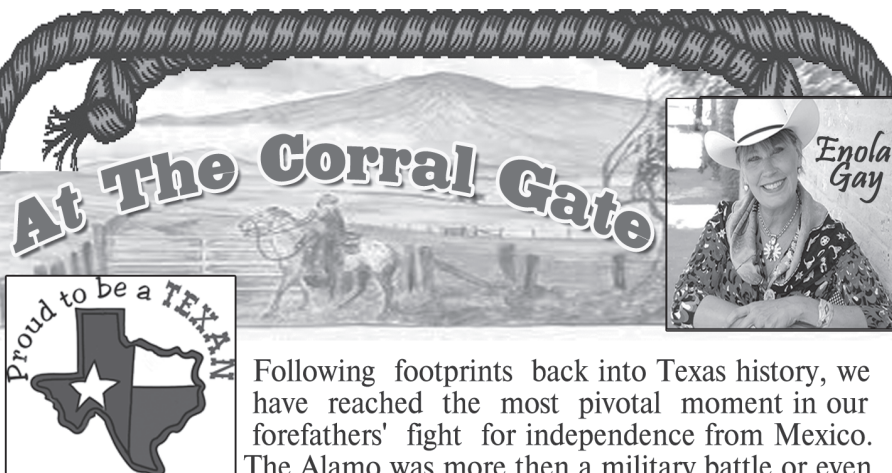

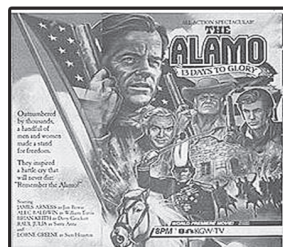

Following footprints back into Texas history, we have reached the most pivotal moment in our forefathers' fight for independence from Mexico. The Alamo was more than a military battle or even a historic happening. It was a line in the sand, the clock's chime of midnight, a moment that stood on it's own. The siege and massacre has been described as the Thirteen Days of Glory and paid tribute through motion pictures, TV mini series, books and songs. Yearly on March 6, patriots from all over the state are present in San Antonio to attend a daybreak vigil outside the mission. The Alamo possesses a place of passion in the hearts and minds of all who wear and bear the title of Texan. Although March 2, 1836 was marked by a declaration of independence, March 6 is truthfully the day of Texas' beginning of life.

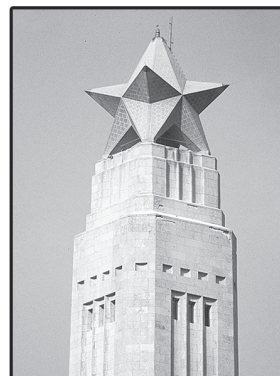
Here are some interesting facts about Texas and the Alamo.

The 1987 television mini series "The Alamo; Thirteen Days of Glory" was filmed largely in Texas, with much of the footage was shot in Alamo Village, a lavish set built by John Wayne for the filming of his 1959 movie "The Alamo". Did you know that when 'The Duke' was unable to secure sufficient funding to make the movie, he paid for the set himself, although he was not a native Texan!

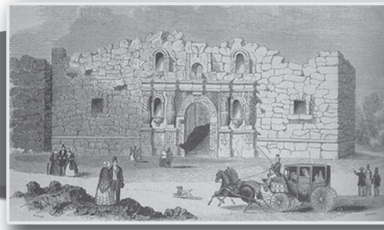


Antonio de Padua Maria Severino Lyepez de Santa Anna y Pñrez de Lebyn (Santa Anna) referred to himself as The Napoleon of the West. The cruelty of Santa Anna at the Alamo and the heroic resistance of the Texian forces inspired many Texians to join the army and win a victory at San Jacinto.

Colonel Travis wrote the famous letter, To the People of Texas & All Americans in the World, at The Alamo. He called for aid "in the name of Liberty, of patriotism & everything dear to the American character". The letter was reprinted throughout the United States and played a part in people volunteering for the Texian cause. It is considered a "masterpiece of American patriotism" and forms part of history education of schoolchildren in Texas.



The flag of the Republic of Texas, blue with a single star, was it's symbol from 1836 until 1839.

January 25, 1839 our current State of Texas flag was adopted as the Republic of Texas flag.



100 years after the battle, in 1936, U.S. Post Office issued a stamp to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Alamo.

As the Spring of 2019 develops and bluebonnets arrive, let's never take the privileges of life, freedom and the pursuit of happiness for granted. Remember, scores of brave men fought and died to preserve these treasures. May we continue to carry the title of Texan and American close to our hearts and wear these with pride! Until next week and for all time to come, "Remember the Alamo!"

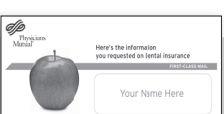

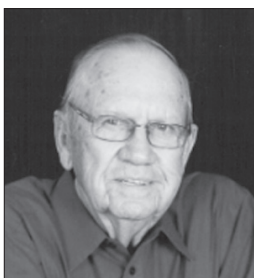

Just 'Plane' Herb...

For decades, four words have been used to magnify success achieved by remarkable individuals. The words? "Only in America could..." Following this opening are tributes to support such a lofty claim.

I'm not sure such a well-intentioned comment really is a true "fit" for Herb Kelleher, who introduced discount air travel to America a half-century ago. This admitted maverick would have "made it big" in the ingenious ways of his choosing in whichever country he lived in.

The late icon's business acumen, zest for life, indomitable spirit and commitment to both employees and the flying public were as expansive as the skies across which fly aircraft of Southwest Airlines, the country's largest domestic carrier....

Media reports of his recent death at the age of 87 were as colorful as the man himself. Herb, the name he liked to be called, wasn't to be figured out by anyone. He earned his eccentric label, laughing all the way.

One person given to hyperbole said Kelleher could call the names of all Southwest employees when he saw them.

Kelleher shot down this accolade, countering that he hadn't met ALL 60,000 SWA employees!...

Greats, near-greats and ordinary folks shared "Herb stories," many beginning with, "Do you remember the time that?" Among hundreds of tributes, perhaps none was more compelling than Ralph Nader's: "....No one has been able to imitate

Kelleher's super-successful management philosophy, his hands-on behavior and authenticity. They may install cut-rate fares, but fortunately for the people, Kelleher stands alone as one of a kind."...

I'm one of the "ordinaries" who never met Mr. Kelleher. I "saw his tracks," though, and believe the "warp and woof" of his book, Peanuts, make it a "must-read." On my book shelf, it rests next to Dale Carnegie's How to Win Friends and Influence People.

It provides a wonderful, common sense guide on how to succeed, in business specifically and in life generally. Perhaps the SWA motto printed on napkins says it best: "In a world full of no we're a plane full of yes."...

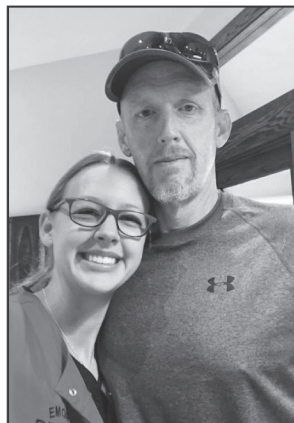

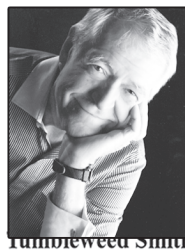

PRESERVING FAMILY STORIES

Tumbleweed Smith



Ruth Merton and her husband Dan live by the San Gabriel River near the community of Mahomet. It's in northeastern Burnet County near the Williamson county line.

"A lot of people were trying to settle Texas in the early 1850's and they thought if they could get some camels into Texas they would flourish more than horses," says Ruth. "Some people from the Middle East came to Texas and one of the men was called Mohamed. He had a lot of camels that he raised around here. Since that time it has been called Mahomet. A post office was established in 1857 but was closed in 1916. Mt. Horef Lodge in Mahomet is the oldest Masonic Lodge in Burnet County."

A wagon train with 16 wagons brought Ruth Merton's family to Texas from Missouri. They bought land in 1852 near Georgetown for 25 cents an acre. The land is still in the family thanks to Ruth's great grandmother Maggie McCormick whose husband had mortgaged the land to buy sheep. But he died and the sheep were stolen.

"She said she would eat dirt and go naked, but would never sell the land," says Ruth. "She milked her cows, got her eggs every Friday and left about 3:30 in the morning in a buggy by herself and she would drive all the way to Georgetown to sell her eggs, cheese, cream and butter to farmers who came into Georgetown. She did that and paid off the mortgage on the land. Our family still works that land today."

Her family donated limestone used to build Southwestern University in Georgetown. A limestone fence surrounds the family land and the family home is built of limestone.

"The walls are 2 and a half feet thick. Every room has a fireplace. That house is where I was born, where my father was born and his father was born. The house has a medallion from the Texas Historical Commission."

Ruth's 92-year-old aunt spent her 90th year writing about family stories. She put them in a book titled THE OLD HOUSE. Ruth's great great grandfather had a gristmill in Burnet. To run it, he bought a steam engine locomotive.

"It was from Waco and he pulled it with mules to Burnet. It was such a hard way to pull it. They would struggle all day and just make a little bit of progress. It took months but they finally got it to Burnet and put it to use running the grist mill."

Once he put too much fuel in it and it blew up. "He was killed. And all they could find was little pieces of bone here and there. And that was on January first, 1880. We've got the newspaper clipping that said you could hear the explosion for miles around. All that was left was just a little finger bone that my great grandmother Maggie had kept. When she was buried they buried the finger bone with her. She loved her daddy so much."

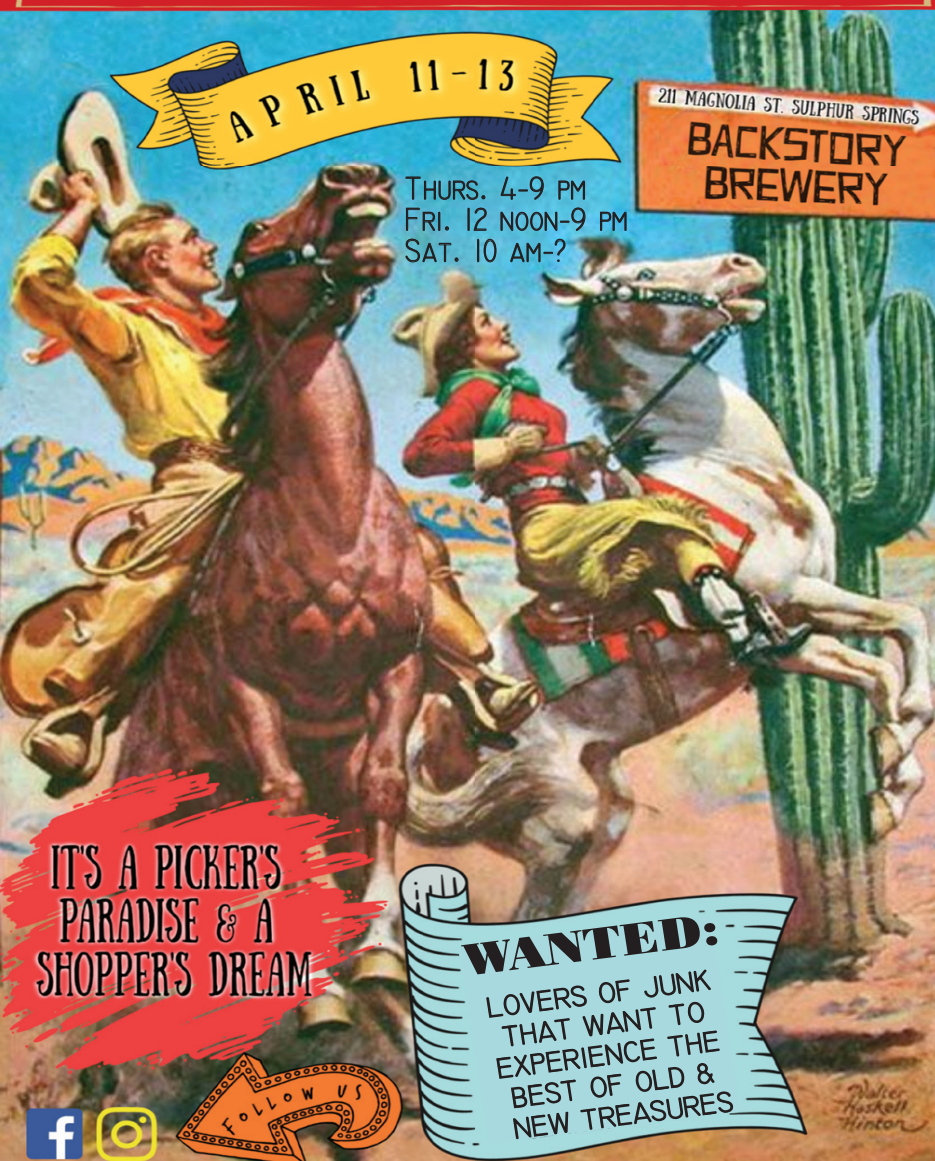
