By Saturday morning, Kerry and another man were on the scene early to begin hand-loading some of the debris onto a trailer. I was out there early too, to prepare the building for the show that night. Watching them, I smiled to myself, gladly knowing that the old-fashioned sense of neighborliness still exists today. Men in work clothes and gloves taking time out of their own busy weekends, how wonderful! But the best was yet to come! Before noon, help began to arrive in a mighty way. About five families came with various trucks and trailers and a backhoe and a tractor with a loader as well! Between the two pieces of heavy equipment, the largest sections of tree were loaded onto a long trailer and the smaller debris pushed into piles and loaded. Finally, the rest of the smaller sticks were cleaned up by plain old elbow grease, with children pitching in for a lot of the work alongside parents. I stood on the sidelines and took photos so that I could proudly show you readers that a sense of duty and community pride still exists in lots of places in today's confusing world, and is truly alive and well at Reilly Springs, Texas USA!



More community pride in evidence! the Sulphur Springs Animal Shelter has received a \$3,000 grant from the Miranda Lambert's MuttNation Foundation. Miranda and her mother Bev have long been animal lovers and rescuers, and a few years ago decided to go public with a Foundation which supports others who do good things toward animals in need. Each year, she selects 50 animal groups (one in each state) and awards a grant. That representative was Vicki Plaxco, a longtime friend of Bev and Miranda's, and a neighbor to many of us. Great work gals, and more good exposure for those "angels" among us who do good things for God's creatures.

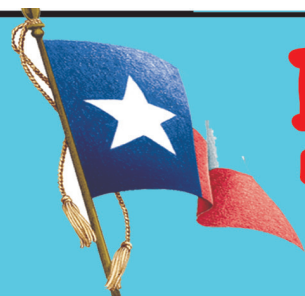

FAMOUS TEXANS

Jordan Spieth

*American Professional Golfer.
Former #1 In The Official World Golf Ranking.*



Jordan Alexander Spieth (born July 27, 1993) is an American professional golfer on the PGA Tour and former world number one in the Official World Golf Ranking. He is a three-time major winner and the 2015 FedEx Cup champion. In April 2016, Time magazine named Spieth to its list of the "100 Most Influential People", noting that he "exemplifies everything that's great about sports."

Spieth's first major win came in the 2015 Masters Tournament, when he shot a 270 (−18) and pocketed \$1.8 million. He tied the 72-hole record set by Tiger Woods in 1997 and became the second youngest golfer (behind Woods) to win the Masters. He then won the 2015 U.S. Open with a score of 5-under-par. He was the youngest U.S. Open champion since amateur Bobby Jones in 1923. He followed up with a win in the 2015 Tour Championship, which clinched the 2015 FedEx Cup. Two years later, Spieth won his third major at the 2017 Open Championship, by three shots at 12 under-par.

EARLY LIFE

Spieth was born in 1993 in Dallas, Texas, to Shawn Spieth and Mary Christine (née Julius) Spieth. He attended St. Monica Catholic School and graduated from Jesuit College Preparatory School in 2011. He learned to play golf at Brookhaven Country Club.

Amateur career

In 2009 and 2011, Spieth won the U.S. Junior Amateur and joined Tiger Woods as the tournament's only two-time winners.

Before turning 18 in July 2011, he was No. 1 in the AJGA Golf Rankings, which promotes the best junior golfers in the world.

He finished second in the 2008 and 2009 Junior PGA Championship. The American Junior Golf Association named him the Rolex Junior Player of the Year in 2009.

Spieth accepted an exemption to play in the PGA Tour's HP Byron Nelson Championship in 2010. It was the event's first amateur exemption since 1995. The tournament's previous exemptions had included Trip Kuehne in 1995, Justin Leonard, and Woods in 1993. He made the cut, becoming the sixth-youngest player to make the cut at a PGA Tour event. Spieth was tied for seventh place after the third round, and finished the tournament in a tie for 16th place. He was offered another exemption into the tournament in 2011, when he again made the cut and finished in a tie for 32nd.

Spieth played college golf at the University of Texas. Spieth was a member of the 2011 Walker Cup team and played in three of the four rounds; he halved his foursomes match and won both singles matches.

In his freshman year at Texas, Spieth won three events and led the team in scoring average. He helped his team win the NCAA championship, was named to the All-Big 12 Team, Big 12 Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year, and was a first-team All-American.

In 2012, Spieth earned a spot as an alternate in the U.S. Open after Brandt Snedeker withdrew from the tournament; he tied for 21st and was the low amateur. He became the number one amateur in the World Amateur Golf Ranking after his performance in the U.S. Open and Patrick Cantlay's decision to turn professional.

Professional career

In 2012, after failing to advance to the Final Stage of PGA Tour qualifying school, 19-year-old Spieth turned professional midway through his sophomore year at Texas. He partnered with Under Armour for sponsorship in January 2013 and with BioSteel Sports Supplements in March.

2013: First PGA Tour win

In the 2013 season, Spieth played in his first tournament in January, where he missed the cut by two strokes at the Farmers Insurance Open at Torrey Pines. In March, Spieth made three cuts, finishing tied for second at the Puerto Rico Open and tied for seventh at the Tampa Bay Championship. He earned Special Temporary Member status in March, which allowed him unlimited sponsor exemptions; non-members are limited to seven exemptions per season. He notched another top-10 finish in April at the RBC Heritage, a tie for ninth.

On July 14 (about two weeks before his 20th birthday) Spieth won the John Deere Classic on the fifth hole of a three-way, sudden-death playoff against defending champion Zach Johnson and David Hearn. He became the fourth youngest PGA Tour winner and the first teenager to do so since Ralph Guldahl won the Santa Monica Open in 1931. Spieth holed out from a greenside bunker on the 72nd hole to make the playoff.

With the victory, Spieth was granted full status as a PGA Tour member and became eligible for the FedEx Cup, entering in 11th place in the standings. It also earned him entry into the next three majors: the 2013 Open Championship, PGA Championship, and 2014 Masters. Five weeks after his first victory, Spieth played the Wyndham Championship, where he lost in a playoff to Patrick Reed.

Spieth shot a final round 62 in the Deutsche Bank Championship, vaulting him into a tie for fourth. Just two days later, captain Fred Couples selected Spieth for the United States squad in the 2013 Presidents Cup. On September 27, 2013, he was named PGA Tour Rookie of the Year. At the end of the 2013 season, he was ranked 10th on the PGA Tour money list and 22nd in the Official World Golf Ranking.

2014: Spieth made his Masters debut in April and shared the 54-hole lead with Bubba Watson. During the final round, Spieth at one point was the stand-alone leader by two strokes and in position to become the youngest Masters champion in history; Tiger Woods holds the record at age 21. But Watson retook the lead heading into the second nine and never relinquished it. Spieth finished in a tie for second with Jonas Blixt, becoming the youngest runner-up in Masters history. Spieth ended the tournament with no scores above even-par (72) in any of his rounds. His finish moved him into the top 10 in the world rankings for the first time.

Following the PGA Championship, Spieth earned selection to the 2014 Ryder Cup team, becoming the youngest American to play in the matches for 85 years since Horton Smith in 1929.

In November, Spieth won his second tournament as a professional at the Emirates Australian Open on the PGA Tour of Australasia; in the final round he shot a course-record 63 to win the title by six strokes.

A week later, he completed consecutive victories, winning the Hero World Challenge in Florida. He won the tournament wire-to-wire and in doing so set a new tournament scoring record of 26-under-par.

2015: Masters, U.S. Open and FedEx Cup champion, World No .1

On March 15, Spieth won the Valspar Championship in a three-way playoff with Patrick Reed and Sean O'Hair. He secured his victory on the third extra hole by sinking a 30-foot birdie putt. The win moved him to 6th in the Official World Golf Ranking.

A runner-up finish at the Valero Texas Open moved him to a career-high ranking of fourth in the world. The following week, Spieth lost in a sudden-death playoff at the Shell Houston Open, having held the 54-hole lead. He shot a final round 70, but had to hole an 8-footer on the last to force the playoff following low rounds by J. B. Holmes and Johnson Wagner that had pushed them to the top of the leaderboard. On the first playoff hole, Spieth put his drive nearly into the water, and then followed up with a poor shot into the green-side bunker, causing his elimination from the playoff, which was won by Holmes.

2015 Masters: On April 9, Spieth shot an opening round 64 to finish the day eight strokes under par with a three-shot lead in the Masters Tournament at Augusta, Georgia; Spieth set a record as the youngest player to lead the Masters after the first round. His score was only one shot behind the course record of 63 shared by Nick Price and Greg Norman, with their rounds coming in 1986 and 1996 respectively.

Spieth shot 66 the following day to break the 36-hole Masters scoring record by posting 14-under 130 through two rounds. The previous record, set by Raymond Floyd in 1976, was 13-under 131. He broke the 54-hole record at the Masters shooting a 16-under 200 through three rounds.

During the final round Spieth briefly held a score of −19 but bogeyed the final hole resulting in him tying Tiger Woods' 1997 score record at 18-under. Spieth set the record for the most birdies during the Masters by making 28 and became the second-youngest person to win the Masters. His victory was the first wire-to-wire Masters win since Raymond Floyd's in 1976. The victory moved Spieth to #2 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

2015 U.S. Open: On June 21, Spieth won the U.S. Open to claim his second major championship. He carded a one-under 69 in the final round to finish with a total of 275 (−5) and win the tournament by one stroke over Dustin Johnson and Louis Oosthuizen. Spieth had begun the day in a four-way tie for the lead and played in the penultimate group alongside Branden Grace.

PERSONAL LIFE

Spieth is the son of Shawn and Christine Spieth, both natives of Pennsylvania.

His grandfather, Donald Spieth, is a music teacher at Moravian College and Northampton Community College in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, where he was a long-time conductor of the former Lehigh Valley Chamber Orchestra. Jordan has two younger siblings, Steven and Ellie. Steven played college basketball and played for the Dallas Mavericks 2017 NBA Summer League team. Ellie has grown up with disabilities, and Jordan has credited her with "keeping him grounded and focused as well as keeping the game of golf in perspective."

On January 2, 2018, Spieth confirmed his engagement to long-time girlfriend, Annie Verret. The two married in November 2018 in Dallas.

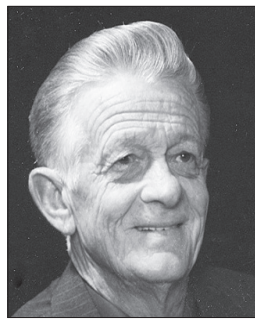

Arnold Lawrence Adams passed away March 17, 2019, in Sulphur Springs. He was born April 28, 1927, in Bellows Falls, Vermont. His parents were Benjamin Moses Adams and Lillian Martha Wilcox. He was the youngest child of a family of 7 sons and daughters (Frank, Bernard, Wally, Evelyn, Madeline, and Virginia) all of whom have preceded him in death as well as his parents.

Arnold entered the US Army in July 1945 and served continuously for over 31 years. His first overseas assignment took him to the Panama Canal Zone where he met and married his wife Rita. Their two daughters, Jean Marie and Karen Gayle were both born in the Canal Zone. Two sons were also born into the family. Keith Douglas was born at Ft. McPherson, Atlanta, Georgia and Mark Andrew was born at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds in Aberdeen, Maryland, and preceded his father in death by two weeks.

While living in Georgia, Arnold joined the Forest Park Masonic Lodge. He was honored with a 50-year certificate presented by the Sulphur Springs Masonic Lodge.

Arnold was accepted into the US Army Helicopter School in 1957 which started at Ft. Wolters, Texas, and ended at Ft. Rucker, Alabama. He graduated in 1958 and was assigned to Ft. Bragg, North Carolina. Arnold's next assignment was for Germany. Because of travel restrictions, families were not allowed to accompany their husbands at that time, so Rita and children resided in Sulphur Springs for one year. On arriving in Germany, the family lived in Mainz and then Schwabach, which is just outside of Nuremberg.

This tour of duty was followed by an assignment to Ft. Benning, Georgia. When the Vietnam War escalated and the First Cavalry Division was activated, Arnold did his first tour of duty in Vietnam. Upon returning home, Arnold was asked to join the White House Executive Flight Detachment and had the extreme honor of working and flying during the terms of Presidents Johnson, Nixon and Ford. Another tour of duty in Vietnam and again returning to the White House Executive Detachment ended Arnold's Military career of 31 years during which he earned the following decorations, medals, badges, commendations and campaign ribbons, The Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star Medal with 2 oak leaf clusters, Air Medal with 24 oak leaf clusters, Good Conduct medal, Master Army Aviation Badge, World War II Victory Medal, National Defense Service medal with 1 oak leaf, Vietnam campaign Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Armed Services Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal Dominican Republic, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm, Presidential Unit Emblem, Meritorious Unit Emblem, Presidential Service Badge, Army Commendation Medal with 2 oak clusters.

Surviving Arnold are his wife, Rita, daughters, Jean Webb and husband Ron of Sulphur Springs, Karen Reed and husband of Tyler, Texas, son, Keith Adams and wife Terry of Jacksonville, Texas, eight grandchildren, and twelve great-grandchildren.

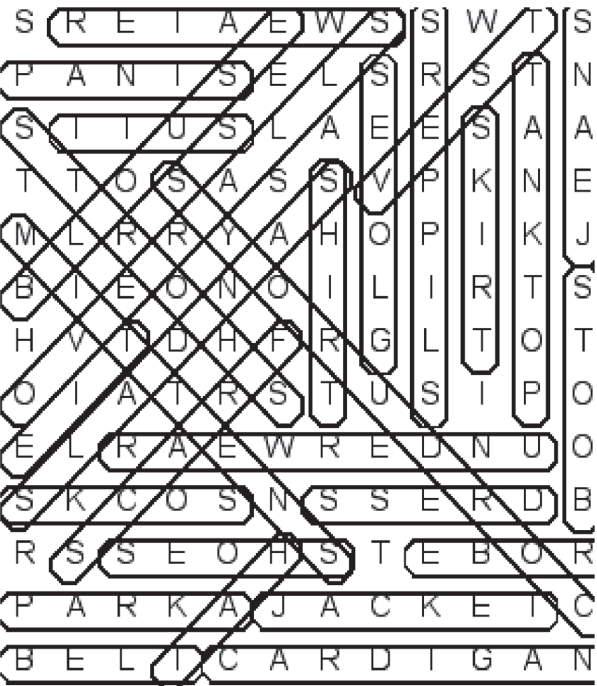
Mary Elizabeth will be buried at Rosemound Cemetery beside her parents.

THE IDLE AMERICA

Just 'Plane' Herb...

For decades, four words have been used to magnify success achieved by remarkable individuals. The words? "Only in America could..." Following this opening are tributes to support such a lofty claim.

I'm not sure such a well-intentioned comment really is a true "fit" for Herb Kelleher, who introduced discount air travel to America a half-century ago. This admitted maverick would have "made it big" in the ingenious ways of his choosing in which-ever country he lived in.

The late icon's business acumen, zest for life, indomitable spirit and commitment to both employees and the flying public were as expansive as the skies across which fly aircraft of Southwest Airlines, the country's largest domestic carrier....

Media reports of his recent death at the age of 87 were as colorful as the man himself. Herb, the name he liked to be called, wasn't to be figured out by anyone. He earned his eccentric label, laughing all

the way. One person given to hyperbole said Kelleher could call the names of all Southwest employees when he saw them.

Kelleher shot down this accolade, countering that he hadn't met ALL 60,000 SWA employees!...

Greats, near-greats and ordinary folks shared "Herb stories," many beginning with, "Do you remember the time that?" Among hundreds of tributes, perhaps none was more compelling than Ralph Nader's: "... No one has been able to imitate Kelleher's super-successful management philosophy, his hands-on behavior and authenticity. They may install cut-rate fares, but fortunately for the people, Kelleher stands alone as one of a kind..."

I'm one of the "ordinaries" who never met Mr. Kelleher. I "saw his

tracks," though, and believe the "warp and woof" of his book, *Peanuts*, make it a "must-read." On my book shelf, it rests next to Dale Carnegie's *How to Win Friends and Influence People*.

It provides a wonderful, common sense guide on how to succeed, in business specifically and in life generally. Perhaps the SWA motto printed on napkins says it best: "In a world full of no we're a plane full of yes..."

I saved a personal, handwritten note from the aviation giant. It was written with the same "scrawl" of his signature seen in print.

It is my memento of proof that he always had time for ordinary people.

It was a response to a letter I'd written to him....

I had completed a long-ago SWA flight. Waking from a nap during the

flight, I walked shoeless to the lavatory when the "unoccupied" light came on. A flight attendant joked about my "going in there in stocking feet."

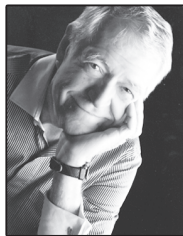
I responded in kind, saying that I'd seen Herb doing the same thing. (Okay, admittedly I hadn't, but it was fun to "play along.") She quipped that he would be the only other person on the planet who would do so.

I wrote him a letter praising the young lady AND his airline, not expecting a reply. A few days later came his note, including these words: "Your recent letter 'made' my day! Welcome to the 'shoeless lavatory club.' We are a rare breed..."

I'm guessing that across the years, "boy babies" have been named "Herb" by countless SWA employees.

Shellie O'Neal has been director of theater at Navarro College in Corsicana 17 years. In her third year there she started writing plays.

"I just decided this way it would save on royalties," says Shellie. "I wanted to see what I could do. So I wrote a play called *Wish I May, Wish I Might*, a midlife summer dream. It was a comedy and the kids had a scream of a time and I had a blast. I fell in love with the playwriting process. So now I've written 22 plays."

She wrote a play about songwriter Cindy Walker of Mexia. "She is probably best known for having written the song *You Don't Know Me* which has been covered by over a hundred different artists. The play celebrated the life of Cindy and it's called *Paper Babies* because she called her songs her paper babies." Once, when Cindy was in California traveling with her parents in the family car, she told her father to stop when they were passing the Bing Crosby studios.

"She said 'I want to go sell my song to Bing Crosby.' And wouldn't you know it, she met with Bing's brother who told her the famous singer might be interested. And lo and behold the next day she met with Bing at Paramount Studios. He told her he really liked the song and he recorded it. The same day she got a recording contract with Decca Records."

Shellie wrote a play called *The Forgotten Air Force* and has turned it into a musical.

"It's about the WASPS, the women's air service pilots of World War Two."

She wrote 3 children's plays about Gnomes, which are performed around Christmas. She wrote the first one as a fundraiser.

"We couldn't think of a way to raise the money we needed so the kids said 'why don't you write something.' So I wrote this little play in one day."

Shellie does a one-woman show she wrote about Fannie Crosby.

"She wrote between 8 thousand and 10 thousand hymns. I've been performing that almost 7 years. I just gave my one hundred and nineteenth performance. I've done it in 113 locations all over Texas but also in New York City and Washington, DC. I've just recently performed it in Bethesda, Maryland. And I've done it in Italy. I've just finished writing a rough draft of a play called *God Bless America* based on The Kate Smith Radio Hour which will celebrate our national anthem."

It's no wonder she is so prolific with her writing. Her father is Bill O'Neal who has written some 20 books and is the official state historian. It has been my privilege to know Shellie most of her life.
