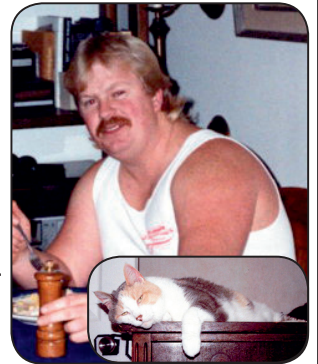

Conor James Walsh
Class of 1998

- Played 4 varsity sports - soccer, alpine skiing, baseball, and track & field.
- 2-time LCAA soccer All-Star who scored a school record 20 goals in 1997.
- Only male student in school history to compete in alpine skiing.
- Qualified for the state skiing finals as an 8th grader and all 4 years of competition.
- 2-time Section V Class B alpine skiing champion in 1996 and 1998 in both the giant slalom and slalom. Was the overall Section V champion in both years.
- Leading member of 1998 track & field team that finished 2nd in sectionals.
- Leader of Alfred University alpine ski team for 4 years. Team captain for 3 years.
- Helped lead Alfred ski team to a combined 40-0 in Empire Conference races, 4 conference titles, and to the USCSA National Championships his final three seasons. Conor won the individual Empire Conference crown three times.
- Inducted into the Alfred University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2013.

Inducted January 11, 2019



On January 11, 2019, the Annual Hall of Fame Ceremony was held at Mount Morris Central School Gymnasium in between the girls varsity and the boys varsity basketball games. While the ceremony took place in 2019, it was actually honoring 2018 Inductees.

Featured here is Conor James Walsh, a graduate from the Class of 1998. He played 4 varsity sports during his high school career - soccer, alpine skiing, baseball, and track & field. On the soccer field, he was the captain and a 2-time LCAA All-Star who scored 20 goals in 1997 which was a school record at that time. He was a leading member of our 1998 track & field team that finished 2nd in sectionals.

In this season, he finished 2nd in sectionals in 2 events, 3rd in another, and qualified for the Meet of Champions.

As our leadoff hitter, his speed and defensive prowess in center field also led him to be named a Livingston County All-Star in baseball. His most impressive accolades came on the ski slopes. This inductee is the only male student in school history to compete in alpine skiing. He did so as a team of one with Dansville. He was very impressive right from the start as he qualified for the New York state skiing finals as only an 8th grader in 1995. He was a 2-time Section V Class B alpine skiing champion in 1996 and again in 1998 in both the giant slalom and slalom and was the overall Section V champion in both of those years. He also qualified for and participated in the New York state skiing finals all 4 years of competition and finished 4th in the state in 1998. After high school he went on to Alfred University where he was a leading member of the men's alpine ski team for 4 years, serving as a team captain for 3 years. During that time, he helped lead the Alfred ski team to a combined 40-0 record in Empire Conference races, 4 conference titles, and to the USCSA National Championships his final three seasons. He also won the individual Empire Conference crown three times. His talents at Alfred led him to be inducted into the Alfred University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2013.

The Mount Morris Athletic Hall of Fame was created in 2006 with the hope of accomplishing the following goals:

1. Recognize and celebrate the accomplishments of outstanding athletes, coaches, administrators, and anyone who made a significant contribution to Blue Devils Athletics program.
2. Reconnect or maintain a relationship with inductees, alumni, and their families with Mount Morris Central School.
3. Enhance the understanding and appreciation of the history of Blue Devils Athletics.
4. Provide role models for current students, coaches, and others to look up to.

In December 2007, when the very first induction ceremony was held, ten individuals were inducted into the MMCS Hall of Fame in a ceremony between a JV and Varsity basketball game in the gymnasium. This hugely successful event not only brought people back together who had not seen each other in a very long time but allowed others to meet and become friends for the very first time. The tradition continues today.

Downtown Enhancement Grants Now Available

Geneseo, NY- Livingston County Economic Development has recently initiated a new grant program for the designated downtown districts of Livingston County: The Downtown Enhancement Program. This new program includes potential funding for public art installations as well as the traditional sign and façade improvement program for downtown buildings.

A Commercial District Analysis was completed last year for the nine villages of the Downtown Partnership and one of the recommendations included the creation of a public art program for the core business districts. As a result, Public Art Committees are currently being established in each community with the mission of developing a plan for permanent public art installations throughout the downtowns.

As in the past, reimbursement grants of up to \$5,000 will be available to qualifying building or business owners for sign and façade projects. New this year, the Villages may apply for funds to supplement public art projects in their commercial district. All projects will need to comply with the design guidelines that have already been established for each community, and all projects must demonstrate matching funds of 50% of the project cost. The deadline for all applications is May 15th. Awards will be announced the first week of June and all projects must be completed by November of this year.

"We are looking for projects that are transformative for the downtown district," said Louise Wadsworth, Downtown Coordinator for Livingston County. "A carved perpendicular sign, a colorful awning or additional display window lighting can transform a storefront and has been proven to impact sales and traffic in the downtown. We are also looking for permanent public art projects that reflect the character and culture of the community. This program is intended to facilitate permanent art projects in the downtown districts with the goal of attracting new pedestrian traffic and increasing community pride."

Livingston County has been acknowledged as a leader in downtown revitalization in New York State. During the last 10 years more than 10.5 million dollars of private and public funds have been invested in over 240 projects in our downtown districts by utilizing a combination of programs and incentives.

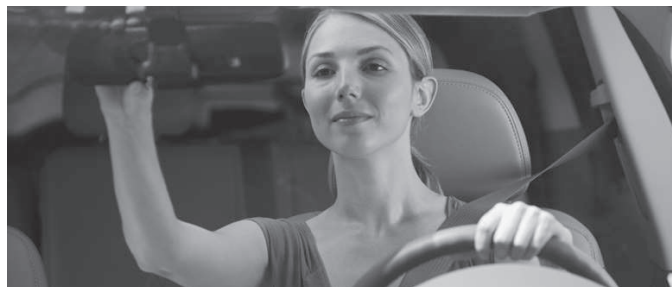

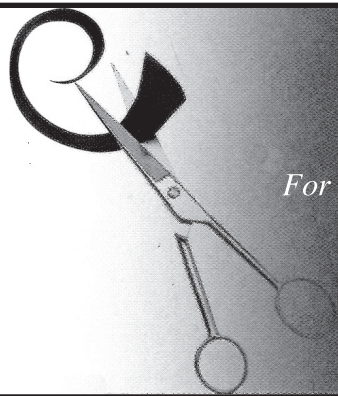
