## Inside the Bottle

## Wine glassware

If you've taken a walk down the glassware aisle of a department store, you know that wine glassware choices are vast. While there are hundreds of different sizes, shapes, and styles to choose from, the most important factor is what feels comfortable to you. Glassware companies claim that different glasses affect wines differently and would lead you to believe that you need a full set of at least two different glasses for red and white wine – but do you?

I have always believed that wine is meant to be enjoyed and however you want to do that is great. Whether it be from a \$50 crystal wine glass or a \$2 thrift shop juice glass is totally up to you. Glassware manufacturers lead seminars with different shaped and sized glassware to show how the same wine can smell and taste differently in each. This is because each glass allows for a different delivery of flavor and aroma based on the surface area of the wine in the glass and the depth of the bowl. While the same wine may taste different in each of those glasses, is it necessarily better? This really comes down to the experience and environment.

In Italy, it is common to enjoy wine out of a stemless tumbler, not a fancy stemmed glass. This is because wine is meant to be an everyday pleasure there, not something that is posh. I think that enjoying a Chianti in a tumbler in a Tuscan villa would be just as enjoyable as enjoying it from a fancy Sangiovese crystal glass in your living room. Some will argue that stemless glasses shouldn't be used because your hands will 'warm up the wine' while you hold it. I think that if you are clutching a glass long enough for your body heat to warm up a wine, you aren't drinking it fast enough. Stemless glasses are great because they are more durable in a dishwasher and are a bit harder to knock over. To some, though,

they lack the romance of a stemmed glass.

For the perfect-stemmed glass, I feel you can get a single wine glass that works for both red and white wine. You want to find something that feels comfortable in your hand, is balanced and sturdy, and not too oversized. Some glasses are so big they will fit an entire bottle of wine in them. While these can make a statement, they aren't all that practical and are often quite expensive. You want to look for a glass that is around a 12-18 ounce capacity so that when it is filled 1/3-1/2 full, it will allow the wine to equal a standard glass-pour size and allow for room to swirl the glass. I like a glass that has a relatively thin lip but is still somewhat durable. It is also a good idea to find a glass that has been produced for a while and from a reputable producer, so if one does happen to break, you can replace it easily without having a mismatched set.

I have seen some people that intentionally have a mismatched, hodgepodge of glasses and this can be a fun conversation starter and make it easy for people to know which glass theirs is at a party. It all really comes down to your personal style and there is no set rule just to enjoy! Cheers!





Celebrity Readers - Dr. Buechel Haack, District Superintendent, and Mrs. Hammann, Elementary Principal, visited classrooms and read to the students.



## News on Water Cross Connection Inspections

The Village will be putting more emphasis on inspecting homes and businesses for cross connections in the water system. The DNR requires that all homes and businesses are inspected for cross-connection. We hired a company named L-R Meter to conduct the cross connection on commercial, industrial, and public buildings. They will begin the work the second week of April and complete half the properties this year and half the properties next year.

What is cross-connection?

Cross-connection is an actual or potential connection between the safe drinking water supply and a source of contamination of pollution. State plumbing codes require approved backflow prevention methods to be installed at every point of potable water connection and use. Cross-connections must be properly protected or eliminated.

How does contamination occur?

When you turn on your faucet, you expect the water to be as safe as when it left the treatment plant or well. However, certain hydraulic conditions left unprotected within your plumbing system may allow hazardous substances to contaminate your own drinking water or the public water supply. Water normally flows in one direction; however, under certain conditions, water can actually flow backwards. This is known as backflow. Backsiphonage or backpressure may cause the water to flow backwards. Backsiphonage may occur due to a loss of pressure in the municipal water system during a fire fighting emergency, a water main break, or system repair. This creates a siphon in your plumbing system, which can draw water out of a sink or bucket and back into your water or the public water system. Backpressure may be created when a source of pressure (such as a boiler) creates a pressure greater than the pressure supplied from the public water system. This may cause contaminated water to be pushed into your plumbing system through an unprotected cross-connection.

In most cases where can cross connection issues occur?

In the bathroom with handheld shower fixtures and toilet tanks and in the kitchen

Do..

- Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants.
- Make sure dishwashers are installed with a proper "air gap" device.
- Verify and install a simple hose bibb vacuum breaker on all threaded faucets around your home.
- Make sure water treatment devices such as water softeners have the proper "air gap", which is a minimum of one inch above any drain.

Don't...

- Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks or ponds.
- Use spray attachments without a backflow prevention device.
- Connect waste pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems directly to the sewer or submerged drain pipe. Always be sure there is a one-inch "air gap" separation.

## Water Conservation & Water Loss

There are many ways a person can conserve water. You turn off the faucet while brushing your teeth, you take shorter showers, you can replace your old toilet with a new 1.28 gallon/flush model, you can check for leaks in your toilets or faucets, or only do laundry when you have a full load, etc. These are all good ways to conserve water, but there are ways you can conserve water and use water efficiently outdoors.

Some things you can do outdoors include:

lished lawns and allow their lawns to go dormant during hot periods in the sum-


- Decrease your lawn area. Assess your lawn and decide if you can convert lawn into garden beds.
- Use native plants. Plants and shrubs native to Wisconsin come in beautiful varieties. Correctly matched to soil and light needs, once established, native plants will survive wet weather and drought conditions alike.
- Redirect and disconnect downspouts. In this case, redirecting your downspouts into your lawn or a garden, allows for some of that rainwater to infiltrate into the soil and eventually reach the water table. This practice keeps your water local and on your property as much as possible. This does not work for all situations such as if the downspout is keeping water out of your basement, but often the water can be redirected to flow into your lawn or garden with no detriment to your yard and a benefit to water supplies.
- Plant a rain garden. A rain garden is

cally captured from a roof, and allows the rain to slowly infiltrate into the ground, contributing to groundwater supplies and reducing storm water runoff.

 Create rain barrels. Installing a rain barrel connected to a downspout is a great way to create an additional water source. Rain barrel water can be used for outdoor and indoor non-edible plants. These barrels usually hold 50 gallons and fill quickly in a rainstorm.

People do not realize how a small leak can be costly. Below is an image that shows that a faucet dripping only 30 drops per minutes can mean that 54 gallons are lost a month. If you have a leaking toilet that is leaking at ¼ gallon per minute, it can use 10,800 gallons per month and can cost over \$125 in water and sewer charges in one month in the Village of Elkhart Lake. If you suspect your toilet is running or leaking you can contact the public works department and they can check for a leaking toilet.

Looking for a way to get the family out of the house this winter? Visit the Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum at Wade House Historic Site for a fun-filled adventure.




