A portion of the proceeds from this event will benefit the Bay Lake Improvement Association to assist in their effort to protect the long-term health of Bay Lake. These efforts include working to control the population of small northern pike in the lake, as

well as keeping the waters free from invasive species.

"This tournament seems like a natural for Ruttger's because fishing has been at the heart of Ruttger's from the very beginning, as have great fish fries," said Ruttger's President Chris Ruttger. "We are excited to host this tournament and to help in the ongoing effort to keep Bay Lake pristine for future generations to enjoy."

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband, Ivan and brother, Dennis Anderson.

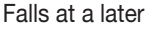

Life jackets a must when boating on cold water

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds anxious boaters that wearing a life jacket is a critical safety necessity during the spring "cold water" season.

While boaters should always wear a life jacket no matter the water temperature or season, public safety officials stress wearing a life jacket – not just having it on the boat – is the one action that significantly increases the chances of surviving a fall into cold water.

"The shock of falling into cold water triggers your gasp reflex, which more than likely means inhaling water," said Lisa Dugan, DNR boating safety representative. "Wearing a life jacket gives you a fighting chance to get your head above water, stay calm instead of panicking, and call for help before hypothermia sets in."

Though air temperatures continue to rise, water temperatures statewide are still dangerously cold – cold enough to cause the gasp reflex and incapacitate even strong swimmers in less than one minute.

In Minnesota, more than 30 percent of boating fatalities occur on cold water, and



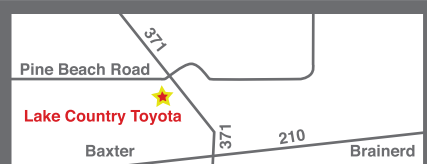
