

Wheeler Trail **Work Begins**

ROGERSVILLE-Joe Wheeler State Park officials joined representativés from the Tennessee Valley Authority last week at the First Creek Boat Launch to break ground for a new 8-mile bike and hiking

trail at the park. The Joe Wheeler State Park Scenic Trail will be built using \$105,000 in grant money from the Recreational Trail Program and the TVA. Several bridges will be constructed along the east bank of First Creek inside the park.

The Joe Wheeler staff will handle most of the construction of the trail. "The Alabama State

Parks Division appreciates the cooperation of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community

for our visitors," said Rob Grant, assistant director of the Alabama State Parks Division of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. "Mountain bikers and hikers have found our state parks to be great places to enjoy the outdoors. We're sure this new trail will attract lots of visitors who haven't been to Joe Wheeler State Park."

The new trail will increase the park's hiking and biking network to more than 12 miles. Joe Wheeler State Park has two hiking (kiling trails two hiking/biking trails, both approximately 2.5 miles. One is located between the Day Use Area and Resort Lodge with another 2.5-mile loop at the Southside Cabin Area, accessed from Alabama Highway 101 near Wheeler Dam.



DELAYS **CAUSED BY THE** GOVERNMENT

We all know that in certain situations Medicare, which is the federal government, can take a person's home if Medicare provides long term care for a person who owns the house. Any home transferred by a Medicare recipient within 5 years of long term care is subject to a claim by Medicare.

In personal injury cases, if Medicare pays bills for an injury caused by someone's carelessness and there is a recovery for that injury, the government requires repayment. There are hefty fines and penalties if Medicare pays bills related to an

accident and a recovery is made by the injured person without considering Medicare and obtaining their consent. Because every personal injury lawyer and every insurance company is aware of these rules, claims are set up as early as possible so that the amount owed can be determined or disputed as the case requires.

Medicare has a computer portal for access to the amount claimed for those lawyers who regularly handle these claims. This method is absolutely the fastest way to obtain the numbers necessary to begin to settle a case and get a check for your client. Insurance companies will not pay a claim without paying Medicare if Medicare paid bills resulting from the accident. Insurance companies don't mind a delay. The longer they have the money, the more money they make.

Medicaid is the state equivalent to Medicare. Medicaid pays less and there are other vital differences but it is still governmentally provided coverage. Medicaid also requires repayment if they pay bills caused by an accident. Medicaid will send records upon the request of an attorney or the person injured but will not send the amounts paid. It takes about 90 days to go through their "third party" administration to obtain the amount of money paid. This simply delays their repayment and creates a delay in the resolution of cases.

It is important to notify Medicare or Medicaid at the beginning of a case to be able to get the amount owed so as to be able to resolve the case quickly. If you have an injury and you have coverage, whether it's Blue Cross Blue Shield, Medicare, Medicaid or any other coverage repayment is required, let your attorney know. The sooner the claim is set up, the sooner a case can be resolved.

delivery of a worldclass education to UNA students, with the affordability, maximum consistent with target quality," said Dr. Gunn. "I also believe that UNA has a unique and compelling history of accomplishment and change that needs to spread beyond its immediate community. I intend to be instrumental in this endeavor."

Gunn enrolled at UNA in 1963, one year before the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. He is the first person to have integrated at an Alabama university and later become a member of its governing body.

"Dr. Gunn is making history at UNA, and this is truly a monumental step for the University," said Gov. Ivey. "When appointing Dr. Gunn to serve on the Board of Trustees, I knew that he would exemplify the honesty and integrity that I seek in our candidates. I appreciate his willingness to serve the state in this capacity."

'I know of no other example out there where a student entered under the circumstances that he did, went on to graduate, then returned to and join the institution's

truly full circle for Dr. Gunn," UNA President Dr. Ken Kitts said. "We welcome him to our Board of Trustees. Dr. Gunn is ideally positioned for this assignment by virtue of his temperament, intelligence, and experience."

When Gunn sought admission to UNA in 1963, he was represented by noted civil rights attorney Fred Gray. Gray had represented Rosa Parks and Dr. M. L. King in the Montgomery Bus Boycott. He successfully represented Vivian Malone and James Hood, who entered the University of Alabama, also in 1963. In fact, lawsuits filed by Gray helped desegregate more than 100 local school systems, as well as all public colleges and universities in Alabama.

"The Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965 were great examples of bi-partisan supported by substantial majorities in both the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives, as well as both of the major political

parties." As a young man from Tuscumbia, the decision to attend Florence State was one driven by location and cost. To do that, he would need to transfer from Tennessee State in Nashville. It would also mean enrolling at a university in a deeply

segregated southern state. "When the news reports came out that I had applied to Florence State College, I received several unpleasant phone calls,' Dr. Gunn said. "But once I enrolled, the calls stopped. Amazing!

His early days on campus were quiet and unmarred by the protest and violence that had plagued other college campuses across the southeast.

"During the first few months I was on campus, the other students and I hardly talked to each other," Dr. Gunn said. "Looking back, I suppose it was because we just didn't know what to say to each other. In the spring, when I won the physics achievement award, received a standing ovation. Everyone stood up and cheered. Wow! Finally, I was just another student. That's all I wanted."

Through the lens of the 50-plus years that have passed since Dr. Gunn's matriculation through the University, he feels a deep fondness for UNA. He credits his UNA experience with preparing him to cross the multiple cultural lines that he encountered throughout his career.

'Looking back at my time at Florence State and the fifty-plus years that have followed, it is clear that I was supported by the school," he said. "I received recommendations great from my professors when I applied to graduate at the University of Chicago. I received handwritten letters of congratulations from (Florence State) President Norton whenever received a promotion in my career. Putting these things into perspective, it is clear that Dr. Norton and the administration were prepared for me before I arrived in 1963. They didn't know who I was or where I would come from, but they were ready to make my entry successful and peaceful. The rest would be up to me." Gunn received a Bachelor of Arts in Chemistry &

was Florence State in 1965, an MBA in Finance from the University of Chicago in 1971, and an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from UNA in 2017. After graduation Gunn

had a prestigious career with many personal and professional achievements in science, finance, politics and as an independent business owner. He has worked as a finance professional, vice president at Chase Manhattan Bank, and assistant treasurer at PepsiCo. He also served in the White House as a senior advisor and Special Assistant for International Trade to President Ronald Reagan.

He later founded Gunn Solutions, technology consultants to institutional investment managers.

Dr. Gunn returns to Florence and the Shoals regularly and often spends time on campus and visiting with friends and family. He is frequently invited by student organizations to speak and answer questions about his time at UNA, his business career, and his government service. He was the commencement speaker in 2017, and it was at the ceremony that he was awarded an honorary doctorate. Dr. Gunn has also addressed campus during the annual fall convocation.

"When I go to UNA now and walk about the campus, I watch how students interact with each other, across all cultural lines, and it seems as if the old barriers were never there. And my heart sings," Gunn said. "Even better, I see the same interactions in the community around UNA, whether in the grocery store or when I am in a restaurant for lunch. I have to believe that the University has had, and continues to have, a powerful positive impact on the entire Shoals community."

Often on these visits, Dr. Gunn spends time with Pres. Kitts, much as he did when E.B. Norton occupied the same space on the first floor of Bibb Graves Hall.

'He told me after the Homecoming Homecoming parade, 'You know, Ken, years ago, I started coming back around the University. I've always liked it, and I've always been grateful for the education I received here. Now, I have really fallen in love with my alma mater.' " Kitts said. "It's this University that he carries in his heart. Even with all the other stops in his high-flying career, from the University of Chicago to the White House, it's the time he spent at UNA that continues to resonate with him."







appreciate symbolism of this season. I think I need it. When David says, "Create in me a clean heart, O God," it's helpful to have a representative shift in decades adjoining the sentiment.

twenties My were voluminous. I experienced more in my twenties than I ever dreamed I would as a little kid growing up in Alabama. I went to four different universities and got three degrees while accruing zero debt. I traveled to more countries across the world than all the states I had ever traveled to in the US. I wrote one of my Masters theses in the spa room of a cruise ship while getting paid to sing Motown. I met the Dalai Lama on three separate occasions, one of which I was his bodyguard. I started my career. I made and lost more friends than I thought possible. I loved fiercely and foolishly. I worked more jobs than my parents have in their lifetimes.

And despite all the triumphs of this incredibly rich decade, I emerge happy to leave it behind. Glad to move on. Looking forward to this clean slate of my thirties as a chance to live differently. What do mean? Throughout my

twenties I had a particular modus operandi. One that largely went the modus unexamined. One that I think is characteristic of many young men in their twenties. I would press into new ventures—be it school, work, relationships, friendships—with an undeterrable sense that things would work out. An irrepressibly winsome confidence. An attitude never malicious, but mostly unquestioned. Just a faith in myself and my yearnings. One that was often inspiring to people and reaped many benefits. This was a disposition it." Hebrews 12:11 born of many things: growing up with both of my parents in a loving household, being told I was great, being male in a patriarchal society, lack of a clear, unvarnished understanding of the existential threat of being black in America, a belief that statistics don't apply to me, a deficient contemplation of death. There were other factors I'm sure. But they all congealed into this way of being.

If I was on the basketball court, I expected my team to win, despite the odds. If I felt a love in my heart, I would move on it, knowing that was enough. Can any young men out there relate to this? Like telling someone, "It's going to be okay," when you do NOT know it's going to be okay.

I would fly into a new situation, all heart, without having counted the cost. And it caught up to me. A lot of times it worked out, but it was an approach with serious limitations. And over time, I met pain and failure with frequency. Until eventually collapsed. I hit a wall and crashed. The pain I caused people in the failure of this approach stopped me in my tracks, and I was forced to examine the unexamined. To re-evaluate my entire approach to life. How I inhabit my body. How I enter relationship. How I honor friendship. How I behave at work. How I pursue my career. How I treat my family. How I interact with God. This time in full view of the heartbreak of failure.

"Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by

Now I seek to walk through life more humbly. More sensitively. More cautiously, but no less joyfully. More contemplátive. More grounded. More willing to admit my shortcomings. And an acknowledgement of how I've grown is also an acknowledgement of how much I have to grow. It is a blessed opportunity, this new decade. May the Lord show up in me in a big way. May God renew a right spirít within me daily. And may my every word and every step be motivated not by a belief in my own corporeal strength of will, but a belief in what God can do through me. Amen.

Medicare Minute "Signing up for Medicare Part 1"

The most common way to qualify for Medicare is when you are turning 65. You will have a specific time period, set by Medicare, to enroll in Part A and Part B Medicare. This is known as the Initial Enrollment Period (IEP).

If you are qualifying for Medicare by turning 65 you will have a 7 month window to enroll in Medicare. This window is based off of the month you turn 65. It starts 3 months prior to the month you turn 65 and extends 3 months past the month you turn 65. For example, if you are turning 65 in September your IEP begins in June and extends all the way through the month of December. If you are eligible, you may not have to pay a premium for Part A, but Part B will have a premium.

For those electing to sign up for Part B after their IEP a late-enrollment penalty may be assessed. This penalty can last as long as you have Part B and there may be a gap in your health coverage. However, one exception to this rule is being employed and having coverage through your company's group health plan. If this applies to you check with your benefit coordinator, Medicare or contact our office.

In most cases, if you are already drawing your Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board benefits you should automatically be signed up for Part A and Part B. If you are not drawing your Social Security or RRB benefits and want to sign up for Medicare you can do so by signing up online at ssa.gov, visit your local Social Security office or give our office a call and we can help direct you.

Where to Get Help Paying Your Medicare Costs

Dear Savvy Senior,

Are there any sources you know of that can help me save on my Medicare coverage? I'm 65, and live primarily on my Social Security, and am having a hard time paying my Medicare out-of-pocket costs.

Dear Need,

Need Some Help

There are several financial assistance programs that can help lower-income Medicare beneficiaries who are having a difficult time paying their out-of-pocket health care costs. Here's what's available, along with the eligibility requirements and how to apply.

Medicare Savings Programs

Let's start with a program that helps pay premiums and out-of-pocket costs for Medicare Parts A and B. It's called the Medicare Savings Program (MSP), and it has several different benefit levels for people based on their income and asset level. At its most generous the program will pay your Part A and B premiums and pretty much all your Medicare deductibles, coinsurance and copayments. At its least generous the program will pay just your Part B premium.

To qualify for a MSP, the minimum standard set by Medicare, is an income under 135 percent of the federal poverty level, which at the moment works out to around \$1,426 a month for individuals (or \$1,923 for married couples). Everything counts towards income, including payouts from 401(k) plans, pensions, Social Security, and help from family members.

Medicare also allows states to impose an asset test, which can be as little as \$7,730 per individual (\$11,600 for married couples), not counting your house or car but counting retirement savings and bank accounts.

But some states have made their MSP programs a lot more generous, with much higher income limits and in some cases no asset tests at all. And the program may be called something else in your state. To find out if you qualify or to apply, contact your state Medicaid program. Visit *Medicare.gov/contacts* or call all 800-633-4227 for contact information.

Medication Extra Help

For help with Medicare (Part D) prescription drug plan costs, there is another completely separate program called Extra Help. To get it, you'll need to apply through your local Social Security office.

Depending on how low your income is, this program will pay part or all of your Part D prescription drug plan's monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments. In 2019, individuals with a yearly income below \$18,735 (\$25,365 for a married couple), and assets under \$14,390 (\$28,720 for a married couple) can qualify for Extra Help.

If you're eligible to be in a Medicare Savings Program, you will automatically qualify for Extra Help. But because the requirements are slightly different, even if you don't qualify for a Medicare Savings Program for Part B you might be able to get Extra Help for Part D. For more information or to apply, visit *SSA.gov/extrahelp* or call Social Security at 800-772-1213.

Other Assistance Programs

Depending on your income level, needs and location there are many other financial assistance programs that can help like Medicaid, SSI (Supplemental Security Income), PACE (Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly), SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), (LIHEAP) Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program and many others To help you find out what types of assistance programs you may be eligible for, and learn how to apply for them, go to *BenefitsCheckUp.org*. This is a free, confidential Web tool designed for people age 55 and older that contains more than 2.500 programs. It's also possible to get help in person at one of the 87 Benefits Enrollment Centers scattered across the U.S. Call 888-268-6706 or visit NCOA.org/centerforbenefits/becs to locate a center in your area. Some centers also offer assistance over the phone.
