## Stifter returns to Aitkin as superintendent of school district



Dan Stifter, former dean of students and athletic director in Aitkin, is the new superintendent of Aitkin Public Schools.

Dan Stifter, 54, is the new superintendent of Aitkin Public Schools. He was selected by the school board on Feb. 11 and will officially take over his duties in July. Growing up on a farm at Winsted near Hutchinson, Stifter has been involved in wrestling since fourth grade. He taught for a couple of years in South Dakota and then came to Aitkin in 1992. He taught social studies and coached wrestling and football, eventually taking over as head wrestling coach. He ended that tenure in Aitkin as a dean of students and

athletic director for two years.

He then served in principal positions in Menahga and then Pierz. While working in Pierz he commuted and his family moved back to Aitkin.

Dan and his wife Karen have a son Nathen, a ninth grader at Aitkin. Daughter Jennifer attends North Dakota State University and son Levi runs a mowing and snowplowing business in Aitkin. Karen returned to being a daycare provider with limited clients.

What made Stifter stand out to the school board? "I

think it was my connection to the community and my familiarity with the school district. This is where I want to be and I'm here to stay."

What draws him to Aitkin? "There is strong community support for our schools from families. Parents and grandparents show up -- they value what is going on. They care about what the school district is doing and want to be part of it."

Stifter also loves working in small towns where there are lots of connections and local pride. He is excited to be back and working with former colleagues and past

students and athletes he coached.

He is ready to take the Aitkin School District forward and create a shared plan -- even if that means some tough conversations along the way. "It is better for school district employees if community people have positive views of the school and a good attitude toward district employees. This community is accepting and understanding."

When not working, Stifter likes the outdoors, fishing and attending school events. He'll continue to volunteer with the wrestling program.

## Rep. Dale Lueck legislative update

Last week was very busy. Monday we paused at the Legislature to welcome the tribal government leaders from the 11 federally recognized Native American Tribes in Minnesota. The full day session was an excellent opportunity to learn more about the history of Native Americans in Minnesota and the challenges they face today.

I want to express my thanks to Chief Executive Melanie Benjamin of the Mille Lacs Band and Chairman Kevin DuPuis of the Fond du Lac Band for providing a straight forward examination of the often very difficult history we share. While we cannot change the past, I share their focus and optimism that by working together we can resolve the many challenges our children and grandchildren face as we move forward.

We got a look at the governor's budget proposal this week. It would add more than \$3 billion in new taxes, I will provide details in the next several updates.

On a more pleasant note, let's jump to last Friday morning's Iron Range Resources & Rehabilitation Board meeting at Eveleth. I am pleased to report that the board issued a favorable recommendation to IRRRB Commissioner Phillips on a loan participation agreement with American Peat Technology.

IRRRB participation will be at \$750,000 as part of a \$7.37 million plant expansion project. The project will allow APT to significantly expand the production capacity at the Spencer Township plant. APT is a leader in producing specialized seed coatings for the agriculture industry and a unique granule absorbent product for pollution control systems.

We also issued a favorable recommendation on a \$350,000 grant proposal to the city of Crosby for sewer and water utility work to support a new hotel/lodge in Crosby. This grant will mitigate some of the public infrastructure costs to the city that are necessary to support construction of 35,000 square foot, 50 room hotel within the city.

The project will add a much needed element to the local economy. Currently there are no lodging accommodations on this scale in Crosby to support visitors to the Cuyuna Country State Recreation Area.

Ways to start a detox

Last week, we introduced the idea and reasons for “detoxifying” our bodies. Remember, we recognized that our bodies our being hit by an ever increasing number of toxins in our food, water and air and even that toxins can even come from within from our normal bodily functions. Further, we said that these can toxins build up over time and can cause an ever increasing number of symptoms.

of meals (with the recipes pre-planned) can be a wonderful way to make the process easier, more enjoyable and, frankly, less stressful. Setting aside the time for this food preparation is also important.

Speaking of setting aside time, allowing for relaxation and generally slowing down is very important for relieving mental emotional stress and clearing your mind. Don’t forget to plan an exercise routine into the process. This will augment your other efforts.

For some, it may be important to get the advice of a health care professional with extensive experience in detoxifying to smooth out the path. They can help troubleshoot symptoms you may have and even recommend high quality supplements that enhance your success in all areas. Finally, eliminating foods that are common offenders such as dairy, gluten and refined sugars can help almost from day one.

Don’t forget to hydrate, hydrate, hydrate (drink a lot of pure water!) It will help in a wide variety of ways and is good for you even after you finish.
