School is out, but the learning has just begun at the Lakes Area Music Festival. Audiences of all ages will find numerous opportunities

to experience music and the arts in a new way through the programs of the 2019 season this August.

As part of the Festival event

lineup, registration is now open for Explore Music! the Festival's annual week long day camp for students entering grades 1 through 5. Now in its eighth year, the program will take place July 29 through August 2, from 9 a.m. to noon at Washington Educational building in Brainerd. Participants will learn about music and the arts through numerous creative outlets including movement, dance, singing and playing instruments - all while exercising their creative muscles through guided improvisation.

The program often fills to capacity well in advance and early registration is encouraged. Need-based scholarships are available by contacting Brainerd Community Education.

This invigorating musical exploration will be led by Alexander Peña, a classical musician and teaching artist now on faculty at the 'lolani School in Honolulu, along with his team of teachers from Chicago and New York. "The Lakes Area Music Festival understands the importance of inspiring our youth and is committed to music education. Explore Music! provides Lakes Area children and their families an unparalleled week of orchestral-music exploration through the lens of engaging activities in theater arts, instrumental study, visual arts, movement, voice and more," Peña said.

At the end of the camp, participants will have a chance to share what they have discovered by participating in a special performance preceding the Lakes Area Music Festival's family concert on Sunday, August 4 at 2 p.m. This concert, titled I

Pottery, photography a nature collaboration

Where does an artist find inspiration? For Butch Holden it comes from his continual fascination with the similarities of gardening and ceramics. Holden's pottery and digital paintings will be featured at Ripple River Gallery near Bay Lake, June 12 through July 14. The gallery will host a reception for the artist on Friday evening, June 14, from 4 to 7 p.m. The public is invited to attend, enjoy refreshments and view Holden's work.

"My art is about looking in different directions and reacting by making a pot, a painting or a photograph," Holden said. "When I garden, I am manipulating all sorts of variables — soil, location, timing, temperature, water all in the hopes of achieving a thriving plant. Pottery making is incredibly similar. I manipulate all sorts of variables - minerals, temperature, timing, water, location in the kiln — all in the hopes of achieving a desirable ceramic outcome."

While the goal of both gardening and art making is a colorful and meaningful outcome, natural surprises and setbacks can occur. Holden approaches his work with optimism. "Patience, knowledge and work fuels my optimism. My photographs of plants and pots are hybrids of what I feel are collaborations with nature."

Butch Holden has a Bachelor of Arts degree in art from the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, and a Master of Fine Arts degree in ceramics from Indiana University, Bloomington, IN. He taught drawing and ceramics at Mount Senario College and currently is a Professor Emeritas at Bemidji State University, where he has taught since 1983. Holden has exhibited in local, regional and national competitions, and also has had many solo exhibitions. In addition to having juried many shows, he has served on numerous art grant panels.

He lives, works and gardens at his home in Bemidji, MN.

Cherrywood Fabrics of Brainerd manufactures hand-dyed fabric. It chose The Purple One, Minnesota's late musician Prince, as the subject for its latest Fiber Art Contest. 



Guest Opinion – **Crosby creates sewer district woes**

At a May 23rd Serpent Lake Sanitary Sewer District meeting the tension was palpable. Under threats from MNDOT and duress from the city of Crosby, the board unanimously voted to accept a bid to move forward on the Hwy 6 tunnel project. The members continued to express concern over the process and the highly unusual time constraint the district has been given to make such a major financial decision.

The sewer district is not accustomed to quick, risky, ultimatum situations, when making their financial decisions. They will now have to budget for the tunnel and catastrophic events in case the main breaks and causes damage to the tunnel, this is not a one-time expense and the citizens will continue to pay.

Without any input since 2017, when the district informed the parties of this project, the sewer force main was present. The district rightfully so, must be diligent in their efforts. This is not and was not a part of the district budget plan and will add budgeting concerns for years to come.

The sewer force main has been along Hwy. 6 for 32 years, and MNDOT was aware of its placement. In the interest of cooperation, MNDOT allowed Crosby's engineer to plan and lay the project out and both Crosby and their engineer pled

ignorant to the sewer main location. MNDOT sends a threating letter stating the main will be moved regardless and the cost could be billed back to the district. The district is in a lose, lose situation that is a direct result of incompetence of the Crosby city administrator and mayor.

In January of 2019, the sewer district was told they would have to move the force main at full expense to the district. The district did the right thing and said no.

Crosby then promised, if the district would participate, they would virtually guarantee IRRRB funds in the amount of 120,000 — a false promise because funding is not guaranteed.

The bid the sewer district voted on was in the amount of \$226,493.50. The Mayor of Crosby falsely stated the sewer district has healthy reserves and should not have to incur any costs to the project.

Crosby too has healthy reserves and should pay for the entire project individually.

Crosby has left multiple legitimate questions unanswered or ignored and the district is concerned.

• Why, when knowledge the force main was an issue in 2017 and in place for 32 years, was the tunnel located in this place creating this issue?

• Why, when a location 300 ft. north of the proposed location ties the tunnel in with a multi-use purpose, including snowmobiles, ATV's, and UTV's not considered?

• Why was a bridge not presented as an option?

At an earlier meeting, one Crosby representative on the sewer district embarrassed themselves by prematurely asking the board to praise, thank and appreciate the efforts of the mayor and city administrator for the time and effort they have shown to this project - obviously not able to understand the dire circumstances Crosby placed the district in.

In the financial interests of Crosby, the tunnel plan has been modified to no longer include lighting or cameras as an original agreement with MNDOT indicated.

The sewer district has every right to question and fight this project, as people of the community and with the community's interests in mind they are struggling with dealing with Crosby and it's current leadership — who once again has shown, it won't be transparent, won't be inclusive, and can't be trusted.

Crosby needs to wake up quickly, deal with their own problems, stop bullying other cities and entities and realize - the end does not justify the means.



50 years ago Marine pinned down by Vietnamese gunfire...

By ANN SCHWARTZ Healing comes in many ways. Flung into heated battle in the Vietnam War at a young age is something that Bob Lake, 70, Aitkin, has taken a lifetime trying to heal from.

Part of the healing process involved members of the American Beauty Marine Reconnaissance team visiting a war memorial at the Apostle Islands. The trip was chronicled by the American Heroes Outdoors show and broadcast in May. The video can be watched at http:// americanheroesoutdoorstv. com/team-american-beauty-story/. [American Heroes Outdoors is in the process of changing their website, so if the link doesn't work try searching for American Heroes Outdoors, Bob Lake].

The show chronicles how Bob and a fellow American Beauty team member took a fishing trip on Lake Superior and then visited a memorial that the Allen family had established on an island in memory of Merlin Raye Allen, who was shot down in Vietnam.

While there, they raised flags and dedicated a ceremony to the members of the American Beauty unit. The battle was chronicled on the TV show; in a book and in an issue of Vietnam magazine which was published in August 2003. It was all classified as "secret" at the time and in later years was declassified and Lake obtained the written records.

"I wouldn't wish for anyone to do what I did," said Lake. The experience turned him off from war and he wonders why he survived and others didn't. "I do attend a group through the VA for my post-traumatic stress disorder," he said.

In 1969, only 24 men, many of whom were inexperienced, were dropped behind enemy lines amongst a battalion of 1,200 enemy soldiers. They spent two days shooting and getting shot at, lobbing and dodging hand grenades, getting wounded, and, for some, getting killed. All left ragged and spent with shrapnel or bullet wounds and they killed a prisoner of war in the process.

Lake went on to teach students at Aitkin. "I taught students under the guise of agriculture," he said. He was especially drawn to troubled students who were struggling because he could identify with them.

"I was a rascal when I was young."

He later returned to Aitkin and taught, farmed, was active with the State Fair Board and is now frequently invited to give the Memorial Day address in Aitkin, In 2001, he was awarded a Purple Heart.

Lake and his wife Sharon, a retired teacher, have two grown children and six grandchildren. Son Ryan and his wife Molly (Cummings) live in the Twin Cities. Ryan, a designer, works on exhibit booths for such firms as Target and the couple has three daughters.

Lake's daughter Shauna married Josh Heggem, who is a lawyer. They live in Fergus Falls and Shauna teaches English at Battle Lake. The couple has three boys.

In 1985, when Lake found out, through an article in Good Housekeeping, that one of those killed on the mission was a stepson of the actor Jimmy Stewart, it really got to him and he had somewhat of a breakdown reliving all the bad memories.

Taking trips such as the one to Apostle Islands help, but Lake still struggles, trying to understand the Vietnam War and the losses that he witnessed.

Time heals all wounds and some physical wounds heal or dissipate over time. But many of our Vietnam veterans, as they age, are still struggling with the wounds of their psyche from a past war that they fought in a strange jungle while Americans at home celebrated their "Summer of Love" and watched the Apollo 11 astronauts land on the moon.


