





What is Natural Gas?

Natural gas is made up of hydrocarbon gases, primarily methane, naturally occurring in rock formations deep below the earth's surface. The natural gas is withdrawn and transported to homes and businesses through an underground system of pipes.

Why use Natural Gas?

Natural gas is a fuel of choice because it is:

- 1. Efficient
- 2. Clean-burning (emits few pollutants)
- 3. Plentiful
- 4. Safe

Who uses Natural Gas?

- Residential users use natural gas in their homes to fuel furnaces, pool/spa heaters, gas lights, stoves, generators and space heaters.
- Commercial users use natural gas in businesses such as restaurants, hotels, and hospitals.
- Industrial users use natural gas for heating processes and as a fuel for the generation of steam.
- Electric utilities use natural gas to generate electricity.
- Natural gas pipeline companies use natural gas as a fuel to run compressor units.

Natural Gas Safety Precautions

Natural gas is colorless, odorless, lighter than air, and non-toxic. Breathing natural gas is not harmful as long as there is an adequate supply of fresh air to breathe along with it. Natural gas by itself will not burn, but with the proper mixture of gas and air combined with an ignition source, combustion can occur.

An odorant that smells like rotten eggs is added to natural gas so that it can be detected. The odor is a warning that natural gas may be present and, if ignited, could result in personal injury or property damage. If the smell of gas is present inside your home or business (no matter how faint or strong),

Do Not:

- 1. Smoke or strike a match.
- 2. Operate an electric switch or appliance control.
- 3. Pull any plugs from outlets.
- 4. Use a flashlight or lighter.
- 5. Use a telephone or cell phone in the building.

If you SMELL A FAINT ODOR of natural gas INSIDE YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, check to see if any appliances have been left on accidentally or if a pilot light has been extinguished, which would cause the odor (rotten eggs). If the odor persists, TAKE NO CHANCES, get out of the house immediately, and then call us from a nearby phone or neighbor.

If a STRONG OR PERSISTENT ODOR OF GAS is present IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, OR IF YOU HEAR A HISSING SOUND of escaping natural gas, follow this procedure:

- 1. Get everyone out of the building immediately.
- 2. Leave the door open.
- 3. Use a neighbor's phone or cellular phone outside the building to call us. 4. If you SMELL OR DETECT NATURAL GAS OUTSIDE, call us.
- Leaks from natural gas pipelines are extremely rare, however it is important that you know how to recognize the signs of a leak if one were to occur in your area. A strong odor, hissing sound, or dirt blowing up from a hole are signs of a leak. Move away from and upwind of the suspected leak before calling us. Do not light matches, smoke, use a cell phone or attempt to start any motor vehicles in the area of a possible gas leak.

Call Before You Dig

Whether you are building a home, installing a sprinkler system, or just planting a tree, we want you to be safe. No matter the size of the project, before you dig, grade, or excavate, the law requires you to call for all underground utilities to be located. Please contact the One-Call Center for more information on this free service. (Alabama One Call 811) If you are digging and expose a gas pipeline, call us. Proper attention to pipe that has been exposed can prevent problems later.



where the sewing machines still hum, attention to detail is a must, and the southern hospitality the shop has always been known for surrounds every gown.







Rainy Day Thoughts

As I write these words it is pouring rain outside and it has been coming down pretty much all day. We have had an unusually rainy season, but that is all right with me. I must admit, I love to see it rain. Oh, I do not mean I want it to rain *every* day! I love to see the sunshine too! But there is both wonder and beauty in rain that cannot be depied

When we read about rain in the Bible, we learn that God used it to fulfil His purpose in various ways.

First of all, God created rain to be a blessing to His people. He promised His people of old, "If you walk in My statutes and keep my commandments, and perform them, then I will give you rain in its season, the land shall yield its produce, and the trees of the field shall yield their fruit" (Leviticus 26:3, 4).

Notice that the promise of rain in this text is conditional. In order to receive it as needed, the people had to faithfully follow God's ways. In fact, the Lord went on to make His point abundantly clear by adding: "If you do not obey Me... your land shall not yield its produce, nor shall the trees of the land yield their fruit" (vv. 14, 20).

That brings us to God's second use of rain which was a tool for punishment. Old Testament history reveals that Israel often did not heed God's words mentioned above. Hence, God did exactly as He said He would do. The Bible goes on to record the droughts that afflicted the Israelites due to their failure to keep God's will.

We also recall that God had already used rain as punishment long before Israel ever became a nation; not with drought, but by means of a flood. In the days of Noah, God sent a great rain for forty days and forty nights because "The wickedness of man was great in the earth, and every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5).

Finally, there is another way in which God uses rain still today that I want to bring to our attention. Jesus taught that "Our Father in heaven... sends rain on the just and the unjust" (Matthew 5:45). In telling us how to love everyone, He notes that God's love for everyone is demonstrated through the sending of rain on the evil as well as the good.

The practical lesson for you and me is that the blessing of rain should be a reminder of God's love for us all and His desire for us to follow Him!

I had a wreck in January and I had only had my car a couple of months. It was brand new and the damage was around \$10,000.00. They did not total my car but repaired it. Now, the insurance company wants to settle and I asked the adjuster about diminution in value and he said that wasn't a law.

I am sure that certain insurance companies have contracts with their insureds' that specify what they will and will not pay. If you are making a claim against your insurance company for collision or comprehensive damage to your own vehicle, the contract (that you haven't seen or read) between you and your insurance company will define what their obligation to pay is and is not.

If you are making a claim against someone else who negligently caused damage to your car and their insurance company is trying to tell you what the law is, don't believe them.

The law of damages in Alabama is simple and straight forward and exactly what you think it should be. If someone through carelessness or negligence damages property that you own, you are entitled by law to the value of the property prior to the damage.

Everyone reading this, if given the choice between two

identical cars except that one had been wrecked and the other not, would choose the car had not been wrecked. We all know that if you trade in a car that has been previously damaged, it is worth less as a trade in.

What you are really looking at is an issue of evidence and proof. If you can by the testimony of an experienced car salesperson or automotive appraiser, provide competent evidence of how much less your car is worth in its wrecked, repaired condition then the Court should award that amount of money for the diminished value of your property.

ON YOUR DEBT

Will Filing **Bankruptcy Affect** Your Employment?



One of the most common concerns my clients have is whether or not filing a bankruptcy case will affect their job. The short answer is this; no, filing a case should not have any impact.

McNutt Managing

The Bankruptcy Code at 11 U.S.C. §525 specifically prohibits employers from discriminating against any person who has filed for bankruptcy relief. Your employer would be breaking a federal law if they fire you or discriminate against you as a result of your bankruptcy.

Protection Against Discriminatory Treatment
(a) Except as provided in the Perishable Agricultural Commodities
Act, 1930, the Packers and Stockyards Act, 1921, and section 1 of the
Act entitled "An Act making appropriations for the Department of
Agriculture for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1944, and for other
purposes," approved July 12, 1943, a governmental unit may not deny revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew a license, permit, charter, franchise, or other similar grant to, condition such a grant to, discriminate with respect to such a grant against, deny employment to, terminate the employment of, or discriminate with respect to employment against, a person that is or has been a debtor under this title or a bankrupt or a debtor under the Bankruptcy Act, or another person with whom such bankrupt or debtor has been associated, solely because such bankrupt or debtor is or has been a debtor under this title or a bankrupt or debtor under the Bankruptcy Act, has been insolvent before the commencement of the case under this title, or during the case but before the debtor is granted or denied a discharge, or has not paid a debt that is dischargeable in the case under this title or that was discharged under the Bankruptcy Act.

(b) No private employer may terminate the employment of, or discriminate with respect to employment against, an individual who is or has been a debtor under this title, a debtor or bankrupt under the Bankruptcy Act, or an individual associated with such debtor or bankrupt, solely because such debtor or bankrupt-

(1) is or has been a debtor under this title or a debtor or bankrupt under the Bankruptcy Act;

(2) has been insolvent before the commencement of a case under this title or during the case but before the grant or denial of a discharge; or

(3) has not paid a debt that is dischargeable in a case under this title or that was discharged under the Bankruptcy Act.

Will My Employer Find out About My Bankruptcy Case?

It is very unlikely that your employer would ever know that you've filed bankruptcy if you file a Chapter 7 case. Chapter 7 is the most common kind of case that is filed nationwide.

In Chapter 7, the court will require you to disclose where you are working and your income, but as long as you provide that information then there would be no reason for the court to ever contact your employer.

In Chapter 13 cases, it is not unusual for the employer's payroll department to find out that a person has filed bankruptcy. Chapter 13 cases allow you to consolidate your debts into a payment plan that is managed by the court.

In the majority of Chapter 13 cases, the person who files a Chapter 13 case will make payments on their case through a payroll deduction. The Bankruptcy Court or Trustee can send the necessary information to your payroll department and they will automatically deduct your Chapter 13 plan payments the same way they deduct your income taxes or health insurance.

A Payroll Deduction issued by a Chapter 13 Trustee is NOT a garnishment. It is a completely different legal document that orders the employer to deduct a set amount from your pay and remit it at least monthly to your Trustee.

Medicare Minute Medicare Part B Coverage

Medicare Part B is most used when you visit your primary care physician or specialist. But Medicare Part B is also used for many other medically necessary services. Medicare defines medically necessary as "healthcare services or supplies needed to diagnose or treat an illness, injury, condition or disease, or its symptoms and that meet accepted standards of medicine".

Medicare.gov list 23 screenings and shots that fall under preventive services. They include things such as mammogram screenings, colorectal cancer screenings and flu shots.

Part B has an annual deductible of \$185 and a coinsurance of 20%. This means that if you have Original Medicare only, with no other supplemental coverage, you will owe the first \$185 filed on Part B each year and, after the deductible is met, you will be responsible for 20% of the cost of Part B services you receive.

Black mold is a dangerous fungus which can produce toxic air extremely harmful to humans. INSURANCE AND SAVINGS

Dear Dave,

I just realized our insurance has a health savings account option. (HSA) We've considered dropping this insurance soon and going to a cheaper Christian medical sharing program. We've got about \$19,000 in debt between credit cards and a car payment, and we're on Baby Step 2 of your plan. Our thought was to fund the HSA for a period of time as a means of saving, cancel that policy, then go over to a medical sharing program we found that costs \$600 a month less. After that, we would start paying down debt again. What do you think?

Dear Amy, There are two components to an HSA, the insurance component and the savings component. You don't have to participate in the savings component. The insurance component is

simply a large deductible, 100 percent coverage after deductible, cheaperpremium health insurance plan. If I were in Baby Step 2, I would not do the savings component. I would only do the insurance component, or I'd do the medical sharing program.

I'm not sure why you'd need to jump back and forth it you're going to permanently move to a medical sharing program. I get the idea of saving money, but what you're talking about isn't something I'd recommend for someone who's in debt. I wouldn't fund a savings account of several thousand dollars only for medical when you're not even on Baby Step 3, which is saving an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses. That money needs to be used to pay off debt first.

It's not the end of the world if you don't fund the HSA portion of your current insurance plan. If you went with a medical sharing program, and just saved up a large emergency fund, the only thing you'd really lose out on is the tax deduction associated with an HSA.

How to Slow Down **Cognitive Aging**

Dear Savvy Senior

Are there any proven strategies to preventing cognitive decline? I have a family history of dementia and worry about my own memory and cognitive abilities as I grow older. What can you tell me?

Almost 60

Dear Almost,

For most people, starting in their fifties and sixties, the brain's ability to remember names, multi-task or learn something new starts declining. While our genes (which we can't control) play a key role in determining our cognitive aging, our general health (which we do have some control over) plays a big factor too.

Here are some healthy lifestyle strategies recommended by medical experts – that you can employ that can help stave off cognitive loss and maybe even build a stronger brain.

Manage health problems: Studies have shown that cognitive problems are related to health conditions, like diabetes, heart disease and even depression. So, if you have high blood pressure, high cholesterol or diabetes you need to treat them with lifestyle changes and medication (if necessary) and get them under control. And if you have a history of depression, you need to talk to your doctor about treatment options.

Exercise: Aerobic exercise increases blood flow to all parts of your body, including your brain, to keep the brain cells well nourished. So, choose an aerobic activity you enjoy like walking, cycling, dancing, swimming, etc., that elevates your heart rate and do it for at least 30 to 40 minutes three times a week.

Eat healthy: A heart-healthy diet, like the Mediterranean diet, will also help protect the brain. A Mediterranean diet includes relatively little red meat and emphasizes whole grains, fruits and vegetables, fish and shellfish, and nuts, olive oil and other healthy fats. Also keep processed foods and sweets to a minimum.

Get some sleep: Quality, restful sleep contributes to brain health too. Typically, adults should get between seven and nine hours of sleep daily. If you have persistent problems sleeping, you need to identify and address the problem. Medications, late-night exercise and alcohol can interfere with sleep quality and length, as can arthritis pain, sleep apnea and restless leg syndrome.

If you need help, make an appointment with a sleep specialist who will probably recommend an overnight diagnostic sleep test.

Challenge your mind: Some research suggests that mind challenging activities can help improve memory, and slow age-related mental decline. But, be aware that these activities consist of things you aren't accustomed to doing. In other words, crossword puzzles aren't enough to challenge your brain, if you're already a regular puzzle doer. Instead, you need to pick up a new skill like learning to dance, play a musical instrument, study a new language or do math problems - something that's challenging and a little outside your comfort zone.

Brain-training websites like *Lumosity.com* and BrainHQ.com are good mind exercising tools because they continually adapt to your skill level to keep you challenged.

Socializing and interacting with other people is another important way to stimulate the brain. So make a point to reach out and stay connected to friends, family and neighbors. Join a club, take a class or even volunteer - anything that enhances your social life.

Don't smoke or drink excessively: Smoking and excessive alcohol consumption both effect the brain in a negative way, so kick the habit if you smoke and, if you drink, do so only in moderation.

Reduce stress: Some stress is good for the brain, but too much can be toxic. There's growing evidence that things like mindfulness meditation, yoga and tai chi are all good ways to help reduce stress.



HISTORY OF TTLEVILLE, ALABAMA

Capt. Benjamin F. Little, a former Confederate soldier, opened a store here after the railroad from Tuscumbia to Russellville was built in 1887. A train station and several houses were soon erected. A rail spur provided access to nearby iron ore mines. Capt. A.H. Keller owned a sandstone quarry and summer resort called Fern Quarry near Keller Springs just north of the town in the 1880s and 1890s. The stone was used in construction of a blast furnace and commercial buildings in Sheffield. In 1917, Jackson Highway (U.S. Hwy 43) was constructed along the general route of the old Jackson Military Road.




