# Light up the sky

Probably the real significance of what the 4th of July represents has been blurred and we think of it as a big picnic fry-out day with possibly a parade but most certainly an after-dusk display of fireworks lighting up the sky.

Seems all the stores now sell various assortments of fireworks -my most explosive fireworks were sparklers. And yes I could write my name really good even though my signature was lost in the abyss of space even before I got to the last letter. However, I was under no illusion that my name would really be emblazoned in the sky for all humanity to gaze upon. Ahh, fame is so fleeting!

Here's a few memories from my childhood: My husband's father worked for a dairy in Plymouth and some of the workers would put a firecracker (a big one) inside a metal milk can and blow the lid off. The lid was heavy so the thrust of the firecracker could equate to a bomb going off.

The house I lived in had a "milk chute" -this was built into the house wall-the milk man opened an outside door, put the milk bottles in (real glass), shut the door and then my mom or dad when they remembered would open the inside chute door and remove the milk. No, houses aren't built that way any more and what dairy delivers milk (ha)—a real thing of the past. Anyhow, back to the story. My cousin, who lived a few houses down, would come on the 4th and put a firecracker in the chutejust large enough to blow the door off.

When our two daughters were growing up we lived in the Milwaukee suburb of Whitefish Bay. Every 4th there was a neighborhood parade of coaster wagons, bicycles, tricycles and a straggling band of costumed kids trudging along on foot. One year we dressed the eldest daughter in a Statue of Liberty costume complete with crown and torch with a simulated flame made of red cellophane. The other one immersed in tears because she had fallen out of the coaster wagon—all this even before the parade started.

Our next house was on Lake Ellenthey had their own fireworks display but always the Saturday after—they didn't want to compete with the bigger near by towns. We had a boat parade with decorated pontoon boats. After that the picnic on the lawn and best of all the kids loved water balloon fights. Some of the pontoon boats would go out and also have water balloon fights-some were armed with sling shots to shoot down any on-coming water bombs.

Now that we're old and grey we don't do some of these things. However, we do like the Elkhart Lake fireworks but trudging down to the beach, fighting the crowds, trying to find a parking space, etc. just isn't something that we find appealing. But rather than miss out on the glory of the night sky fireworks we park the car on Victory Lane.

We have a good and clear view of the sky fireworks—yes, we miss the ground displays but we don't miss the crowds, etc. After the Grand Finale we drive home and go to bed.

And that's our 4th and we still like it.



# **REINS celebrates start of fifth year**

REINS, Inc. is celebrating the start of its fifth season at Majestic Crossing Dairy, LLC, who continue to generously donate their facilities to the organization. The facility is located on County Rd O off Hwy 32 in Sheboygan Falls.

REINS, Inc. is a non-profit Wisconsin organization committed to improving the lives of those with special needs through individually structured classes using therapeutic interactions with horses. They offer summer programs 5 days per week during the months of June, July and August to people ages 4-99. REINS, Inc. is a place where people come to heal and to make friends that last a lifetime.

The program started as a part of Lakeshore Technical College in 1982, but when the college dissolved its equine program, REINS became a 501(c)(3) organization. The program then moved to Snow Hill Farm in Glenbeulah, staying at this location for over 15 years. The program transitioned to Brackenwood Farm for the 2014 season while a more permanent home was located. After reaching out to several locations, it was decided that Majestic Crossing Dairy, LLC was the perfect fit. "Moving REINS to Majestic Crossing Dairy was a lot like coming home," said Deana Hamel, Executive Director for the REINS Board of Directors. "The facility built here by Joe Zoran was a model for the LTC program that started the equine therapy program some 33 years earlier." It was the perfect place for us to build and expand our program into what it is today."

Majestic Crossing Dairy, LLC has not only provided the program a home for the past four seasons, but has afforded the organization the opportunity to grow, with the program doubling in participates from 2017-2018. "The continued generosity of Majestic Crossing Dairy and the community is humbling. We couldn't offer this service without them." said Hamel.

With over 100 participants in the summer program, REINS, Inc. relies on the generosity of many, including volunteers. The 10-week program requires over 200 volunteers to ensure the safety and fun of its participants. The season officially starts June 17 and there are still a few volunteer spots to fill. # Honor grads feted by EL-G High School

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School has abandoned the traditional Valedictorian/Salutatorian designations for graduating seniors in favor of the Laude System.

Typically, the Laude System recognizes three levels of honor graduation: Cum Laude (with praise), Magna Cum Laude (with great honor) and Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor).

The laude score is based on a formula in which students are rewarded for taking classes with higher rigor. The program is based on a two tier system: tier 1 worth 1 point per semester awarded to transcripted and AP courses, and tier 2 worth .5 points per semester awarded to advanced standing and teacher selected courses.

Cum Laude - 7 to 10.5 points; Magna

Cum Laude - 11 to 14.5; and Summa Cum Laude - Greater than 15 points.

A minimum GPA of 3.25/4.00 is needed in order for a student to be recognized in the laude system.



# Inside the Bottle

### Yes, they can!

If you still aren't sure about screwcap wines instead of cork, brace yourself. The new big thing in wine is wine in CANS!

Portable potables are the latest trend taking over the wine and cocktail world. Perfect for boating, tailgating, hiking, and more; it is easy to see why this convenient package is sweeping the nation. There are lots of wonderful options out there, but like all wine, there are certain things to look for and avoid.

Aluminum cans have long been used for beer and are the preferred vessel of most brewers who like to tout them as "mini kegs". They offer a container that doesn't allow harmful sunlight in, allow easy transportability, and they are easily recyclable. Some feel that beer in bottles is fancier and avoid cans, but more and more breweries are investing in canning lines and are making the switch.

With the rise of beer in cans, there has been a more surprising rise in canned wine. The traditional glass bottle is still preferred by most wine makers and consumers, but cans offer an option that is perfect for beaches, boats, and pool decks where glass is often prohibited. Cans are also lighter in weight than bottles, so they're great for packing.

While they are great for outdoor events, I find that they typically aren't the best for the outdoor environment. Most people don't drink the wine straight from the can and instead pour it into a plastic glass, as they would with a bottle, to allow it to breathe and enjoy the aromatics. This leads to more landfill waste, so I do encourage people to use reusable glasses like collapsible camping wine glasses, silicone tumblers, or plastic tumblers. Each of these options are great for the outdoors and offer a more enjoyable drinking vessel than the lip of a can.

Cocktails are also popping up in cans, premixed. Vodka sodas, moscow mules, margaritas, and even bloody marys are being offered in cans. Not having to tote "Inside the Bottle" will be a monthly column that dives into the world of wine, craft beer, spirits, and other beverages – fermented and beyond. Jaclyn Stuart, author of The Complete Idiot's Guide to Wine & Food Pairing and owner of Vintage Elkhart Lake, will author the column and answer questions she frequently encounters inside her shop, at our wonderful Elkhart Lake area restaurants, and on her travels. all the necessary ingredients to a tailgate party or pontoon cruise is amazing and this ready-to-drink ("RTD") category is growing quickly in the United States. Each month, new RTD styles pop up ranging from cheap, generic brands to those with all-natural, high-quality ingredients. I love the craft canned cocktails from California's Cutwater Spirits, but with more competition I'm sure other amazing options will soon be here.

Now, there are typically two cocktail servings to a can, so it is important to pace yourself. Wine cans are typically 375ml, which is the same size as a standard 12oz soda can. It is also equal to a half bottle of wine...not just a glass! It is important to keep this in mind and not quickly consume the can like you're chugging a soda because it will catch up with you quickly. I know many people that have made this mistake the first time they've tried canned wine, so hopefully this little warning helps others.

Wine cans are specially made to not affect the wine, so they won't taste "tinny," but they aren't made for aging. Grab-and-go is best, and checking the date code on the cans is helpful. You typically want to consume canned wine within 18 months of its canning date. So, if you are enjoying wine by the lake this summer, be sure to grab a can and enjoy! Cheers!

Youth apprenticeships give high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to prepare for the workforce by exploring a future career through hands-on, paid work experience. Over 70 local employers partnered with 126 students from 17 Sheboygan area high schools during the 2018-19 program year.

This year's 126 youth apprentices gained over 70,000 hours of experience in 10 different career areas spanning a wide range of fields including information technology, agriculture, healthcare, manufacturing, hospitality, and others. While participating, 147 college credits were earned by those who attended college level classes at LTC.



# Bitter lemon sewed seed for charity

Jill Swanson Peltier knows what it's like to be fighting an uphill battle against cancer.

She also knows how important those friendly gestures of support can be for cancer patients.

Swanson Peltier took the lemon that life handed her in 2014—late stage colon cancer— and turned it into an opportunity to help others facing similar circumstances.

Inspired by the saying that we need to make lemonade when life hands us lemons, Swanson Peltier founded a helping charity she calls Lemons of Love.

In a nutshell, Swanson was so moved by a care package she received as a healing cancer patient, she decided to extend the favor to others who were experiencing similar battles.

Chemotherapy treatment for Jill was strenuous all while trying to run her business and be a mom, step mom and wife.

She began to extend the favor to fellow patients, bringing them joy in the form of small "chemo care packages."

As she shared her story through blogs, an amazing thing began to happen. She started receiving checks in the mail to support her goodwill effort for others. People were donating items for the bags, money and even their time. Thus marked the start of the Lemons of Love charity.

#### Impact of small gifts

Built on the impact of a small gift, the charity still holds strongly to the vision of sharing that loving support in the form of a simple gift to another who is suffering.

Since 2014, Lemons of Love has contributed more than 11,000 care packages to cancer patients in all 50 states and 15 other nations.

In addition to the care packages, support for Lemons of Love has been so passionate that the organization has been able to create a cancer resource center in Mt. Prospect. "We host cancer support groups, wellness classes, yoga and craft classes for cancer patients," Swanson Peltier said.

The center even offers a private space for head shaving for cancer patients who suffer hair loss. "To some it represents a loss to have their heads shaved, but we look at it as a step in the journey, and we welcome patients to bring their friends or others along," she said. Some even celebrate with chocolate cupcakes or a bottle of wine, honoring the event as part of the fight against cancer.

#### New chamber member

One of the Elkhart Lake Chamber's new members in 2019, Lemons of Love is anchored in Mt. Prospect, Illinois, but has a lot of Elkhart Lake connections. Not only is its founder a part-time Elkhart Lake resident, her company, FAST (Fresh Air System Technologies) makes cooling suits for race drivers. Swanson Peltierhas literally spent her whole life at race tracks—and Road America is among her favorite venues.

Lemons of Love has already had a significant presence at the track and in Elkhart Lake. Last August, working with Throttlestop, Lemons of Love held its first annual barbecue dinner, a night to enjoy a barbecue meal, participate in silent auctions and mingle with personalities from the IMSA racing circuit.

At Road America, Lemons of Love also has made its presence known. "This year, during Indy Car weekend, a pair of sponsored cars sported the Lemons of Love







Wisconsin Technical College System President Dr. Morna K. Foy also addressed the audience.

"When I come here and look at all of you, and I think about all the things you know, and all the things you know how to do, and how excited you are to get after it and to make a contribution, I cannot help but feel optimistic and very excited about what's to come," Foy said.

Rep. Glenn Grothman from the 6th District of Wisconsin delivered the commencement address. His advice to students was to have a plan for what they want to do in life.

"Imagine you're 75 years old. Then imagine what you want to have accomplished in your life, and how you are going to accomplish those things," Grothman said. "Start making your list when you get home tonight, and get going," he urged.

Tegan Gonzalez of Plymouth was the student speaker. She graduated with an associate degree from the criminal justicelaw enforcement program after overcoming many obstacles, including her fear of returning to school as a single mother of three.

"In the journey through life we will come across many obstacles and barriers. Never let them stop you," Gonzalez told her fellow graduates. "Your journey may change from your original plan, but it is never a failure. Have faith and stay focused on the positive things around you even when you're having a hard time seeing them. When you follow your given passion, you will become more than you can ever imagine!"

Already experiencing a change from original career plans and together at commencement were a mother and daughter who not only graduated together with associate degrees in accounting, but who took all their courses together, except one. Amber Hewitt, 24, and her 44-year-old mother, Julie Pitz, are both employed as accountants as of May 20.

Before adjourning the ceremony, Carlsen announced a surprise, honorary degree to Rep. Grothman in recognition of his positive relationship with, and commitment to, technical education and LTC.

"Shortly after the fire area, banquet halls called to offer us support with our customers," stated Scott McMurray, owner; "We have been able to relocate all 2019 special events and banquets to nearby venues."

The company hopes to rebuild the N8350 Co. Rd. J event venue. In the mean-

time, anyone who was looking to book an event at Three Guys is still encouraged to call as the firm will connect customers with nearby event spaces that serve Three Guy's food.

"The outpouring of support has been overwhelming and appreciated," stated McMurray.

Offers of help McMurray received included employees offering to work without compensation and neighbors volunteered to clean up fire debris.

One local volunteer fire fighter, an IT professional, took Thee Guys' damaged computer and put the hard drive into a new computer free of charge; saving company records.

"I don't know if this support is because we are in rural Wisconsin," explained McMurray, "but, the generosity of the area invigorated our commitment to this community, employees and customers. The fire is not an ending for Three Guys and a Grill, but a chance at a new beginning. I would like to thank a lot of people who I now view as everyday heroes."

# **DNR offers reminders** on water skiing rules

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has provided information that outlines state laws that apply specifically for water skiing or other activities that involve towing items from motor boats.

Those rules are reviewed here.

Vessel operators towing a person(s) on water skis, a surfboard, or any other device have additional laws.

#### **Requirements for Towing Skiers**

• A person may not be towed behind a vessel between sunset and sunrise.

• When a vessel is towing a person on water skis, a surfboard, or other device, the operator must have another competent person on board to act as an observer or the vessel must be equipped with a wideangle rearview mirror.

• A PWC operator may not tow a person on water skis or other devices unless:

 The PWC is designed and recommended by the manufacturer to accommodate at least three people, and...

• A competent observer is on board and in a position to observe the person being towed or the PWC is equipped with a wide-angle rearview mirror.

• Those towing skiers on water skis, a surfboard, or similar devices and those being towed must act in a safe and prudent manner.

 Vessels towing persons may not come within 100 feet of any occupied anchored boat, any PWC, or any marked swimming area or public boat landing.

• Persons being towed behind a vessel on water skis, a surfboard, or other device, or their towing rope, may not come within 100 feet of a PWC.

#### **Avoid Propeller Strike Injuries!**

Most propeller strike accidents result from operator error. Victims include swimmers, scuba divers, fallen waterskiers, and boat operators or passengers. Most propeller accidents can be prevented by following basic safe boating practices.

• Maintain a proper lookout. The primary cause of propeller strike accidents is operator inattention.

• Make sure the engine is off so that the propeller is not rotating when passengers are boarding or leaving a boat.

• Never start a boat with the engine in gear

 Slow down when approaching congested areas and anchorages. In congested areas, always be alert for swimmers and divers.



#### Vintage Weekend parking and street closures



#### **Boating Regulations**

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

6. There is a radar-enforced speed limit


John wrote, "This is not J & Woodside Lane—That location has no telephone pole or a fence line and it is a straight area not curved.


#### Leash Law

# ElkhartCares reflects on volunteers
