## RSV: How to protect your child this cold season

Respiratory Syncytial Virus, commonly known as RSV, is a respiratory virus that causes mild, cold-like symptoms. Annually, over 57,000 children younger than 5 years old in the United States are hospitalized due to RSV infection. The season of RSV occurs in most regions of the United States during the fall, winter and spring. However, there are ways to attempt to help keep children and infants healthy during the season.

Laurel Pediatric Clinic's newest pediatrician, Grant Saxton, MD, explains what parents should do to help their children during this season. "RSV is a very common virus that circulates in cold weather months much like influenza. Most children will recover from RSV within a week, but it can be serious especially for infants. In younger infants with prematurity, RSV can be more severe."

The signs and symptoms of RSV are typically runny nose, congestion, cough and a decrease in appetite. RSV symptoms may not be severe when it starts; however, it can develop over time.

"RSV can cause a generic clinical condition called bronchiolitis that causes a lot

of mucus in the lower airways that affects the lungs' ability to oxygenate well with resulting difficulty breathing," states Dr. Saxton. "This is more likely in younger infants and infants with history of prematurity. For an older child or adult, it will present as an upper respiratory illness similar to a common cold. RSV is notorious

because it is the main offending virus that causes bronchiolitis. However hundreds of other respiratory viruses can also cause the same bronchiolitis illness."

To help prevent RSV and other respiratory viruses, the number one thing a person can do is practice good hand washing hygiene. Dr. Saxton explains, "Children are busy and they touch many things, and share germs with classmates and friends. It is important to be diligent with hand washing for parents and children."

Other ways to help prevent illness this cold and flu season are:


- Teach your child to cover coughs and sneezes with inside of elbow technique rather than into hand
  - Get vaccinated to prevent influenza
  - Avoid touching your face
  - Limit contact with sick people
  - Clean and disinfect surfaces
  - Always stay home when you are sick

If your child presents with cold symptoms, there are experienced healthcare professionals available to help. Visits to a healthcare provider for an RSV infection are very common. During the visit, the healthcare provider will evaluate the prop-




## Bridge 184 remains closed

## CPRAM offers \$1,000 scholarships





## Sideline View: No expansion on horizon for college playoffs

Super Bowl LIII is set with the Los Angeles Rams and the New England Patriots facing off on Sunday, February 3, in Atlanta. Both teams won over-

time thrillers as the Patriots won a thrilling 37-31 contest over the K.C. Chiefs, while the Rams stole one from the New Orleans Saints, 26-23. It is the first time in pro football history that both conference championship games were decided in overtime. The big news in Mississippi this



past week was the Sanderson Farms Golf Championship being named a full-fledged PGA Tour event. The 2019 event will be September 16-22 at the Jackson Country Club. The purse has increased to \$6.6 million, up from \$4.4 million. The most important aspect of the change is

that now the winner of the event will earn an invite to the

Masters the following April.

A record number of college football players are passing up their remaining year of eligibility to enter the NFL draft. There are 103 underclassmen eligible for the April 25-27 draft in Nashville. Another 32 players have graduated but still have eligibility left. Three Ole Miss players are expected to be high draft choices: tackle Greg Little and wide outs A.J. Brown and D.K. Metcalf. MSU's Jeffery Simmons will also be near the top choices.

Mississippi State defensive back coach Terrell Buckley and former Ole Miss linebacker Patrick Willis will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. Buckley, a Pascagoula native and former Florida State All-American, played 14 years in the NFL. Willis was an All-American at Ole Miss and played eight seasons in the NFL.

The Senior Bowl will be played this Saturday in Mobile. Mississippi State has three players in the game with Ole Miss having one player. State players in the game are Jonathan Abram, Montez Sweat and Elgton Jenkins. MSU has had a least one player in the game for 24 of the last 25





## Mustangs still holding on to perfect season

The perfect streak in Region 5-5A coninues.

West Jones soccer improved to 5-0 Friday night in Region 5-5A with a 1-0 win over rival South Jones in Ellisville. The win also gives the Mustangs a second-straight region title in as many years.

Senior striker Jacob Fulcher scored the game's only goal.


His goal in the 6th minute that gave West Jones a one-goal advantage that lasted throughout the match.

# Sanderson Farms Championship receives stand-alone date on PGA Tour schedule

JACKSON, Mississippi (January 15, 2019) - At a press conference held today at The Country Club of Jackson, the PGA TOUR, Century Club Charities and title sponsor Sanderson Farms, led by CEO and Chairman of the Board Joe Sanderson, Jr., announced that the Sanderson Farms Championship will have a stand-alone date on the PGA TOUR schedule going forward starting in the fall of 2019.

The tournament, which in recent years has been held the same week as the World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions in China, will be the only PGA TOUR event played the week of September 16-22. The Sanderson Farms Championship will be the second event on the 2019-20 PGA TOUR schedule, one week after The Greenbrier Classic kicks off the

"The partnership between the PGA TOUR and the Sanderson Farms Championship is unique in that Joe Sanderson has been selfless with his intentions for the tournament and the State of Mississippi. Because of Joe's vision for growing the state's largest professional sporting event, this standalone date will further elevate the tournament's stature and provide an even better experience for fans attending the Sanderson Farms Championship."

With the upgrade to a stand-alone event, the Sanderson Farms Championship will offer 500 FedExCup points to the winner for the first time and will play a larger role in the season-long race for the FedExCup. The tournament will also have a record purse, jumping from \$4.4 million to \$6.6 million, with \$1.188 million going to the winner. Cameron Champ, the 2018 Sanderson Farms Championship win-

"It was simply the right time to contemplate the future and what kind of commitment we were going to make going forward," said Joe Sanderson. "We believe that it is important, particularly for the charities and for Batson Children's Hospital to know that we will be here for them, and for the Jackson metro area and the state of Mississippi to know that they can depend on us. Since 1994, when Century Club Charities became the host organization, the tournament has raised \$14.75 million dollars for Mississippi charities, and the economic impact on the Jackson metropolitan area now averages \$26 million every year.
