

Minnesota takes a large portion of those proceeds through an onerous charitable gambling tax. Charitable gambling tax revenues are part of a complicated formula

to make the annual bond payments on the Viking Stadium. My proposal would cut the gambling tax rates in half.

Rural Minnesota have always helped share the burden on major projects like the Vikings stadium. However, the current charitable gambling tax is siphoning off more local revenue than is needed to meet the bond requirements. My bill is one of several bills in play from both sides of the aisle that are working to resolve this issue.

This week I met with a wonderful group of school children from the Catholic Home School Academy at Crosby when they toured the capital this week. We had a good visit in Capital Rotunda at the conclusion of their tour. The trip was part of their civics and government studies.


