Ripple River Gallery to host special Peruvian weaving event

Bay Lake will host a one-day exhibit and demonstration of fine traditional tapestry weaving and the art and culture of Peru with Master Weaver Wilber Quispe and Melanie Ebertz, founder of ArtAndes. The special presentation is set for Friday, July 5 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Since 1985, Ebertz, a Stillwater resident, has been designing textiles and cultural journeys in the Andes. She says it took her 10 years to find Quispe, one of the best tapestry weavers in Peru. Weaving at a level that is now rarely found in Peru, Quispe's skill has won him many awards both in Peru and in the U.S. At just 12 years of age, Quispe began weaving; by 16 was teaching tapestry weaving to others.

Together Ebertz and Quispe have been working together in Peru to preserve the craft

> "We are excited to host this special presentation at Ripple River Gallery," said Amy Sharpe, gallery owner. "ArtAndes offers a great opportunity to see the process behind fine textile craftsmanship."

ArtAndes Textiles are complex in technique and craftsmanship. The wool yarn is handspun on a drop spindle—a step that elsewhere has almost entirely been replaced by machines. Handspinning and hand-dying the wool using local plant, mineral and insect knowledge lend ArtAndes textiles their heirloom quality. Complicated tapestry techniques give the textiles a tight and durable weave.

Peru's textile collection spans from about 3000 B.C. to the present. Through extensive historical research and museum visits, Ebertz has helped reintroduce traditional designs to contemporary

weavers. The result is handwoven rugs that have iconographic designs rooted in Pre-Columbian civilizations but with a contemporary flair. Ripple River Gallery is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday; and from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sundays. The gallery is located five miles south of Deerwood on Highway 6, then 3 miles east of Ruttger's





Guest Opinion – Baby Boomers should be wary of Medicare changes

By SANDIP SHAH Baby boomers are aging rapidly. Around 10,000 Americans celebrate their 65th birthday every day.

Unfortunately for these seniors, the government health care to which they're entitled may put their lives at risk. That's thanks to a new proposal from the Department of Health and Human Services that would impose price controls on certain medicines covered through Medicare.

HHS' plan could save Uncle Sam a few dollars in the short run. But its long-term side effects would be far costlier for both the government's budget and patients' health.

The proposal impacts treatments covered through Medicare Part B. These are highly potent medications administered in doctors' offices,

including oral cancer drugs, infusions, vaccinations, and IVs.

Currently, doctors purchase Part B drugs ahead of time and store them on site. Once physicians administer a treatment to patients, Medicare reimburses them the average sales price of that particular drug.

Under Sec. Azar's proposal, Medicare would instead reimburse doctors a flat fee for the drugs they administer. This reimbursement would correspond to the average price of that drug in 14 benchmark countries.

The majority of these countries rely on artificial price controls to keep drug spending in check. By copying this model, HHS hopes to cut Medicare spending by as much as 30 percent.

Implementing price controls would harm American patients

in a couple of ways.

First, artificially capping the cost of medicines will devastate access to quality healthcare providers. Consider what happened when the government tried cutting Medicare reimbursements in 2013. Eight in 10 oncologists said payment cuts impacted their practices. And half had to turn cancer patients away because of it.

Second, HHS' plan would stall the medical advancement that benefits patients today -- and paves the way for breakthrough cures for the patients of tomorrow.

Drug development isn't easy. It takes \$2.6 billion and over a decade to develop a single drug. Scientists and investors need ample financial incentives to put money towards future medicines.

main will be angled to the 17-foot mark and angled again to return to the 10-foot mark, this creates a potential 300 ft. "trap". When pumps are not running, the settling of material may clog. Thus, increasing repairs and maintenance to the sewer district.

The Serpent Lake Sanitary Sewer Distric reserve money was never supposed to be used for a tunnel that has nothing to do with the sewer district itself. The reserve funds in the sewer district are used and sometimes earmarked for projects the district can expect to repair and upgrade, without having to raise rates. It takes years for the district to build those reserve funds. It remains a mystery why Crosby's mayor, city administrator, and city engineer would create such a burden upon the sewer district, unless it was a calculated move for funding they thought would not be challenged.

The location chosen for the tunnel creates long-term maintenance and financial problems the district never planned or budgeted for. A rate increase is probable to 17 teet. This means the sewer accomplish this and to pro-

tect the future, unless another solution can be found. It's becoming clear; the project has not been planned accordingly and, is a complete fiasco that has not been thought through properly.

While the district thinks the tunnel is a good idea, the lack of inclusion and incompetence of the people in charge has brought the tunnel project to the forefront of people in the sewer district.

The question arises; why should the people in the sewer district pay for a tunnel that is not nor should have ever become an issue for the sewer district's budget?

It appears there is motivation by Crosby's engineer to take over management and control of Crosby's water and sewer and ultimately control over the sewer district, if they can. If that is true, use the tunnel project as a prime example not to let that happen because when it comes to the money in your checkbook, they will find a way to spend it and the whole tunnel project does not seem to add up financially nor planned with an ounce of

This big-government approach to fighting climate change isn't merely expensive -- it's ineffective. States like West Virginia and Ohio, which haven't enacted such policies, have actually seen greater emissions declines than the Golden State.

Germany's renewable-energy push has similarly failed. "An average four-person household has to pay more than double for power in 2017 compared to 2000," the head of a consumer lobbying group told German radio.

Ontario politicians' green dreams have also turned into a nightmare for consumers. The Canadian province passed a law promoting green energy

in 2009. From 2008 to 2016, electric prices spiked more than 70 percent -- prices jumped 15 percent between 2015 and 2016 alone. The provincial legislature recently repealed the law.

The Green New Deal would replicate such failed schemes, but on a much grander scale.

If electricity prices surged here, working-class Americans would be clobbered. The poorest 20 percent of U.S. wage-earners spend nearly 10 percent of income on electricity, while the richest 20 percent spend around 1 percent.

Fossil-fuels keep energy bills affordable for working families. Natural gas production has surged roughly 50 percent in the past decade, causing electricity and cooking fuel prices to plummet. This production boom saved the average American family more than \$1,300 in 2015.

The oil and gas sector also provides jobs to working-class Americans. Oil and gas firms support over 10 million jobs across the country -- the Green New Deal would eliminate nearly all these positions. By comparison, the Great Recession of 2007 to 2009 eliminated fewer than 9 million jobs.


