Rishik Gandhasri is co-champion in marathon National Spelling Bee in Washington D.C.

Rishik Gandhasri, a seventh grader from Evergreen Valley, was the first declared co-winner at the National Spelling Bee in Washington D.C. on May 31.

After correctly spelling the word "auslaut," Rishik, who attends Chaboya middle school, cheerfully raised both hands in the air in victory and relief.

Rishik said he was happy his dream finally came true. "I felt very happy; it was surreal like a dream."

For the first time in its 94-year history, Rishik, was one of eight co-champions, octochamps, when the last of the eight surviving finalists, Rohan Raja, spelled his word correctly, the ballroom shook and confetti rained down on the stage.

The competition has never hosted such a large group of spellers who could not be defeated. The eight co-champions closed out the bee by spelling 47 consecutive words correctly.

Rishik successfully spelled the following words correctly: crambo, invincible, Yiddishkeit, hendiadys, Aufgabe, hinalea, keriah, frailejon, myctophid, bottarga, coryphee, chelydroid, Nyaya, fravashi, tjaele, rhathymia,

Rose Herrera launches campaign for Santa Clara County Supervisor

Former San Jose Vice Mayor Rose Herrera announced her campaign for Santa Clara County Supervisor. The longtime community leader is running to replace termed-out District 3 Supervisor Dave Cortese. She is widely expected to be an immediate front-runner in the race.

Herrera served eight years on the San Jose City Council representing District 8 - Evergreen Valley and two years as Vice Mayor.

"I've watched the transformation of Santa Clara County and what I'm concerned about is making sure we have a Santa Clara County that works for all of us —



not just a few of us. Whether we are talking about affordable housing, affordable long term care for seniors, health care, transporta-

tion, or a sustainable environment, these are issues that impact the quality of life for all of us."

Since leaving office, Herrera has served as a consultant to bring affordable housing for Veterans to the Millbrae BART station. She is also president and founder of the neighborhood group Involved Evergreen, and serves on various veterans organizations. "My involvement in this community runs deep and covers most of my life," Herrera said.

Herrera, an Air Force veteran, got her start in Santa Clara County government as a staffer for the Human Relations Commission work-

ing on gang prevention efforts and programs for at risk youth. "Running for County Supervisor is like coming 'full circle,'" she said. "I'm ready to give 200 percent commitment to serving the residents of District 3 and the County as a whole."

While serving on the San Jose City Council, Herrera's proposal to bring back veteran police officers helped to resolve pension reform lawsuits and implement measures to help recruit and retain police officers.

During her tenure in San Jose, Herrera developed a reputation

for getting things done. She led city-wide economic development efforts and worked to revitalize the business climate in Evergreen, bolster women and veterans rights, create recreational spaces including a long-awaited citywide youth sports complex, led an effort to save the Lake Cunningham Skate park, fought to prevent the sale of Muni Water, and served eight years on the VTA fighting for improved public transit. Herrera recently joined other past and present lawmakers to push to prioritize

funding light rail to East Side residents.

Herrera said she'd love to see Santa Clara County explore public-private partnership opportunities with tech companies to provide training for displaced workers, job opportunities and address Silicon Valley's housing crisis.

Herrera joins a race that includes Assemblymember Kansen Chu, San Jose Councilmember Magdalena Carrasco, San Jose Planning Commissioner John Leyba and former Sunnyvale Mayor Otto Lee.

The district spans north San Jose, Alviso, the Evergreen area, all of Milpitas and the northern half of Sunnyvale.

Final concert of music director Steven Barnhill attended by nearly 1,000

Nearly 1000 concertgoers came to see Evergreen Valley High School (EVHS) Music Director Steven Barnhill's last concert at the California Theatre on May 21.

Barnhill, who conducted the EVHS Advanced Strings and the Wind Ensemble to a standing ovation at the concert, is retiring after 35 years in the East Side Union High School District. He taught four concert bands and the Advanced Strings every day and strived for excellence in their performances.

For Barnhill, it was an emotional concert where he selected a combination of pieces that meant a lot to him. "This music is what I've always wanted to do, or that has meant a great deal to me in the past," Barnhill said. "I wanted to offer the best performance possible with the music that I selected. The experience was a walk down memory lane."

Barnhill started his teaching career at William Overfelt High School in the fall of 1984 and spent 22 years there, and he spent the last 13 years teaching at EVHS. He taught approximately 6,300 school days and an additional 4,000 after school rehearsals, and hundreds of concerts. He held his students and colleagues to a very high standard.

"For all that Overfelt High School meant to me, these past 13 years at Evergreen Valley High School have been truly life changing," Barnhill said. "I brought over the kick-butt attitude from Overfelt and raised the stakes. Not only has the new equipment and facilities

to the music program been a blessing, but also the love and support the parents have given to the program and me have made a huge difference. Having the opportunity to take our music students to Carnegie Hall on four separate occasions has provided memories that will last a lifetime."

After the concert, Barnhill said good bye in the lobby with hundreds of students and parents surrounding him who wanted to express their appreciation to him for the many years of dedication to excellence as a music teacher for both Overfelt High School and Evergreen Valley High School.

Hawaiian Luau retirement party was held on May 25 at the EVHS cafeteria.

More than a hundred students, parent volunteers and well-wishers attended the event which included a video presentation highlighting Barnhill's 35-year teaching career.

Barnhill told those attending the Luau to be patient with their musical experience, saying we all achieve our greatest success when we reach the age of 40. "Be patient, gather all the skills you can, and make all the friendships you can," Barnhill said. "For those who will be here when I leave here, it's your responsibility to make sure the music program is better than when I was here!"

In the words of Mrs. Green; "Not only was it informative, but also inspirational as Mrs. Kaliska ended with the message: You can do anything!" Mrs. Kaliska herself, though she has muscular dystrophy, and is in a wheelchair, was a teacher, has been all over the world, and has even been sky diving. Mrs. Green was very excited to be reunited with her teacher who ignited a passion for learning in her so many years ago.

There was a video during the assembly showing all that the training dogs have to encounter before becoming a certified Companion Dog. There were also demonstrations of all the commands a dog must

learn. They must be able to open doors, refrigerators, cabinets, bring objects to their master, as well as, be able to handle wanting to be petted by every child they encounter. Mrs. Kaliska explained very carefully how children must approach the master to gain permission to pet the particular animal. These animals must also be trained to actually approach a check stand and pay for articles that the owner purchased.

After the Canine Companion assembly, all presenters moved on to their perspective rooms to greet several classes from different grades to talk about their particular career.

Councilmember supports neighborhood safety

Dear Evergreen Neighbors,

As your Councilmember, I've made improving public safety a top priority – and I've been proud to support the hiring of hundreds of new police officers, bringing back the burglary unit, and returning to police response to all home alarm systems in the city.

In District 8, I have been working to support neighborhood safety by organizing crime prevention meetings, public safety trainings, business district safety meetings, and community meetings. It's deeply important that we work together to address neighborhood-specific concerns, and to connect neighbors to officers.

When I ran for office, I promised that I would always put our families first. As a mom of two little ones, making our city family friendly is a challenge that I have experience with – which is why I've worked to get the City to adopt a Family Friendly Initiative. The initiative has included expanding access to affordable childcare, making sure all new parents can access paid family leave, and adding changing tables to city facilities that are supposed to be accessible to families.

There's one place where these two issues (Public Safety and Families) come together: crimes against women and children.

While San Jose is one of the safest major cities in the country, there has recently been an alarming increase in the number of sexual assaults in our city – with the number of rapes having almost tripled in the last ten years.

The causes for that uptick aren't fully known. Some believe it's an increase in women coming forward to report, while others believe there's an increase due to factors like overcrowding in homes. I believe it's some combination of the aforementioned and other factors.

But the response is still the same: with almost three times as many cases in need of investigation, it's vital that the San Jose Police Department invest more resources in solving these crimes. The Police Department must increase its focus and improve its systems for investigating sexual assault, domestic violence, and human trafficking.

That's why I was so proud to lead my female council colleagues in calling for our Police Department to bring forward a plan that is as bold as the crisis is big. We're also calling on the City Administration to schedule a series of public hearings on the subject and to set up formal coordination with Santa Clara County.

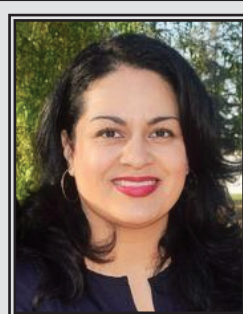
There are now five women on the City Council – half of the districts have women representing them. I was so pleased to have each of them join me in this effort. This is especially true for our senior female colleague: Councilmember Magdalena Carrasco, a leader on combatting domestic violence against women and now joining us are Councilmembers Dev Davis, Maya Esparza, and Pam Foley.

Working together, we have a true opportunity to move the needle on this stubborn and tragic issue. It will not be easy and as the nation grapples with unacceptable sexual conduct our city has an opportunity to have a breakthrough on the successful prosecutions of those who harm mostly young women and children.

With that in mind, I've requested the Mayor include a reserve in the budget to fund implementing the Police Department's plan, as well as new trainings for our officers. I hope you'll join me and my colleagues in urging swift action.

'Thank You America' monument to honor the camaraderie between South Vietnam and American soldiers

Santa Clara County Supervisors Cindy Chavez, Dave Cortese and San Jose Council Member Maya Esparza held a community meeting on the status and progress of the Thank You America monument honoring the bond and camaraderie between South Vietnamese and American soldiers who often fought alongside one another during the Vietnam War.

Many former South Vietnamese soldiers and their families now live in Santa Clara

County after the Republic of Vietnam fell to communist North Vietnam on April 30, 1975. The monument is expected to be placed in San Jose's Vietnamese Heritage Garden.

After the monument is built, it will eventually be positioned so community members can reflect and pay tribute to the sacrifices of the South Vietnamese and American soldiers.

The statue was proposed by a group of Vietnamese-Americans seeking to raise \$300,000 to erect and maintain the monument, which would include a bronze statue of two soldiers, with flags of the United States and the former nation of South Vietnam as well as a circular black granite bench.

It would be in the corner area beside the District Attorney's Office.

murrain, anthocyanin, and the final winning word, Auslaut.

After the 17th round, close to midnight, EST, Jacques Bailly, the event's pronouncer, announced that any of the eight remaining contestants who made it through three more words would share in the prize.

In a group interview on CNN, the eight champions agreed that once the possibility of a tie was announced, they each hoped that all of them would answer their words correctly.

The competition normally offers a \$50,000 prize to the champion. Instead of splitting it eight ways, all eight contestants will receive \$50,000 and their own trophy.

The competition began Monday, May 27 in Oxon Hill, Maryland, with 562 spellers ages 7 to 15. After the field was narrowed to 16, the competition took a break. On Thursday afternoon, May 30, Gandharsi correctly spelled crambo, invincible, Yiddishkeit, hendiadys, Aufgabe, hinala and keriah, before

heading into the final televised prime-time finals which narrowed the field to the final eight co-champions.

Bailly called the winners "the most phenomenal assemblage of spellers in the history of this storied competition."

More than 11 million spellers started a journey more than eight months ago in classrooms across America. They shared one dream: make it to the National Spelling Bee.

"This is a night to celebrate the remarkable academic achievement of a group of the world's most talented spellers," said Paige Kimble, executive director of the Scripps National Spelling Bee. "These spellers have conquered the dictionary unequivocally with their ability, skill and command of the English language. It's an incredible achievement, and we salute all the years of hard work and dedicated study that brought these intelligent young people to the world stage. We congratulate them all."

Every year, students from all walks of life have the opportunity to participate in the Scripps National Spelling Bee, one of the nation's oldest and most iconic competitions.

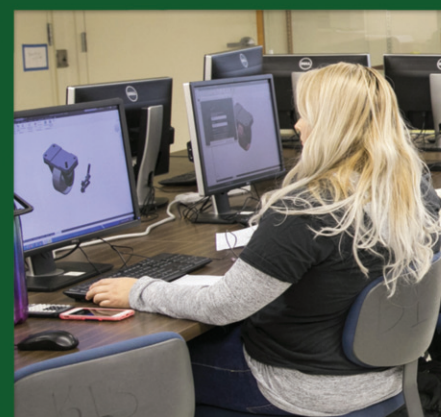

Summer dangers for pets, part 2

Summer has begun—the season meant for fun, sun, and spending time outdoors with pets. When the temperature heats up, the dangers to pets increase, too. To keep your dog and cat safe make sure you are prepared.

1. Fleas and Ticks

With all the time your pet will be spending outdoors, one of the biggest dangers is fleas/ ticks. During the summer you should check your pet for ticks at least once a day and check your pet thoroughly after walks or trips through wooded areas. Ticks can be harder to find on thicker coat dogs. Ticks carry a number of diseases, including Lyme disease, but symptoms are often hard to spot. Dogs may be tired or feverish or become lame. Also talk to your vet ahead of time about effective tick medication, and only use products that are made for your type of pet.

2. Dehydration and Heatstroke

Dehydration and heatstroke are very real threats. Animals should always have fresh, clean water available, whether it's summer or the dead of winter. Carry portable water bowls when traveling anywhere. Dogs that have shorter noses, such as Boston terriers or pugs, cannot cool themselves as efficiently as other breeds. Dogs that are always playing outside, Labrador retrievers for example, can become so focused on what they're doing that they don't stop to cool down.

Watch out for these symptoms:

- Excessive lethargy
- Decreased urination
- Dry gums
- Refusal to eat
- Sunken eyes
- Decreased skin elasticity (Gently pinch your pet's skin near the shoulder up into the shape of a tent. If the skin is slow to snap back, your pet may be dehydrated.)

Don't worry if your dog pants. That's how they cool themselves off. The hotter they are, the more they'll pant. Other ways to cool your pup include fans, ice packs, frozen treats, ice cubes, kiddie pools and sprinklers. Your kids and dog will have a blast. If they seem weak or off-balance, cool them with a hose or wet towels and get them to a veterinarian as quickly as possible.

3. Pools and Water

Not all dogs have mastered the doggie paddle. Some may not like water, and certain breeds like pugs and terriers, may have trouble swimming. So before you bring your dog to the beach or pool, buy a flotation device to keep your pup safe. If you are plan-

ning a boating adventure with your dog this summer, make sure he doesn't jump overboard, which can be dangerous for animals. And never try to force your pet into the water.

If you luck out and your pet enjoys splashing around, always rinse off after a swim. The chlorine, salt and bacteria in pools and lakes can be harmful. Animals should also have a shady area nearby where they can cool off and have access to fresh water, as drinking salt water and pool water can cause health problems.

4. Cars

Just as with children, leaving a pet in the car for even a few minutes can cause it to have heat stroke. Even on a 70-degree day, a car in direct sunlight can heat up to 100 degrees within minutes.

5. Snakes

Many snakes are harmless, but some are poisonous. Protect your pet (and

the rest of your family) by keeping your yard tidy. Snakes love to hide, and tall grass and piles of junk are perfect spots.

If your dog is inclined to chase wild animals, get them into the house until the animal goes away. If your cat is allowed to go outside, do a quick check of your yard beforehand to make sure the coast is clear. If a pet is bitten by a snake, its face and head will become swollen and you should call your vet right away.

6. Bee Stings

Bee stings and spider bites, are common in dogs. Check around your home (inside and out) for beehives, wasp nests, and other hazards your family and pets may encounter. Don't forget to also check garages and storage sheds. So what should you do? If there is a lot of swelling, call your vet, who can suggest an office visit or prescribe an over-the-counter medicine. Some OTCs are harmful to pets, though, so never dispense them on your own. And watch how your pet responds to any swelling. If they are very irritated, they may scratch the stung area, pulling out the fur. These "hot spots" make your pet look bald. Bring your pet to the vet right away if you notice this behavior or these spots.

7. Sidewalks

Things like black pavement (or asphalt) can get very hot and can harm your pets' paws. A good gauge is:

"If you wouldn't like walking on it with bare feet, try to limit your dog's time on it, too."

Try to schedule walks during cooler times of the day

These dangers may sound scary, but a little preparation and a watchful eye is all you need to take the heat off your summer.

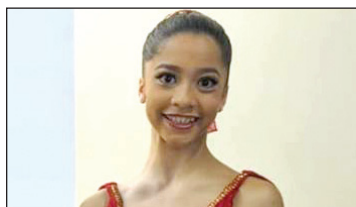

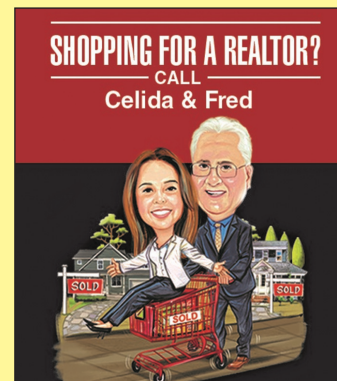
