Men's Health Week

Each June, the week before Father's Day is celebrated as "Men's Health Week." The Cancer Services Program and the Livingston County Department of Health wants you to have the facts about men's health. "Many men continue to ignore their health. Poor health education and poor health behaviors in the lives of men continue to contribute to a growing crisis in men's health," said Jennifer Rodriguez, Public Health Director of the Livingston County Department of Health.

"Men often make their health a low priority. But many causes of illness are easily preventable. It's a fact that simple awareness of preventable health problems, and the early detection and treatment of disease, can make a profound difference in the quality of life. Early detection by such routine exams as prostate screenings, blood pressure checks, cholesterol testing, colorectal cancer screenings – even such simple tests as those for blood sugar and overweight – can play an important role in staying healthy," Mrs. Rodriguez said.

Men are less likely than women to see a physician regularly, and are significantly more likely to be disconnected from the health-care system. They are often extremely reluctant to admit that there might be anything wrong until a problem is too severe to ignore.

This reluctance is a contributing factor in the growing health disparities between men and women. The difference in life expectancies between the genders is now more than five years. Men have higher rates of heart disease and cancer, and higher rates of chronic problems such as high blood pressure and dangerously high cholesterol problems. These are problems that are often treatable if they are detected early. And, of course, there are problems such as prostate and testicular cancers that are unique to men.

Men need to see their healthcare providers to assess their personal risks for various problems. "Men should take the occasion of "Men's Health Week" as a perfect opportunity to make an appointment with their doctor or other health care provider.

Cancer screenings save lives! Talk to your healthcare provider about life-saving cancer screenings today! No health insurance right now? Colorectal cancer screenings are available at NO COST through the Cancer Services Program of the Finger Lakes Region for uninsured men ages 50 or older who qualify (and breast and cervical cancer screenings for uninsured women ages 40 and older, as well as colorectal cancer screenings for women ages 50 and older are also offered). The Dangers of Indoor Tanning

To get ready for the summer months, some people will be going to use tanning beds and booths. Once thought of as a "safe alternative" to natural sunlight, indoor tanning booths are just as dangerous to skin health as the sun. Tanning beds release high amounts of UV radiation, causing damage to the skin. Although this damage may not be seen immediately, it may result in skin cancer in the future. The Dartmouth Medical School found that using a tanning bed makes a person 2.5 times more likely to develop skin cancer. This research was based on the use of a tanning bed once during a person's lifetime, not regular or prolonged use. Indoor tanning can also cause immune system suppression and complications with vision and eye health, including cataract development and eye cancer.

According to the Skin Cancer Foundation, one in five Americans are estimated to be diagnosed with skin cancer in the course of a lifetime. Although preventable, thousands of people die from skin cancer each year. There are two forms of skin cancer. Non-melanoma skin cancers are those that are localized to one area of the body and do not spread to other systems or organs in the body. They are usually found on areas of the skin that are most exposed to ultraviolet (UV) radiation, such as the face, hands and neck. In the United States, over 5.4 million cases of nonmelanoma skim cancer are treated each year. Melanoma skin cancer is more dangerous, and results from repeated overexposure to UV rays. In the United States, over 5.4 million cases of nonmelanoma skim cancer are treated each year. Melanoma can spread to other parts of the body, making it more dangerous and deadly if left untreated. In 2017, an estimated 87,110 new cases of melanoma will be diagnosed.

Both forms of cancer are highly treatable when detected in their early stages, however avoiding indoor tanning beds all together is the safest and easiest way to avoid skin cancer. Talk to your doctor about a skin cancer screening.
