

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
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# THE WISE WOMAN'S STONE



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
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# **DINNER TONIGHT**

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

# **BLUEBERRY ZUCCHINI**

### **Ingredients**

- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 3 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 1/4 cups white sugar
- 2 cups shredded zucchini
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 pint fresh blueberries

### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease 4 mini-loaf pans.

In a large bowl, beat together the eggs, oil, vanilla, and sugar. Fold in the zucchini. Beat in the flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, and cinnamon. Gently fold in the blueberries. Transfer to the prepared mini-loaf pans.

Bake 50 minutes in the preheated oven, or until a knife inserted in the center of a loaf comes out clean. Cool 20 minutes in pans, then turn out onto wire racks to cool completely.

# **BANANA NUT**

### **Ingredients**

(All ingredients should be room tempt.)

- 3 large extra ripe bananas
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1½ teaspoon cinnamon





# Fruit Breads

- ½ cup white sugar
- ½-3/4 cup brown sugar (I used ½ cup)
- 8 tablespoons butter, softened (1 stick)
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1½ teaspoons vanilla extract
- ½ cup buttermilk
- 1 cup chopped pecans

### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 325.

Grease and flour a loaf pan.

In a medium size bowl, mash bananas until creamy and stir in lemon juice. Set aside.

In a medium size bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda, baking powder, cinnamon, and salt. Set aside

In a large bowl, cream together the butter and sugars.

Beat in the eggs until combined.

Fold in the bananas.

Add in the vanilla extract and buttermilk.

Beat until combined.

Add the dry mixture into the wet mixture.

Fold in Pecans

**IMPORTANT:** STIR GENTLY AND JUST UNTIL THE FLOUR IS INCORPORATED. DO NOT OVER STIR.

Pour the batter into the prepared loaf pan.
Bake on center rack for 1 hour and 10 minutes.
Cooking times may vary. Check on bread at the 1 hour mark. Toothpick inserted into the center

should come out clean and bread should be golden on the outside.

Brush the top of the bread with butter if desire when it comes out of the oven.

Let cool for 5 minutes and then remove the bread from the pan and place on a cooling rack to finish cooling. Slice and Enjoy!



# ORANGE CRANBERRY NUT

### **Ingredients**

2-3/4 cups all-purpose flour

2/3 cup sugar

2/3 cup packed brown sugar

3-1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1 large egg

1 cup 2% milk

1/2 cup orange juice

3 tablespoons canola oil

2 to 3 teaspoons grated orange zest

2 cups coarsely chopped fresh or frozen cranberries

1 large apple, peeled and chopped

1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts

### **Directions**

1. In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugars, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. Whisk the egg, milk, orange juice, oil and orange zest; stir into dry ingredients just until blended. Fold in the cranberries, apple, and nuts.

2. Pour into two greased 8x4-in. loaf pans. Bake at 350° for 50-55 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pans to wire racks. Freeze option: Securely wrap and freeze cooled loaves in plastic wrap and foil. To use, thaw at room temperature.

# **CARAMEL-GLAZED APPLE**

### **Inaredients Bread:**

1 1/2 cups shredded peeled baking apples 2 large

1 cup packed brown sugar

1/2 cup buttermilk

1/2 cup vegetable oil

4 eggs lightly beaten





3 cups All Purpose flour

1/2 cup chopped pecans

2 teaspoons baking soda

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon ground nutmeg

### Glaze:

2 tablespoons butter or margarine

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 tablespoon milk

1/2 cup powdered sugar sifted

### **Directions**

Heat oven to 350°F. Grease bottoms only of 2 (8×4-inch) loaf pans with cooking spray or

In large bowl, stir together apples, 1 cup brown sugar, the buttermilk, oil and eggs.

Stir in remaining bread ingredients just until dry ingredients are moistened.

Pour into pans.

Bake 45 to 55 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Cool 10 minutes on cooling rack. Loosen sides of loaves from pans; remove from pans and place top sides up on cooling rack.

Cool completely, about 1 hour.

In 1-quart saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in 1/4 cup brown sugar. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly; reduce heat to low. Boil and stir 2 minutes.

Stir in milk. Heat to boiling; remove from heat. Cool to lukewarm, about 30 minutes.

Gradually stir powdered sugar into glaze mixture. Place saucepan of glaze in bowl of cold water. Beat with spoon until smooth and thin enough to drizzle. If glaze becomes too stiff, stir in additional milk, 1/2 teaspoon at a time, or heat over low heat, stirring constantly. Drizzle glaze over loaves. Wrap tightly and store at room temperature up to 4 days, or refrigerate up to 10 days.

The husband calmly listened to my gripes and then explained, "Dirty magazines: the clips from their rifles had not been cleaned."







# Claybank Master Gardeners



Did you know that the primary goal of every Master Gardener is to learn about horticulture through state university research-based education and then teach it to adults and children in the community? Reach us at the Dale County Extension Office at (334) 774-2329 for information you need on yards, fruit trees, gardens, and similar topics. Classes for Junior Master Gardeners are now underway at the Ozark-Dale County Library. Youngsters from grades 4 through 6 began a weekly Thursday after school class about horticulture, plant growth and development, ecology, insects, vegetables and herbs.

Last month Coffee County Master Gardener Brenda Evans shared some things we never knew about butterflies. Did you know that--

- most butterflies only live for only about two weeks?
- flame azaleas need butterflies to pollinate them so they will bloom?
- weed killers, pesticides, and other yard chemicals will kill the pollinators in your yard?
- Butterflies need temperatures between 82°-102° to thrive
- native milkweed is the only host plant that monarch butterfly larvae feeds on, and it makes the monarch adult butterfly toxic to birds and other predators!






At first, the passengers do not react thinking that it must be some sort of practical joke. After a few minutes though, the engines start revving, and the airplane begins moving down the runway.
