



Address identification of your property is not only for your safety it is required under the NYS Building & Fire Code. In the event of an emergency seconds count. If first responders cannot find you, they cannot effectively help you in any emergency! Please be sure your property is clearly marked and visible from the road.

304.3 Premises Identification (NYS Property Maintenance Code)

Buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be not less than 4 inches (102 mm) in height with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch (12.7 mm).
