RA races line up for summer

Another exciting season of racing action is in store for motor sports fans this year, as Road America plans to host 10 racing weekends throughout the 2019 season, with a number of weekends encompassing multiple series.

"Road America is known for having the most active schedule of any road race circuit in the U.S., and we look forward to hosting the MotoAmerica Series, IN-DYCAR Series, Pirelli World Challenge Series, IMSA WeatherTech® SportsCar Championship, NASCAR XFINITY Series, Stadium SUPER Trucks, the Sports Car Club of America and three separate vintage events in 2019," said Mike Kertscher, President and General Manager of Road America.

Road America's first race weekend will be May 17-19, when it hosts the SVRA Spring Vintage Weekend. Two-wheeled action takes to the track when the MotoAmerica Dunlop Championship comes to Road America May 31 - June 2. The-WeatherTech® Chicago Region SCCA June Sprints® returns to the 4-mile circuit from June 14-16 - Road America's longest running annual sports car event.

The NTT IndyCar Series REV Group Grand Prix weekend takes center stage at Road America June 20-23 where an international lineup of drivers will have their chance to battle it out for glory on one of the world's most revered road courses. The first NTT IndyCar race at Road America took place in 1982, when Hector Rebaque was crowned as the winner.

In 2000, Dario Franchitti set the track record with a lap of 1 minute, 39.866 seconds (145.924 mph) set in qualifying for the 2000 race. Legendary drivers Mario Andretti, Michael Andretti and Emerson Fittipaldi have each won three times at Road America, while Jacques Villeneuve and Paul Tracy were two-time winners on the high-speed course. Since the NTT IndyCar Series returned in 2016, Will Power, Scott Dixon and Josef Newgarden have earned titles at the storied circuit.

The NTT IndyCar Series will be joined by the Road to Indy Presented by Cooper Tires with doubleheader rounds for Indy Lights, Pro Mazda, and USF2000. Sanctioned by IndyCar, the Road to Indy develops the stars of tomorrow with several drivers on the IndyCar Series grid as graduates.

In addition, the Vintage Indy Registry will showcase over 20 vintage race cars over the course of the IndyCar race weekend. Cars will be on track and on display at various times through the weekend.

Is it May or Mae?

Well, spring is finally here! I know that April is supposed to be the harbinger of spring, but I can also remember a long ago Easter in early April when we had some snow showers that didn't do much to bring forth May flowers. So, in Wisconsin one is safer to think of May as the transitional month from winter to summer.

But I also have a personal reason for liking May. It's spelled the right way: Not "Mae" like my middle name. When I was born in the early 1930's Mae West was a sultry, siren of stage and screen and my parents made the unforgivable mistake of naming me after her. For years I suffered with the cutesy name of "Carol Mae." Later, when I was married I simply used my maiden name as my new middle name - hence - Carol Edler Baumann.

May Day is actually one of the oldest holidays we have, originating in pre-Christian agricultural societies as an expression of thankfulness to the gods for the arrival of spring and the rebirth of nature. One of the traditional ways of celebrating May Day is for children to dance around a May Pole, holding long, colorful ribbons attached to the top which they wind around the pole as they dance. These May Pole dances have their antecedents back to the ancient times of the Druids, Romans and Phoenicians

who asked Mother Earth to be fruitful and give them a prosperous season. The May Pole was regarded as a symbol of life and fertility.

In modern times, Russia celebrated the first of May by massive parades in Red Square, which displayed its military might.

May Day parades in the United States were often associated with the labor movement and labor unions. For a time after World War II the United States recognized May 1st as "Loyalty Day" with parades and flags, but this petered out in the 1960's with the advent and disillusionment of the Vietnam War.

Most Americans probably think of Mother's Day as May's favorite family celebration. Its roots go back to the ancient Greeks and Romans who held annual festivals in honor of their mothers. In the United States, Julia Ward Howe (author of The Battle Hymn of the Republic) led the Mother's Day movement seeking to designate July 4th as Mother's Day and using it to promote international peace. But it didn't become an official holiday until 1914 when President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day, "a public expression of our love and reverence for the mothers of our country." We have been celebrating it every since.

And remember, its May, not Mae!



Rudnick reflects on growth

Outgoing village president looks back on spirit of cooperation

Outgoing Elkhart Lake Village President Alan Rudnick bid farewell to his 11-year tenure on the village board April 15.

In his final board meeting, he stepped down as village president after a 10-year run in the village's highest elected seat.

Rudnick leaves behind a sense of accomplishment in the decade he served, but acknowledges his was only a small role in a larger, cooperative community effort.

His praises ring loudly for his fellow public servants, local businesses, local and regional planning groups, investors and community visionaries, all of whom have played a role in Elkhart Lake's growth over the past 10 years.

One-by-one he recalled the individual success stories that, together, have spelled success for the village.

Closure of Osthoff TID

One of the major highlights of the decade was the closure of the tax incremental finance district used to support growth of the Osthoff Resort.

"It was one of the most successful TIF's in the state of Wisconsin. The revenue growth in that TIF truly allowed the village to create new infrastructure. We were able to improve streets, water systems, parks and the village beach," Rudnick said.

"As a reason, we were able to do quite a lot of things without placing the burden on the village taxpayers," he added.

Rudnick said financial estimates show that the work accomplished would have cost the average taxpayer \$43,000 over the span of the TIF district.

Sargento expansion

Fortunately for the village, the closure of the Osthoff TIF district was just the beginning of an economic boom.

"Within just a few days of that TIF closing, Sargento approached us with a fairly major expansion to their facility in Elkhart Lake," Rudnick said. An expansion of research and development facilities and new office space would make for another TIF success story. "That is just starting to produce positive tax dollars to pay off the district.

After the Sargento TIF got underway, Osthoff approached the city about yet another TIF district to support the addition of a convention center.

"We were fortunate to be able to accommodate that," Rudnick said, pointing to the overwhelming success of the new addition.

"It has brought an inordinate amount of business into the village, opening up both convention business and wedding business opportunities in a beautiful facility," he said.

Rudnick noted that the project was squeezed into a pretty tight area, and one of the residual issues is a shortage of parking in the village.

"If that's your worst problem, you are doing pretty well," he acknowledged.

Private-public partnerships

The use of private-public partnerships

remains a strong tool for the community.

Just as those partnerships worked with two of the largest community businesses, so too have they been effective with other development.

Rudnick pointed to two auto sports related developments as key examples.

"Bart Wolf came to us with a proposal to do car condos. To his credit, he found a piece of land on which he thought he could do the project and we gave him our support," Rudnick said. The successful condo project was originally expected to be phased in with separate segments. However, the news of the project spread like wildfire, with all the units successfully selling as the project started.

Rudnick said that the use of TIF districts and other tools of village support have helped foster those private-public partnerships. "If the village can help, I feel it's a win-win for everyone. Not everybody agrees with that, but I think we have created some pretty good expansion with that philosophy."

Sargento Victory TIF

On the east side of Highway 67, in a portion of the Sargento Victory TIF, similar private-public partnerships have offered additional economic growth.

"We were able to work with the people at Throttlestop—adding phenomenal storage facility and showroom to the community. Dr. Jon did a fantastic job with the vet clinic," Rudnick said.

Part of the TIF still holds land available for a proposed 55-unit housing development. "That one is still in the works, still fermenting," Rudnick said. "Development sometimes takes a long time."

During all of the development efforts,

the village board also worked with Switch Gear to get the local micro brewery set up in the village.

Shining star

As a result of all the TID work, little Elkhart Lake has made the world take notice

Economic development in Elkhart Lake caused the village to lead the county in commercial growth in all categories—dollar value, percentage of business growth and other areas

"That is one of the biggest highlights of my tenure with the village," Rudnick said. "And it all comes from our ability to work together."

He pointed to the efforts of the village board, who can feel very proud of the accomplishments of the past decade.

Maintenance efforts

While regular maintenance issues for the village might pale in comparison to the economic development stories, they are far from insignificant.

Moraine Drive was upgraded several years ago. Lake Street was improved two years ago.

The village continues to look at its water system with an eye to looping and modernizing it.

Through the efforts of Village Administrator Jessica Reilly, DNR grant funds were made available to assist businesses and home owners in replacing lead water piping.

Recently a 10-year garbage contract was signed to take care of recycling and trash pickup needs in the years ahead.

The village also passed a noxious weed ordinance to help keep proper appearances

"People are always amazed by how well the lawns and gardens are kept in the village. It's something that every home owner and property owner takes seriously," Rudnick said.

"Especially because of our local tourism industry, first impressions are so important. I have to give a lot of credit to our public works staff who keeps our village properties looking good as well.

Many agencies contribute

Rudnick has no shortage of praise for those he has worked with in village government for the past 11 years.

"Our police department does an amazing job. Because of the inflow of people we get, we often deal with some of the same issues big cities have. On a vintage weekend, it's not unusual to have 15,000 or more people in the village," he added.

Rudnick shared praise for retired Chief Randy Boeldt who laid much of the groundwork for upgrades in the Elkhart Lake Police Department, along with kudos to current chief Mike Meeusen, who now leads the department after working under Boeldt. "Mike brings some additional talents to the table, and he and the rest of the department are doing a great job for the village," Rudnick said.

Public works focus

The village's public works department is headed by Pat Zorn. "He and his crew are dedicated, and they have taken ownership caring for the village infrastructure—from sweeping the streets, to repairing things and helping our residents. "We have expanded from two and a half to three full time people, as the workload has

increased," Rudnick said.

"Snow plowing is one of their biggest challenges, and they are there when we need them, doing a great job 24-7 to keep our streets cleared."

Tourism directives continue

Elkhart Lake Tourism continues to be a wing of the village government, supported by the room tax.

They run pretty autonomously. Kathleen Eickhoff has done a great job," Rudnick said. Funds raised by the room tax are cycled back into marketing and promotion to encourage ongoing success for the tourism trade, which is such a big part of the Elkhart Lake community.

Their mission is to promote the community and literally put heads in beds," he said. "Tourism has also worked hard to develop and improve business in our slower season, bringing in conventions and groups when the weather turns cold."

Rudnick noted that Road America is a key strategic partner in tourism, and is represented on the tourism board. The village president and police chief have also worked closely with Road America for the mutual benefit of the track and the village.

Library remains strong

Though operated and administered independently, the Elkhart Lake Public Library is also connected to the village.

'Our librarian Betty McCarthy has been doing a great job for us. We have a wonderful library that is very community minded," Rudnick said. "They do a great job."

Administrative help

During Rudnick's tenure, he was fortunate to work with a solid, supporting administrative staff which runs the dayto-day operations of the village.

came on board during his time in office, replacing the long-tenured Jeanette Moioffer upon her retirement.

Their administrative support comes from Kim Purkey and Katie Weir.

"I couldn't have done this job without Jessica and the other two ladies. I may bring in a project, but Jessica has the know-how to get it done. They are just a wonderful staff, and they stay on top of everything," he said.

Likewise, Rudnick shared praise for the village board members he has worked with over the years. "We didn't always agree, but we always worked to come to consensus," he said.

Rudnick is excited to welcome new board president Richard Sadiq to the role. Sadiq has been a member of the board for the past eight years, and recently the chairperson for administration and finance committees.


"Richard has worked a lot with budgets and finance and he is very well versed in that," Rudnick said.



Preserving history in New Holstein

For one of the newest members of the Elkhart Lake Chamber, the mission is all about preserving the past.

The efforts of the New Holstein Historical Society preserve memories of the past that show details about how people of Eastern Wisconsin lived, worked and raised families since the early 1800's.

The mission of the New Holstein Historical Society is to collect, preserve, conserve and restore significant sites, artifacts and document that specifically relate to the New Holstein area and its citizens.

Formed in 1961, the New Holstein Historical Society owns two facilities, both of which portray historical significance.

The Timm House

The Herman C. Timm House, is a standout architectural restoration project at 1600 Wisconsin Avenue, in New Holstein's main thoroughfare. A stick-style Victorian home, the Timm House was built in 1873 and expanded in 1892.

Restoration of the Timm House, a \$1.25 million project, which was supported by a lot of elbow grease and volunteer hours, dates back to 1974, when the historical group took ownership of the building.

From 2003 to 2007, the bulk of the restoration work took place on the interior and exterior of the building.

The Timm House is open to the public on Saturdays and Sundays from the first weekend in May through the end of October, with hours from 1 to 4 p.m.

At holiday time, the Timm House comes alive with special Christmas season decorations. A different theme is featured each year. The New Holstein Historical Society also offers tours from school groups and other groups by appointment.

"We have been real popular with bus tours, and especially with the Red-Hatters," spokesperson Terry Thiessen said.

The Timm House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Pioneer Corner

In addition, the New Holstein Historical Society maintains the Pioneer Museum at 2013 Main Street.

At the museum, folks can catch a closer glimpse of New Holstein and area history through a series of rotating gallery exhibits.

One such exhibit, entitled "The Streets of Old New Holstein," features a recreation of New Holstein's main street from the early 1800's, around the founding of the city, with many vignettes of businesses that lined the central business district.

Other galleries and collections currently on exhibit include a furniture collection featuring the works of the Laun Companies, in a Tale of Two Cities.

Included in the rotation is one of the country's largest button collections is on display, known as the Fenn-Aggen Collection.

A World War I exhibit features stories about New Holstein service people and artifacts from that era.

Another popular display reveals the story of Gramma Clown, a popular New Holstein personality.

In the north gallery, a diorama of early New Holstein features a collection of farm tools, manufacturing items and other pieces from that era.

The Pioneer Museum is open to the public on Saturdays and Sundays from

Each April the New Holstein Historical Society holds its spring lunch with topics of general interest, such as fashion, landscaping, historical clothing, gardening or general interest.

Bus trips are scheduled in spring and summer, offering a chance for people from New Holstein and surrounding communities the opportunity to tour other historic sites in Wisconsin.

In the past, some of the selected sites include mansions of Milwaukee, the governor's mansion in Madison, the state capitol, Frank Lloyd Wright tours, Hearthstone in Appleton and Ten Chimneys in the Waukesha area.

The group usually combines a tour of historic buildings, a garden area and a luncheon in a historic setting.

November is the month for the group's annual meeting, which features a historic program along with lunch.



The New Holstein Historical Society is a 100% volunteer organization, with a

current roster of 136 members.



A letter from the Friends...

Support sought for marsh building goal

Dear Friends,

Let me begin by way of introduction. My name is Lil Pipping and I am the President of the Friends of the Broughton Sheboygan Marsh. As our mission statement below says, in part, we provide opportunities "...to learn about nature and the environment..." We started this non-profit organization in 2005 with a group of volunteers and we continue to not have any paid staff.

Our first project was to construct a wooden 80 foot observation tower (the tallest in the state) so people could enjoy seeing the marsh and surrounding area without the need for a water craft. If you haven't already climbed the tower I encourage you to take a drive out to the marsh and have a look for yourself.

In 2012 we began planning our next project—to construct a multi-purpose educational facility at the marsh. The main purpose of this new facility is to provide a safe space for students from the Sheboygan, Calumet and Fond du Lac areas to learn about nature and the environment. These classes will be provided primarily by licensed camp Y-Koda educators. The facility will be used for meetings and small gatherings, as a kitchenette is included to support those types of activities.

Because there are campgrounds at the marsh, we also planned for shower and bathroom facilities. Funds for this will be provided by the County. In addition, this new structure will also provide a safe storm enclosure to students and campers alike.

Funding for this project will come from private donations from businesses and private citizens. The cost of constructing this new building is \$2.3 M. We have been soliciting funds via a "silent campaign" for the past several years. Some of the major supporters to date include Kohler Company, Brotz Family Foundation, Sheboygan County Conservation Association, Sargento, F.K. Bemis Family Foundation, Krier Charitable Foundation, Garton Foundation, Hayseen Foundation, FJC Foundation, Van Horn Automotive Group and many other contributors.

So why am I writing this letter? Because we are planning to break ground for the new building the summer of 2019 and we need your help. At present time we are approximately \$450,000 short of our building goal. With your contribution we can reach our goal. If you are a business we can also provide you with a formal presentation at a place and time convenient to all parties involved.

Inside the Bottle

Rosé - Think Pink!

Every spring as the daffodils and the robins return, pink wine starts appearing on wine shop shelves. These pink wines known as rosés ("roh-says") are made from red grapes, but in a special way that renders a rosy-pink, light and crisp beverage that is perfect for summer sipping.

Not to be confused with sweet "blush' wines, rosé is a dry pink wine that is carefully created by utilizing the pigment from popular red-skinned grapes like Pinot Noir, Cabernet Sauvignon, or Syrah. To create a rosé, the winemaker utilizes one of two methods. The first is the maceration method where the red-skinned grapes are carefully pressed to extract their clear juice but left in contact with the red skins for a few hours before being removed. This allows the juice to pick up some of the pigment to make it pink, but not completely red. It also keeps too much tannin from being extracted, which leaves the wine with lovely red-fruit notes, but no real tannic bitterness. The juice is then fermented as a white wine would be-typically in stainless steel and temperature controlled to protect the delicate aromatics and flavor.

The second rosé method is known as saignée ("sawn-yay", meaning "to bleed") and is actually a secondary-product of creating a deeper red wine. With this method the winemaker will start by pressing and macerating the grapes to make a red wine but will then bleed off a portion of the wine before it has steeped too long. This creates a darker rosé, as well as an even further concentrated red wine. Two wines from one harvest!

With both methods, rosé is fermented to a dry (little to no residual sugar) state, but they tend to be fresh and fruity. Some range from a nearly clear white color all the way to a dark magenta, depending on the grape type and skin contact duration. There are a lot of wonderful styles and varietals to explore in this category of wine. I have always been a big fan of rosé wines because of their wonderful food pairing possibilities and their refreshing quality.

"Inside the Bottle" will be a monthly column that dives into the world of wine, craft beer, spirits, and other beverages – fermented and beyond. Jaclyn Stuart, author of The Complete Idiot's Guide to Wine & Food Pairing and owner of Vintage Elkhart Lake, will author the column and answer questions she frequently encounters inside her shop, at our wonderful Elkhart Lake area restaurants, and on her travels. Best when enjoyed chilled like white wine, they can be like strawberry lemonade on a hot summer day but can also be wonderful with turkey and mashed potatoes on Thanksgiving.

In the last few years, this style has boomed in popularity so there are now a number of new bottlings available from popular brands, but the boutique labels are where it is at. Provence, France is known as the epicenter for rosé and is a great place to start. This region's style tends to be the perfect lakeside picnic pink and is wonderful with foods like summer salads, fresh fish, and cheese. Rosé from other French regions pair nicely with foods ranging from chicken salad to seafood and pork. Domestic rosés vary so much in style depending on where they are from and what grapes they are crafted from, but pork pairings are always a safe bet (including Sheboygan brats!). You can experience a plethora of rosés paired with porky delights at Vintage's annual "Swine & Pink Wine" on June 23rd or check out some of the wonderful rosé options at our local restaurants.

With rosés being made in just about every major wine region that are reasonably priced, it is easy to explore the world through rosé colored glasses, so think pink and drink rosé!







EL-GHS National Honor Society helps recycle


The National Honor Society at Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School recently held its 4th annual Electronics Recycling

Lakeland's bachelor's degree in food safety and quality blends the science of biology and chemistry with best business practices to prepare students for careers in food processing. Graduates will be well-rounded manufacturing professionals equipped to advance in the production of food, while also possessing finance, management philosophy and other skills needed to lead people to their potential.

Frink said the degree is ideal for employers seeking professional development opportunities for their employees. The program is also open to those new to the industry and to high school graduates who may not be familiar with this career path.

For students planning to enroll full time at Lakeland's main campus in Sheboygan County, Lakeland's Cooperative Education Program will provide 12-18 months of full-time work experience at food producers, academic credit for their work and a combination of scholarships and wages that will significantly reduce or eliminate post-graduation debt.



Collaboration formed

Inspire Sheboygan County, Lakeland University connect

Inspire Sheboygan County, a collaboration of educators and employers whose mission is to connect students to career experiences, is expanding its base of operations to Lakeland University as part of a broad new partnership which will better serve local students, employers and young adults.

Inspire will have access to office space at Lakeland's main campus with a second location at Lakeland's space in Jake's Cafe in downtown Sheboygan.

"We have admired the work Inspire Sheboygan County does in assisting local students to determine the right pathway for their future success," said Lakeland President David Black. "Since we both use cooperative education as a primary tool to help students grow and achieve their goals, this partnership makes sense because it will allow us to work together and better serve this region."

"Inspire Sheboygan County and Lakeland will work together to help students use experiential education to select the pathway best for their future, whether that's employment, a two-year degree or a four-year degree," said Nikki Kiss, Executive Director for Inspire Sheboygan

Inspire connects local high school students to local employers in a variety of ways, including through its Youth Co-op work experience. Students in the youth co-op program receive on-the-job training and evaluation through carefully planned and supervised experiences to develop, improve and/or refine occupational competencies required for a given

career objective.

Youth co-ops are available in a variety of career fields including manufacturing, automotive, healthcare, hospitality and small business entrepreneurship.

Lakeland launched its Cooperative Education program last fall by partnering with more than a dozen local employers. The university has adopted cooperative education across all academic majors as a new way for students to earn a bachelor's degree.

Today, 250 Lakeland students currently participate in the co-op program, working in full- or part-time, credit-bearing positions for partner companies, earning valuable work experience and networking opportunities while continuing to progress towards their degree. Between scholarships and wages, students in this program are counseled to use their earnings to significantly reduce or eliminate post-graduation debt.

This new partnership will create bridges by industry to potentially transition students from youth co-ops into Lakeland's program. Inspire and Lakeland will collaborate on employer and mentor training and support, and high school co-op students will be invited to attend some meetings and activities of Lakeland's Coop Student Association.

Other highlights of the Inspire-Lakeland partnership include:

- Sharing advocates/trainers/liaisons for quality training of mentors and checks on student progress.
- Co-hosting educational events for employers.

• Offering the foundational courses for Lakeland co-op students as dual credit courses at local high schools.

Inspire was founded in 2013 as an outgrowth of the Business Education Partnership committee of the Sheboygan County Chamber of Commerce. It is funded solely by its member employers and school districts. Inspire typically serves more than 13,000 students per year in a variety of career based learning experiences experiential events that help high school student select a pathway following high school graduation. About 100 students currently participate in cooperative education while in high school.

Inspire Sheboygan County exists to support all schools in the offering of career experiences. Currently all public K-12 schools in Sheboygan County are served as well as three colleges and universities.

New equipment offering distribution of fresh emergency food to 3,000 families made possible from growing partnership of two non-profit organizations.



Sheboygan County has established three (potentially four) periodic collection sites for disposing of hazardous wastes. The majority of the program is funded with County tax dollars, so be prepared to show proof of residency. When those funds are depleted, the sites will be closed until funds are again available. The fees are: \$10 – Vehicles with hazardous waste only, \$30 – Vehicles with household size electronics only (for each six items), and \$30 - Vehicles with both hazardous waste and household size electronics (for each six electronic items). False Alarm Ordinance

A reminder that the Village Board has passed a false alarm ordinance. Each time the Village of Elkhart Lake Police Department, Fire Department, or First Responders respond to a false alarm arising from an intrusion alarm and/or fire and/or emergency medical alarm, the Village Clerk's Office should be notified to determine what, if any, service charge is applicable.

- A service charge for excessive alarms shall be charged for false alarms in a 12-month period (January-December of the same year) as follows:
- a. No service charge shall be charged for the first alarm occurring within a calendar year.
- b. 2nd occurrence shall result in a service fee of \$100
- c. 3rd occurrence shall result in a service fee of \$175
- d. 4th occurrence shall result in a service fee of \$200
- e. 5th and subsequent occurrences shall result in a service fee of \$400 per occurrence.
- There are certain cases when no service fee shall be assessed.

Beach Pass Information

The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall use or possess beverages containing alcohol on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall ignite nor maintain fires of any kind on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.
