

Livingston County Board of Supervisors Proclaim Invasive Species Awareness Week

Geneseo, NY- July 5, 2019 – In support of the state-wide initiative, the Board of Supervisors proclaimed July 7-13, 2019, as Invasive Species Awareness Week (ISAW) in Livingston County to promote awareness of invasive species, the harm they can cause, and how they can be detected and eradicated in order to protect the environment, human health, and economy. ISAW features statewide events that encourage New York residents to help protect resources – such as fish, wild-life, plants, and crops – from the negative impacts of invasive species. This year's theme is "Early Detection: Explore, Observe, Report" which highlights the importance of detecting infestations of invasive species early, thereby increasing the success of response efforts.

Invasive species are defined as non-native plants, animals, insects, or diseases that can cause harm to the environment, economy, or human health. Common invasive species in Livingston County include Eurasian watermilfoil, zebra mussels, alewife, Japanese knotweed, giant hogweed, emerald ash borer and hemlock woolly adelgid. Potential species to be on the lookout for are the spotted lanternfly, oak wilt, hydrilla and water chestnut.





The Dangers of West Nile Virus

The mosquito season is upon us. Not only are mosquitoes a nuisance, but some can carry West Nile Virus. West Nile Virus is spread through the bite of an infected mosquito. Even though the chances of catching this virus are slim, it is important to take precautions. Although people of all ages can become infected with West Nile Virus, those who are at highest risk for severe illness from the virus include people with compromised immune systems and the elderly. This virus can cause a serious life altering disease or even death. The following guidelines are recommended to reduce the risk of contacting West Nile Virus:

- Apply insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE), or PMD to exposed skin, following the manufacturer's instructions. If using on small children, do not apply to the face, hands or open sores. Do not apply to infants; use mosquito netting instead.
- If possible, wear long sleeves and long pants. Mosquitoes can bite through thin layers of clothing so using insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, IR3535, or oil of lemon eucolyptus, lowers the risk of being bitten by a mosquito.
- Get rid of standing water. Even the smallest amounts can be enough for mosquitoes to lay eggs. Look around at such things as buckets, cans, flowerpots and other items that may retain water. Empty and refill birdbaths once or twice a week.
- Install or repair window and door screens so mosquitoes cannot get into the house.
- Many mosquitoes are most active from dusk to dawn. Minimize outdoor activities during this time, if possible.

Is Your Home Bat Proofed?

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), bats are the most common source of human rabies in the United States. Although bats are very helpful to humans and the environment, by consuming insect pests, bats can also be infected with rabies. You can't tell whether or not a bat has rabies by looking at it. Rabies can only be confirmed in a laboratory. People and animals can get rabies if they are bitten by a rabid bat.

A bite from a bat may not be noticed because bat's teeth are so small. If you or someone you know has had physical contact with a bat, please call the Livingston County Department of Health at (585) 243-7280 and consult with a health care provider to determine if rabies treatment is needed.

It is important to keep bats out of homes. It's best to contact an animal-control or wildlife conservation agency for assistance with "bat-proofing" your home. However, if you choose to do it yourself, "bat-proofing" can be done by caulking any holes that are larger than a quarter inch, closing all doors to the

outside tightly, using chimney covers, window screens, and draft guards beneath doors to attics. Bats can even enter homes through loose shingles, siding, or open vents.

If a bat is in a home and there is a chance that the bat had contact with a person, pet, unattended young child, a sleeping individual, a person under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or a person with other sensory or mental impairment, please follow these simple guidelines:

- Do not touch the bat with your bare hands. Put on leather work gloves.
- Get a small box or coffee can, a piece of cardboard and tape.
- · Wait for the bat to land.
- Approach the bat slowly, and while wearing the gloves, place the box or coffee can over it.
- Slide the cardboard under the box or can to trap the
- Tape the cardboard to the can or box opening so the bat cannot escape.
- Punch small holes in the cardboard allowing the bat to breathe.
- Leave the bat in the container. Then take the container outside and call the Livingston County Department of Health at (585) 243-7280, or the Livingston County Sheriff's Department at (585) 243-7100 after hours.
- Do not release the bat. The bat should be tested for rabies to determine the need for rabies treatment.

If you have pets, it is important to keep them up to date with their rabies vaccinations to prevent exposure. If there are any questions or concerns please contact the Livingston County Department of Health at (585)243-7280 or visit our website at www.livingstoncounty.us/doh.htm.

Keep Your Children Safe This Summer

When summer weather comes, it means more outdoor activity for children. For parents and guardians this means being extra careful to make sure your children stay safe. Keep your children safe this summer by following these simple tips:

Water safety: Never let your child play in or near water without an adult present. Even if children know how to swim, they can still find themselves at risk. Also remember that infants, toddlers and young children can drown in as little as 2 inches of water. Make sure that children wear life jackets in and around natural bodies of water, even if they know how to swim. Pools should have a four-sided fence, separating the pool from the house, keeping children away from the area when they are not supposed to be swimming. Also, teach kids to swim to prevent drowning and learn CPR to be ready in case of an emergency.

Insect Repellant: There are many insect repellants that are safe to use for children. Be sure you pick repellants with DEET, picaridin (KBR 3023), IR 3535, or citronella oil. If you use a repellant with DEET, be sure the product has less than 30% DEET, and do not spray near the mouth or eyes and follow manufacturer's directions. Do not use insect repellants with DEET on infants; instead cover them with netting to avoid bites.

Sun Safety: Overexposure to sun and ultraviolet light increases your child's risk of skin cancer. Regular use of sunscreen can lower children's risk of skin cancer by almost 78% (www.keepkidshealthy.com). Sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher is the best defense. Sunscreen should be applied 30-45 minutes before exposure to the sun, and should be reapplied every 2 hours or sooner if your child has been swimming or sweating. Also, be sure to stay in the shade whenever possible, and wear clothing that protects you from the sun, such as a hat and sunglasses. Schedule outdoor activities for morning and evening hours when the sun is not as strong.

Bicycle Safety: All children ages 14 and under are required by law to wear their bicycle helmets. Wearing a bicycle helmet can protect a child of any age from serious injury. Make sure your bicycle has reflectors if you are biking at night.






