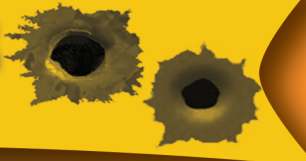

The Reilly Springs Jamboree came "to town" on Saturday June 15! Why? Well, to celebrate "Flag Day" and to bring live country and gospel music to the Sulphur Springs city dwellers and newcomers who might not have heard about the Jamboree before. Yes, the Reilly Springs Jamboree is an old-time country stage show located in Hopkins County with a pretty impressive history as well as the best new talent from around NE Texas! It's membership includes singers, songwriters and musicians of all ages. Here's a few highlights from the flag-waving evening in town.

The musical event was held in the beautiful new multi-purpose building inside Heritage Park. Winniford House, newly opened in March 2019, seats 100 persons and offers comfortable amenities for weddings, anniversary parties and meetings, etc. The bright, climate-controlled building also boasts a spacious full-service kitchen, perfect for receptions and reunions. the Lonestar Heritage Quilt Guild, and her family will be entering her most recent quilts in this year's quilt show in her memory.

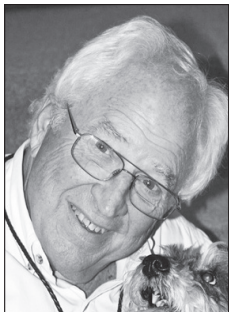

Tom Green died from complications of lung cancer Tuesday, June 11, 2019, at University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas, surrounded by friends and his loving family.

He was born at home on South Davis Street on April 21, 1942, the son of the late Johnny and Betty Green.

As a child in Sunday School, he learned about Jesus' work with the poor, a lesson that stayed with him throughout his life. At an early age, he became aware of the inequality in society and joined to NAACP to work for

change. He was a life-long champion of the underdog. Tom had a great time at Sulphur Springs ISD. He played trumpet in the

marching and symphonic band and was offered a music scholarship when he graduated from Sulphur Springs High School in 1960. He also served as a disc jockey for the KSST Radio Workshop during his high school years. He received a degree in government and history from then East Texas State University in Commerce, where he served as freshman class representative. He was elected president of the student senate during his sophomore and junior years at ETSU. After receiving his undergraduate degree, Tom was admitted to law school at The University of Texas, where he worked as an announcer on KLBJ AM radio. In August of 1966, he covered the Tower Shooting, calling home to KSST's Bill Bradford with updates. Upon passing the bar, Tom worked in state government and was especially supportive of labor unions. He served on several political campaigns with Texas Attorney General Jim Mattox. Tom was First Assistant Attorney General for the state of Texas until he retired in 1991. Tom loved travel, saying his favorite place was Rome and central Italy, where he stayed in a monastery. He also spent time in national parks, favoring Yellowstone in winter where he could run with the wolves. He traveled to Alaska and visited the famous Ghost Ranch in New Mexico. Combining his love of travel and music, Tom attended the annual Wood Guthrie Music Festival in Okemah, OK, for many years and loved meeting the wonderful musicians there. He also attended several Americana Music Festivals, once representing The Sulphur Springs News-Telegram as a special correspondent. Tom kept up with the musicians he befriended, supporting their careers with his presence and by purchasing their recordings. With a camera around his neck, Tom was a fixture on the coffee house concert circuit, attending as many performances as he could in Dallas and Northeast Texas. Tom also loved animals. 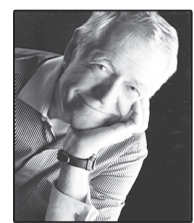

A BICYCLE RIDE OF 4,000 MILES
Tumbleweed Smith

Bill Huckabee of Sweetwater is a retired executive and a serious bicycle rider. He rode around his neighborhood, covering 100 miles every week. Gradually he increased his mileage until he was biking 50 miles a day, going to nearby towns 25 or so miles away. One day while looking at the map he discovered that Lebanon, Kansas is known as the exact center of the country. Bill, who is 65 years old, made that his destination.

"I bought a touring bike and outfitted it with camping gear, tools, clothing, a pillow and other essentials and took off. Two weeks later I was at the geographic center of the contiguous United States. This was supposed to be my turning around point. I called my wife and told her I was not through with my ride, that I was gonna keep going. She asked me where I was going. I told her she would be the second person to know because I hadn't made that decision yet.

"One evening I was studying the map and wondering how far am I going to go? There was a town called Fargo. I thought that solves how far I'm going to go. So I pedaled to Fargo, North Dakota. When I got there I knew that I would forever regret not going to the border of Canada. So I went to the Canadian border, almost straight up from Fargo. That was my turn around point but I took the long way home. I came back down to Grand Forks, North Dakota then headed east to Itasca State Park in Minnesota where the headwaters of the Mississippi river are located. Then I just followed the Mississippi down until I got to the northeast corner of Arkansas and than angled down to Dallas and on home to Sweetwater."

He says anyone who takes a trip like this needs to be a god mechanic. "I was self-contained. There were a couple of occasions where I didn't see a town for 2 or 3 days and there was no cell phone service. Once I needed a tire and I called a big bike store and had the tire shipped to the next town on my route."

Bill had 3 flats but repaired them with patch kits and a pump. Once when it was raining friends he met let him stay in their garage. He camped out more than half the time, sleeping in city, state or national parks, once a week he stayed in a motel.

"My best day of mileage was 90 miles. My longest day of being in the saddle, which means moving time, not break time or stopping to get a drink, was 8 hours and 41 minutes. Most of the ride that day was uphill somewhere in Missouri."

He was gone 79 days, pedaled 4,000 miles and spent \$4,000. His goal was to make 50 miles a day but he averaged 59 miles a day. He kept in touch with his wife by phone most every day. One of the most common questions he got was: are you by yourself?

"The favorite response I got after I said I was by myself was from a gentlemen who said, 'you're married, aren't you?'"


