Fire danger high

weather, much of Minnesota is still dry enough to fuel a dangerous wildfire, according to the Department of Natural Resources.

"It's easy to think all of this rain has saturated the ground enough to prevent a wildfire," said Casey McCoy, the DNR's fire prevention supervisor. "But even though the ground may be wet, the reality is grass, leaves, and pine needles dry surprisingly fast and become ideal fuel for a fire."

Until foliage greens up, McCoy urges people not to burn debris piles. Escaped debris fires cause four of every 10 Minnesota wildfires each year. To prevent wildfires due to escaped debris burns, the DNR has issued burning restrictions in 44 counties. Always check the DNR's statewide fire danger and current burning restrictions

If a debris fire, or any other fire, gets out of control, people should call 911 immediately. Grass fires can be deceptively fast, change direction suddenly, and be challenging to extinguish. Trained firefighting professionals would rather be called in to put out a fire safely than have someone get hurt or lose their life trying to extinguish it themselves.


In the end, prevention is key. People planning to have a campfire this spring should follow Smokey Bear's safety rules:

• Keep flammable material 3 feet away from the fire.

• Attend to the campfire at all times.

• Have a handy source of water ready.

• Stir the ashes and make certain the campfire is completely out before leaving.

Fishing opener 2019 is in the books as history. Weather held and ice was out in Central Minnesota, despite an earlier-in-the-week snowstorm. May 11 was the first day licensed anglers could fish for walleye, sauger, trout and northern pike all over the state.

Anglers were allowed to keep one walleye on Lake Mille Lacs this year. New Governor Tim Walz and some lawmakers headed to Albert Lea, which hosted the Governor's Fishing Opener.

It's estimated that about half a million anglers turned out in sunny, breezy and cool days for opening weekend.

Candy and Chuck Meyer of Zimmerman, who have a cabin in the Aitkin area, tried out Farm Island Lake last Sunday where Chuck hooked a large northern.

After fishing, while Chuck lands the boat, Candy throws balls to their black dog Rex, who was not deterred by the cold weather. He jumps off the dock, fetching balls and holds them carefully above the waterline as he swims to shore.

"This is Rex's favorite part about going fishing - when he gets to take a swim afterward," laughs Candy. In Albert Lea

Thousands took to Fountain Lake in Albert Lea for the Governor's Opener. This is the furthest south this event was ever held.

"We had a perfect day here in Albert Lea and could not have picked a better place to kick off the fishing season in Minnesota," said Governor Walz. "Lt. Governor Flanagan may have caught more fish than me, but I plan to best her at the Pheasant Opener in Austin this fall. Thank you to all the folks in Albert Lea who joined us on the lake and graciously hosted anglers from across the state this weekend."

Man arrested on drug, weapons charges after FBI investigation

A Breezy Point man faces felony criminal charges following an investigation led by the FBI and Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office.

Nicholas Ronald Wynn, 33, Pelican Township, was arraigned in Crow

Wing County District Court the criminal complaint, the



According to

FBI was investigating Wynn, who is a felon and is not allowed to possess ammunition or weapons. Wynn had been purchasing a number of suspicious items online, including body armor, various chemicals and gun parts.

On Wednesday, May 8, the FBI informed sheriff's investigators that agents intended to take Wynn into custody at the Pequot Lakes Post Office when he arrived to pick up several packages. Wynn was taken into custody without incident at the post office on Thursday, May 9.

During the investigation, investigators located suspected methamphetamine, items consistent with the manufacturing of methamphetamine, firearms, and bullet resistant equipment. The site of the suspected methamphetamine lab has been processed in Pelican Township and the investigation continues with local and federal law enforcement. During an interview with

FBI agents and Crow Wing County Sheriff's investigators, Wynn said he had several weapons stored at a separate location and ammunition in his residence. He also said he did think about making a bomb to blow up his father's vehicle, but he didn't want to hurt his father. Wynn has three prior felo-

ny convictions for possession of controlled substances, according to court records. He is being held at the Crow Wing County Jail.

"I am very pleased that Mr. Wynn has been apprehended and that no one, including law enforcement was harmed," Crow Wing County Sheriff Scott Goddard said in a news release. "The charges are serious in this investigation and I couldn't be more appreciative to our deputies, local police departments and federal agencies involved. I want to reassure the public there is no current threat or danger stemming from this investigation."

Assisting in this investigation was the Breezy Point Police Department, FBI, Brainerd Police Department, Lakes Area Drug Investigative Division (LADID) and Crow Wing County Public Health.

Unresponsive inmate dies at hospital

Crow Wing County Sheriff Scott Goddard reported an inmate, Kobe Eugene Marcel, 18, was found unresponsive inside his cell at the Crow Wing County Jail on Saturday, May 4, at approximately 10:53 p.m.

Deputies and jail staff provided medical assistance at the jail until Marcell was transported by North Memorial Ambulance to North Memorial Medical Center in Robinsdale, where he was later pronounced deceased. Kobe Marcell was origi-

nally booked into the Crow Wing County Jail on May 1, 2019 for a probation violation warrant after being arrested in Wadena County.

Sheriff Goddard states this case is actively being investigated and his office is awaiting the final autopsy report from the Hennepin County Medical Examiner's Office. At this time, the sheriff's office is not able to release any more specific information related to this investigation.



Council member Cash calls out City of Crosby Council for cloud of vagueness Crosby Council member Cash doesn't consent to Consent Agenda

After approving the agenda at the May 13 City of Crosby Council, Mayor Bob Novak called to approve item number four the Consent Agenda. Council member Diane Cash, raised a question about the LETG for Law Enforcement Technology Group, Inc. software. payment. Cash wanted to know, if this charger was new this year. Police Chief Kim Coughlin said no the \$4,850 is either a yearly or semi yearly fee payable to Crow Wing County. Without any documents in front of her, Coughlin stated that the charge is usually in the fall, but they have changed that. Also she recalled it was normally more than that about \$10, 00 a year.

Cash brought up the next claim payable on May 30 for about \$7,000 to Waste Management for recycling. This included over \$3,500 in contamination fees. Contamination of recycled materials happens when plastic bags, food waste are not cleaned off and other non-recyclable material are present in the recycling containers.

Novak asked what she was recommending?

Novak responded, "Okay, that could be done. But the claims and the dollar amount is in the packet and the amount. "

Cash responded, "But the last four meetings, they've changed. There's two claims now: a final and a preliminary."

Novak stated, "Correct." Cash continued, "And on April 8, there was a final that I can't find a copy of. And that's why I feel more comfortable, if from an auditing standpoint, if we read the dollar amount in. Then it can't be changed."

Then Cash spoke about the minutes and concerns about the Highway 6 Tunnel Project north of Crosby.

Cash said, "I have been watching the Highway 6 Project extensively for 18 months now, and I don't find anything in our minutes or in the newspaper that tells the citizens that they're paying the \$197,000 in engineering fees. And I was wondering, if there's some policy that we aren't doing that or why that's not showing up anywhere? Do we have an obligation to tell the residents what we're spending? Because it's not in this minutes and I really hope when Phil [Martin, City Engineer] had the final budget breakdown of who is paying what, that, that would have shown up in either the minutes or the newspaper. Does anvone else feel uncomfortable with not telling the residents what it's costing?"

Novak replied, "Well um, I don't think we spell out every project that we do along the way."

Cash added, "This isn't a small dollar amount and I feel uncomfortable. When I ran for office I promised the taxpayers I'd be transparent."

Traylor said, "The engineering fees aren't going to be accumulated until the end of the project."

Cash said, "But Phil [Martin, City Engineer] had a really good idea of what they were on there. What he listed at the 197, [thousand]) it could be approximately \$197,[thousand].

Novak, "We approved the amount initially that we were going to contribute for engineering fees."

Cash said, "You approved \$9,800."

Novak responded, "Could I finish?"

Cash replied, "Yes, please sorry."

Novak continued, "We approved the amount initially, but we said there would be ongoing fees that would be connected with that. And

the cost would be charged accordingly.

Novak ended the discussion saying, "Just so there isn't any doubt cast over this, this was not an example of the city taking care of a council member's problem. This had happened before, long before. As Jim said, it wasn't recorded. When the problem occurred it was brought to my attention and I agreed that we could go ahead and fix the problem — have the city take care of the problem. And then we would look at the situation and decide if it had indeed had been a city line or if it was Ron's line. And if it was Ron's line, there was also an agreement that he would pay for it, after the work was done. And that was done before anybody did anything to the line. So I don't want anybody to cast dispersions toward Ron or toward the city council. That we're acting to help out a member of the city council, because that's not what was going on here. It was unfortunately sloppy record keeping going back to what ever year that was."

The City Council approved the city assuming the responSerpent Lake Sanitary Sewer District force main relocation at the Highway 6 Tunnel Project site. The bids for the force main relocation are to be opened at 10 a.m. on Monday, May 20 at City Hall in Ironton.

The council unanimously approved accepting the donation of a Park Bench in Memory of Jeff Stirewalt who died September 7, 2018, as a result of a motorcycle accident near Pequot Lakes.

The council unanimously approved Optum for Renew Active by UnitedHealthCare to provide membership opportunities agreement with the Hallett Center pending any revisions.

The council unanimously approved the Hallett Center Membership Agreement with no changes for reprinting.

Police Chief Kim Coughlin announced they have purchased a male Malawa dog for the K-9 Unit and named him "Ragnar". He is scheduled to be trained for tracking people and drugs by the end of June. Officer Mike Davis has been chosen and will be partnering with Ragnar. A new police car will likely be no longer have the contract. He also said they cancel right away and redirect to Deerwood Fire Department. He was also looking at discussing with the finance committee a ladder truck on May 22.

Council member Robyn Wolfe asked about tearing down the building located behind the Crosby Post Office, since it had burned last winter. DeCent indicated Tom Antonsen was checking for hazardous materials before demolition could start.

Hallett Center General Manager Amber Moon said they have started their Summer hours and the pool is open again.

Head Librarian Abby Smith talked about the Easter Egg Hunt and other topics from the library.

Working Foreman Adolph Rono spoke with Novak about pot hole priorities. Novak asked how many man hours they are putting against it. Rono said there are two men for two half days per week working on the pot holes, since they have other things to do and that was the most time available without additional staff.

Cash said there is about a 16% fee that is not required by the State that needs to be discussed and renegotiated. Novak indicated the contract allowed them to add a contamination fee. The questions was posed to City Attorney Joe Langel who said without reading the contract it would be difficult to determine. Cash expressed concerns of going over budget without backup funding for the additional fees. It was decided to pay the bill.


