Republic resubmits development zoning proposal in Evergreen

epublic Urban Properties LLC (Republic), a San Jose-based development company, has resubmitted a Planned Development Zoning proposal for the project known as "Montgomery Place" in Evergreen.

The PD Zoning resubmittal application was filed with the City Planning Department on March 14, 2019, and will propose the development of 103,000 SF of medical office and 175 units of senior commercial care on approximately 13.6 acres of surplus land owned by San Jose – Evergreen Community College District (SJECCD) adjacent to Evergreen Valley College. The District will maintain ownership of the property while generating unrestricted financial resour-

YMCA partners with Stanford to offer no cost cancer survivor fitness program

Living Strong-Living Well 12 week program

MCA has joined with Stanford to provide a free strength fitness program.

LSLW (Living Strong Living Well) is a 12-week program now being offered free of charge to adults who recently experienced a battle with cancer at the Evergreen-East Valley Family YMCA and other selected locations in the Bay Area.

Some enter the program while in treatment too. The goal is to enhance spirit, mind, and body for those confronting the disease. Participants meet two times a week for 75-minute sessions offered at no cost thanks to the generous support of donors.

Goals of the program

The Living Strong Living Well program offers support so that one can meet new friends and charge together in learning and defending their bodies against the foe called cancer. The warm small group setting composed of certified staff provides personalized attention to each participant to expertly meet their individual needs.

The program uses exercise machines as well as time for stretching to help guide each participant through their choreographed paces and nurture their total unique health needs. Some key areas focused upon are;

Chaboya, Quimby Oak Middle Schools are 2019 California Distinguished Award Recipients


vergreen School District middle schools Chaboya and Quimby Oak have both earned a 2019 California Distinguished School award from the California Department of Education (CDOE).


Of the 162 middle schools and high schools announced as California Distinguished Schools, seven are in Santa Clara County.

Acting District Superintendent Bob Nuñez shared his excitement over the state's announcement. "I want to congratulate the Chaboya

and Quimby Oak communities on their commitment to ever-increasing academic gains and their dedication to maintaining a supportive school environment where students can truly excel. These schools serve as models of what can be accomplished through strategic, student-focused efforts."

The state recognition highlights public schools for "achieving exceptional student performance for two consecutive school years or closing the achievement gap





between two school years," the CDOE's press release says. Only five percent of all California schools are awarded this honor each vear.

"Distinguished School award winners represent examples of not just excellent teaching, learning and collaboration, but also highly successful school climate efforts ranging from real-time conflict resolution to positive behavior intervention," the press release

The California Distinguished Schools program honors middle schools and high schools in oddnumbered years and elementary schools in even-numbered years. All 18 of Evergreen School District schools have been California Distinguished Schools and in 2018, Evergreen School District was recognized as the first California Exemplary District in Santa Clara County. Housing access and affordability issues discussed at District 8 Community Roundtable

The Thursday, March 7th meeting of the District 8 Community Round Table featured a discussion about housing access and affordability issues in Santa Clara County.

The event was originally planned as a moderated panel discussion with experts from government, nonprofits, and industry moderated by Greg Kepferle, the CEO of Catholic Charities of Silicon Valley. However, due to a couple of health-related cancellations, the event became an interactive discussion between Mr. Kepferle, Mathew Reed, Policy Manager for Silicon Valley at Home, and Rachel Vander-Veen, Deputy Director for the City Housing Department of San Jose.

The panelists began with comments regarding the

most important challenge for the Valley's housing market. "Without a doubt, the number one challenge facing housing accessibility and affordability is a lack of supply," VanderVeen remarked. Reed agreed, adding that "the problem is a bit bigger than that," citing the large influx of new jobs relative to the construction of new homes, a ratio exceeding three jobs for every new home built. Kepferle quoted Carl Guardino of the Silicon Valley Leadership Group, who characterizes the issue as one of "dollars, dirt, and determination." He also observed that "the problem is made worse by a misalignment of incentives for government entities. The County gets most of their funds from property taxes, while the cities rely on fees and other taxes more related to employment."

The discussion pivoted to solutions for the crisis. "Being creative is really important," Reed pointed out, adding "we know what some of the big solutions are, but we struggle for funding." Panelists identified a variety of solutions in search of funding, including bridge community housing ("tiny homes"), accessory dwelling units ("granny units"), and safe parking locations for people living in cars or motor homes. VanderVeen talked about the City's pilot projects for "coliving" housing, a dwelling unit consisting of multiple en suite units sharing common facilities such as a kitchen and living room.

Kepferle talked briefly about shared housing and housing land trusts, which disassociates the ownership of land and housing, as a way to improve housing affordability. He pointed out that "this is something organizations with sizeable amounts of unused land, such as school districts and churches, might pursue to provide themselves additional income and provide the community with additional housing."

The engaged audience offered up additional ideas including building housing on or above land currently dedicated to parking, streamlining the development process,

and increasing taxes on businesses to help fix the jobs/housing imbalance by slowing down in-migration of jobs and new employees. It was also pointed out that co-living has been used successfully in Europe for many years.

Audience members were handed a challenge. "If you're on Nextdoor, start a conversation about supporting affordable housing," suggested VanderVeen. "It's important that we have civil conversations about how we can work together to create a more welcoming and inclusive community." Kepferle closed with an observation. 'Many of us are scared of 'the other,' but all of us are 'others' to somebody. Take the time to reach out to someone you normally wouldn't and you'll discover

that most of us are pretty much the same. Our community should reflect that welcoming spirit."

The District 8 Community Round Table (www.d8crt.org) serves as a common body of community members who come together to address, research, communicate and educate on issues important to the greater San Jose Council District 8 communities. General meetings are usually held on the 1st Thursday of each month (except for July and August) beginning at 7:00pm at the Village Square Library Community Room.

reducing side effects of treatment, addressing weight changes, support for how to gain energy and confidence and help in planning continuing activities after the program comes to a close.

Testimonials

One participant stated, "When I finished chemo, I had no energy, muscle tone, strength for stamina and a decrease in coordination and memory. I started the Living Strong Living Well Program and began walking and then lifting minimal weights. I felt better physically and my memory improved. Now I exercise regularly. The staff understood my limitations and encouraged me along the way."

In speaking with caregivers, other factors also became apparent in the recovery process. For example, taste buds may deplete the flavor of foods. Appetite may change. Survivors of cancer often experience a "de-conditioning" and have a lack of energy causing them to become chronically fatigued.

Certified trainers Misty and John are heroes

It is seen while observing in the area that houses over a hundred various training machines called the "Wellness Center," that John and Misty offer meaningful encouragement. One person stated, "It's amazing what they do for there is a passion seen in how they help others and one just realizes that they give of themselves in a very deep level." This backs up the meaning of the word "Family" stated on the front of the building of the East Valley Family YMCA.

Trainer John states, "With my experience over the past five years in teaching the class, it makes me feel good to see participants grow in strength from the beginning to the end of the class and succeed in their goals. For example, one participant built up their balance skills and everyone witnessed confidence in their walking."

"Doctors often refer people to our program and suggest the class to build strength," said John. "The first days we do testing to measure ability balance and strength and we get an idea of what a person can do. We help decide which machines are capable of being used. The length of visit varies, and we work the sessions on how the participants feel in that some sessions might last 15 minutes while others, the entire time. We always end the sessions with stretching exercises."

A wellness coordinator at the "Y" explained that the stretch time helps not only the body but allows the individual to bond with the group and know that they are not alone in their journey.

Another instructor named Misty shared, "Every participant comes to the program at a different level of fitness due to the types of treatment he or she may be undergoing: cancer medications, chemotherapy and so forth."

Misty shared her personal story about losing her dad and her brother to cancer and expressed that the Living Strong Living Well program at YMCA is very dear to her. She said, "When I experienced my dad and brother dying of cancer, I thought to myself, if I had to bring back all the stars from the night sky to save them, I would have. After that, I returned to the YMCA motivated to do all I could for the living. I

knew, and I know that I could positively impact the people with the knowledge I have."

Misty went on to explain, "What I like most about the program is that I get to witness the transformation in the participants. I see their faces glow, and they become more happy and energized. It seems I am making an impact on their lives. I feel a deep sense of gratitude." Misty states that each day when she wakes she thinks about the word "gratitude" and "how it is so vital to make the best of each day we are given."

Everyone cares about each other

An experience shared by the YMCA staff: one participant had not shown up to the program for a long period of time, so a friend reached out and asked if they were OK. This element of connectivity and care allowed the family to invite many over to see the individual. The person was not doing well and a day was set for others to visit. After the group visited, the spouse called the next day to thank all and said, that night their partner passed, but it was a beautiful thing that so many came to say hello. It was thought that the person hung on to make sure to say thank you to all who visited to wish them well.

Cancer grabs many

Staff at the Y explained that cancer touches just about everybody whether a family member or friend. It was noted that participants are inspiring and positive and always "focusing forward" in their lives.

Everyone witnesses participants walk through and make it to the other side with grace. The participants teach happiness for they look at things more positively though they may be in a cancer battle. It is not that one can compare the quality of life and struggle from one body to another it is instead about the creation of a positive attitude and the importance of living with joy no matter what cards they are dealt. Those who battle cancer help inspire all by their view on life.

The YMCA 12 week Live Strong Live Well program is free to those that meet the criteria.

Councilwoman Sylvia Arenas's 'Age and Family Friendly City Initiative' unanimously passes rules committee

an Jose City Councilwoman Sylvia Arenas successfully passed her "Age and Family Friendly City Initiative" to unify the city's response efforts to the crisis that San Jose families face.

"San Jose families are in crisis," Councilwoman Arenas said. "As a city, we've recognized the housing crisis – but the reality is that families are at the center of this hurricane. They're dealing with low wage jobs, high costs of living, cramped living conditions, and a lack of affordable child care and support."

The San Jose City Auditor's Annual Report on City Services for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Resident Survey revealed a decrease in overall quality of life in San Jose, with only 41 percent of residents considering San José as a good place to raise children. Almost 80 percent rated the availability of child care and preschool as either only fair or poor.

Arenas added, "San José families are the essential fabric of our community, and it is time for a city-wide and cross-department response to the crisis they face. My proposal calls for a coordinated response that unifies existing efforts with new initiatives."

Arenas's memorandum to kick start this process unanimously passed the San Jose City Council Rules and Open Government Committee yesterday. This item focuses on bringing together existing city efforts to support families, increases the city's focus on supporting families with our Legislators

in Sacramento, and creates an avenue to bring forward new efforts to support families. Arenas will be bringing a related Council Policy Priority Setting proposal at Council on March 5th, with suggested new efforts to add to the Initiative.

"There's no doubt that families in Silicon Valley are facing serious, multifaceted challenges that call for urgent and immediate action from our local leaders. At FIRST 5 Santa Clara County, we understand that strengthening our families to meet the challenges of the barriers they experience

means doing all we can to support parents, caregivers and the healthy development of children," said Jolene Smith, CEO of FIRST 5 Santa Clara County. "Councilmember Arenas understands that too. Increasing access to quality and affordable childcare and strengthening parental leave for City employees through the Age and Family Friendly City Initiative, along with the Mayor's Early Education and Childcare Initiative, will be critical in ensuring a strong future for all of San Jose."

The City Council has adopted a policy consideration structure that places new policy proposals into a "Policy Priority Setting" process which will occur at the upcoming March 5th Council Meeting. Proposals that call for completely new projects are included in Councilwoman Arenas' Priority Setting policy proposal – while her Rules Committee Memo unifies existing efforts, elevate legislative priorities for the city in Sacramento, and would include related efforts from priority setting.



Johnny Khamis formally announces his candidacy for State Senate at kickoff rally

S everal hundred enthusiastic supporters cheered Johnny Khamis as he formally announced his candidacy for California's Senate District 15 at a kickoff rally on February 28 at the Campbell Community Center.

Khamis, who currently serves on the San Jose City Council, said he is running for State Senate as an independent because it's time that we put people ahead of political parties. "It's time for leaders to ask tough questions, demand results, and work for our community, not for political parties."

"The problems we face have no party affiliation nor do they have a "party solution," said Khamis. As an independent, I will work with colleagues on both sides of the aisle to improve public safety by closing loopholes that have led to a rise in burglaries and car thefts. I will call on my experience as a VTA board member to help find and fund local solutions to our traffic congestion problems."

Fiscal responsibility

Khamis is an advocate of fiscal responsibility. He collaborated with his colleagues on the San Jose City Council on reforms to refinance \$2B in debt and save \$32M in interest per year. While serving on the Board of the Valley Transportation Authority, he insisted on an audit that uncovered \$3M annually in unsubstantiated reimbursement to one vendor.

"I have consistently worked to apply fis-

cal responsibility to our San Jose budgets as a member of the San Jose City Council. "Although intended as a criticism by some, "The Numbers Guy' on the City Council," said Khamis. "Having grown up in a low-income family, I came to understand and appreciate the enormous value of sound money management. It's not good enough to throw money at a problem without planning and accountability.

Khamis said, "New taxes and fees should not be our first and last answer to solve every problem. I have been asked to support many taxes; those that I have supported had well-defined accountability measures. Conversely, many new taxes and fees have been levied that show no results and are placing the affordability of our area out of the reach of middle and lower income earners."

the Academy's most nominated living person and the second most-nominated individual in history, after Walt Disney. In 2005, the American Film Institute selected Williams' score to 1977's Star Wars: A New Hope as the greatest American film score of all time. The soundtrack to A New Hope also was preserved by the Library of Congress in the National Recording Registry, for being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant." Williams was inducted into

the Hollywood Bowl's Hall of Fame in 2000, and he received the Kennedy Center Honors in 2004, the National Medal of Arts in 2009, and the AFI Life Achievement Award in 2016. Williams has composed the scores for eight of the top 20 highest-grossing films at the U.S. box office (adjusted for inflation).

From former Supervisor Blanca Alvarado to East Side Union High School District Board Member Patti Cortese, and from City Councilmember Magdalena Carrasco to recently retired Evergreen Elementary School Board Member Sylvia Alvarez and Board Member Bonnie Mace -- I can tell you that our community has truly benefited from the strong represen-

tation that we've received from these fabulous leaders.

I was thrilled to lead our city in proclaiming Women's History Month at City Hall on Tuesday, and welcoming the Women's Center at Evergreen Valley College to receive the proclamation. And it was even sweeter, because our Council finally has equal representation between men and women again.

Family Friendly City

We've been working together to make District 8 more family-friendly, and

I'm excited to share with you my efforts to pass new city-wide policies to make San José a better place for families to live.

That's why I've proposed my Family Friendly City Initiative, and why I'm so excited to announce that I've been able to move these policies forward, including receiving enough votes in both rounds the prioritization process to become a key city-wide priority.

San José families are the essential fabric of our community, but too many families are in crisis. As a city, we've recognized the housing crisis – but the reality is that families are at the center of this hurricane. Many of you know this reality first-hand. Families today are dealing with jobs that don't pay enough, high costs of living, cramped living conditions, and a lack of affordable child care and support.

That's why my team and I have been working to strengthen the resources available to District 8 families.

That includes creating fun and accessible opportunities for children, teens, and seniors at the new Eastridge Community Room; more park activations throughout the summer with VivaParks; and increased safety around our schools through the city's Walk 'N Roll program. My new Family Friendly City Initiative is another step in making sure that all families have the tools they need to thrive in our community.

My proposal calls for a coordinated response that unites existing efforts with new initiatives including:

• Expanding quality affordable child

care for San Jose families

- Expanding our city's efforts to support families facing homelessness
- Providing diaper-changing tables and private breastfeeding areas in city owned building restrooms to encourage civic engagement and participation from families with kids
- Pilot existing child care programs offered through the City's Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services and Library Departments at City Hall
- Raise the quality of the early learning environment for license exempt home childcare providers
- Expand access to Paid Family Leave for the birth, adoption, or foster placement of a child – so that more San Jose families have access to essential bonding time
- Expand San Jose's efforts to support family friendly legislation at the State

Capital in Sacramento

Our office continues to work alongside families in District 8 – supporting school PTAs, improving our local parks, and advocating for the needs of our families and children.

I'm excited to continue building on our efforts by leading this initiative for a Family Friendly City that implements a city-wide and cross-department response to make it easier for San José families to stay and thrive in our community.



"Our housing crisis is a result of decades of under-investment and imbalanced development throughout the State," said Liccardo. "So long as jobs-heavy suburbs continue to embrace the boardrooms, but depend on cities like San Jose to provide the bedrooms, our state's housing crisis will worsen. Cities that do not make good faith efforts to meet their housing goals are failing their communities and their children, and they should be held accountable. The Governor's proposal will incentivize more of our suburban cities to meet their housing responsibilities, increase the supply of affordable housing, and do the right thing."

Rainy day blues

t's a downer for every dog to stay indoors during the rainy season. It affects their physical and psychological health.

As a responsible dog owner, you should prepare your dog before you go out together, as well as when you stay inside your home. Activities should continue even if it is raining. Dogs are creatures of habit. You should not let the rain alter their routine, or they will stress out.

The rain is not good if you and your dog are not prepared for it. It's

not only cold, but it's also very wet out there. Making sure that your dog is healthy even when he has his daily walk in the rain is essential for your furry friend's wellbeing.

It's never an excuse for a dog to stay cooped up inside just because it's raining. All you need to do is be aware of the safety and protective measures you need to take when it is time to walk in the rain. You are not the only one who needs to stay dry. Even if dogs are covered with fur, they still need to be shielded from the elements. Take care of your dog during the rainy season, and you will have a loyal friend for years to come rain or shine. The rainy season is nature's way of cleaning up and rejuvenating your surroundings. It would be great to go outside and enjoy the sights, smells, and sounds of the rain with your loyal furry friend. Of course, you should be aware that the rainy season is not exactly ideal weather for dogs. Discomfort and health issues are the main things you should watch out for during the rainy season. Here are some ways to care for your dog when it's wet out-

1. Keep your dog's fur dry

side:

Wet or damp, fur is an ideal incubation area for fungi and bacteria. Make sure that you rub down your dog before and after your walk. You can also blow dry your dog's fur to fend off the dampness. During the rainy season, bathing your dog can be tedious and messy. It will also help if you use a dry shampoo instead of giving your dog regular baths.

2. Clean your dog's paws

Paws are sensitive. They come in contact with the ground all the time. This is the reason they are prone to infection. It is ideal to wipe your dog's paws during the rainy season. Doing so will prevent mud, water, grass, and insects from getting into their paws. Paws can easily harbor pathogens or vectors of diseases. It could also help if you trim the fur around the paws, especially if you have a longhaired breed such as a golden retriever, Shih Tzu, poodle, etc.

3. Keep your dog's bedding dry

There is nothing better than having a warm, dry bed to sleep in dur-

ing the rainy season. If your dog is used to spending time on the terrace or balcony, a covered resting area with dry bedding should be provided. All food or drinking bowls should be covered as well. During the rainy season, any surface gets cold, and this could harm your

dog's joints. The bedding should be changed frequently to prevent bacteria from accumulating.

4. Clean your dog's ears

Your dog can contract ear infections during the rainy season. Moisture easily accumulates in dogs with closed ears such as Dachshunds, Labradors, and Basset Hounds. Earwax and moisture come together and cause ear infec-

tions. Just like the paws, ears should always be kept dry, especially after your walk outside.

5. Conduct activities inside the house

Since it is raining, outdoor activities are not going to be pleasant. Another resort is to have activities for your dog inside the house. If long walks are not possible you could just play fetch or perform tricks in your house or garage. If you live in an apartment building, you could take your dog up and down the stairs instead of just using the elevator. This would be a good exercise for you as well.

6. Pay attention to feeding

When it's raining too hard, you should make sure you monitor your dog's diet. Adding more fruits and vegetables to your dog's diet will provide additional fiber. More fiber in your dog's food will allow regular bowel movements, even if you don't walk much. To prevent your dog from becoming overweight, reduce the amount of food during feeding. Balance out the level of activity with the food intake

7. Be on the lookout for infections.

It is very irritating for dogs when they have infections. During the rainy season, infections are usually rampant. Signs that your dog has an infection or allergies are: constant licking of body parts, scratching, odorous ears, and itching. Itchiness may indicate fungal or bacterial infections or allergies. These can be caused by the inability of moisture to escape from the skin's surface. Dog breeds that have deep skin folds, such as boxers and pugs, are prone to such skin infections. Be sure to consult your vet once you notice signs of infections or allergies.

Nobody wants to be depressed; neither you, nor your pet. Make sure you stay on top of your game by adjusting your schedules to fit what you can and can't control.

Volleyball, basketball and races


