Max Increase 4.1% for Fall

FLORENCE - The University of North Alabama last week announced a move toward a transparent, true cost-of-attendance tuition model for students and parents. This includes a reduction in fees (from seven to one); fee inclusion in overall tuition cost; and a "truth in advertising" methodology, which sets UNA apart from many peer institutions.

"UNA is extremely conscious of and sensitive to a total costof-attendance for our students, evidenced by the comparison to our peers, all of whom receive significantly more funding from the state to provide essential services," said Dr. **Ross Alexander**, UNA's Vice President for Academic

Affairs and Provost. The impact of the new plan on students will vary depending on course load. Some students will see little to no change in overall expenses, while others will see an increase. The maximum increase for students taking 15 hours will be 4.1%, and officials expect UNA to remain 9th out of the 14 public universities in Alabama in total cost of attendance.

That cost will include tuition plus fees. Further, UNA receives between \$10 million and \$20 million less annually in state funding compared to peers with enrollments of 5,000-8,000 students. University officials have created "Project 208" – named for the distance in miles from Florence to Montgomery – to highlight the need for fairness in funding for UNA.

UNA President **Ken Kitts** notes that impact of the funding deficit extends to the region.

"UNA has missed out on hundreds of millions of dollars that should

MAURICE CAUSEY

Causey Maurice is American-born. European-based artist. He began studying ballet at the age of 15 in his hometown of Florence at the Florence School of Ballet directed by Michael McCadden and Patsy Hill. During his early training years, Mauricewas awarded several Ford Foundation scholarships. Maurice has been Ballet Master for both Royal Swedish Ballet (2002-2003) and The Netherlands Dance (2004-2019). Theatre He has choreographed original works for several companies including NDT and was a guest teacher for numerous companies in Maurice has Europe. choreographed for galas, schools, and competitions throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Korea, and Australia (Khio) and has staged ballets by William Forsythe. He has conducted workshops, teaching Forsythe's Improvisational Technologies around the

DR. JOHN WILKINSON TAYLOR Plaque reads: As Deputy Director-General of UNESCO, Dr. John W. Taylor

pioneered international programs following WWII aimed at ending illiteracy by promoting education within communities. He introduced an early version of distance learning through correspondence courses via radio.

Born in Kentucky in 1906, John W. Taylor held a doctorate in philosophy and taught in leading universities in Europe and the United States. As President of the University of Louisville from 1947 - 1949, he helped end racial segregation pioneered and community education programs. In 1950 Dr. Taylor became Deputy Director-General of United Nations Economic Cultural Social and Organization (UNESCO). He was appointed acting Director-General upon the resignation of Jaime Torres Bodet in 1952.

One of the chief functions of UNESCO was to make studies, reports, and recommendations to the General UN Assembly with respect to international economics, social relations, culture, education, health, and related matters for the purpose of promoting respect for and observance of human rights and fundamental freedoms for all. UNESCO was founded in 1945.

Dr. Taylor's education began at Florence State Teacher's college. He later studied at Peabody College (Vanderbilt) and Columbia Universities. He also worked with foreign exchange the program at Columbia.

friend of mine popped into the office a couple of weeks ago, handed me an envelope, and asked me

what I thought of it. Inside the envelope was 3 legitimatelooking checks for \$998.33 each (\$2,995 total) made out to my friend. Enclosed with the checks

was an official-looking letter from a "Mystery Shopper" company. The instructions said that my friend was chosen at random to participate in a Mystery Shopper program. All he had to do was to deposit all three checks in his bank account, travel to an Apple Store, and purchase 2 Apple

gift cards and 1 iTunes gift card for a total of \$2,695. He was then required to text the gift card numbers to the Mystery Shopper people. For his trouble, my friend got to keep the remaining \$300.

Easy money, right? Wrong. Here's what would have happened had my friend allowed himself to be roped into the scam: his bank would have accepted the checks, my friend would buy the gift cards, texts the gift card numbers to the scammer, and, knowing my friend, would buy \$300 worth

of beer with the proceeds.

The scammers would then use the gift card numbers to purchase expensive merchandise from the Apple Store. A couple of days later, my friend would get a sad call from the bank informing him that the 3 checks were fake, and the funds would be removed from his account. My friend would be on the hook for the entire \$2,985.

I talked with a banker friend of mine to get his opinion on whether or not my friend would have been on the hook

for the \$2,995. He said that Federal law requires that banks reimburse clients for certain kinds of scams, mainly electronic scams. For example, if your bank account is hacked and thieves transfer your entire balance to some other account, you have 48 hours to report the breach. After that, the bank is not obligated to reimburse you one penny. They still might pay you back, but they aren't obligated under the law. But this particular check scam is non-reimbursable. My friend would have been out \$2,995 and no way to get it back unless he owned the bank.

My banker friend also told me that tellers are trained to look out for these kinds of things. So if you show up at the bank with this kind of thing, you might be asked to speak with the branch manager. The

manager may warn you of the dangers of proceeding but they cannot stop you from making a bad decision. So if you're approached by the branch manager, please pay attention.

Everyone is susceptible to this kind of scam, of course, but the usual targets are our older folks who simply aren't able to recognize the dangers as well as they once did. So please share this story with your favorite old person.

LIN DUNN

Plaque reads: Serving as head coach in women's collegiate basketball, 1970-1996, Lin Dunn became a 17-year coach in the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) and was inducted into the WNBA Hall of Fame in 2014.

Coach Lin Dunn is well-chronicled as one of the nation's foremost pioneers of women's basketball and one of its most prominent coaches

and leaders. She has Towns, Doublehead was Creek in the west. been a proven winner at both the college and pro levels with three half of fame inductions, 2010, 2012, and in 2014, she was inducted into the National Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

Dunn's coaching career preceded the passing of Title IX legislation in the 1970s. Her storied career includes trips to the NCAA Final Four and the WNBA Finals. A native of Dresden, Tennessee, she spent her early years in Florence, Alabama. She attended Elementary Gilbert School and Appleby Junior High School. She played basketball for Coach Noona Kennard's independent girls' team before moving back to Tennessee after the 10th grade. her

During distinguished

44-year coaching career, Coach Dunn had 683 college and pro wins including the WNBA postseason. In her 38 seasons as head coach, she coached 1,156 games. She had 25 years as a collegiate head coach and went on to coach 17 seasons in professional women's basketball with 13 years as head coach.

In addition, Dunn served on USA Basketball staffs for the 1992 Olympics and the 1990 gold medal-winning World Championship and medal-winning Goodwill Games teams.

DOUBLEHEAD **CHEROKEE CHIEF**

Plaque reads: Through negotiations with President George Washington, Chief Doublehead owned all lands between Bluewater and Cypress Creeks. The lands became federal property after 1807, allowing a corporation to purchase 5,515 acres to establish Florence.

Doublehead (1744-1807), or Incalatanga (Taltsu'tsa in Cherokee), was one of the most feared warriors of the Cherokee during the Cherokee-American wars. Doublehead was among a delegation of Cherokees who visited U.S. President George Washington in Philadelphia in 1791. After the peace treaty at the Tellico Blockhouse in 1794, Doublehead served as one of the leaders of the Chickamauga Cherokee or "Lower Cherokee". death of Upon the Principal his nephew, Chief John Watts, in 1802, Doublehead was chosen as a leader of the Chickamauga.

elected first Speaker of the Cherokee National Council when the Cherokee formed their first nascent national government in 1794. He became one of the foremost advocates of acculturation and one of the richest men in the

Cherokee Nation. being the Doublehead site. which Reserve, received in 1806. The Reserve contains most of what is now Florence and Genealogy Department at stretched from Elk River the Florence-Lauderdale in the east to Cypress Public Library.

Rising From The Dead







That report helped create six general areas of focus that the Greater committee Shoals members would consider: Infrastructure, Digital Tourism, Workforce Development, Economic Development, Quality of Life, and Governmental Collaboration.

Committees were formed to discuss those areas in detail. Each committee met three times in recent months with solid attendance of between 25 and 40 at each one. Among general findings the by the working groups was that the Shoals is fragmented, the area has more deaths than births, has too many agencies government, and of has a need for updated economic development and tourism marketing plans.

A spokesperson from each committee shared those recommendations through a Powerpoint

presentation to a packed room of community leaders and interested parties at the Sweetwater Depot in Florence last week.

Bank Independent President, Macke Mauldin, former University of North Alabama President, Robert Potts, Shoals Chamber of Commerce President, Caitlin Holland, and Alvin Rosenbaum, author of "The Muscle Shoals: First Frontier of These United States," formed the steering committee.

Mauldin welcomed everyone to last week's event and gave a brief overview before handing it off to the presenters. He wrapped up the presentation by reminding the gathering that the presentation they just saw and participated in represented a beginning

to the process rather than an end. "We have the framework for how we're going to make the Shoals a better place to live," said Mauldin. "We have a mandate, so now we need the leadership of the private and public sectors to move toward

getting these things done." Mauldin closed by saying the steering committee will review polling from the meeting, establish priorities, develop a budget for implementation, and report back to the community in early November.


DIGITAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Develop a digital infrastructure in the Greater Shoals in order to become one of the best-connected communities of our size in the USA.



Working Group Findings:

1. Create a new entity as shaped by all the Shoals utility departments to design, finance and implement a modern digital infrastructure throughout the Greater Shoals to take advantage of the significant TVA investment in broadband fiber resources already installed in the Shoals area. 2. Highway Hypnosis

Have you ever been driving down the road and your mind goes into autopilot? It happens most frequently when you are driving on a familiar road. You can go for miles in deep thought about something other than driving and then you kind of "wake up" and wonder, "How did I get here?" You do not remember driving through familiar areas, the cars you met or passed, or the stops and turns you made- - but somehow you did it!

Probably most drivers can identify with this phenomenon. There is even a name for it. It is called "highway hypnosis" or "white line fever." A textbook definition for "highway hypnosis" is "a mental condition in

which a person can drive an automobile great distances, responding to external events in the expected and correct manner with no recollection of having consciously done so."

I will admit that I have been a victim of highway hypnosis from time to time. But even though I have lived to tell the story, I do not believe it is a good thing for me or any other driver.

Even worse is the thought that this type of hypnotic trance can slip into our spiritual lives. For example, it could easily happen during worship services. We might mouth through the songs, bow our heads during prayer, stare at the preacher during a sermon, partake of the communion, and make a monetary offering as we have often done before, but with our minds in another place. Surely, that is not a good thing either! Jesus taught, "The hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth" (John 4:23, 24). Hence, there are two ways our Lord specified that are essential for acceptable worship. One is "in truth," meaning that we much worship in the manner he prescribed in his teaching. The second is "in spirit," which means our hearts and minds must be engaged when we worship. Worshiping God in both spirit and truth are equally important. Thus, we cannot worship with our minds in autopilot and think God will be pleased. God expects our proper attention as well as our proper actions.

percentage of any Metropolitan Statistical Area in the state. Efforts to increase the quality and readiness of the local workforce have been nothing short of sensational. The credit can be spread far and wide from basic reading skills early, to innovative programs late, teacher efforts throughout, and so many other factors and directives within those 13 years.

That doesn't leave much room to improve. Between those who really aren't interested in working or continuing their education and those who can't pass a pre-employment drug screen, 85% may be a best case. Apathy and excessive drug use are already crippling local employers looking to increase their work roles.

Another valid consideration was brought up by the working group that was looking at quality of life, albeit maybe not for the reasons mentioned here. They recognized that accelerated growth may create some unintended consequences for our community that may impact our quality of life.

Many of us would say that we like living here because it's relaxed with comparatively little traffic and road congestion, rural areas are literally 10 minutes away from anywhere, courtesy seems to reign on the roadways, long-held Southern values, little added stress, and so on. Accelerated growth could change all that quickly.

If we wanted more hecticness and headaches, we could move to suburbs of Huntsville, Nashville, San Antonio, or Greenville, SC.

Another thing that happens when growth comes in from the outside that communities is become more liberal. That trend toward liberalism occurs naturally enough in young people anyway. Their gleeful ignorance is often pro-government, pro-social equality, and pro sex of any kind. When a community grows quickly and people come in to accommodate that growth and fill newly-created positions, they often bring a more progressive, urban, fastpaced mindset, that is not conducive to a smalltown, individual-driven America. Therefore, if more progressivism is а part mandated of accelerated progress, we need to decelerate a little.





If you were to take a penny and hold it between your thumb and index finger, with Abe Lincoln facing you, you could hold it up between you and your view of the sun in such a way as to eclipse the sun.

No words could have conveyed the meaning of that touch. It said what couldn't be said.

Over the course of the next few days, I am sure that members of that family will go to their mailboxes and will find cards of sympathy. Not a book about grief but a simple card or letter. However, those cards

Dear Dave,

My husband and I met a young woman through an outreach program at church. She is a single mother with she is a single mother with a small child, and recently she asked us for money, so she could buy baby food and diapers. This isn't the first time she has asked us for money. In the past, she has used money we've given her to buy alcohol for herself after telling us it was going to be used for the baby. She truly does need financial help, though. Can you give us some advice on handling this situation? Angela



Dear Angela, Financially speaking, her problem sounds as much like a mismanagement of money as it is a lack of money. That, and she seems to have an issue with lying. If you're determined to help this woman, you can put conditions on your help designed to improve her decision-making abilities and her life.

If someone is bold enough to ask for your money, you have every right to attach requirements to the money for their own good. One of two things will happen if you handle it this way. She'll either graciously accept your conditions and welcome the help, or she'll get angry and say you have

no right interfering in her helping someone is a business. I've never had a problem helping people who have good hearts and just need a break. But if someone cops an attitude with me in a situation like this, I wouldn't be breaking out my wallet anytime soon.

If you choose to do this, make the money a gift and not a loan. Concentrate on trying to get her on a path where she's a little more honest with you and thinks a little straighter. Hopefully, as a result she will start making better choices. Teach her how to create and live off a budget, or help her enroll in a personal finance course, too. Right now, just handing her money is like giving a drunk a drink.

This whole situation is a lot bigger than helping someone with baby food and diapers. The answer to that is easy. In this case, however, I'd probably give it to her in the form of a gift card. Some of those don't allow alcohol purchases. You could avoid that possibility, too, by getting things for the baby yourself and taking them to her.







Concern Over Education

Editor:

I am writing this because the children here because the children here in Florence, AL are not being taught English or the importance of using it properly. If they are, one would never know it. I have to wonder what the requirements are for a Bachelors degree these days, and even more importantly, a state Alabama teaching of certificate.

There are two reasons I make that rather bold statement. The first is that the students with whom I interact through my places of employment are unable to speak in complete sentences; using dangling participles; use the wrong verb (or tense) if a verb is used at all; end sentences with prepositions; use the incorrect pronoun; and have very poor vocabularies. I could point

out other deficiencies. However, those are the most glaring. I am not referring to only those in kindergarten, or first grade. I see the problem in all K-12 students.

The problem, and remedy appears to be the teaching staff. I believe that if tested, a very large number of teachers don't know or choose not to use grammatically correct standards themselves.

I have been on field trips with a lot of them, and I hear teachers saying things such as "me and her", or incorrectly using "is" with a plural subject. They don't know the difference between bring and take.

I also grew up during a time when ALL teachers time when ALL teachers considered grading for grammar and spelling to be part of their job, even if Biology was the subject for which I had to write a paper. I don't see that anymore. In fact, when I have asked, I have been tald by a tracker that their told by a teacher that their job was to teach History, or whatever subject, and

they left the grammar to the English Department. We no longer diagram sentences in school. Why? sentences in school. Why? The answer I was given for that by the head of the English Department in the high school where I taught was that the "kids found it boring." I too found it boring, but I learned how to construct a sentence, which was a skill obviously lacking in too many of the students we were graduating. We do not, or so it would appear, constantly teach and reinforce grammar in the See LETTERS... on p. 44

classroom. I doubt there is a classroom filled with K-6 students in the entire State (probably few across state (probably few across the country) in which the students are corrected every time they say something grammatically incorrect. I don't wish to sound like the "back in my days as a student" old foot but we were all but fogy, but we were all but brow beaten when we made those mistakes, or so it felt. We did however, grow up knowing that good grammar, and a large vocabulary were important to a successful life.

It is my belief that something must be done at the level of the Superintendent of Schools to get the attention of the Principals and teachers in our schools. I don't think they are bad at what they do; however, I do believe they are missing something very significant, and which I also believe as a retired high school teacher, is a primary responsibility. It is fundamental to education to ensure that the teachers being hired have an excellent command of the

English language. They need to know that if they fail in that aspect of the education of their students, they (as the teacher) have failed those students. Frankly, I don't believe that many of the teachers realize the significance of this preparatory hurdle for their students' futures.





Los Angeles Homelessness and Econ 101

Editor:

"We can't arrest our way out of this. We can't shelter our way out of this. We have to house our way out of this," Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti said last year while campaigning for a measure to spend \$1.2 billion in taxpayer money over ten years on housing for his city's homeless population.

Los Angeles County Supervisor Mark Ridley-Thomas, who backed a \$355 million county sales tax initiative to provide services to the homeless in the county, called it the height of contradiction that homelessness is growing in

"The stunning increase in homelessness announced in Los Angeles this week -- up 16% over citywide," reports CNN, "was an almost incomprehensible

conundrum given the nation's booming economy and the hundreds of millions of dollars that city, county and state officials have directed the problem." toward There's nothing stunning or incomprehensible about it. or Eric Garcetti, Ridley-Thomas, Mark meet Ronald Reagan, "If you want more of something, subsidize it."

Los Angeles is already an inherently attractive destination for the homeless for several Homelessness reasons. in the Midwest can mean freezing to death if you can't find a shelter bed, to jobs, to transportation, to an already larger concentration than rural areas of both private charities and government services aimed at their problems.

did Ridley-What Thomas Garcetti and EXPECT to happen when they announced their plans to stack hundreds of millions of dollars in new government assistance on top of those inherent attractions?

If I were homeless in the western United States, I'd make a beeline for LA.

Garcetti is correct that housing is key to reducing homelessness. If Garcetti and Ridley-Thomas want to address homelessness with housing, they should get to work reducing tax and regulatory burdens that make it more expensive, difficult, time-consuming, and less profitable, to build new housing in Los Angeles than it should be.

However good their intentions, políticians hate giving up any amount of power and control over any activity. LA's politicians will probably just continue pouring gasoline on the fire and wondering why it gets hotter instead of burning 011t.



Many times, a person who is going on Medicare for the first time will come into our office with the understanding that Medicare will cover any and all medical procedures they have performed. Today's FAQs will address some items, services and procedures Medicare does not cover.

Does Medicare cover all medical procedures? Medicare doesn't cover everything. If you need a service that isn't covered under Medicare Part A or Part B you will have to pay for it yourself unless it's covered by a supplemental Medicare health plan or Medicaid. The phrase that Medicare uses is "medically necessary". If you have a procedure performed that is elective and not "medically necessary" there is a good chance it will not be covered by Medicare. It is always a good idea to check with your healthcare provider before you have a procedure performed to assure that it is covered by Medicare.

What are some examples of items and services not covered by Medicare? Some items and services not covered by Medicare are: Long-term custodial care, most dental care, eye examinations related to prescribing glasses, dentures, cosmetic surgery, acupuncture, hearing aids and exams for fitting them and routine foot care. Also, most prescription drugs are not covered by Medicare.

Will Medicare cover me outside the U.S.? Medicare generally doesn't cover healthcare while you're traveling outside the U.S. There are, however, rare exceptions when Medicare will cover you outside the U.S. You can find these exceptions in your Medicare and You Handbook or by going to Medicare.gov. In these rare cases Medicare, may pay for ambulance transportation to a foreign hospital only with admission for medically necessary covered inpatient hospital services. You pay 20% of the Medicare approved amount, and the Part B deductibles apply.
