

enough and most would bore you to tears. But I can reveal enough computer repair secrets to keep you busy until I get back.

The first step in computer diagnosis is to determine if the problem is hardware or software related. Heat buildup can cause all sorts of issues so one quick way to determine that is to open the

case and inspect the innards of the system. If your first reaction is, "Ewwww!" then you should purchase a can of compressed air and get rid of the dust. If you have a laptop, it should be blown out as well. Just stick the air nozzle into the vents and blow away. While you're in there, just look for broken stuff.

If the initial hardware inspection passes, you should know that, besides user errors (what we in the business call "loose nuts behind the keyboard"), the biggest cause of most computer problems

are viruses, spyware. and junk programs. If you don't have updated security software, chances are very good that whatever problem you are having is virus and spyware related. Our choices for free antivirus programs are AVG Free Edition and Microsoft's "Windows Defender" that's built into Windows 10 and is available for Windows 7.

Even the best antivirus programs aren't perfect. There are some types of junk that get by the major antivirus programs. An excellent free product called

"Malwarebytes Anti-malware" removes the junk that antivirus programs don't. Download and install this program and remove whatever it finds.

The next step is to go through your list of installed programs and remove stuff that looks suspicious. You need to be careful to not remove something just because you don't know what it is. Some programs are necessary. But if you have ANY sort of "Speed Fixer" to "PC Speed" or "Registry Clean" programs, remove them with a vengeance. They are all pure junk.

If your computer freezes often, and the system is free of viruses and spyware, the likely culprits are either a bad hard drive or a defective memory module. Problems with RAM modules are rare but do happen. Microsoft provides a free RAM tester. If it finds a problem, you simply

replace the defective module. Do an Internet search for "Windows Memory Diagnostic" and run this test.

Next is a test of the hard drive. Most computer manufacturers include bûilt-in hard drive diagnostics on their systems that aren't quite as thorough as the "professional" stuff we use in the shop but it's good enough for home use. The test is simple: If your hard drive fails the test, you need to backup your important stuff and call someone that knows what they are doing.

Following its creation in 1990, the UNA Athletic Hall of Fame inducted four members each year through 2005. From 2006-2014 that number was expanded to six. The induction class returned to four honorees per year in 2015.

This year's induction brings the total number of inductees into the UNA Athletic Hall of Fame to


RENAE CODY Women's Basketball 1981-84

Cody was

year member of UNA women's basketball teams from 1981-84. She was a member of UNA's 1982 AAIAW Northern Division Championship team under Gary Elliott and a member of UNA's first NCAA Division II Tournament team as a senior in 1983-84 under Wayne Byrd.


She was selected first-team All-Gulf South South Conference in 1983-84. The Lions had a combined 79-39 record in her four years in the program. She currently ranks as the fourth leading scorer in UNA women's basketball history with 1,294 points, all in the era prior to the three-point shot. Cody made 559 career field goals and 176 free throws in 118 career games. She still ranks as UNA's career leader in steals with 208 and is second in career assists with 477. Her

top scoring game was 30 against Stillman in 1983-84.

Cody scored 294 in 1980-81, 264 in 1981-82, 357 in 1982-83 and 379 points in 1983-84.

Cody is a native of Red Bay, Alabama. She has worked for the Central Service Association in Tupelo, MS for almost 34 years as a programmer customer service

representative. The company is a computerized information system service that serves the needs of public utilities across the seven states of the Tennessee Valley and other utilities outside the Tennessee Valley area.

MIKE KLUG Baseball 2004-05

Klug was the starting second baseman on UNA baseball teams in 2004 and 2005. He was a twotime all-conference and all-region selection who went on to be named All-American in 2005.

Klug was elected second-team All-GSC in 2004 and 2005. He was first-team All-South Region both years and a second-team Rawlings/ABCA Division II All-American pick as a senior at second base.

For his efforts in helping lead the Lions to the championship game of the 2005 GSC Tournament, Klug was voted GSC Tournament MVP. UNA lost in the championship game to West Alabama, but Klug became the first player from a nonchampionship team to win the tournament's MVP honors.

Klug helped lead UNA to a 34-20-1 record in 2004 and a 39-19 mark in 2005 under 1971 with 144 rushing, 417 Mike Lane. He led the team with 76 hits, 70 runs scored, 52 runs batted in, 25 doubles, 37 bases on balls and 14 home runs in 2005. He also led the Lions with 9 home runs and 7 triples in 2004 while hitting .353 with 61 hits, 53 runs scored and 43 RBI.

He earned one GSC Player of the Week award on April 20, 2004.

Klug had a career batting average of .358 (137-of-382) with 123 runs scored, 95 RBI, 39 doubles, 10 triples and 23 home runs. He stole 44 bases in 50 attempts, walked 63 times and was hit-by-pitch 13 times. He finished with a .694 career slugging percentage and a .459 career on base percentage.

He was selected as UNA's Male Athlete of the Year in 2005 and was later drafted in the 28th round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the Oakland A's in

BOBBY JOE PRIDE Football 1968-71

Pride was a four-year football letterman for the Lions from 1968-71. He was a member of the first integrated collegiate football team in the state of Alabama under coach Hal Self. He finished his career in 1971 with 3,655 allpurpose yards, second best in school history behind his teammate Leonard Thomas (3,938). That mark still ranks eighth in school history. His career numbers include 854 rushing yards, 799 receiving yards, 1,525 kickoff return yards and 477 purification of the state of the 477 purification of the state of 3,655 all-purpose yards. He scored 7 career touchdowns, including 2 kickoff returns for touchdowns in his career - 67 yards against Jacksonville State in 1968 and 100 yards against Tennessee-Martin in 1970. The 100-yard return is tied for a school record.

Pride led the team in kickoff returns in 1970 with 18 for 623 yards and a 34.5 average and again in 1971 with 19 for 417 yards and a 21.0 average. His 623 kickoff return yards in 1970 set a school record that has since been broken. He had 1,106 all-purpose yards in 1970 with 177 rushing, 254 receiving, 623 on kickoff returns and 52 on punt returns. He finished with 1,069 all-purpose yards in three sons.

receiving, 417 on kickoff returns and 101 on punt returns.

Pride played wingback and tailback his first two seasons before moving to flanker. A 1977 UNA graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree, the Decatur, Ala., native was inducted into the Morgan County Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

JUSTIN REGAN Men's Golf 2000-03

Regan was a four-year letterman on the men's golf team at North Alabama from 2000-03. He received All-American recognition in three of his four seasons with the Lions and helped lead UNA to three NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances. He was first-team All-Gulf South Conference in 2000 and 2003 and second-team All-GSC in 2002. He earned All-South Region honors in 2003, was a second-team All-American in 2003 and an honorable mention All-American in 2000 and 2002. He also received UNA's Jack Karnes Award in 2000 for leadership, citizenship, athletic and academic performance. Regan tied for 12th individually at the 2002 NCAA Division II Golf Championships, tied for 33rd in 2003 and tied for 47th in 2000. He helped lead UNA to back-to-back NCAA Regional championships in 2002 and 2003, including taking Medalist honors as region champion in 2003.

Regan played in 36 tournaments for the Lions, winning six and posting 15 Top 10 finishes. He becomes the sixth former UNA golfer to be elected to the Hall of Fame.

Regan was a first-team selection me South Conference Team of the Decade for 2000's. He received a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from UNA.

Regan worked for 15 years following graduation as an account manager with Spectra Contract Flooring in Atlanta. He has been in his current position as Vice President of Sales and Operations for Spectra in Alabama for the last two and a half years. He and his wife, former UNA cheerleader, Carly Ingersoll, live in Birmingham and have

How Seniors Can Spot Fake News

Dear Savvy Senior,

I recently read that seniors are the number one purveyor of fake news on the Internet. Is this true, or is it fake news too? If it's true, how can seniors go about spotting fake

Faked Out Seniorr

Dear Faked Out,

Yes, it's true. According to a recent study published in the journal Science Advances, people aged 65 and older are almost four times more likely to share fake news on social media than younger people.

Why do older users share fake news more often? There are two theories. The first is that seniors, who came to the Internet later, sometimes lack the digital literacy skills of their younger counterparts to identify false or misleading content. The second is that many older people experience cognitive decline as they age, making them more likely to fall for hoaxes.

What is Fake News?

Fake news is not new, but it is more prevalent than ever before because of the Internet and social networking, which enables it to spread like wildfire.

Fake news is false news stories, hoaxes or propaganda created to deliberately misinform or deceive readers. Usually, these stories are created to either influence people's views, push a political agenda or cause confusion and can often be a profitable business for online

Also note that some fake stories aren't completely false, but rather distortions of real events. These deceitful claims can take a legitimate news story and twist what it says, or even claim that something that happened long ago is related to current events.

How to Spot Fake News

Here are some tips from the International Federation of Library Associations, Harvard University and Facebook that can help you spot fake news stories.

Be skeptical of headlines: False news stories often have catchy headlines in all caps with exclamation points. If shocking claims in the headline sound unbelievable, they probably are.

Look closely at the Web link: A phony or look-alike link may be a warning sign of false news. Many false news sites mimic authentic news sources by making small changes to the link, for example "abcnews.com.co" (an illegitimate site) versus the actual "abcnews.com."

Investigate the source: Ensure that the story is written by a source that you trust with a reputation for accuracy. If the story comes from an unfamiliar organization, check their "About" section to learn more. You can also find a list of websites that post deceptive and fake content at *FactCheck.org* – type "misinformation" directory" in their search feature to find it.

Watch for unusual formatting: Many false news sites have misspellings or awkward layouts. Read carefully if you see these signs.

Inspect the dates: False news stories may contain timelines that make no sense, or event dates that have been altered.


Check the evidence: Check the author's sources to confirm that they are accurate. Lack of evidence or reliance on unnamed experts may indicate a false news

Look at other reports: If no other news source is reporting the same story, it may indicate that the story is false. If the story is reported by multiple sources you trust, it's more likely to be true.

Is the story a joke? Sometimes false news stories can be hard to distinguish from humor or satire. Check whether the source is known for parody, and whether the story's details and tone suggest it may be just for fun.

Do some fact checking: There are many good websites, like PolitiFact.com, Snopes.com and FactCheck. org that can help you fact check a story to help you identify fact versus fiction. These sites have most likely already fact-checked the latest viral claim to pop up in your news feed.





Are You A Praying Parent?

Numerous times during my ministry have parents come to my office, often in tears and wringing their hands, because of some concern over their children. Sometimes it is the "normal" parent versus adolescent conflict and at other times it can be far more serious. Whatever the case, their pain is very real.

I have often thought that parenting would be a lot easier if each child came with his own set of instructions. That way you could just look up a question in the index and follow the appropriate steps given on the reference page.

But as you know, such is not the case.

One of the questions I always ask troubled parents is: "Are you praying for your child?" Surprisingly I find that many are not, or maybe haven't been very much, so I find this a starting place for a solution.

I view parenting, like all other aspects of life, as a partnership with God. There are so many times when we just don't know what to do- - but God does so we should seek His wisdom (cf. James 1:5). There are many times when we cannot be with our childrenbut we know God can, so we should pray that He will keep them in His care (cf. Hebrews 4:13; Proverbs 30:5). On and on we could go, but the point I want to stress is that parenting and prayer go hand in hand.

An illustration that might be cited is that of Thomas Calhoun Walker. He was born a slave in 1862 and reared in extreme poverty. Even so, he grew up to be a lawyer and an extraordinary citizen. One of the main factors of his success was his father. Walker said he was often awakened in the early morning hours by his father who was praying so earnestly that he was almost shouting. In those prayers he would plead, "O God, please take care of my children 'cause I don't know how." It is any wonder that Thomas Walker turned out as he did?

Another illustration we might reference is the Bible character, Job. We know him as a man of patience, but he was also a concerned father. Initially he was blessed with ten children for whom he would "rise early in the morning and offer burnt offerings according to the number of them all... thus Job did regularly" (Job 1:5). Hence, Job also was a praying parent.

Of course, prayer is not the only ingredient to good parenting, but it is too vital to be left out. So, please pray for your children. They need it- - and so do you!

HERE IS YOUR 4TH OF JULY QUIZ

It doesn't matter that no one knows how and when to assert their rights under the 3rd Amendment to the Constitution. It probably does matter that not a lot of people can name the five rights contained in the 1st Amendment, can you?

Let's remember that the 4th of July isn't a constitutional celebration. It does matter that our Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 very brave individuals who stood to lose everything they had, including their lives.

The Constitution is America's fundamental law but not its first law. The Declaration appears on Page 1 of Volume 1 of the U.S. Statutes and is at the head of the United States Code. Every state's admission has been conditioned on the adoption on a constitution consistent with the U.S. Constitution and the Declaration. The Declaration of Independence was signed July 4, 1776 and the Constitution of the United States and the first Ten Amendments were eventually ratified on December 15, 1791.

The Declaration of Independence contains ideas that were new and radical at the time. Probably the most radical idea was that governments derive their powers from the consent of the governed. There wasn't a king or queen in the world that governed by the consent of those governed at the time our Declaration of Independence was signed.

The idea that people have rights such as life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness seem obvious today but these ideas were unheard of at the time the Declaration was signed. There was a big dispute over the idea of the pursuit of happiness. Probably the foremost philosophers of the day believed that people would pursue happiness just as water runs downhill. The central idea of those inalienable rights that was left unstated was the right to own property.

Those 56 men who signed the Declaration did so with a firm reliance of protection of divine Providence and mutually pledged to each other their lives, fortunes and





Tuition Set-Up Hurts Working Students

UNA Board The Trustees recently approved a 4.1% tuition increase for the coming school year.

If a student is taking 15 credit hours, the cost includes tuition of \$4,325 plus fees of \$1,030 for a total of \$5,355. This is for one semester. Normally, eight semesters (four years) are required for a student to graduate. Therefore, for a student to graduate, it will cost \$42,840 (Éight times \$5,335) in tuition and fees. Please note that this charge does not include books, supplies, dorm rent, off campus living, food, gas, new clothes and

Tuition has increased each year for the past several years at UNA. Therefore, tuition will probably increase over the current level.

Also, last year UNA changed tuition its structure. If a student is taking 12 to 18 credit hours, the charge is for 15 credit hours. This hurts the student who in addition to going to school has a part time job and does not have the time for 15 credit hours and is taking 12 credit hours. It helps the student who does not need to work during school days and has the time for 18 credit hours.







Medicare Minute

Qualifying for Medicare

When I began working with Medicare health plans a few years ago it became obvious to me that people aging into Medicare were joining a health insurance program that they really didn't understand. Although the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) do all they can to educate Americans about the benefits of Medicare it still isn't enough for them to fully understand what they have as far as medical coverage through the federal government. Over the next the next few weeks we're going to discuss the basics of and what is covered under Medicare. But first let's look at how Medicare started.

On July 30, 1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed into law the bill, Title XVIII of the Social Security Act, which led to the establishment of Medicare. The original bill included Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance). Today we know these 2 parts as "Original Medicare". In the beginning Medicare was created to provide health insurance to people 65 years of age and older, regardless of income or medical history.

Over the past five decades changes have been made as to who qualifies for Medicare. In addition to people over the age of 65, Medicare now covers people under the age of 65 who are permanently disabled and have been receiving Social Security Disability Insurance for 24 months. Also anyone at any age can receive Medicare if they have End Stage Renal Disease or ALS.

Although Medicare provides medical coverage for those who qualify it is not 100% coverage!! We often hear "once I go on Medicare my medical insurance worries are over." Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance that the Medicare beneficiary is responsible for unless the beneficiary has additional coverage to supplement Medicare.



You could think of it as a gift to yourself and your family. Nursing home costs are astronomical these days, and care of that sort can deplete your nest egg very quickly!



Smile! You're on camera!

So many things have changed in the real estate business since I first started back in 2000. From how we handle showings and access to homes, to how they are marketed, it's all really completely different.

Another major change and one of the newest issues we're facing in the industry is the ease in which you can be recorded while you're actually looking at a home. For example, if a home you're looking at has a "Ring" doorbell, well... you're pretty much being recorded from the time you step on the porch. A motion detector will instantly allow the doorbell camera to begin recording. It will even open the app on the homeowner's phone if they have it set up and they can essentially listen to you LIVE!

Think about this for a second, let's say you tour a home, fall in love with it and while going out the front door you start discussing how much you should offer with your agent... Yes, you guessed it. You are also discussing how much to offer with the homeowner although you don't even realize it.

Is it right? Is it legal? Great questions, and as agents I think we're still trying to figure all of this out, as we did when the World Wide Web first came on to the scene. (By the way, some people still call it that.)

I had a long conversation with a few of my colleagues this week about whether or not a seller should be recording agents and potential buyers as they walk through their home. It's an interesting topic as there are two sides that could be considered.

On the seller's side, it is their home and they certainly may have the right to know what's going on. However, I can assure you with 100% certainty, it definitely makes a buyer (and their agent) very uncomfortable while looking at the home if they know they are being recorded.

Right, wrong, good, bad, or indifferent, the fact is this: As an agent or a buyer, if you're walking through a home that you're considering buying, you need to be aware that your comments, positive or negative, may be being heard by more than just those with you.
