO in Beirut. I have been researching the positive effects of meditation and yoga on trauma and PTSD, and created a proposal to teach a "Peace through Breathing" meditation program which was accepted by the NGO. While in Lebanon, I also connected with a ministry medical team from South Carolina, serving displaced Syrian families. Although I don't have much professional medical experience, this team was willing to train me on the spot, as their medical assistant. Together, we made up a 10-person team, with doctors, pediatricians, pharmacists, dentists, and assistants. We served over 300 families in one week! On a side note, Beirut was once an important port and educational center of the Roman Empire; hence, there are scores of breathtakingly beautiful Roman ruins and temples all over Lebanon that I managed to visit. Such beauty is unknown to many around the world because the globe is too busy reporting on the destructive and ugly side of such countries."

Side note: "I've been practicing Yoga and meditation for nearly 15 years and have seen the positive effects in my life as well as others. I'm currently working on my certification to become an international yoga instructor. I've been accepted into the oldest yoga school in India (the region known as Rishikesh is the birthplace of yoga). I will complete this program in India over this coming summer."

Lucy's husband was not completely comfortable with having their daughter being in Lebanon with her so they arranged it so that her trip was shortened to two weeks. Lucy's parents were scheduled to meet her on the next leg of her journey, Cambodia, along with her baby.

Why Cambodia? "About seven years ago my husband and I had traveled to Cambodia, and we befriended Kosal, a local tour guide and teacher. He shared his dream of building a village school so that local children could have the opportunity to learn English and basic computer skills. We kept in contact with Kosal over the years and promised we would support him in any way we could. Finally the school was completed back in Feb 2017, and I was invited to come teach the children and train two new teachers. Hence I visited the school in Siem Reap, Cambodia in July 2018. Siem Reap is a fascinating place, and the most important city in Cambodia; it is home to the famous Angkor Wat Temple, the largest religious complex in the world. I was eager to see this breathtaking temple for a second time and bring my baby with me. I invited my mom and dad to join me on this trip. Firstly, they also love to travel. Secondly, it was a great help to have them along to assist with my then 10-month old

From July 8 through July 20, Lucy visited Singapore, Brunei, Indonesia and Malaysia. She reports, "My husband flew out here to meet all of us here. Since my husband has limited vacation days from work, he came only for this last leg of the trip to celebrate our 9th anniversary." This must have been some family reunion!

When asked what she thought was her greatest accomplishments on this trip, Lucy replied: "connecting with Syrian families in Lebanon, volunteering with a medical team, despite being out of my comfort

Continued from page 13 zone, I'm glad I didn't let my fears stop me, appreciating the dedication of medical workers and gaining a greater appreciation for the hard work they do! I feel content to follow my heart and go to a country that had been calling me. Though people generally have negative impressions of Lebanon due to the media, I'm glad I followed my

instinct not to listen strictly to the media and instead, use other resources, such as firsthand accounts of other avid travelers from my travel clubs and travel networks. Many who were in Lebanon or had recently traveled there, felt the conditions were stable." Mrs. Hsu also felt that teaching and training teachers in Cambodia was a great accomplishment. It's a project I've followed for nearly 6-7 years and seeing it come to fruition is truly gratifying." These are truly

great accomplishments!

To tell the whole saga of this amazing young lady who has a heart for the poor and underprivileged of other countries would take many pages, a book in fact! But Lucy is not the only one who has seen some of these other countries. Her daughter, Siena, though too young to remember most of the travels will most assuredly have the photos and brochures to remind her in later years of all the places visited. Lucy relates, "In total, Siena has been to 17 countries; Australia, New Zealand, Azerbaijan, Dubai, Philippines, Belize, Mexico, Honduras, Cambodia, Singapore, Malavsia, Indonesia, Brunei, Saint Vincent, Grenada, Senegal, and this past summer she was with me in: Cambodia, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, and Brunei. Traveling with my baby has been a wonderful experience. My husband and I both share a love for travel, and we want to share the world's beauty with our daughter, rather than follow a common notion that global travel is dangerous or too inconvenient with a baby. There's certainly more preparation and precautions to consider, but we focus on the positives and the joys of the experience. When people question my choice to travel with her to certain countries, especially third world countries like Cambodia, the Philippines, Honduras, and Mexico, I have to trust my own judgement being that I've traveled extensively through many of these regions. Often times, it's those who haven't ventured out of the country much who have the most concerns, understandably. I also am part of various travel networks consisting of avid parent travelers with babies, and I consult my pediatrician before trips as well. Sure, there are places without readily available running water and electricity makes it more inconvenient, but there are parents raising babies in these countries which meant survival in such environments is nothing out of the ordinary!"

Changing the way other countries do things is not an easy task:

Lucy says, "In some of the underdeveloped countries, a lack of organization slows down progress greatly. There's a more 'go with the flow' approach, and | Siena with native of Senegal.

sometimes detailed plans and blueprints are lacking. Appointment times, deadlines, and committees are hardly set or followed...as results I've encountered confusion among workers and volunteers, inadequate preparations, and considerable delayed progress!'

So along with the unbearable heat in Cambodia, the delayed flights, inconvenience of lost luggage, this volunteer continues onward. Most of these countries have never even heard of air conditioning, and some do not have running water. Do any of these roadblocks, that would normally stop ordinary human beings, prevent this dynamo from accomplishing her goals? Not in the least! During Christmas break she was at it again traveling to Africa to help build a school in Malawi. For part of the trip to Senegal, Lucy's husband and daughter accompanied her. What will she do next?



## **Cashing in on the rain: Water District** launches rainwater capture rebates

he Santa Clara Valley Water District is launching a new set of - rebates to help Santa Clara County residents continue making conservation a lifestyle.

The water district now offers rainwater capture rebates within its Landscape Rebate Program. Rain gardens, rain barrels, and cisterns are all systems used to keep rainwater onsite for reuse within the landscape and are now available for a rebate.

With nearly half of the water supply in Santa Clara County coming from groundwater, rain gardens can serve as a valuable tool in the landscape to help capture stormwater runoff and sink it back into the ground, helping to replenish our underground aquifers.


Rain gardens are sunken garden beds that collect stormwater runoff from impermeable surfaces such as rooftops. These gardens are designed to mimic the natural landscape that once existed and have a variety of benefits. They help filter pollutants before reaching our creeks and streams, reduce flooding, recharge our groundwater supply, and provide wildlife habitat.

Under the new rainwater capture rebate, customers can receive a rebate of \$1 per square foot of roof area for stormwater diverted into designated rain garden areas (for a maximum of \$300). The rebate rate is based on the roof area and not the size of the rain garden. Residential and commercial sites can redirect rainwater collected from rooftops and funneled through downspouts into shallow depressions that have been strategically located and excavated in the existing landscape. These manmade seasonal wetlands can be designed to look like creek beds or mulched and planted to blend into the landscape.

Also offered under the new rainwater capture rebate are additional options for capturing rainwater onsite for reuse, including rain barrels and cisterns. Homeowners and businesses can receive a rebate of up to \$35 per rain barrel installed (40-199 gallon capacity). These simple barrels, designed specifically for rainwater capture, can be easily connected to an existing downspout to collect rainwater that will be redistributed into the landscape through a garden hose or watering pail. For sites wishing to install a larger, more robust rainwater capture system, a rebate of \$0.50 per gallon is available for installing cisterns (large above- or below-ground water storage tanks) that hold a minimum of 200 gallons of rainwater. The collected water can be used in an automatic irrigation system when equipped with an electric pump system and backflow device.

For all rebates under the Landscape Rebate Program, including the rainwater capture rebates, application submittal and approval is required before purchasing any new equipment or starting any work. 




