The Texas Revolution (October 2, 1835 – April 21, 1836) was a rebellion of colonists from the United States and Tejanos (Texas Mexicans) in putting up armed resistance to the centralist government of Mexico. President Antonio López de Santa Anna, the Mexican government believed the United States had instigated the Texas insurrection with the goal of annexation. The revolution began in October 1835. Determined to avenge Mexico's honor, Santa Anna vowed to personally retake Texas. His Army of Opera-tions entered Texas in mid-February 1836 and found the Texians completely unprepared. Mexican General José de Urrea led a contingent of troops on the Goliad Campaign up the Texas coast, defeating all Texian troops in

his path and executing most of those who surrendered. Santa Anna led a larger force to San Antonio de Béxar (or Béxar), where his troops defeated the Texian garrison in the Battle of the Alamo, killing almost all of the defenders.

A newly created Texian army under the command of Sam Houston was constantly on the move, while terrified civilians fled with the army, in a melee known as the Runaway Scrape. On March 31, Houston paused his men at Groce's Landing on the Brazos River, and for the next two weeks, the Texians received rigorous military training. Becoming complacent and underestimating the strength of his foes, Santa Anna further subdivided his troops. On April 21, Houston's army staged a surprise assault on Santa Anna and his vanguard force at the Battle of San Ja-

cinto. The Mexican

troops were quickly routed, and vengeful Texians executed many who tried to surrender. Santa Anna was taken hostage; in exchange for his life, he ordered the Mexican army to retreat south of the Rio Grande. Mexico refused to recognize the Republic of Texas, and intermittent conflicts between the two countries continued into the 1840s. The annexation of Texas as the 28th state of the United States, in 1845, led directly to the Mexican-American War.







JOURNEY OF A MEDICINE MAN

Tumbleweed Smith



Tumbleweed Smith

Dr. Richard Bartlett of Crane is like Indiana Jones but with a medicine bag. He spends a good deal of his time doctoring in the Midland-Odessa area. "I have a family practice and also I help oil companies with pre-employment screening, physicals and taking care of work-related injuries," he says. "I'm also an emergency room doctor in Odessa."

He travels the world on humanitarian medical trips. "Four years ago I turned 50 years old and went on a trip to North Iraq with World Mission Alliance headquartered in Missouri. I saw some amazing things in a very dark place." He has been to war zones in Egypt. "Isis and al qaeda were running around along with other bad guys. There weren't too many good guys in Egypt at the time. We did medical clinics in the churches and there was a dark cloud over everywhere we went."

Lebanon wasn't any better. "It was a strange sensation for a west Texas boy to be driving down the street and see hezbollah flags everywhere. But we never had any immediate threat to our lives, although we were in a dangerous place." He went to Nepal. "It had just had 3 earthquakes that killed over 9,000 people. Thousands of people were homeless. It was total devastation. So I brought duffel bags of medicine and did medical clinics there." He has been to Thailand, Argentina, Ethiopia and other places on medical clinics. He wrote a book about his experiences titled Journey of a Medicine Man. "It's about my first 5 medical mission trips. I've been on 8 since."

His taste for foreign experiences extends to his family. "We have seven kids. Red, yellow, black and white." Six of his children are adopted. "When we got married I was in my first year of medial school at Tech. My wife went to visit her family in Houston and her appendix ruptured. The surgeons told her she would not be able to have kids. Five years later we applied to adopt. We adopted children from Latvia, the Republic of Georgia, China and 3 more made in the USA.

"When we had been married 20 years and our youngest was 10, my 40-year old wife starts feeling bad. She's light headed and dizzy and wondering if she had a brain tumor. So we ordered a CT scan. I called her after I got the verbal report from the radiologist to tell her the result. She told me that she was listening to a story on the radio about a lady who had a tumor and instead found out she was pregnant. She asked me if that could happen to her. I told her she didn't have a tumor. My wife wanted me to go out and find a pregnancy test. So I went to Family Dollar and found one. I didn't even know they made those. Then there was a big celebration for child number 7. He's 10 now. Before he was delivered, my wife got everybody assembled in the living room and told our kids there was going to be another member of our family. One wanted to know what country he was from. She said this one is closer to home. They were shocked and amazed and this little guy is the family's son. They all have ownership of him. It has solidified our family."


