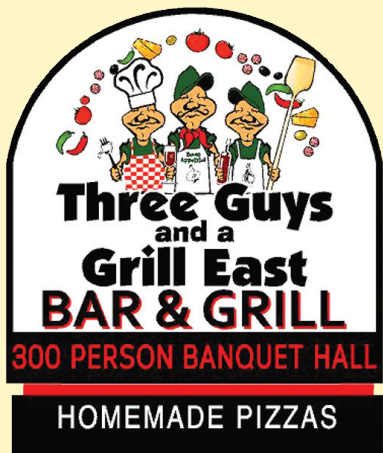

# Camp Y-Koda turns 50

Camp Y-Koda is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2019.

The camp was founded in 1969 by the Sheboygan County YMCA and has been offering summer camp experiences ever since.

Camp Y-Koda is located on a beautiful 80 acre parcel just west of Sheboygan Falls, WI. The property is bordered by the Sheboygan River to the north and east, has a three acre lake, wetlands, forests, and more than five acres of prairie.

Camp Y-Koda Outdoor Skills and Education promotes responsible stewardship of our environment and enhances participant quality of life by offering hands-on education opportunities.

The camp's vision is to strengthen our community by connecting youth and families with the outdoors by providing valuable outdoor experiences.

## Old pony farm

At the time of purchase, the land where camp currently sits was a pony farm with not a tree on the property. The conversion of the site into a full-fledged summer camp was a dramatic and intensive undertaking, but through the commitment of past Y leaders and countless volunteers, we are now one of the largest summer day camps in the state of Wisconsin and an award winning environmental education center.

## Merged in 2001

In 2001, Camp Y-Koda merged with the Outdoor Skills Center and officially became known as Camp Y-Koda Outdoor Skills and Education. The merger combined two organizations that shared the same passion of providing valuable outdoor experiences to youth, families, and community members at large.

Today, Camp Y-Koda is one of the premier summer day camps in the state of Wisconsin serving roughly 1900 campers each summer through more than 80 different camp choices. Camp doubles as a year-round, award-winning environmental education center serving more than 50 schools and tens of thousands of students annually.

## Connections with river

We pride ourselves on having something for everyone at Camp Y-Koda. From arts and crafts camps to Apostle Island sea kayaking, we have a camp for your child. Camp Y-Koda is the perfect setting for a summer day camp experience featuring a high ropes and challenge course, a zip-line and 40 ft. climbing wall, three acre lake, basketball and volleyball courts, playground, soccer field, camp store, a huge slip and slide, canoeing, kayaking, row-boating, tubing, archery, bb gun, arts and crafts, swimming at the beach and the pool, and so much more!

There are two lodges at the camp; Lohmann Lodge houses our Pee Wee campers during the summer and the Johnsonville Lodge serves as headquarters during inclement weather, our cafeteria for resident camps and other indoor programs.

Camp Y-Koda is a State of Wisconsin Licensed Day Care and Day Camp. Our staff, hiring procedures, and safety policies meet standards set by the state of Wisconsin for Day Camp Licensing. These standards ensure the highest quality program and experience for our campers.

## Pre K Program

Sheboygan Area School District, Camp Y-Koda and Maywood Environmental Park are partnering to start a nature based 4k in the fall of 2018.

Our 4k initiative aims to develop the whole child through daily nature explorations and play in the outdoors throughout the seasons. Nature will be the central organizing concept of our initiative and curriculum will be based on local season

and natural occurrences. Our emergent curriculum is a holistic approach that will be infused with attributes of the Reggio Emilia philosophy. Children build their knowledge through their first-hand experiences with nature, classroom materials and their relationships with peers and adults.

The mission of the Maywood Nature School is to provide a high quality, hands-on early childhood experience that promotes child development and inspires a lifelong connection with nature through play.

## Outdoor education

Camp Y-Koda Outdoor Skills and Education is an 80 acre summer camp and environmental education center that serves more than 15,000 youth and families annually.

We are one of the largest summer day camps in the state of Wisconsin offering more than 50 summer camp choices each year ranging from arts and crafts to high adventure sea kayaking trips on Lake Superior.

ronmental park where habitat diversity abounds. Prairie, maple forest, wetland, ponds and the Pigeon River provide a haven for wildlife. A stunning nature center features exhibits, program space and laboratories which serve to enhance the experiences and discoveries made while outdoors. The park also has many miles of trails for hiking, skiing and snowshoeing. Access to the grounds and nature center are all free year round. However, family memberships are just \$25.00 to the Maywood Association and help support the many programs and events.

The summer camp experience at our Maywood site provides a different feel with the same great quality and staff. ## Inside the Bottle

### Ordering a bottle of wine in a restaurant

In Elkhart Lake we are lucky to have several wonderful dining establishments with great wine lists, but ordering wine in a restaurant can sometimes be a little intimidating. With a few simple tricks, you can navigate the wine list, pick a perfect bottle, and impress your dining companions.

Wine lists are typically organized by either grape type or region. If you are trying to find a selection on your own, it is important to acclimate yourself with the layout in order to get to the section that you are interested in. If just figuring out the layout sends you into a panic, asking the server for assistance is a great way to get the ball rolling.

Something simple like, "Can you assist me with picking out a bottle?" will allow the server to reply with "absolutely. What style are you looking for?" or "I would be happy to get our manager/sommelier/steward/owner" if they are less comfortable with the wine list, too.

At this point, narrowing down your options is key. Whether you prefer Cabernet Sauvignon or simply a 'heartly red' will give the person assisting you a lot to work with. A helpful suggestion to make sure you don't end up with the most expensive bottle on the list, is to simply set a limit. You don't have to vocalize this as a dollar amount if you are trying to hide cost from your dining companions, but instead can point at the price column at a couple options that are in your comfort zone. Once you have decided on a bottle, the restaurant staff will seek out that bottle and the server will come to your table to present it.

The ceremony of opening a bottle can seem stuffy, but it is a routine with several important steps that do serve a purpose. As a customer, it is really important to take a moment to verify that the bottle they have is indeed the correct one. Check the name, grape, vintage, and region to be sure that they don't start opening the wrong bottle. It is easier to send them back to the cellar at this point than to realize there's a white wine in your glass instead of red when they pulled the Chardonnay instead of the Cabernet that you wanted.

Once the details of the label have been confirmed, the server will proceed with opening the bottle. Once the cork is out, they will often present it. I've seen people do anything from stare at it awkwardly to sniff and even lick it. The only thing you should do with the cork is check it for storage quality. To do this, you simply grasp it between your thumb and index finger and make sure it has a little sponginess. Too dry and it will be hard and can indicate poor, upright storage. Too gooey with wine staining all the way up the side can indicate that the bottle has leaked. This just helps to put you on alert for a possible flaw when you smell the wine and taste the first sip.

Once the server pours you a little taste, you want to check the wine for

any issues. Simply not liking it isn't a valid issue, though. If the wine smells like wet cardboard, nail polish, or mold; then you should alert your server and see if they can get another bottle. I kindly and simply say, "I think this wine is off. Would you care to smell it?" Now, I have had friends do this only to be met with a server saying, "that's just how it smells," but typically restaurants won't hesitate to get another bottle. If you simply don't like it, you can mention that to your server and see if they'll offer any options. Sometimes restaurants will offer to pour the bottle by the glass as a special, but don't rely on this. If there is nothing technically wrong with the wine, then it is yours to consume or take home. It's the same as if you went out on a limb to try the steak, knowing you don't care much for beef, but then asked to send it back simply because the beef is too beefy. Restaurants typically want to do what's necessary to please their customers, so just being open and friendly about it can go a long way.

A standard bottle of wine has 25.4 oz in it. This equates to roughly four-five standard glasses. If you can't finish the entire bottle at dinner, Wisconsin law allows you to recork the bottle and take it home, so long as you ordered food with it. The restaurant just needs to recork the bottle to a point where it requires a corkscrew to remove the cork.

Some will bag up the wine and attach your dining receipt just to be safe. To make sure you don't appear to have an open container in your car on your way home, I recommend putting the bottle in your trunk, just to be safe.

If you experience great restaurant wine service, I encourage you to let them know. It seems that people are more inclined to vocalize complaints than praise, so if you have a stellar server that led you to your new favorite wine or an extraordinary wine pairing, be sure to share that with the management or owners. While it isn't always customary to tip the full 20% percent on a bottle of wine, that can go a long way, too.

Servers are often underappreciated, so when you encounter a great one, be sure to let them know.

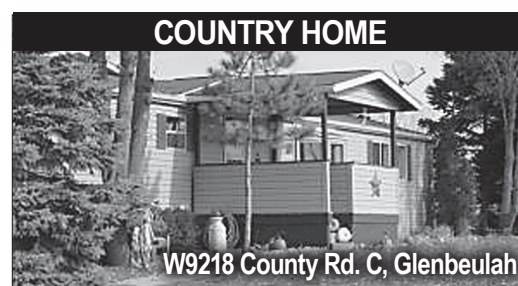

# ELGHS grad retires from Air Force as Brigadier General

“Heroes come and go but legends live on forever.”

On Feb. 2, 2019, Brig. Gen. Ronald Wilson, Director of the Joint Staff, Michigan Air National Guard, wore his uniform in a military capacity for the last time, retiring with 37 years of distinguished military service during a ceremony held at the 110th Attack Wing, Battle Creek Air National Guard Base, Mich.

Wilson, a graduate of Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School was fortunate to have several people attend from his home town.

“To look out here and see everyone in attendance is a bit overwhelming, and I am very humbled and grateful,” said Wilson.

Wilson may be retiring from military service, but he will always be remembered as an important part of the Michigan National Guard and the 110th Attack Wing’s success. He served as the 110th’s Wing Commander from 2012-2015.

“The work he did as the Wing Commander here at the 110th was amazing; we were able to capitalize on what he did and move forward into the next mission because of him,” said Col. Bryan Teff, the 110th Attack Wing’s present commander.

**Multiple careers**

Amazingly, the military isn’t the only career Wilson has had. He has been a commercial airline pilot, a firefighter, and he also volunteers at his church and takes a hands on approach within the

community of Colon, Mich., where he makes his home.

“I swear that General Wilson was the de facto Mayor of Colon, he was so heavily involved in the athletic department of the Colon School district and community,” said Teff.

Wilson was commissioned as an active duty Air Force officer in 1982 after graduating from the University of Wisconsin-Superior. He was selected to attend Air Force pilot training to fly the A-10 Thunderbolt. After nearly ten years of active duty flight service, Wilson joined the Michigan Air National Guard in 1991, serving at Battle Creek Air National Guard Base.

Wilson accumulated more than 4,000 hours of flight time in a variety of aircraft, earning many military awards and decorations including the Distinguished Flying Cross for aerial combat and over-watch missions in Bosnia, Kosovo, Iraq, and Afghanistan.

“He is one of the reasons we are so successful in the A-10 mission today, and I would like to thank you for everything you did to keep the Michigan Air National Guard ready to deploy,” said Maj. Gen. Leonard Isabelle, Assistant Adjutant General and commander of the Michigan Air National Guard.

Wilson served in many different capacities throughout his career. Since his time as commander of the 110th Attack Wing, Battle Creek, Mich., he has been the Director of the Joint Staff for the Michigan National Guard, based at the Michigan National Guard’s Joint Forces Headquarters in Lansing.

“When we did a reboot at Joint Force Headquarters, we had the right leader at the right time and we were able to put Michigan back on the map because of

him,” said Col. Jeffery Terrill, Michigan Army National Guard.

As Director of the Joint Staff, Wilson oversaw the coordination and integration of Army and Air Force personnel in supporting Michigan’s role in protecting the homeland. He also assisted the Michigan Air National Guard commander in the administration of units located at Selfridge ANG Base, Battle Creek ANG Base, and the Combat Readiness Training Center in Alpena, Mich.

“[Brig. Gen. Wilson] had everything in place and the residents of Michigan were in good hands,” Terrill said.

Wilson earned the rank of Captain in 1986. He was promoted to Major in 1996, became a Lieutenant Colonel in 2002. Six years later, in 2008, he achieved the rank of full Colonel. Wilson was named a Brigadier General in December, 2015.



## The last word from Rudnick

This will be my final Depot Dispatch article. I will be retiring as Village President in April. I have been writing this since 2010 and would like to thank the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce and the Depot Dispatch publishers for giving the village this space. My hope was to keep our taxpayers and guests informed and updated on current issues in the village.

Over the past 10 years that I have been Village President I have been fortunate to oversee significant commercial growth. The village created three Tax Incremental Tax Districts (TIF) that in turn allowed the construction of Sargento, Victory Lane, the Vet Clinic and Throttle Stop 1 & 2, the Osthoff convention center and Wolf Motorsports and Villas.

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve you all as your village president. I have enjoyed working with a diverse village board and the various committees. The village is fortunate to have a dedicated group of volunteers that help with all aspects of village life. They were recently honored at a Volunteer Dinner at the Osthoff Resort.

I would also like to thank our village staff for making this a village that we can all be proud of. All of our staff has worked very hard to maintain our quality of life in the village. It is a testament to all of our departments. You have all been wonderful to work with. You made the village board and my job very easy.

### Snow Emergencies

2. Apartments are still being considered on the Braun's Ranch property.

3. We are working on a commercial development on the village owned lot on Lincoln Street and Maple Street. Hopefully this will happen in April.



4. Village Park upgrade and Visitor Center and Public Restrooms are also being considered by the Village Board. Unfortunately, we have had to remove some of the larger trees in the park. With that and the need for public bathrooms we are in the process of creating a master park plan.

#### PARKING REGULATIONS

All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street or the parking lot on North East Street between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be

removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.
